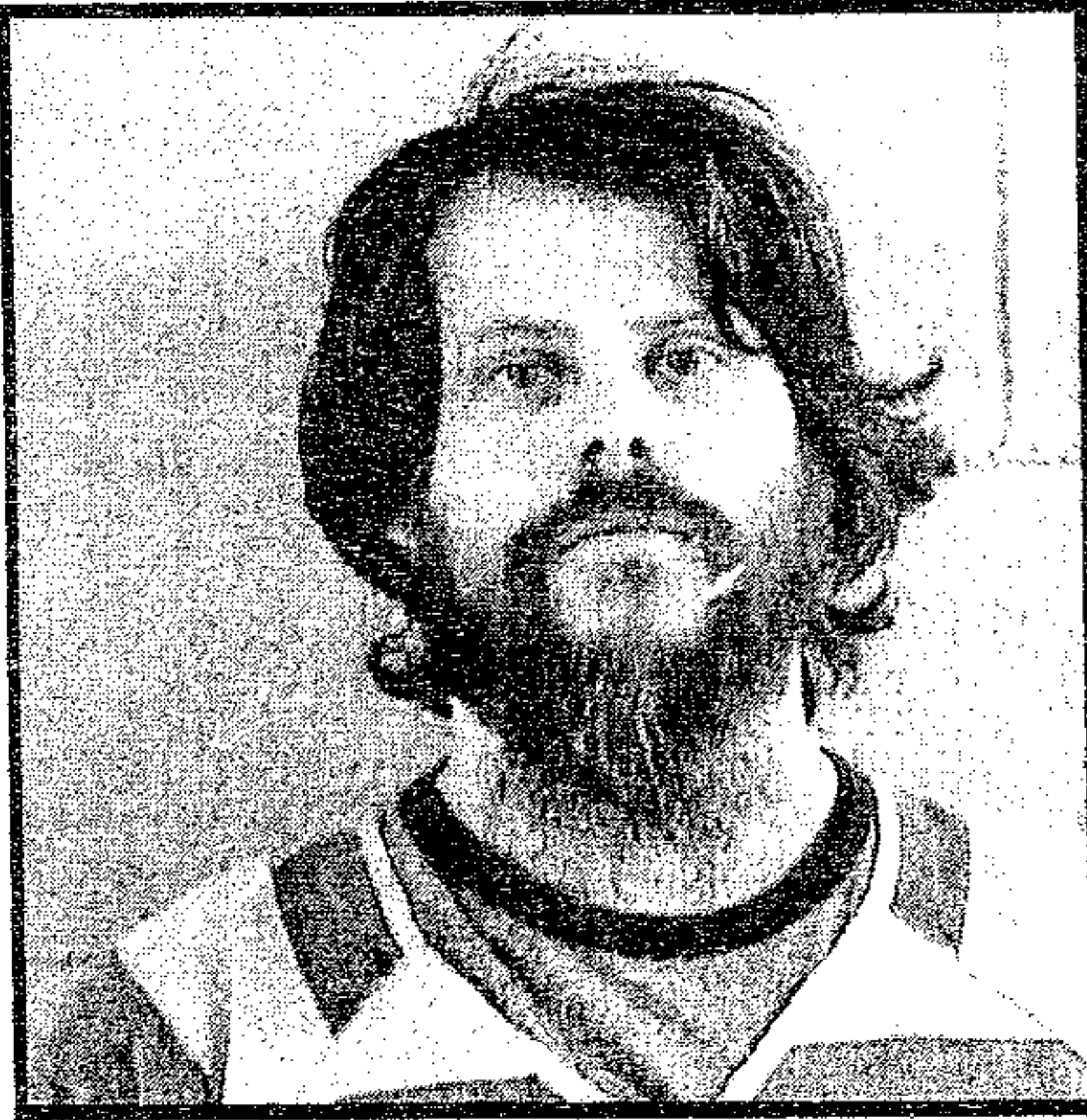

Mr. Thatcher then stated he heard the splash and started talking with the other witnesses and did not see the victim surface. Mr. Thatcher reported

when the victim did not come up the hill he started looking for him and could not find Caywood.

At that time all witnesses stated they did not see the victim go into the water and only Mr. Thatcher stated he watched the victim go

into the water but did not wait to see if he came to the surface.

At that time Detective Charles Cosner, LCSO CID was called to the scene and along with Loudon County Fire and Rescue and the Loudon County Dive Team began an investi-

gation and search.

Deputy Smith further reported he did notice several empty beer

cans at the scene and the family of the victim, Justin Caywood, was notified.




Ashley Claxton, 22 Homeless, was charged with Violation of Probation.
