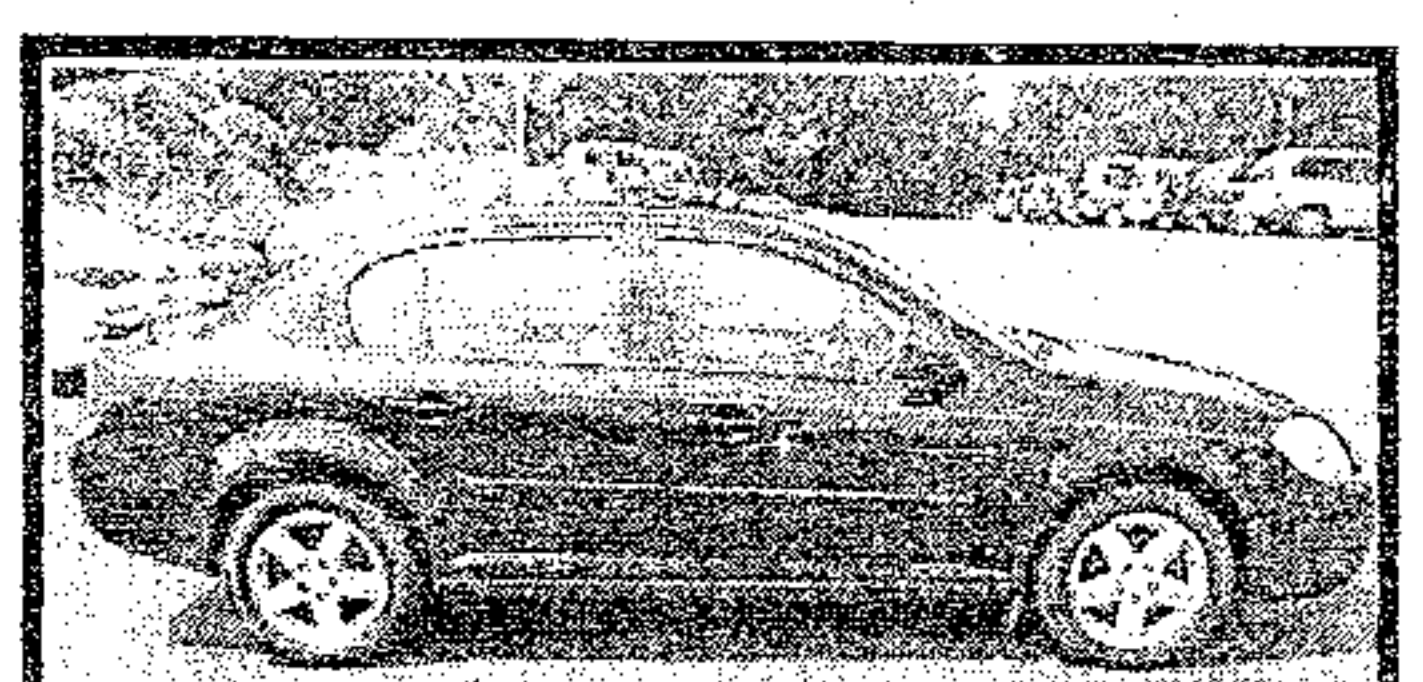
2005 Isuzu Ascender, 79k miles



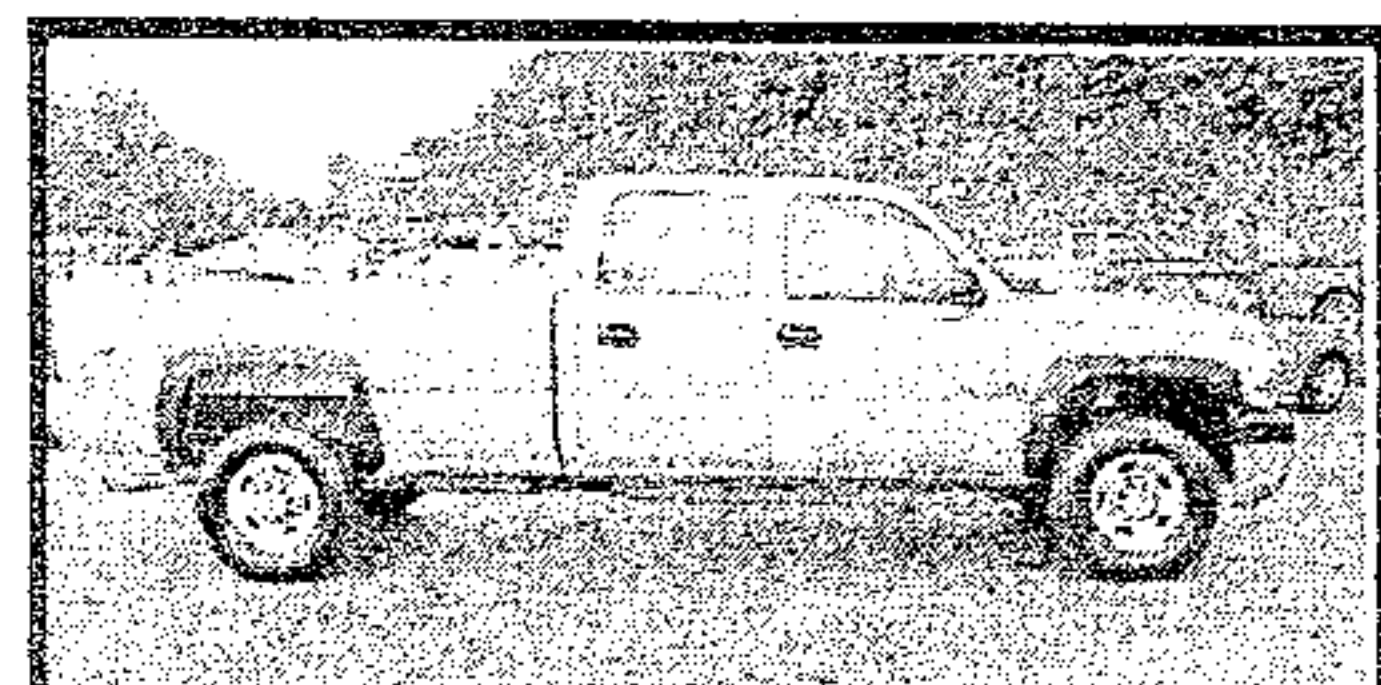
