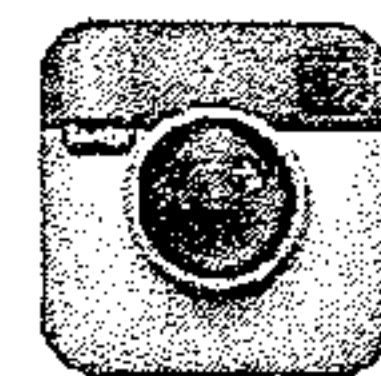

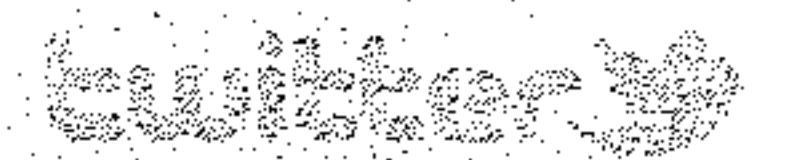



Cody Chastain, 25, Bell Ave. Lenoir City, was charged with Criminal Impersonation, Driving on Revoked License, Evading Arrest x2, and Violation of Community Correction.

Officer Ron Reagan LCPD, responded to the area of 4th avenue and Kingston Street to a complaint of a suspicious person and vehicle. Upon arrival Officer made contact with a white male that could not provide any form of identification and stated his name was Jeremy and he was waiting on another friend.

The male eventually

started the car off and accelerated away from Officer in the car.

Officer located the car at the dead end of 4th ave abandoned in the parking lot of an apartment complex. Through investigation is was determined that the male drivers name is Cody Chastain and that there was an active warrant for his arrest for violation of community corrections and that his driving status in Tennessee was Revoked. Approved teachers are given access to a secure system that enables them to set up classes, create anonymous test keys for their students, and obtain their exam scores. E-mail customer service is also provided.

The website is open to the public year-round. So even if their children's school does not take part, parents can still guide their kids through the online

activities, minus the exam.

Teachers and students have responded positively to FBI-SOS, and the Bureau plans to continue improving the program and encouraging more students to join. For the FBI, preventing crime and keeping kids safe are top priorities.

Burn ban in effect for East TN

From the Loudon County Government, Office of the Mayor

Currently, East Tennessee weather has produced dry conditions with little or no rain fall, temperatures in the 80's, wind and low humidity for several weeks. Counties in our area have varying levels of drought

conditions and these factors have created an increased brush and forest fire risk.

Because of this increased risk, Loudon County Mayor, Roland "Buddy" Bradshaw, in consultation with the state forestry office and TEMA has requested a "Ban on Open Burning" in Loudon County from the state Commissioner of Agriculture. As approved, this ban is effective immediately and will remain in place until further notice.

Until our region receives appreciable rain fall, this increased fire risk will continue and the ban will remain in

effect.

For the safety of all persons, livestock and property, we are asking our citizens to voluntarily comply with this ban.

A violation of this ban is classified by the Tennessee Code Annotated 39-14-306 as "reckless burning" and is a class A misdemeanor with up to a \$2,500 fine.

Jason Walker, 35, Oakdale Street Maryville, was charged with Simple Possession, Poss. of Drug Para., and Driving on Revoked/Suspended License.

Deputy Cody Fritts LCSO, observed a male acting suspicious at the Dollar store in Greenback. The male was walking to a silver dodge neon and stopped when he saw Deputy. The male then walked around the area of the silver dodge neon for approximately

10 minutes but would not get in the vehicle. When Deputy left the parking lot the male then got in the vehicle and pulled off.

Upon running the tag it came back to Jason Walker. Mr. Walker's license was confirmed to be revoked and Deputy confirmed Mr. Walker to be the driver by the picture of his driver license. Mr. Walker pulled on Highway 411 and then immediately pulled into the corner market next to the dollar store when he saw Deputy. Deputy made contact with the driver Jason Walker and he stated he did not have a valid driver license. The passenger was identified.

Mr. Walker hands were shaky and he appeared to be nervous. Deputy asked Mr. Walker if he had anything illegal in the ve-

hicle or on him and he stated no.

Deputy asked Mr. Walker for consent to search his vehicle and he agreed. Upon searching the vehicle 2 syringes and a Tylenol bottle with 3 1/2 Suboxone strips were found under the console cup holder. Mr. Walker was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County jail.

DUI

Jason Wilder, 28, Dogwood Grove Lane Powell, was charged with DUI, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Deputy Jamie Ketter LCSO, observed a 2009 Nissan Altima traveling in the area of 404 Hwy 321 N near Ingles. The vehicle was traveling without headlights and tail lights. Deputy made contact with the driver and identified him as Jason Walder. Mr. Walder was unsteady on his feet and had slurred speech. He also stated that he was watching a man walk up the hill that was "on fire". There was no fire in that area at the time of contact with Mr. Walder. Mr. Walder stated that he was not on any medication.

Dispatch advised the deputy that Mr. Walder's license was revoked for D.U.I. out of Knox County with the action date of 9-28-16 and also Revoked for Financial Responsibility with the action date of 7-6-16. Deputy arrested Mr. Walder for D.O.R. Once we got to

the jail Mr. Walder stated that he would have trouble doing S.F.S.T because he had a bad back. Deputy demonstrated alternative task for Mr. Walder and he stated that he understood. Mr. Walder had trouble doing the finger count, had trouble reciting the alphabet from E-Q and while doing the rhomberg test for he stopped at 15-16 sec. Deputy explained the Tennessee Implied Consent advisement to Mr. Walder and he refused. Mr. Walder also stated the he was taken Methadone and xanax. These above actions did occur in Loudon County, Tn.

daylight hours on Tennessee highways. The average round bale of hay measures seven feet across. The increase in width allows haulers to transport standard round hay bales side by side, increasing the capacity hauled per truck without a special permit. Transporters must have the proper oversize signs and escorts as required by the Tennessee Department of Transportation, and trucks and their drivers must be properly licensed. Maximum weight limits outlined in TCA, Section 55-7-203 remain in effect.

The executive order will expire January 31, 2017.

Agriculture Commissioner Jai Templeton said the governor's decision is an important one for the agricultural community.

"Tennessee farmers have seen their share of weather-related challenges this year," Templeton said. "I thank Governor Haslam for recognizing that farming is a tough but important business. This order will help enable livestock owners to provide the best care possible during this drought."

Tennessee is a major producer of hay, ranking fifth in the nation in 2015, excluding alfalfa. The USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service forecasts that Tennessee farmers will produce 3.96 million tons of hay this year. For more information, visit www.nass.usda.gov/tn.

Haslam Eases Truck Restrictions To Help Farmers During Drought

Executive order eases restrictions on trucks hauling hay

NASHVILLE - With much of Tennessee and the Southeast coping with extreme drought, Tennessee Gov. Bill Haslam has issued an executive order to ease restrictions on trucks hauling hay.

"Agriculture is critical to our state's economy, and rain is a critical ingredient that farmers need to keep their businesses running," Haslam said. "This order will allow haulers to move hay across and through Tennessee efficiently, so farmers can feed their livestock during these drought conditions."

Haslam's executive order increases the height of hay trailer loads to 13 feet, 6 inches and the width to a maximum of 14 feet during
