The enumeration on the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others re-

tained by the people.

However; the ninth amendment comes in to also back up that claim, stating that the right was there all along, and any other

rights we so deem to be there all along are protected even if they are not written down. Got it?


In 1965, a court case in Connecticut was sent to the Supreme Court to be ruled upon using the phrase, right to privacy. Two Justices ruled against this, saying the Constitution does not specifically state a right to Privacy, therefore, it does not exist. However; the ninth amendment tells us that we have that right, even if not explicitly stated in the Bill of Rights. This argument is readily used in cases involving contraception and or homosexual marriage (Lockhart, Andrea (1997). "Griswold v. Connecticut: A Case Brief". Journal of Con-







The arrest today was the result of a joint investigation by the FBI Safe Streets Task Force (SSTF), composed of the FBI, KPD, and KCSO, and the KPD Major Crimes Unit and the Blount County Sheriff's Office.

All defendants are presumed innocent unless or until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

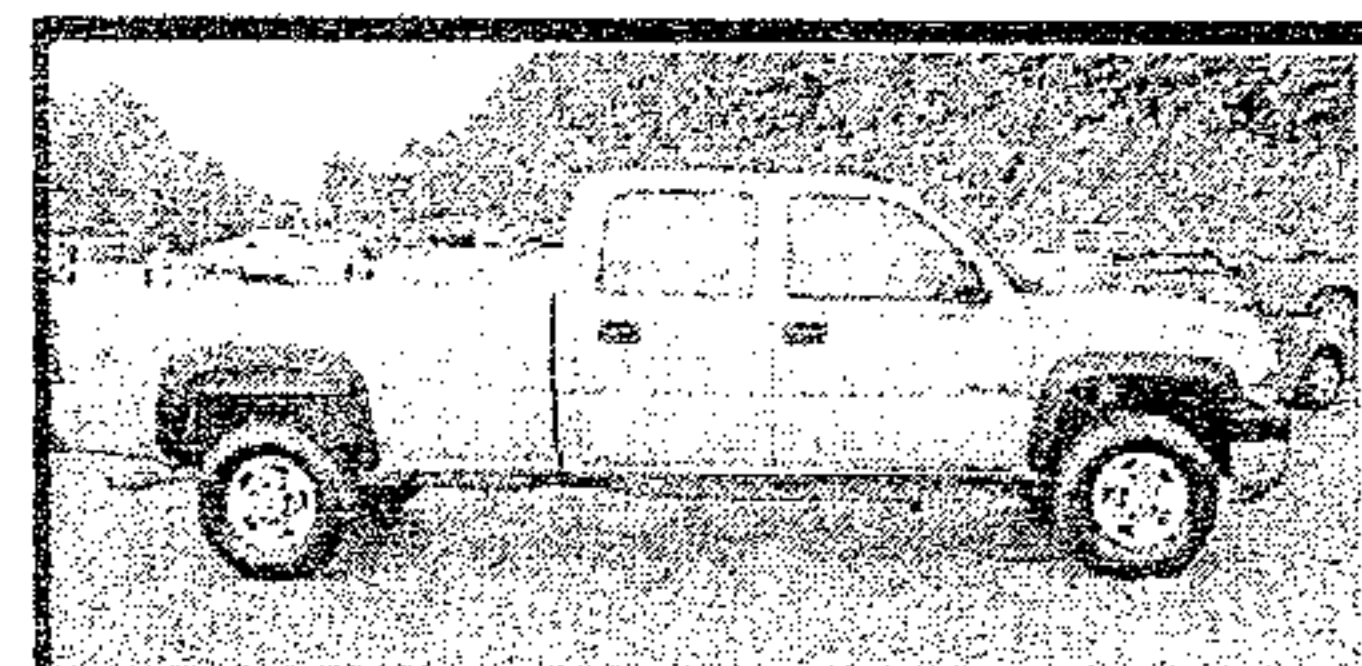
2005 Chevy Colorado 4 Door, 117K miles



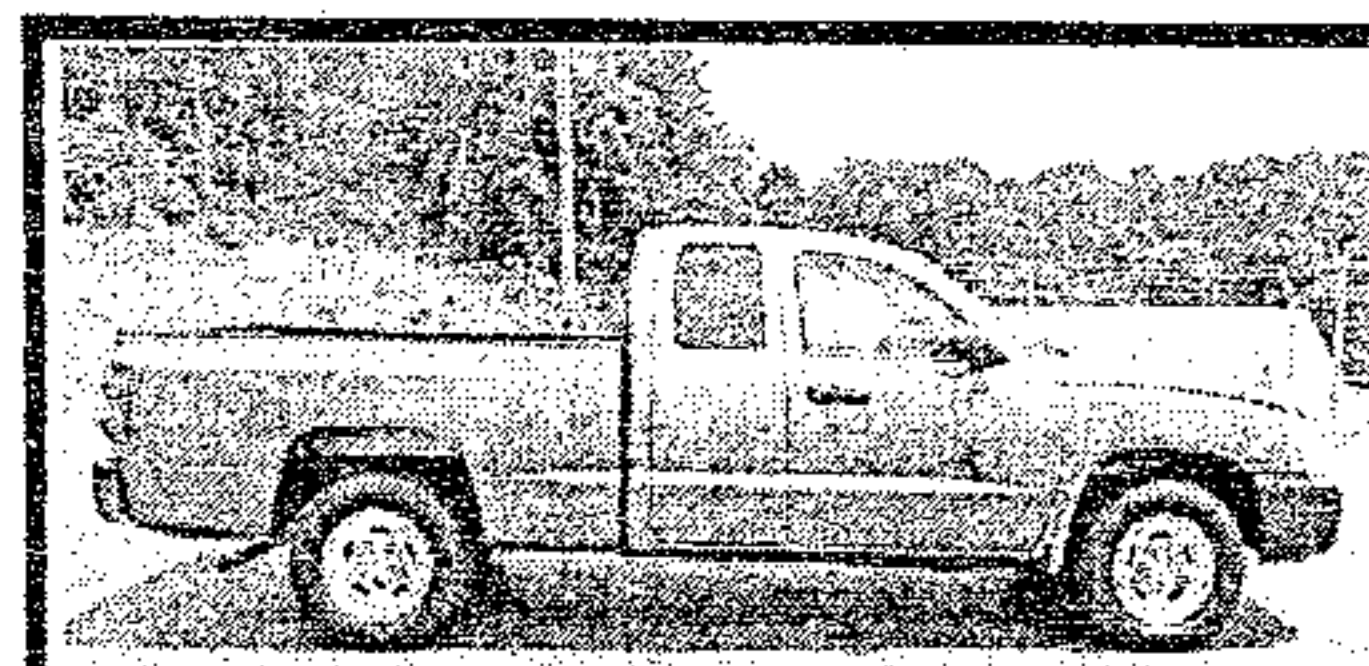

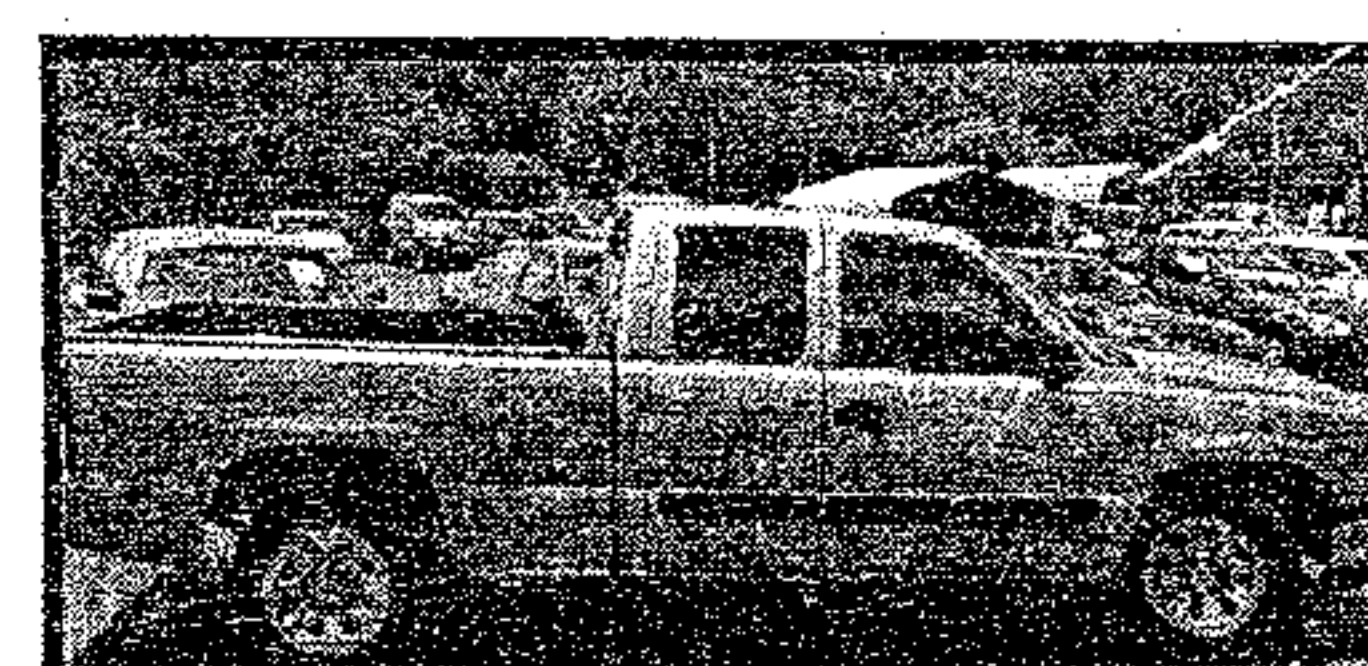