2005 Chevy Colorado 4 Door, 117K miles



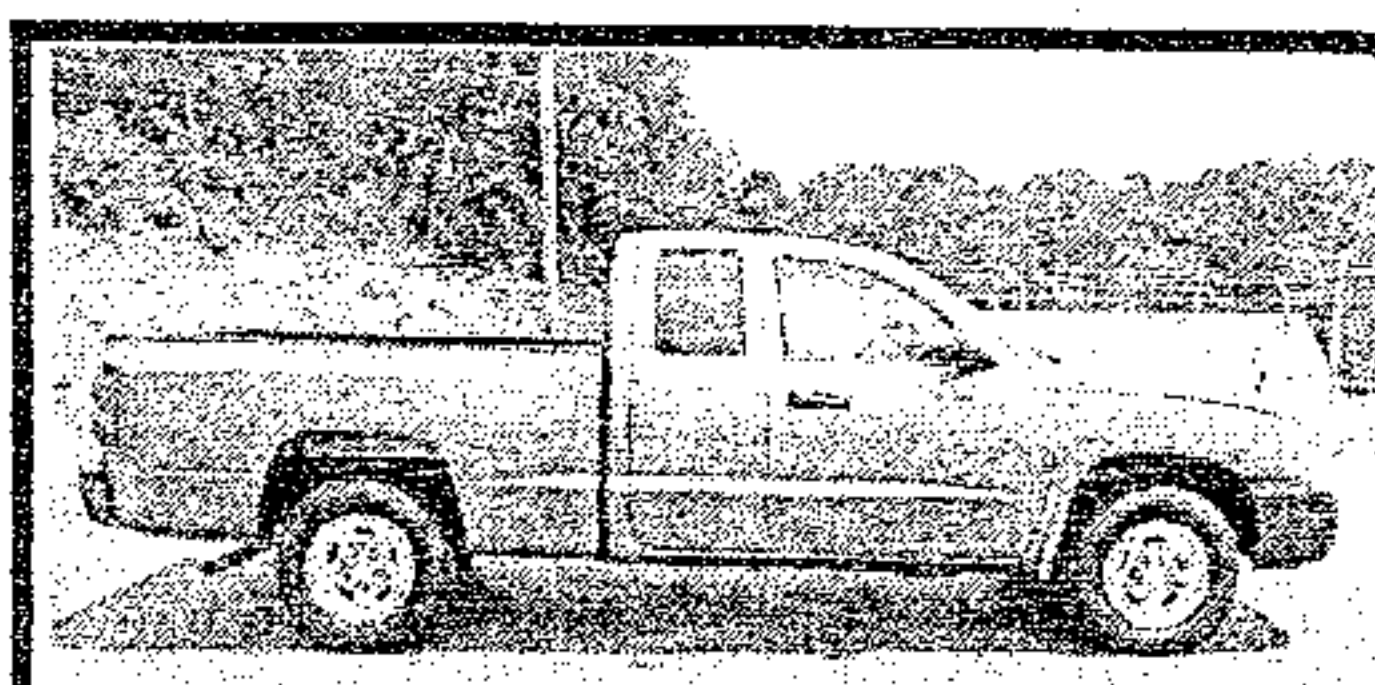
