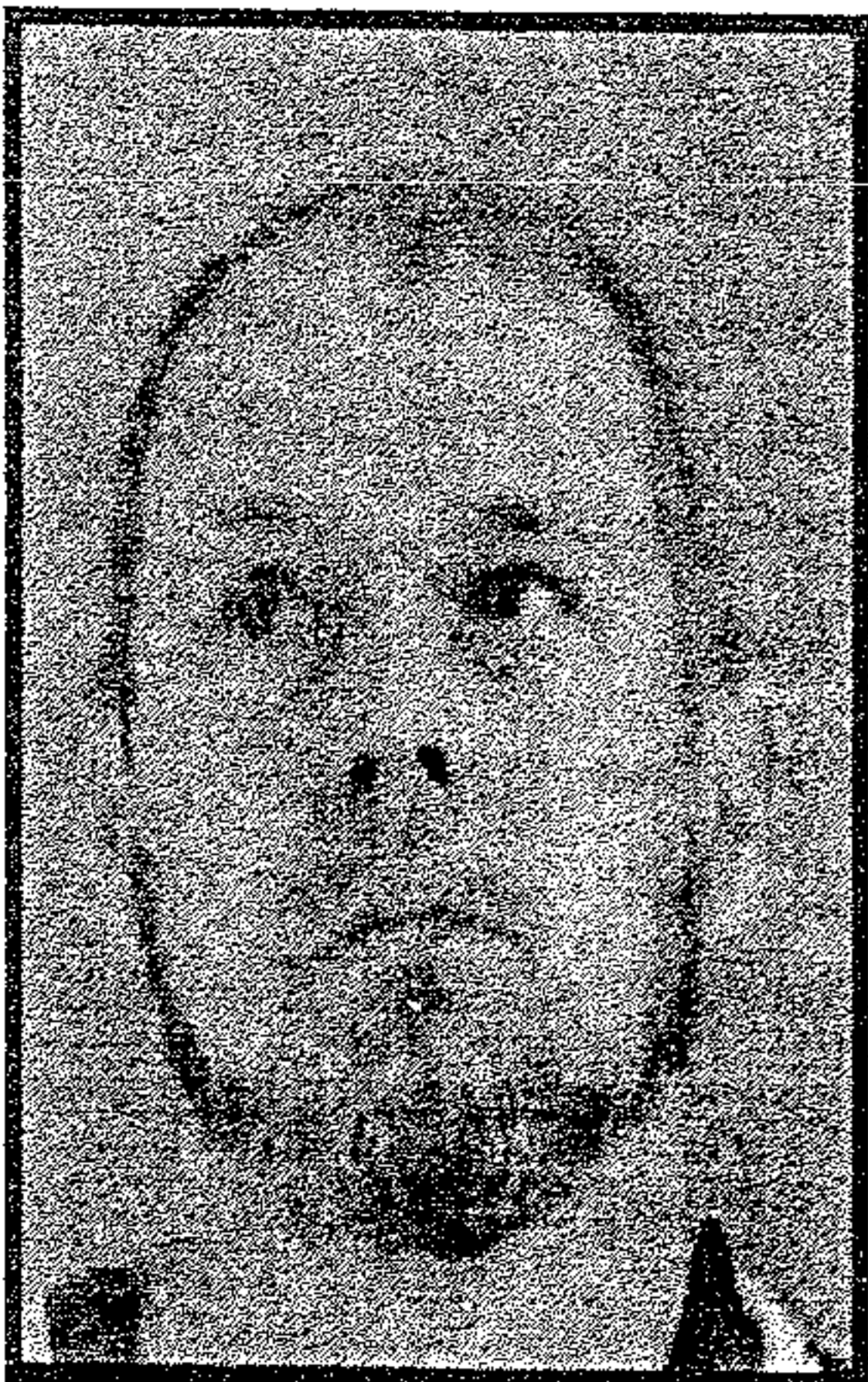
Law Enforcement Focus on Thieves Reaps Numerous Arrests

