

LC man charged with statutory rape

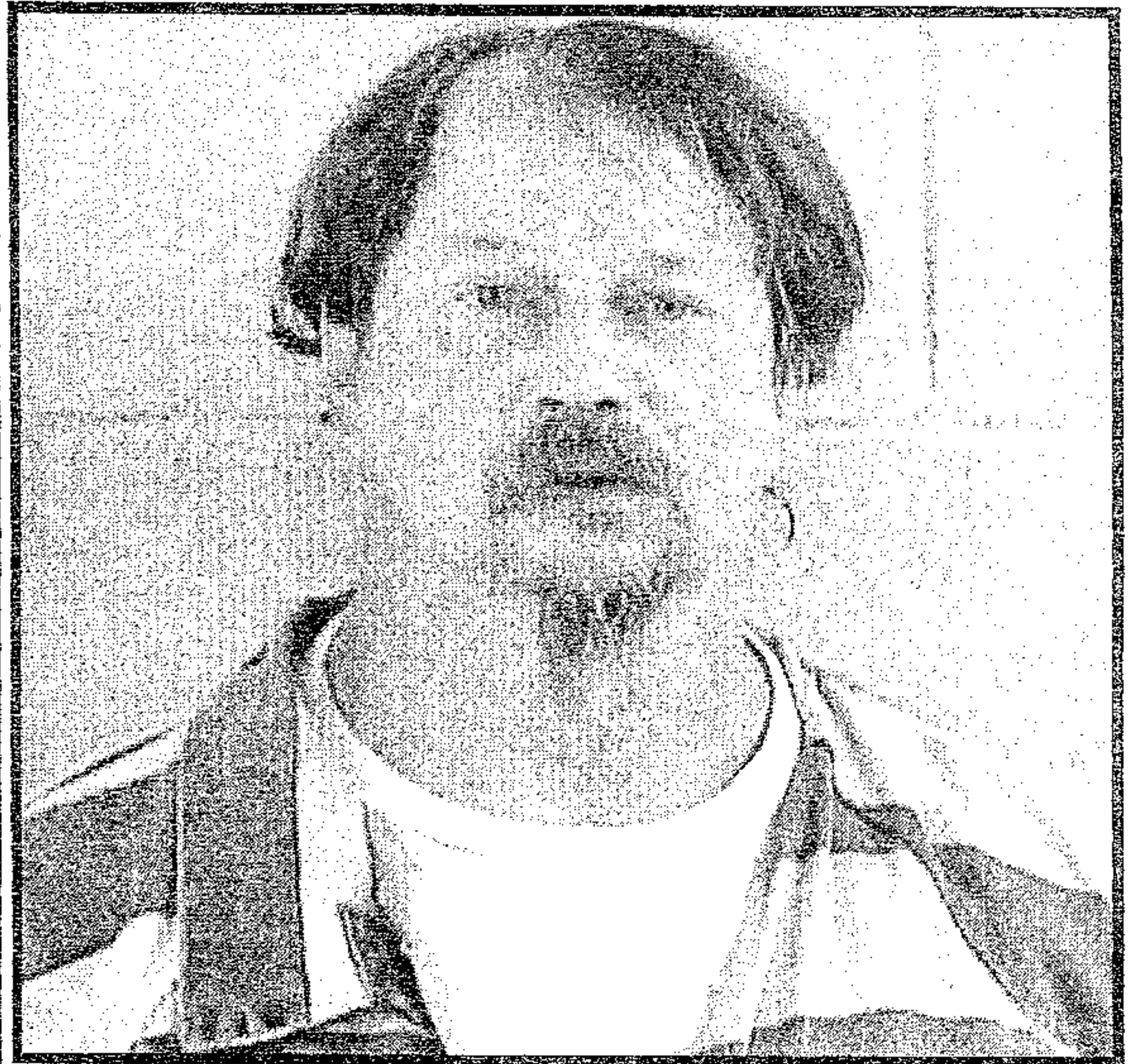

An agreement was made between the victim and Russell to meet. The victim left her residence and walked to a location where Russell met her, driving his 95 Ford F150. The victim got into Russell's truck and was driven to Lenoir City Park.

