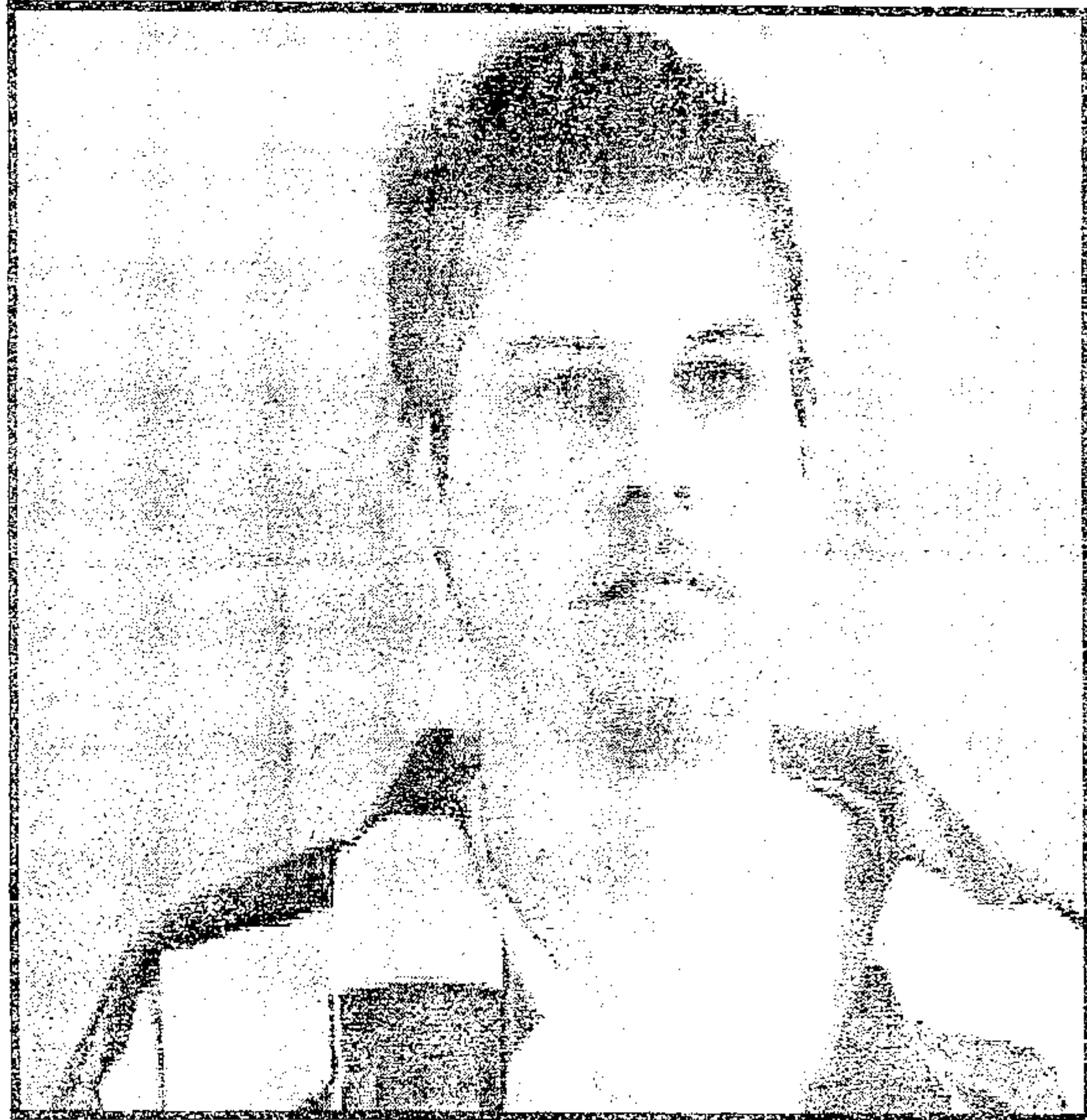


Man packs more than a pinch in his cheeks, racks up