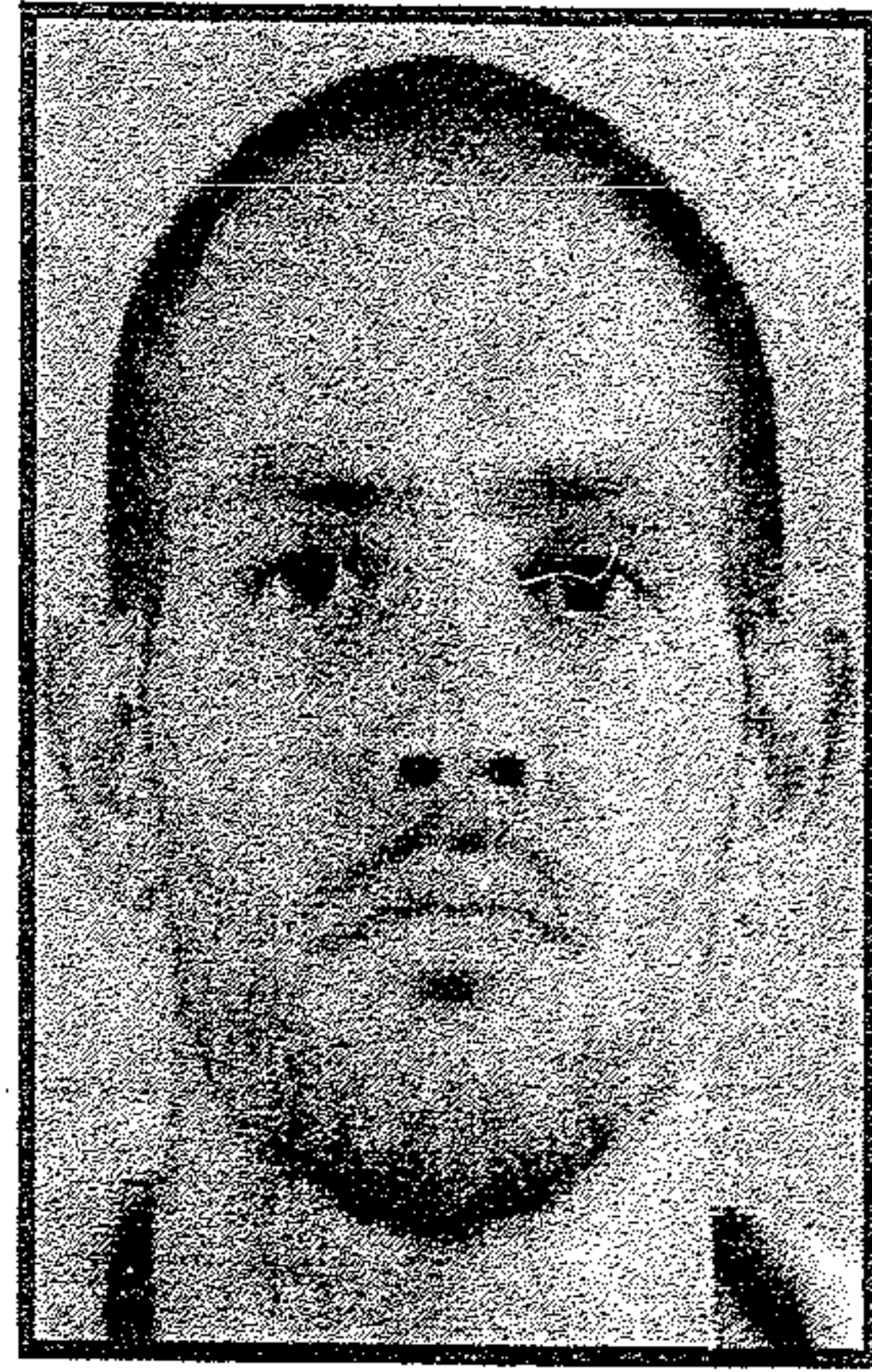

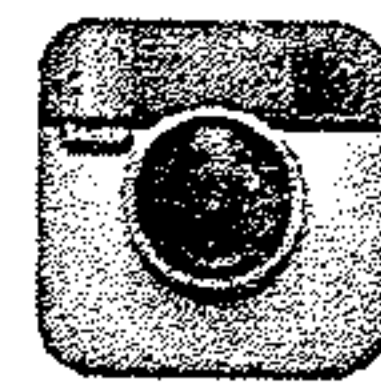

Agents and Officers from these agencies worked for 6 days leading up to the weekend prior to Christmas and successfully arrested 25 individuals for crimes committed inside local stores or in their parking lot. These Agents and Officers recovered over

\$1300.00 dollars in stolen property, approximately 42 grams of methamphetamine and approximately 18 grams of marijuana. Officers and Agents also arrested two individuals with outstanding warrants and located one run-away juvenile.

Trends show that crimes against persons seem to in-

crease around the holidays. The presence of undercover law enforcement blending into the large volume of traffic at retail stores around the holidays help keep our

residents safer by allowing officers to react to crimes in progress at these specific locations.

