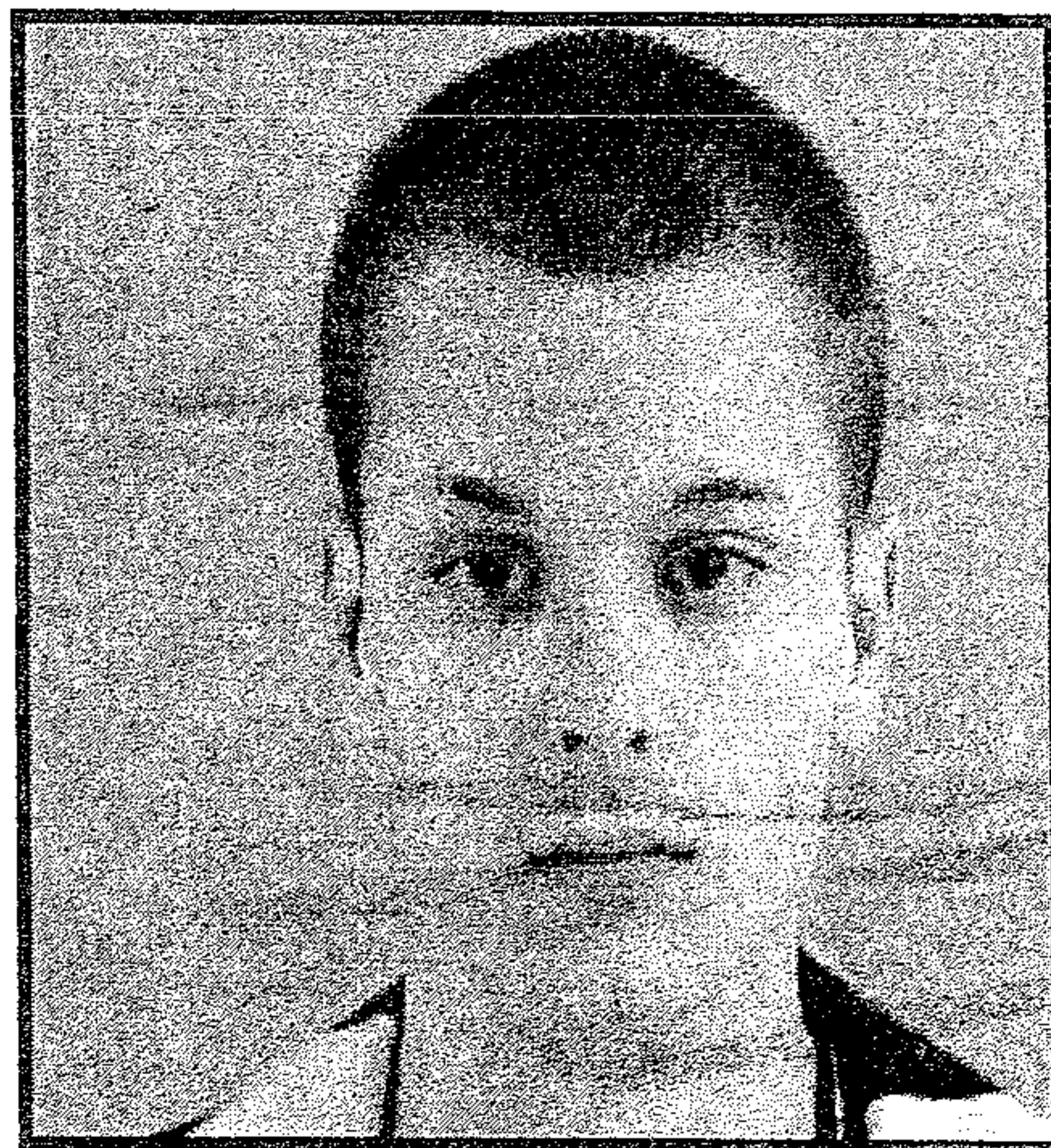
Governor Haslam, Commissioner Boyd Announce State Infrastructure Investment Surrounding St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Shelby County

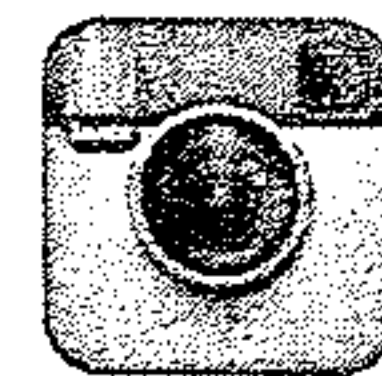

