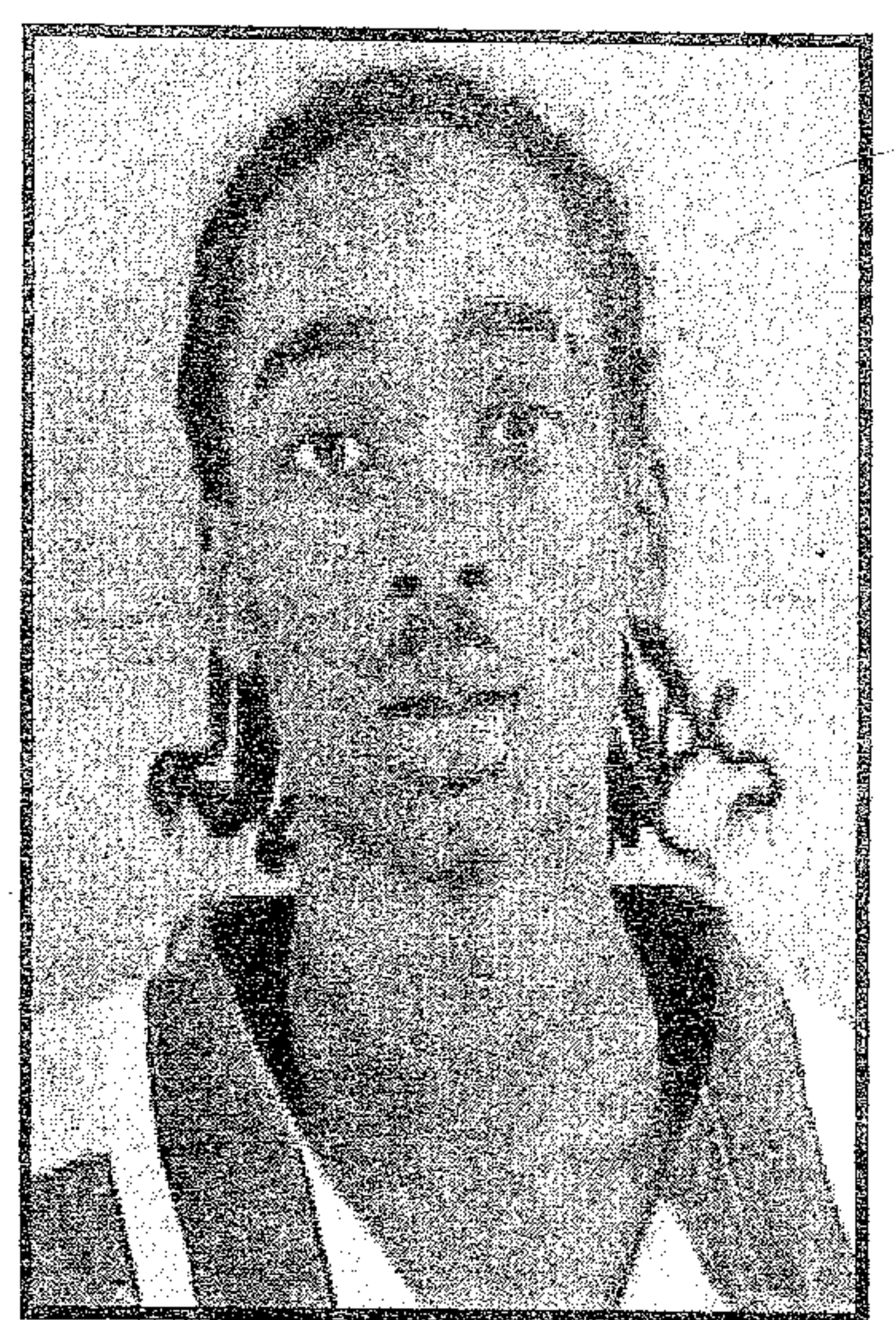

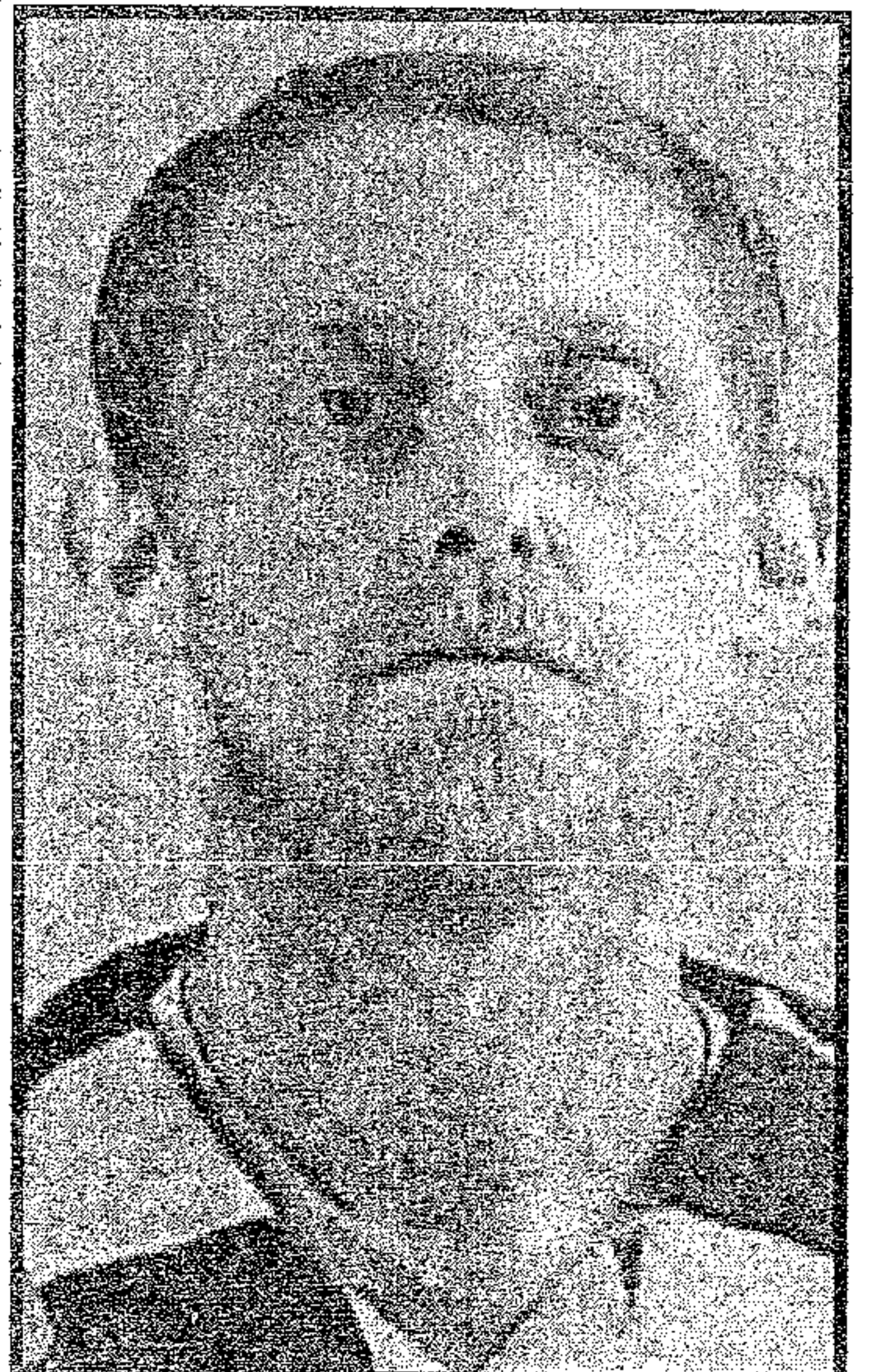

Theft

According to records, Officer K. Sennett, LCPD, stopped Mr. Zamudio driving a green Cadillac on G Street Monday for driving on suspended license. It was discovered Mr. Zamudio also had a warrant for theft. According to the affidavit, filed by De-