multiple charges

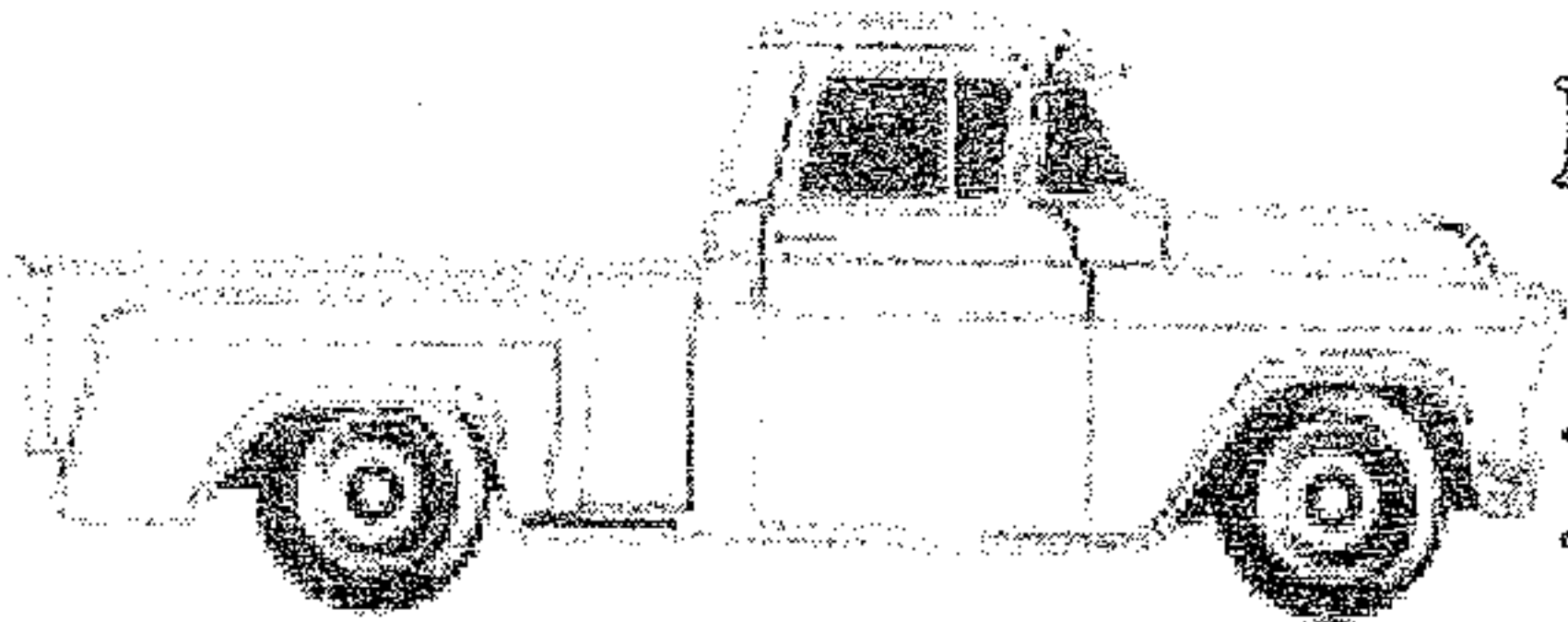
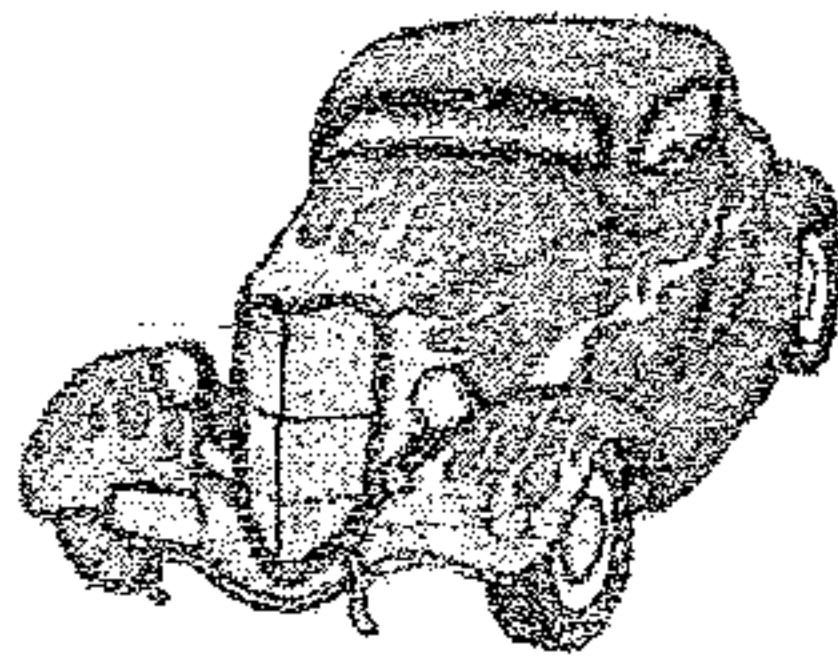

