Reports further state Officers were dispatched to Weigels on HWY321 and HWY 70 for suspicious persons begging for money.

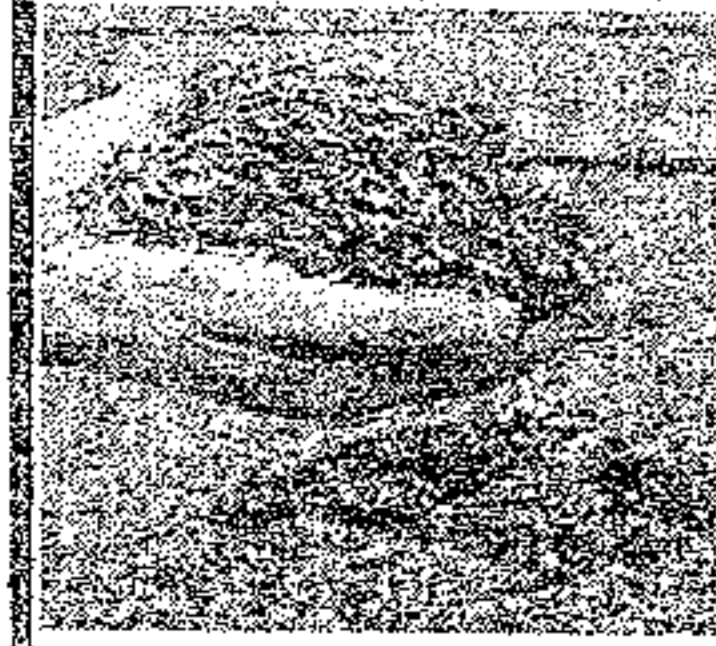

by Officer Sennett. Located in the vehicle was many empty baggies, several needles, and a spoon, also located was a small container which had a small corner baggie tied with a white substance. The defendants stated it was BC powder. The white substance was field tested and tested positive for methamphetamine. Then the defendants stated it wasn't theirs and someone must have swapped the baggy of BC powder for meth. The field weight of the white powder was .08 grams.

Officer Keith Sennett, LCPD made the arrests and filed the charges against the Monroe

County duo.

talk to in depth conversations about the eternity of their souls? How can I best encourage the congregation of Big Sky and allow my life to be a "living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is my reasonable service?"

I have been studying the life of Christ as

written in the gospels and this morning I was reading in the Book of Mark. My reading schedule this morning began in chapter 12 and I had just prayed for Jesus to speak to my heart about this article. I hadn't been reading for two minutes when I came to a conversation that Christ was having with some Jew-

ish scribes who were testing Him. As I read Jesus' reply to their question, it was like the chapter stopped and the answer to today's article and my mission for Christ were both staring me in the face. As you read this passage, see if He speaks to you as well:

Mark 12:28-31 (NKJV) (28) Then one of the scribes came, and having heard them reasoning together, perceiving that He had answered them well, asked Him, "Which is the first commandment of all?" (29) Jesus answered him, "The first of all commandments is: 'Hear O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord

is One. (30) And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' This is the first commandment. (31) And the second, like it, is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."

I felt as though Jesus was asking me the question; does Jeff Vittatoc love the Lord his God with all of his heart, with all of his soul, with

all of his mind and with all of his strength? Do I really love my neighbor as myself?

Unfortunately, I had to answer that I do not. I paused in my study and asked God to forgive me for not being the Christian that He has called me to be. I asked God to change me and to teach me how be that person.

God reminded me this morning that if I will only focus on Him, that He will take care of all the details that have consumed my mind for weeks now. I was reminded that it is not me that has the ability to win Montanans to Jesus; it is He who lives in me! Sometimes I'm so stupid!!