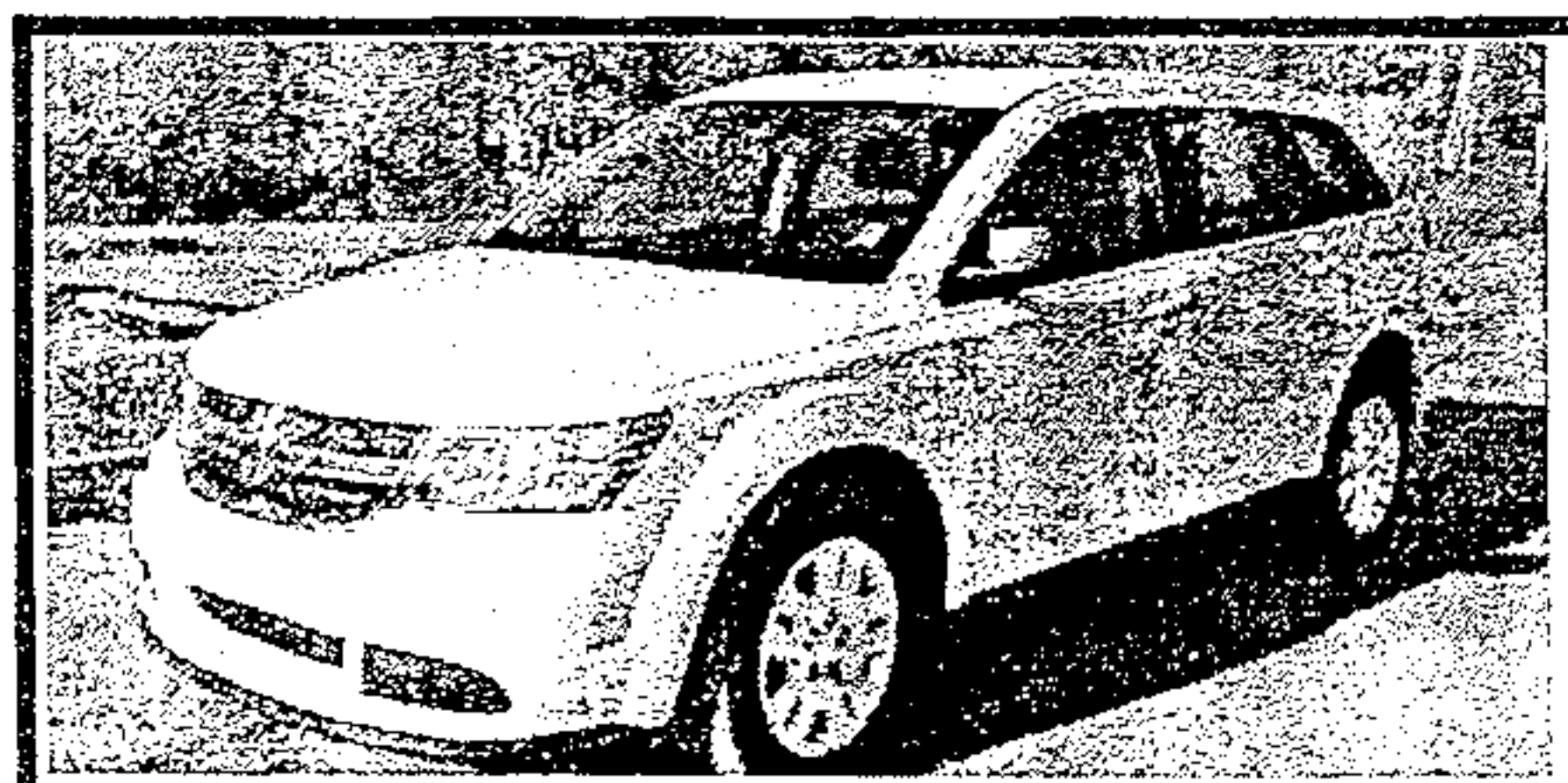

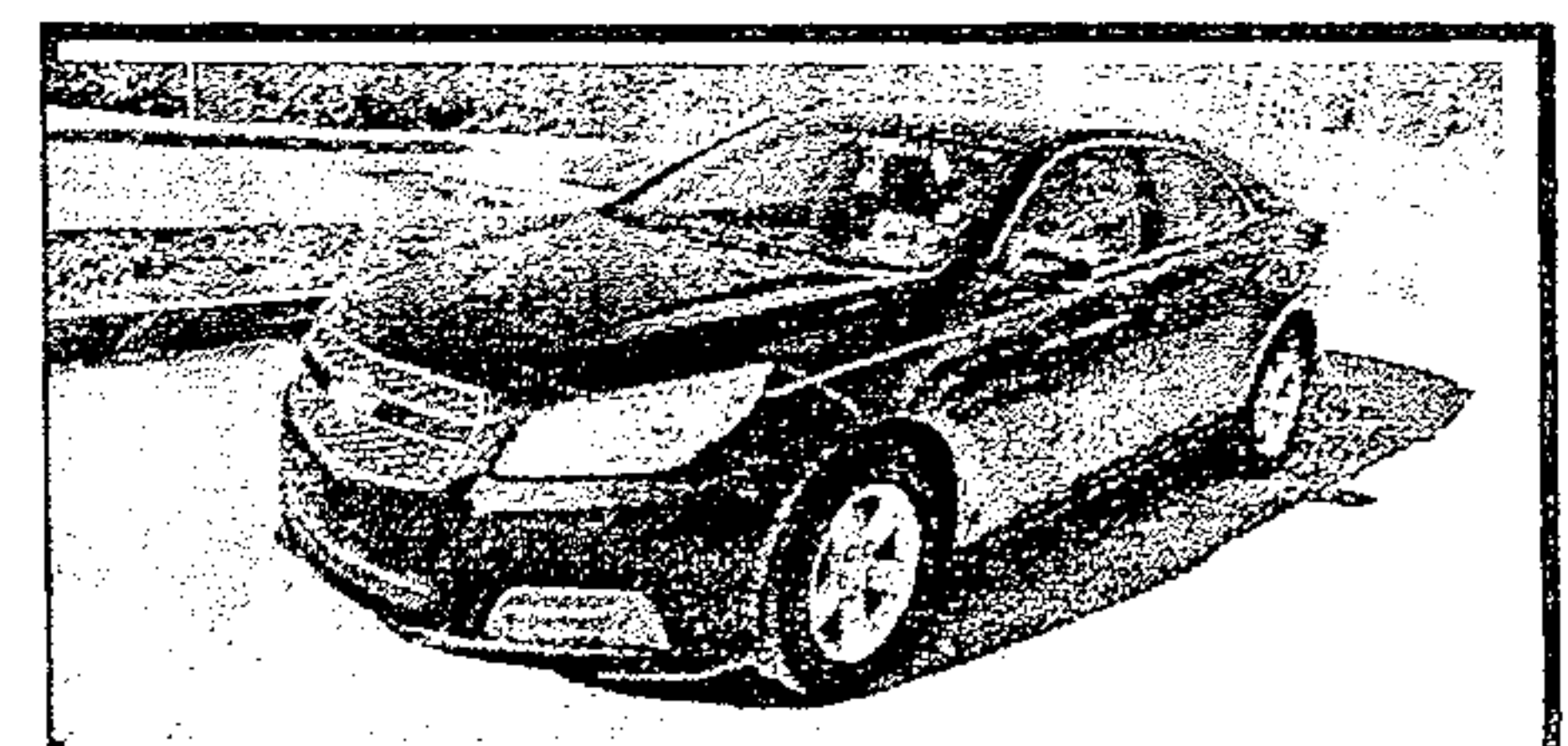

agencies in Loudon County plan to continue this effort during the holiday season in the future and want to make the residents, and visitors of Loudon County to feel comfort knowing that we are there to assist them and keep them safe during the holiday season.

9th

Christopher Carr, 37, Cable Road Maryville, was charged with Theft of Property.

On November 29, 2016, Agents from the 9th Judicial Drug Task Force (JDTF)

made contact with Christopher CARR at Wal-Mart in Lenoir City, Tennessee.

Agent April Farmer did observe CARR to conceal two items on his person and exit the store without paying for the merchandise. Agents approached CARR and spoke with him briefly about the merchandise. CARR consented to a search of the vehicle he had just gotten in. Both of the items CARR was seen shoplifting were located in between the driver and passenger seat of the vehicle. CARR

admitted to having stolen the items and was taken into custody. This occurred in Lenoir City, Tennessee.

Banned

Kayla Michelle Allison, 24, of Steekee Road, Loudon, was charged with criminal trespass, theft of property and driving on revoked license.