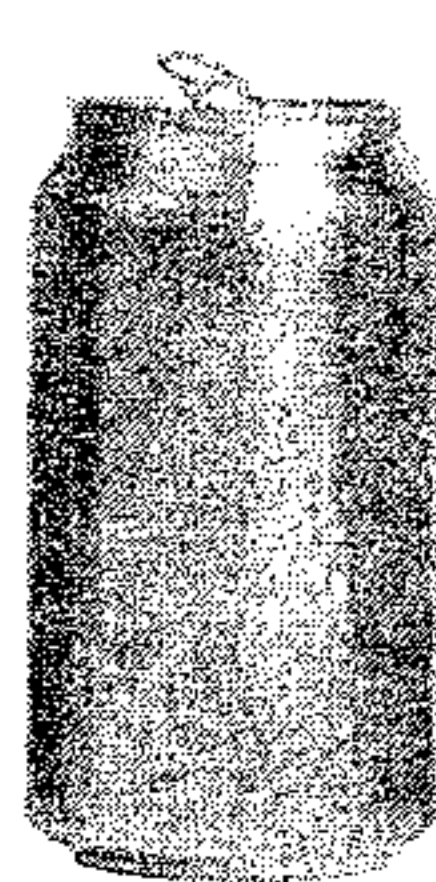

Pizza

A Lenoir City man's apparent taste for pizza resulted in two warrants being issued for his arrest after he allegedly used someone else's credit card without permission to order the popular pie at least twice from a local pizzeria.

Rodney James Vite, 21, of Kelly Lane was charged Monday with two counts of theft under \$500 when Officer K. Sennett, LCPD executed the warrants after locating him walking through McGhee Square.

According to those affidavits, Detective Kevin Condee filed the charges after Vite ordered pizza from Pizza Hut on at least two occasions in late May, 2013, and used a credit

card both times during the calls.

Vite reportedly did not have permission to use the card and the lawman noted the cardholder advised the credit card company to deny the charges, thereby stopping payment to Pizza Hut.

The charges, \$42.73 and \$64.96, were not paid, causing the pizzeria to suffer a loss totaling \$107.69 due to Vite's fraudulent credit card usage.