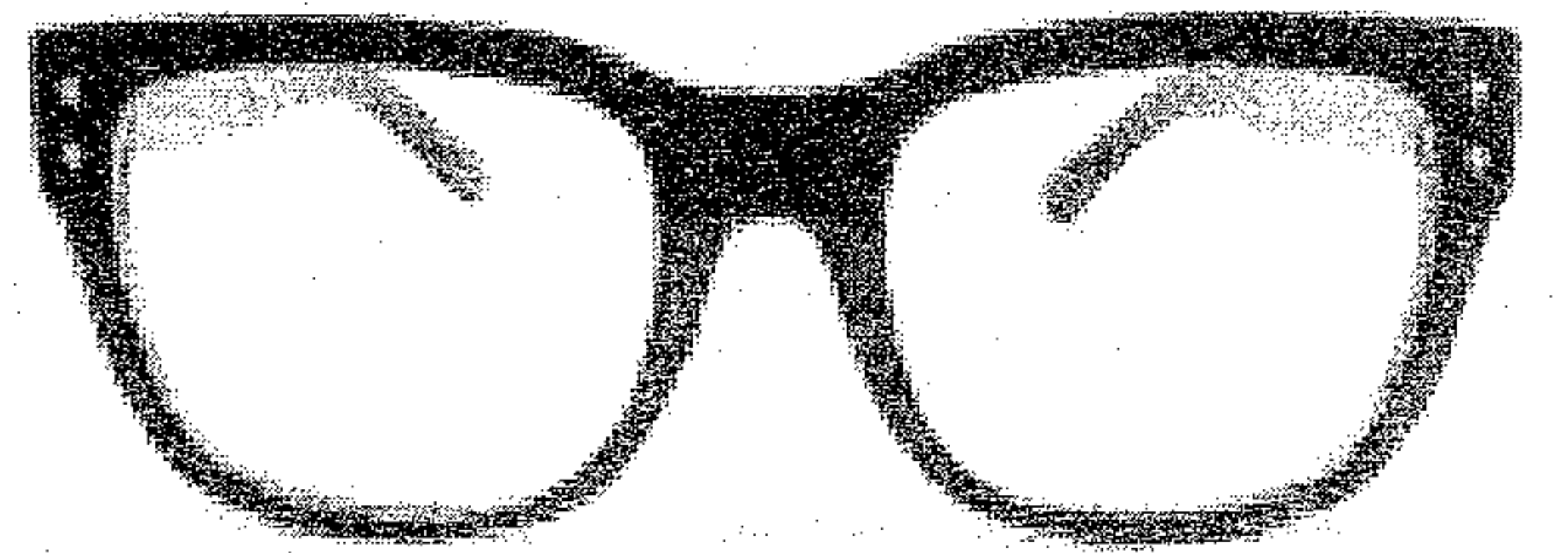
have a valid Driver license, a check through Dispatch showed that