Kayla Viars, 26, Pinetop Street Loudon, was charged with Criminal Trespass, and Theft of Property.

On December 2nd 2016 Loss Prevention notified Investigator Jeff Russell (affiant) that two females that was identified as Kayla M Allison and Kayla Viars who both have been permanently banned from all Wal marts for theft of property . Both females who signed agreements to this band Where in side the store and appeared to be hiding items on their persons with intentions of not paying. When I arrived on scene several

other officers from the Loudon county Sheriff office advised me what vehicle Kayla Allison had driven to Walmart and where it was setting. Contact with these two females was made by myself at the Blue Chevy SUV parked on the market side of Wal-Mart as they entered the vehicle. Upon my contact both subjects agreed that they where band from Wal-Mart also when asked if they had taken any items from the store that was not purchased both admitted that they had taken items from the store . Items taken from store but not limited to are two blankets , several types of cosmetic jewelry , four types of under gar-

ments and two shirts for a total amount of 102.68 . Kayla Allison licence was checked by using NCIC and the check showed revoked for failure to pay fines . This did happen in Loudon County Tn.

Bag

Jacob Hicks, 32, Grubb road Lenoir City, was charged with Poss. of Drug Para., Simple Possession, and Criminal Trespass.

On 11/29/2016, Agents from the 9th JDTF made contact with Jacob Hicks at Wal-Mart in Lenoir City. Hicks was identified as a person acting suspiciously inside Wal-mart by Agent April Farmer. Agent Farmer observed HICKS drop a bag while he was checking out at the store. Agent Farmer retrieved the item that HICKS dropped and it contained a crystal like substance. This substance tested positive for the presence

of methamphetamine. Agents made contact with HICKS in the parking lot and also recovered a syringe in a backpack located in the vehicle he was oc-

cupying. HICKS admitted to possessing the needle and the methamphetamine. The methamphetamine recovered was less than 1/2 gram. HICKS was also found to be trespassed from

Wal-Mart previously. HICKS was arrested and charged with Simple Possession, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and Criminal Trespass. This occurred in Loudon County.

