very intelligent people," said Special Agent Rick Velasquez, who investigated the case from the FBI's Dallas Division. "He was a very believable guy."

From 2006 to 2010, Lucas defrauded more than 250 investors. He claimed to have insider information regarding a Disney resort and theme park planned for a rural area about 50 miles north of Dallas. He was giving investors a chance to buy surrounding land outright, or to purchase options to buy the land near the supposed resort. The 65 investors who purchased options lost every cent they invested—more than \$8 million. Some including investors, Lucas' father and uncle in the family real estate business, purchased land outright, believing

the Disney story.

"There was not one grain of truth in Lucas' presentations," Velasquez said, "but his pitch was very elaborate, and it fooled a lot of people. He duped his own fam-11y."







to the FBI.

Velasquez, who specializes in financial fraud cases, says the scheme went on for so long because Lucas was believable—and also because investors could not resist the temptation of making large returns on their money.

When confronted by investigators about his claims, Lucas falsely blamed the supposed Disney information he received on a man he met at a methadone rehab clinic, who had since died. In 2014, Lucas was indicted by a federal grand jury on seven counts of wire fraud and one count of lying to the FBI.

Last September, after a jury trial in which Lucas maintained his innocence but was found
