On Jan. 19, 2016, Morris Anthony Phillips, 39, of Culver City, Cal., was sentenced by the Honorable J. Ronnie Greer, U.S. District Court Judge, to

serve 144 months in federal prison for his leadership role in an extensive marijuana, oxycodone and money laundering distribution conspiracy centered in the Eastern District of Tennessee and the Western District of Virginia. Phillips was the primary source of supply responsible for the distribution of

hands out of his pockets the man had a handgun. Due to the man's violent past authorities opened fire on the suspect striking him multiple times before he went down. After being struck the man was then transported via EMS to Lifestar who transported the man to UT where he later succumbed to his in-

juries and died.

The man's identity was not released at press time due to contacting his next of kin. The Daily Edition has learned the man is 40 years of age and was the boyfriend of the homeowners daughter. The man is also convicted of first degree murder in Wisconsin and was on parole.

The maps illustrate the House of Representatives and

Senate legislative districts overlaid with school district and school level information. The legislative profile maps are both clickable and searchable. A user can search by legislator, school district, and school name.

The maps include demographic information, accountability and performance, and financial data. Some specific data points include the number and type of schools (e.g., traditional, charter, etc), school designation, average ACT score, per-pupil expenditure by average daily membership, and average classroom teacher salary.

“These maps offer a simple and unique way for General

Assembly members to learn more about the schools in their districts,” Comptroller Justin P. Wilson said. “This interactive map is also useful to any Tennessean who wishes to learn more about public education achievement and spending in our state.”

Higher Education Attainment map, and Mapping Tennessee Education page.





as it becomes available. No law enforcement officials were harmed and no other injuries were reported.

Sheriff Tim Guider stated "knowing the potential danger of the situation the entire detectives division responded as they were trained and I'm glad none of them, nor any of the public around, were injured."

The investigation and case is being handled by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation.

in a Skittles candy bag, re-sealed and placed inside Parsley's suitcase.

Others who have been previously sentenced in this prosecution include Draughn, Parsley, Larry Williams, 68, of Mendota, Va., and Kenny Rus-

sell, 57, of Kingsport, Tenn., who were sentenced to 63 months, 46 months, 140 months and 60 months, in federal prison respectively. Wright is scheduled to be sentenced in February 2016.

"These sentences send a clear message that drug and money laundering violations are serious crimes. IRS Criminal Investigation is proud to work with our law enforcement partners, by providing our financial investigative expertise, to stop the flow of illegal drugs into our communities," stated Tamera Cantu, Acting Special Agent in Charge.