Meth Azucena Terrasaz, 27, Poplar Avenue Sweetwater, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II & VI, Poss. of Drug Para., and Driving without a License.

On 11/29/2016 Agents with the 9th DTF observed a female that we were familiar with, due to recent interactions, at Wal-Mart in Lenoir City.

Agents were aware that she did not have a driver's license and observed her get into a GMC Yukon and drive away from Wal-Mart. Agents conducted a traffic stop for no drivers license and identified the driver Azucena Terrasaz. Terrasaz was detained due to her drivers status and uncooperative.

A Lenoir City Police Officer deployed a drug detection dog on the vehicle and the officer stated that his dog gave a positive alert to the presence of narcotics. A search was performed on the vehicle and a backpack in the back seat of the vehicle was found to contain approximately 35 grams of suspected methamphetamine, approximately 15.2 grams of marijuana and digital scales.

Agents also located a large zip-loc bag containing numerous small bags for drug distribution that also contained small amounts of methamphetamine. TERRASAZ is seen on video carrying this bag into the store and in possession of this bag when she entered the vehicle just prior to this encounter with law enforcement. A passenger in the back seat of the vehicle was 16 years old and found to be in possession of a methamphetamine pipe. This incident occurred in Loudon County.

They came with drugs!

Derek Littleton, 36, Tinnel Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Jeremiah Downs, 39, Gateway Circle Loudon, was charged with Man/Sell/Poss. of Controlled Substance.

Agent DeBoer of the 9th JDTF observed a vehicle in the parking lot of Wal-mart occu-

cated a bag containing methamphetamine on Jeremiah Downs. This bag was contained inside another bag and weighed approximately 1.3 grams. The back seat passenger, Derek Littleton was approached by your Affiant and was bleeding from the arm where it appeared he had attempted to inject, or had recently injected himself with a needle. The owner of the car was also present and

to LITTLETON was a plastic baggie containing a small amount of methamphetamine, less than 1/4 of a gram. Both LITTLETON and DOWNS were arrested and transported to the Loudon County Jail. This incident occurred in Loudon County.

Under \$40 gets a trip to jail

Gregory White, 40, Dogwood Valley Road Kingston, was charged with Theft of Property.

Investigator Marty Stanley LCSO, was advised by LPD Officer April Farmer that a white male wearing a black ball cap and black jacket was observed in Wal-Mart in Lenoir City concealing property on his person. Deputy observed the male walk out of the market doors and approach a vehicle in the parking lot. Inv. Shane Ezell and Inv. Stanley made contact with the male and identified him as Gregory Gilbert White. Mr. White was asked if he had anything on his person and a weapons pat down was performed. During the pat down, Inv. Ezell could feel

the items concealed in Mr. White's pants.

Mr. White gave investigators permission to remove the items. One pair of red pants and two pairs of blue pants were found during the search. The total price of the items was \$33.59. Mr. White passed all points of sale with the items concealed with the intent to deprive the owner of the items.

Mr. White was arrested for Theft of Property under \$500 and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

Game Over for Thief

Nathaniel Smith, 20, County Road Niota, was charged with Theft of Property.