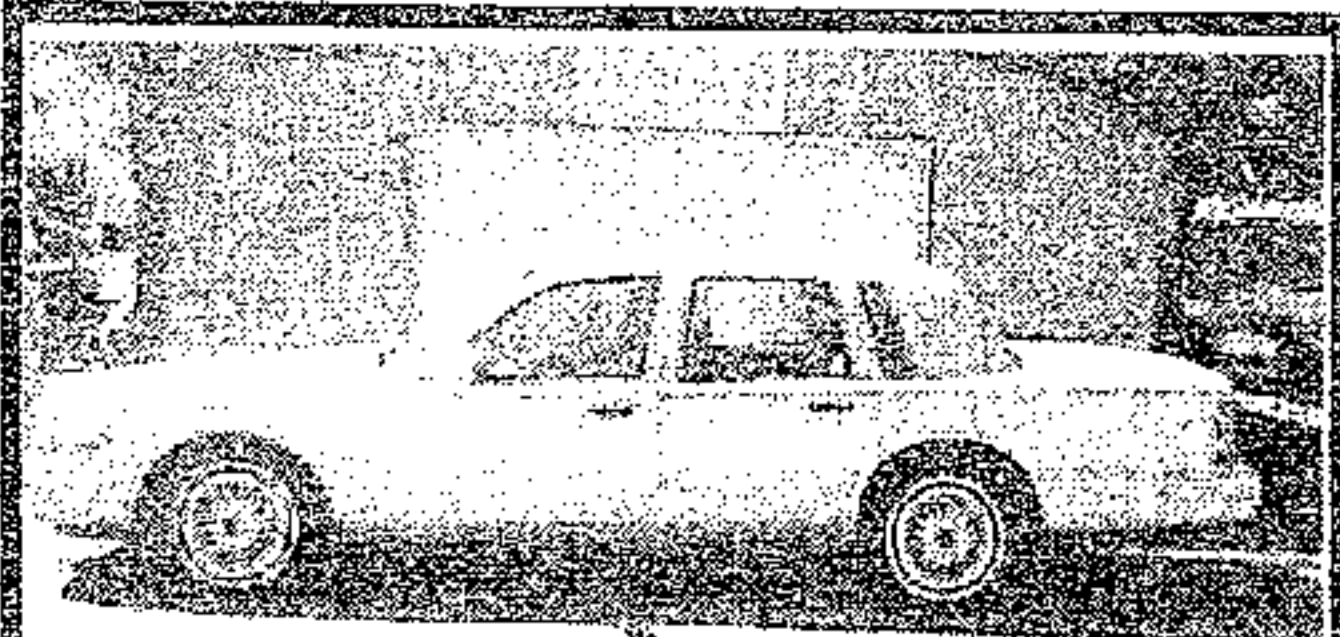
stopped him. A check showed Mr. Huffman to have a revoked license. Deputy Chris Jenkins, LCSO made the arrest.

on suspended license, DUI, violation of implied consent, and introduction into a penal facility.

According to records, Deputy Jamie Ketner, LCSO, was on Callo-way Road around 2:00 AM, Monday when he saw a white Pontiac Grand Prix cross the centerline several times. He initiated a traffic stop at the intersection of Grimes and Corinth Church Roads and identified Meddings as the driver.

The officer reported he noticed Meddings had bloodshot eyes, dilated pupils and he kept sniffing his nose while they were speaking. Meddings information was run and dispatch officers advised Meddings' driving privileg-

es were suspended for failing to satisfy a citation in McMinn County on January 11, 2013.

Meddings was asked to exit the vehicle and he reportedly had a 9mm Ruger P89 semi-automatic on his hip. The officer secured the weapon and performed a search of Meddings person and reported he had small container in his left front pocket that had clear baggie of white powder inside it. Meddings was placed under arrest and transported to jail.

Records indicate Meddings was uncooperative on field sobriety tasks once at the jail and he refused implied consent. He was strip searched for contraband and illegal substances by corrections officers and two baggies of drugs were

found packed between his butt cheeks. One baggie contained a small amount of suspected marijuana and the other had 1.3 grams of white powder that field tested positive as methamphetamine.

Deputy Ketner, assisted by Deputy Jamie Pistole, made the arrest.
