Deputy located the black vehicle and observed said vehicle cross completely over the right side fog line several times, and before the Deputy could make a traffic stop on the vehicle, the vehicle in question ran off into the emergency lane 10 times.

The deputy activated his lights and siren and vehicle stopped on HWY 411 at Black Rd. The Deputy exited his patrol unit and had to scream at the driver for she was backing up toward patrol car. Driver of the vehicle stopped and put the vehicle in park. Deputy made contact with the driver, identified as Rhondalyn Dunlap, she had extremely slurred and delayed speech and smell of an alcoholic

beverage coming from her person. Deputy asked Ms. Dunlap if she had drank any alcohol or taken any medication this date, and she replied yes that she took her prescription clonazepam and that she had been fired from her job.

The Deputy asked Ms. Dunlap to perform field sobriety tests, she replied she would try. Ms. Dunlap could not perform any field sobriety test given and at that time Deputy advised Ms. Dunlap she was under arrest for DUI and was read the implied consent law and she refused a chemical test. The deputy found an empty bottle of clonazepam in the center console. Enroute to the Loudon Co. Jail Ms. Dunlap became very violent, kicking and

screaming and trying to kick the rear window out of the patrol car and actually broke the rear dome light out with her feet. Ms.

Dunlap also threatened to kill the Deputy if she went back to Federal

Prison. Deputy B. Rayfield LCSO made the arrest.