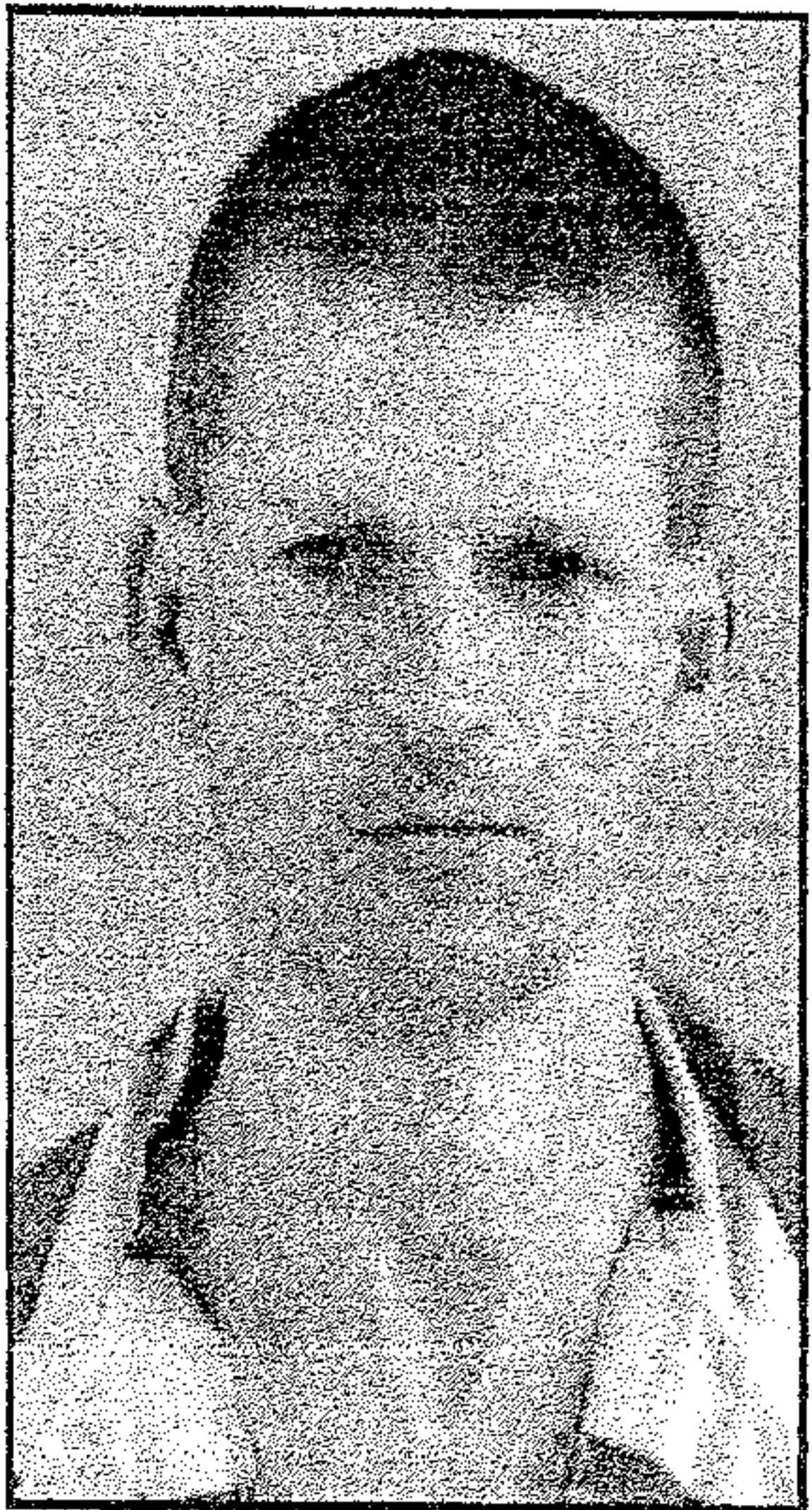
Agents with the 9th DTF were contacted by Loss Prevention at

Walmart in Lenoir City about a possible theft in the store. They described a white male with all black clothing that appeared to be cutting open video game packages with a razor blade and concealing games on his person in one of the aisles of the store. The male subject then exited the store where Agents made contact with him and identified him as Nathaniel Smith. Loss Prevention located an empty video game case on one of the shelves along with an opened pack of razor blades. A search of Mr. Smith's person revealed a video game disk that matched the game case that was left in the store. Mr. Smith stated that he was going to take the game