While at the park Russell and the victim engaged in unlawful unprotected sexual activity. Later that day, the victim's mother was informed

about the offense and she transported the victim to the hospital for examination and treatment. Law enforcement was then contacted to investigate the offense.

On July 20, 2013 Mr. Russell was interviewed and admitted to Detective Condee to the unlawful sexual activity and was taken into custody.

Samuel Paul Russell, 21, of North D Street, Lenoir City, was charged with statutory rape. Detective Kevin Condee, LCPD made the arrest.

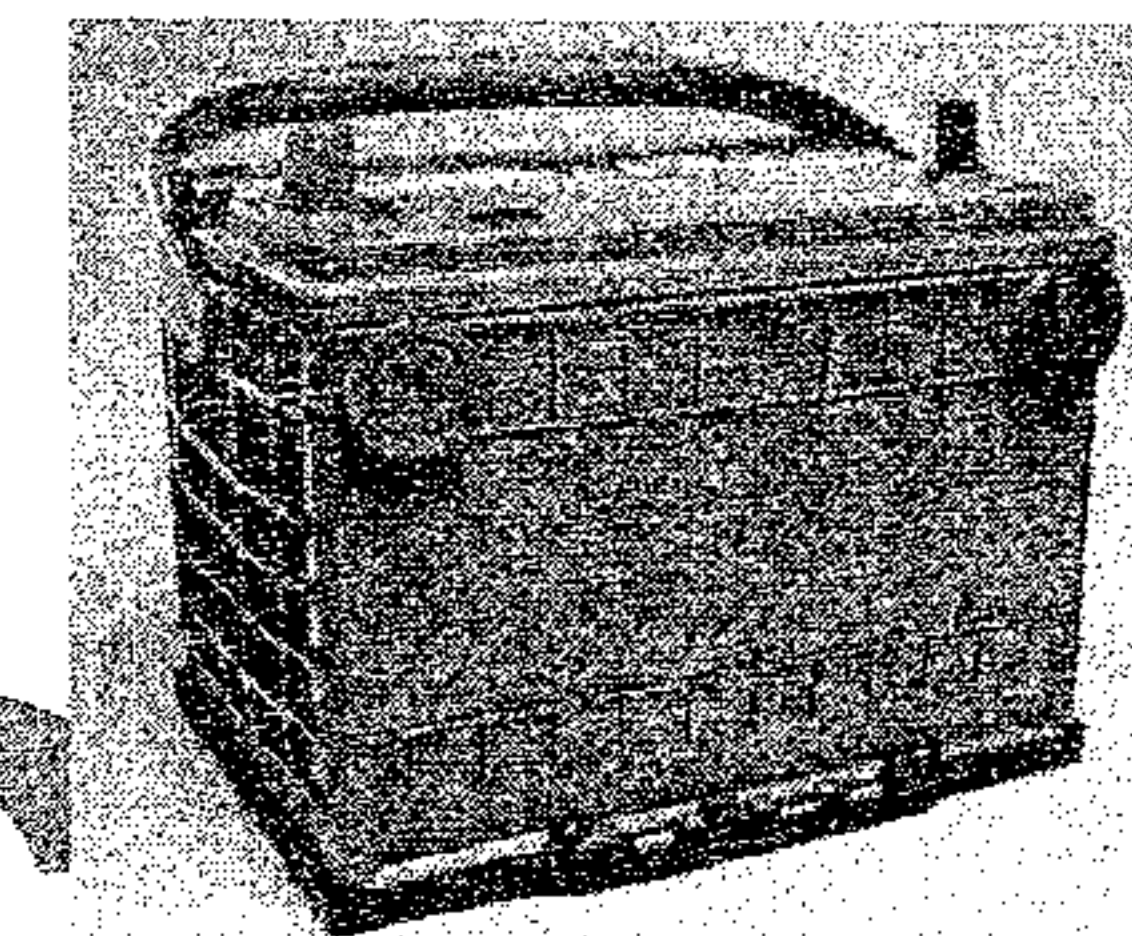

In another warrant, filed by Detective

Kevin Condee, I.CPD on July 21 Rodney Vite was in possession of \$410 in counterfeit US currency. Furthermore, Mr. Vite possessed the