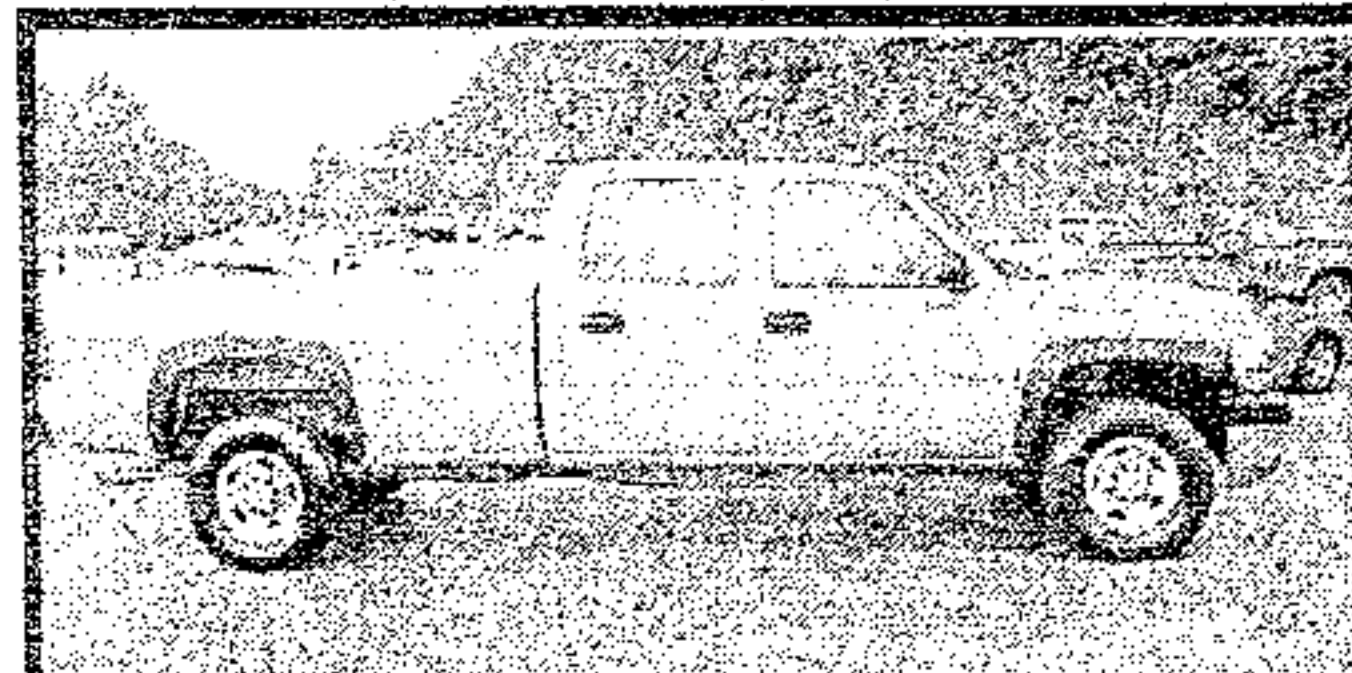