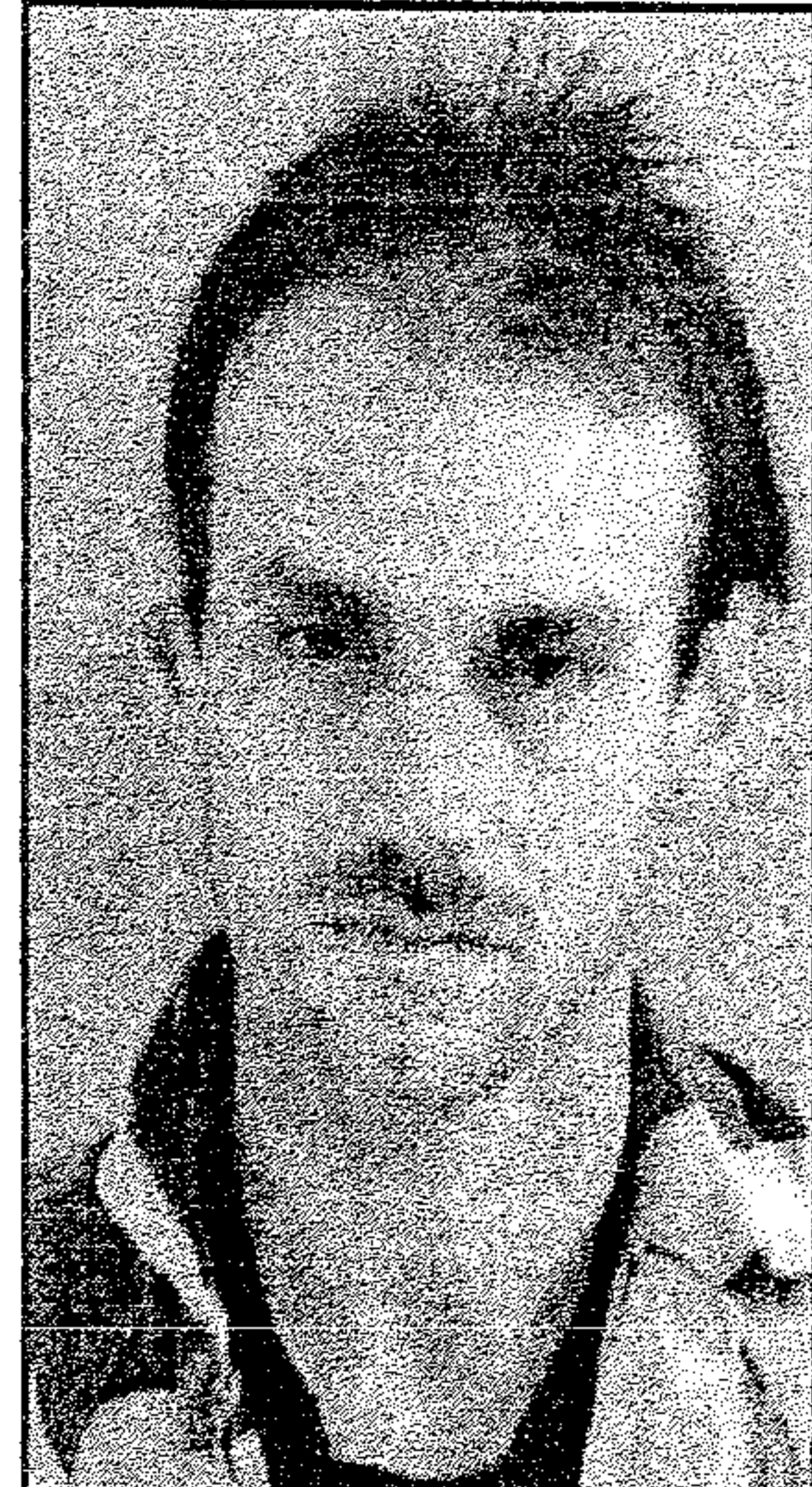
