now seeking God through His word and hoping that as I learn what it means to be a true follower of Christ, that someone reading today will learn with me. Could that person be you?

One of the things that I struggled with for many years is alcohol. It was not uncommon for me to be plastered on Saturday night and then get up and go to church on Sunday morning. When I felt convicted over this obvious sin in my life, it made me feel better to remind myself that although it was "sort of sinful", at least I wasn't out there smoking crack, breaking into people's homes or harming others. I placed drinking as a lesser sin in my life than the sins of others. (For those who say it's ok for Christians to drink alcohol as long as you don't get drunk, I say this; have you ever had one more than you meant to have and found yourself

intoxicated? Was that sin? I can probably rest my case right there.)

Another example was my language. I hear foul language on a daily basis, as many of you do in your lives and jobs. Apparently I thought that if I used every curse word imaginable with the exception of using the Lord's name in vain, I was good to go because "they" were worse than me! "Oh wretched man that I am, who will deliver me from this body of death?" (Romans 7:24)

What about adultery? Mathew 5:28 tells us that if we even look upon another in lust then we have committed adultery already within our hearts. Many times we try to justify these sins by telling ourselves that other folks are doing worse things than this. We even try to justify our actions by blaming our spouses while thinking all along that no one will ever know. Experience, as well as Numbers 32:23, have

convinced me that God isn't buying into that.

Here is what God's word says about my former way of thinking;

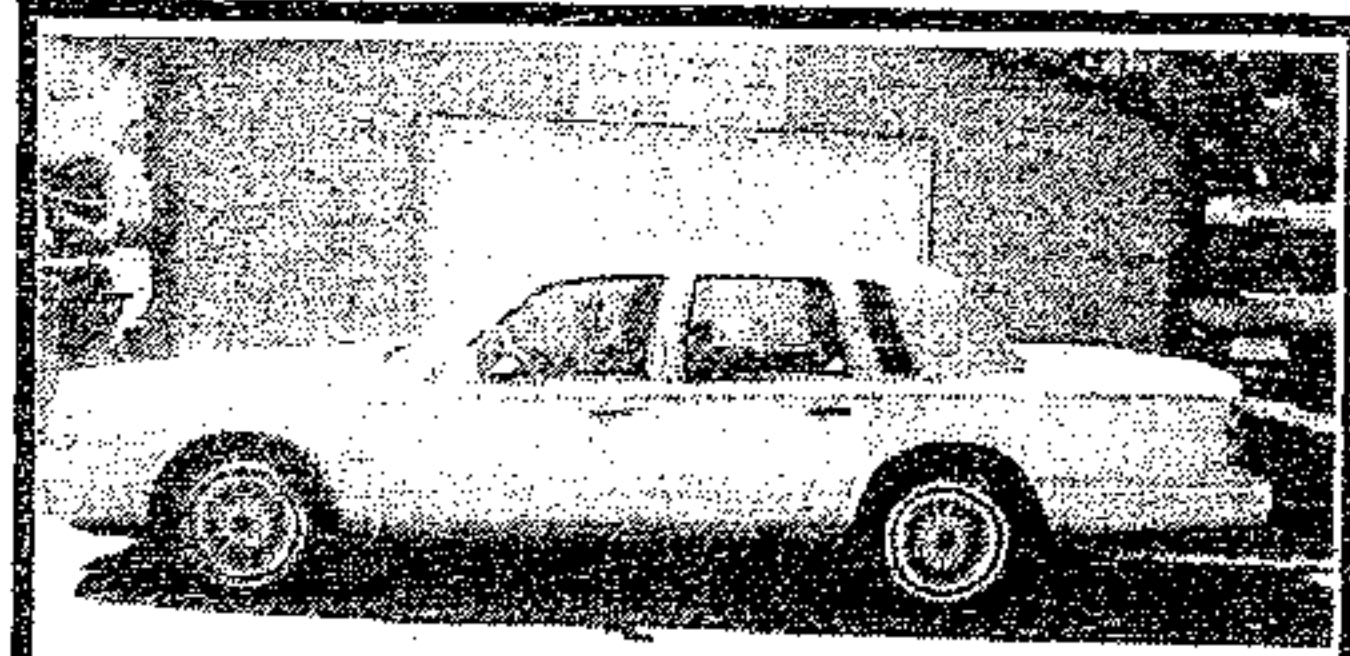
James 2:10-13 (NKJV) (10) For whoever shall keep the whole law, and yet stumble in one point, he is guilty of all. (11) For He who said, "Do not commit adultery," also said, "Do not murder." Now if you do not commit adultery, but you do commit murder, you have become a transgressor of the law. (12) So speak and so do as those who will be judged by the law of liberty. (13) For judgment is without mercy to the one who has shown no mercy. Mercy triumphs over judgment.

What James is saying here based upon the beginning of Chapter 2, is that we cannot pick and choose the level of our sins. If we sin by judging the poor man who enters the temple and give honor to the rich man, we have sinned against God

just as the adulterer or murderer. Contrary to some, I do not believe that all sins are equal, but I do believe that all sins are still sins. I believe James is saying what Jesus said in Mathew 12:30, "He who is not with Me is against Me; and he who does not gather with Me scatters abroad." Jesus also said in John 14:15 "If you love Me, keep my commandments."

Verse 12 tells us to speak and to act as someone who will be judged by the law of liberty. The law of liberty is the law of Christ. While we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. (Romans 5:8) The Old Testament law was fulfilled at that time but the law of Christ, that is to love our neighbors as ourselves, raises the bar even higher for those of us who claim to be Christians, or followers of Christ.

Verse 13 should be plenty of incentive for us to love one another and to abstain

from even the appearance of evil. We are therefore to live a life that displays mercy to others and we too will obtain mercy when we stand before God on the day of judgment.

Just in case you need to hear it more simply and clearly than described here by James; consider what Jesus said during what is known as the sermon the mount and recorded in Mathew 5:7; "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy."

Do you have sins in your life that you justify as being of a lesser magnitude than those of others? Is there things in your life that you hope no one ever finds out about? My friend, Jesus knows even our most intimate thoughts, He knows the things that we struggle with and He tells us to bring our burdens to Him and that He will help us carry our heavy load. (Mathew 11:30)

I have learned many lessons the hard way by choosing not to seek the

instruction and guidance made available in God's word. You have the benefit of hearing how bad I failed and watching how God is restoring my life more and more with each passing week. I list many scripture references every week and hope that you will take the time to read these promises yourself. I will never ask you to take my word on what is written within The Good News, but to seek the truth in His Word.

Today's title is, "All for One, One for All". Let us all live and love like Jesus, as He gave His life for us all! May we see sin as it is.... Sin. May we take our focus off of others and place our trust in Christ!