tective Kevin Condee, LCPD, a Lenoir City woman reported she picked up Mr. Zamudio on June 19th, 2013, and gave him a ride to the Justice Center. She stated on the way she stopped at the EZ Stop on West Broadway and left him in the vehicle along with her purse while she went into the store. Later that evening the woman discovered \$200 was missing from her purse. She contacted Zamudio to inquire about the missing money, to which he replied he got everything he

needed from her and wasn't saying anything. According to the victim, Zamudio continued to call and harrass her and told her he was not paying the money back.

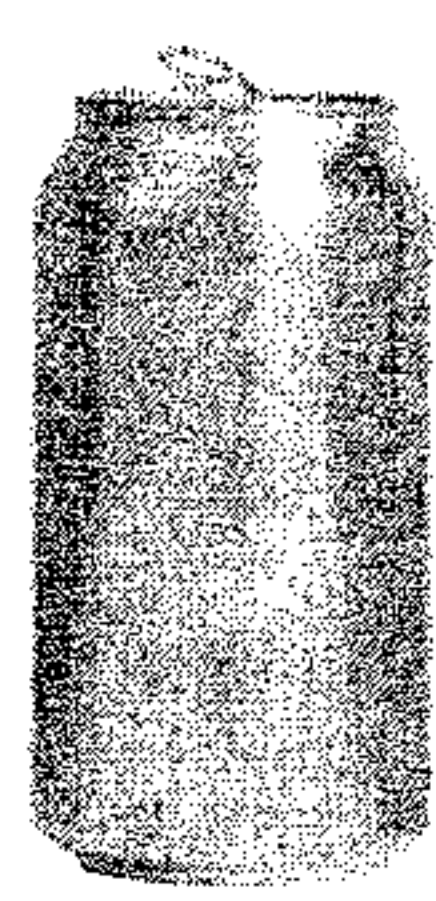

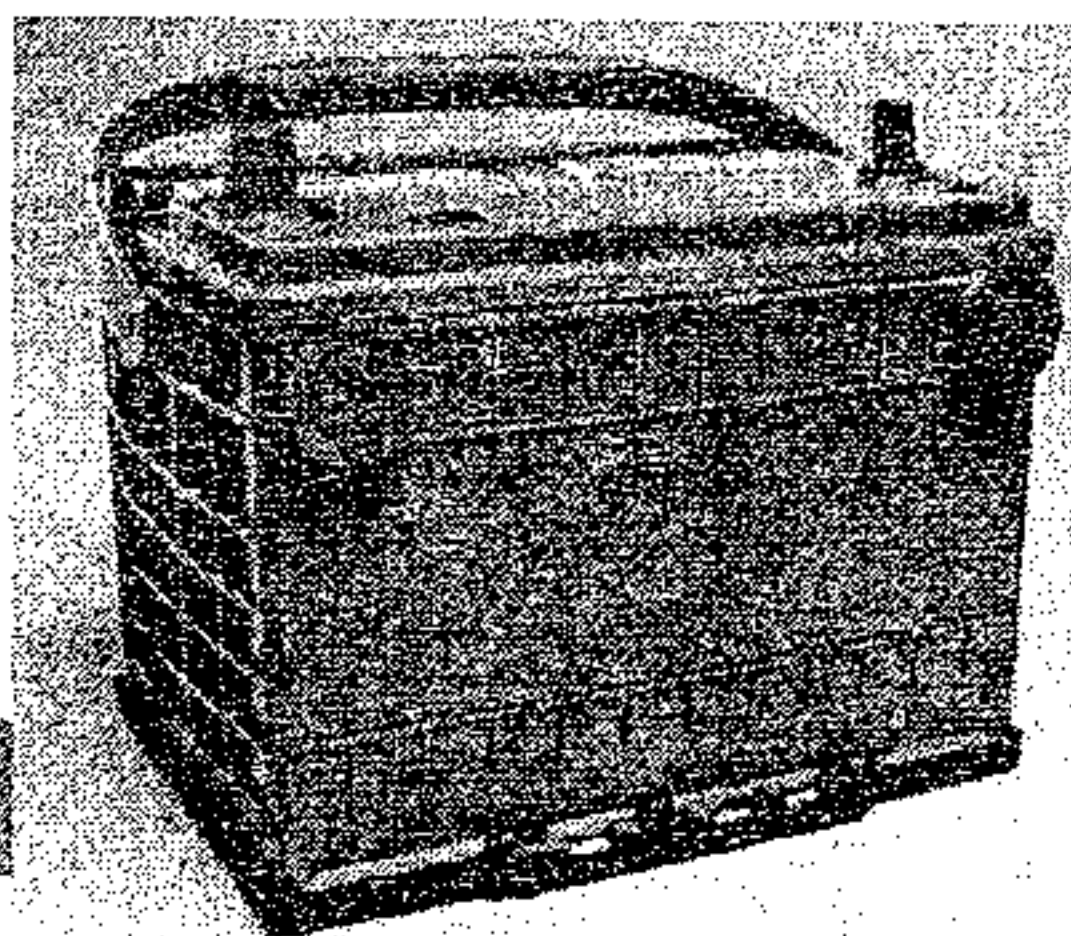

Police beat

According to the report, Deputy John Bearden and Deputy Brandon Burley, LCSO observed a gray vehicle run off the roadway on hwy 70 into the ditch and was driving in the middle of the roadway and stopped it.

Stolen Gun

Four Georgia persons found themselves behind bars Sunday after two of them were involved in a physical domestic inside a vehicle that was traveling along I-75 and when located by officials a stolen gun and an infant seated between the combatants were also found.

Darryl R. Taylor Jr., 19; Shabria Lynn Pennyman, 19; Brandy Nicole Hull, 20; and Kevin C. Brown, 19, all of Knotty Pines Place, Hampton, Georgia were all charged with unlawful possession of a firearm, felony reckless endangerment, possession of stolen property.

According to records, Deputy Chris Hutchens, LCSO responded to the Exit 68 on-ramp on I-75 south to look for a blue Chevy Cobalt that had two people fighting in it and upon locating it; he initi-

ated a traffic stop about a half-mile south of the onramp. A black female later identified as Shabria Pennyman got out of the vehicle without a shirt on and went back to the police unit.