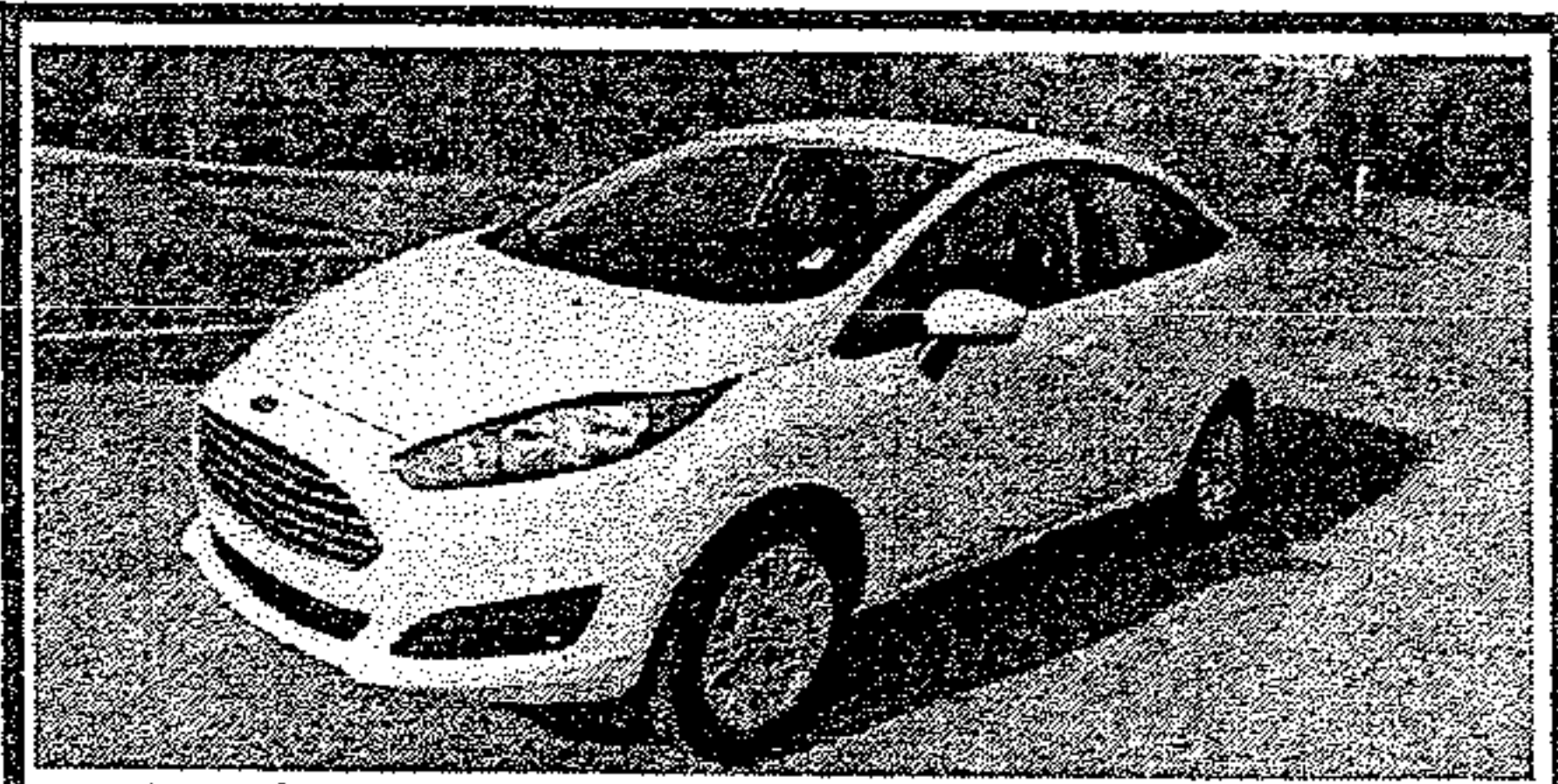

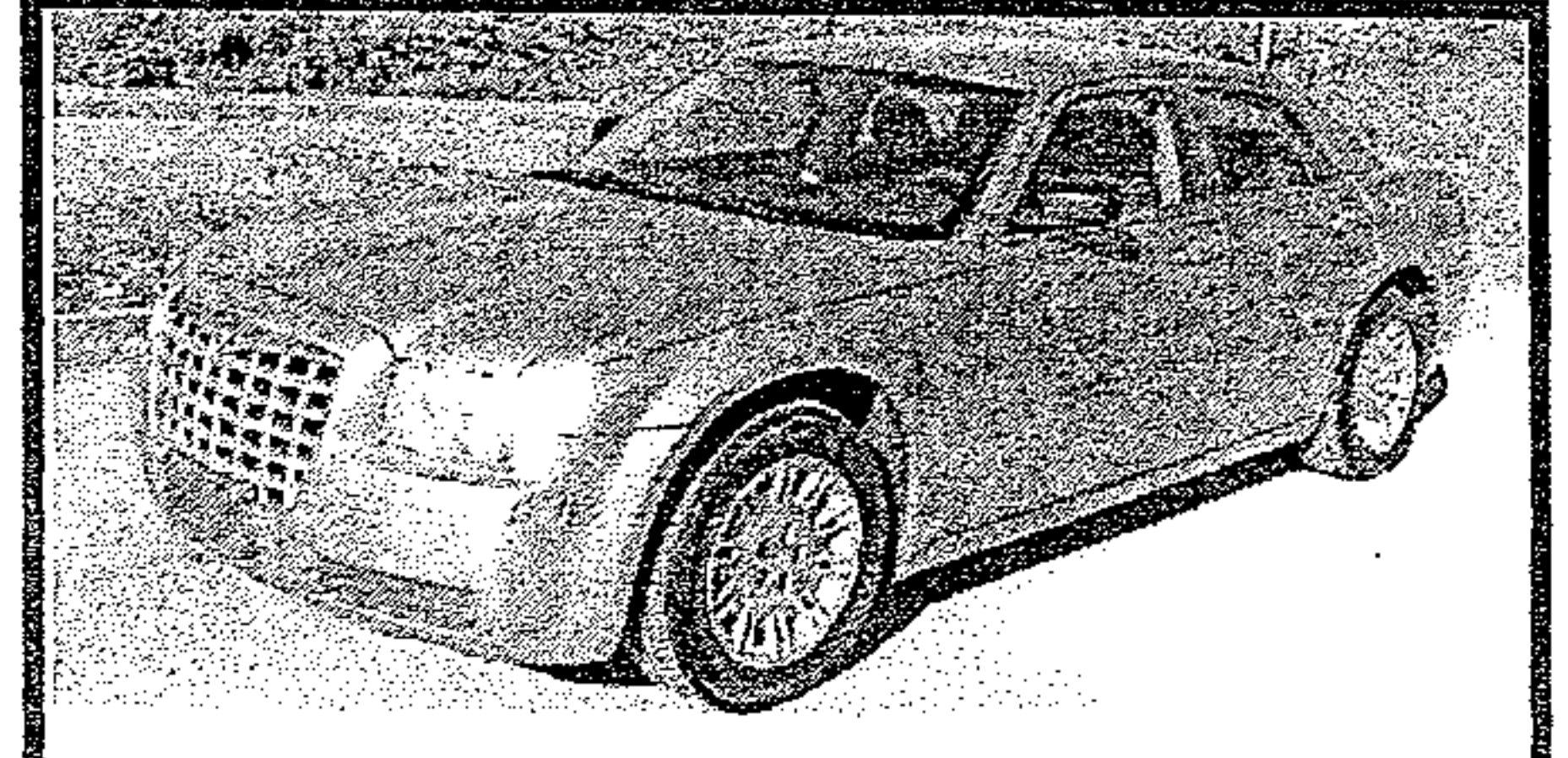

Silvestre Valasquez, 22, Corinth Road Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Deputy Jeremy Garland LCSO, was dispatched to Corinth Rd. in reference to a physical