

A special investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has revealed that former West Cheatham Elementary School PTO treasurer Beth Christie stole at least \$7,450. Ms. Christie stole the money between December 2012 and May 2014. Comptroller investigators found that she withheld thousands of dollars in cash fundraiser collections from deposit into the PTO kept \$800 that she withdrew using the organization's ATM/debit card. Ms. Christie admitted to investigators that she used the money for her personal expenses. After leav-