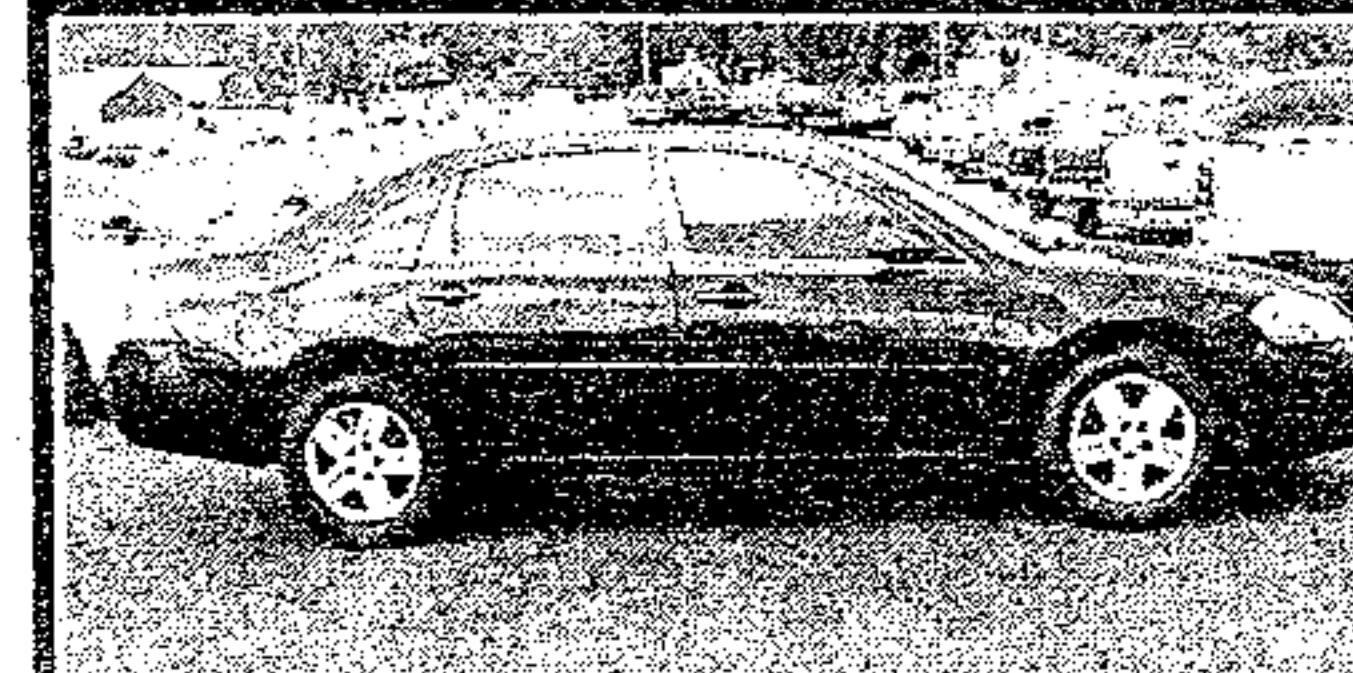

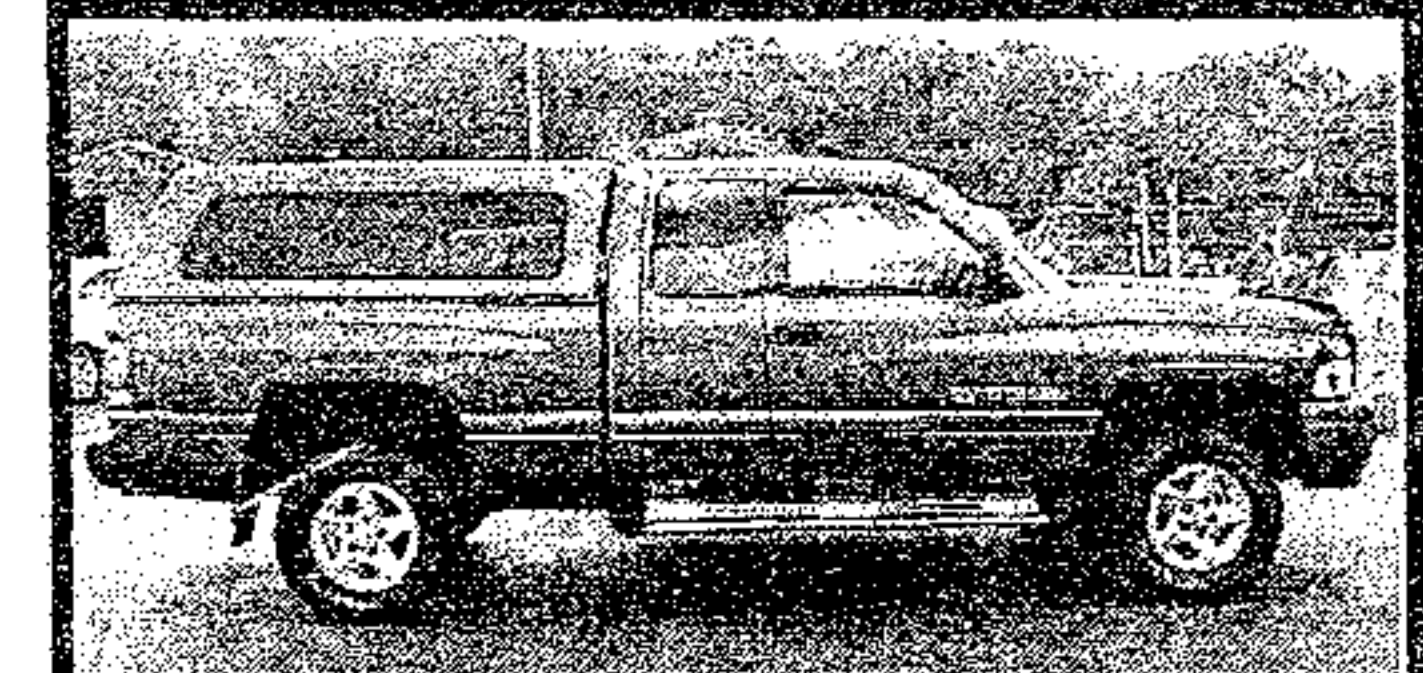