domestic. The victim, reported her boyfriend, Silvestre Valasquez, was hitting her and she had to lock herself in a car in the driveway. She also

stated to dispatch that he attempted to break the windows out of the vehicle and then went back in the house. As Deputy arrived on scene, she was exiting the vehicle, and he came back out and started to approach the victim. Deputy did immediately detain the defendant for the safety of everyone on scene. 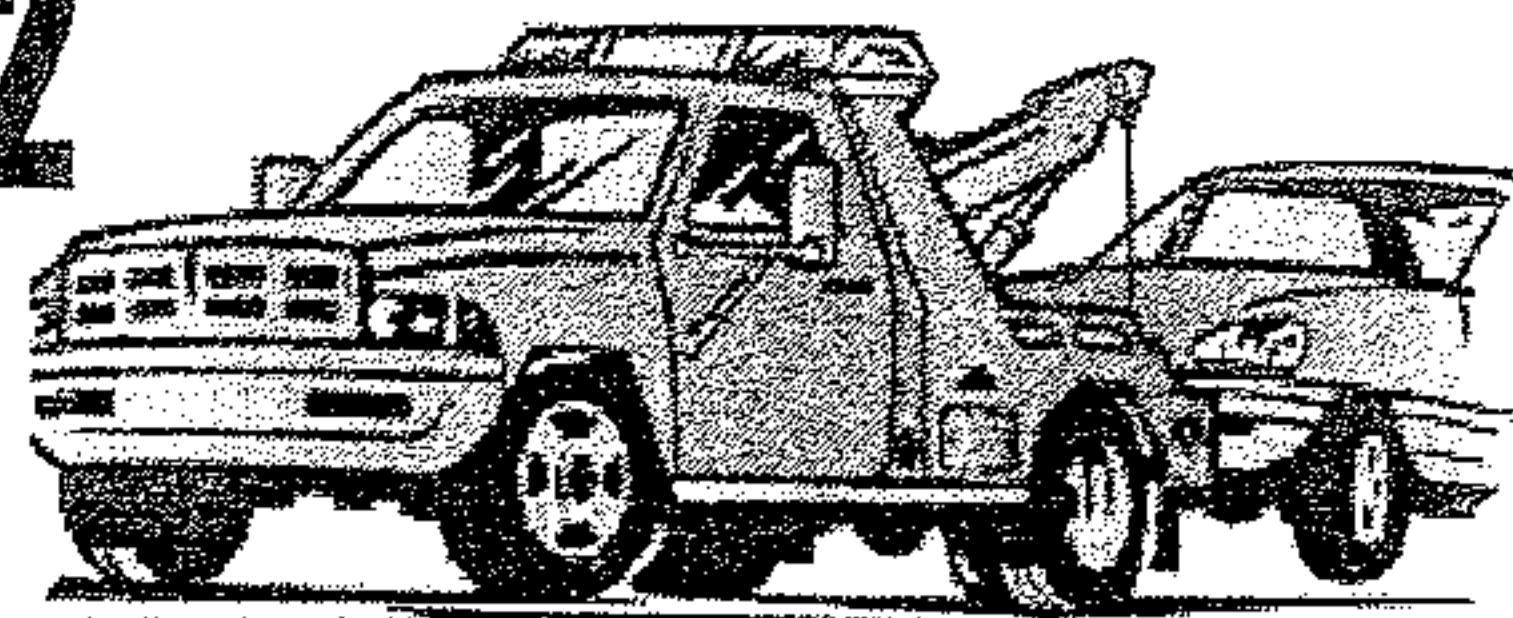