The officer reported Pennyman confirmed she had been the person who had called 911 and dispatch advised she had called several times, with fighting heard in the background, but the calls kept being disconnected.

Pennyman reportedly advised she and her boyfriend, Darryl Taylor, who also is the father of her six months old infant, had been in a physical fight and he grabbed her hair, and then began striking her. Pennyman said when she attempted to call 911, Taylor continually took the phone away from her and hung it up.

Records indicate the Cobalt

was stopped at one point and passersby called in stating they could see Taylor trying to remove Pennyman from the vehicle.

The driver and owner of the vehicle, Brandy Hull, confirmed the incident as described by Pennyman, but passenger Kevin Brown said he was asleep and only heard arguing, while Taylor himself advised he did grab and pull Pennyman, pulled her hair and took the phone away from her. He was arrested.

The lawman went on to report Pennyman's and Taylor's infant child was in the vehicle between the fighting and all the adults said they were returning to Georgia from Michigan and they seemed nervous.

LCPD Officer Keith Sinner and K9 Dagger arrived on the scene and the K9 officer performed a sniff on the

vehicle and alerted. A search of the vehicle resulted in the discovery of two handguns. A loaded .22 caliber revolver was found inside a cooler in the back passenger side floorboard and a loaded .45 Browning was found in a duffle bag in the trunk. When the officers learned the Browning had reported stolen from a location in Marietta, Georgia, the remaining three passengers were detained.

After having been advised of their rights, both men invoked their rights while both waived theirs, stating they didn't know anything about the stolen pistol. All four adults were taken into custody and transported to jail and the infant was released into DCS custody.
