Tennessee History Center auditorium, 601 South Gay Street, in this month's Books Sandwiched In, a program series sponsored by the Friends of Knox County Public Library.

"This is a conversation with a son that every father should have," Battle said.

Between the World and Me is a letter that Coates writes to his adolescent son about how to be black in America. Coates tells his son, "This is your country, this is your world, this is your body, and you must find some way to live within the all of it." Pivoting from the biggest questions about American history and ideals to the most intimate concerns of a father for his son, he offers a powerful new framework for understanding our nation's history and current crisis. Americans have built an empire on the idea of "race," a falsehood that damages us all but falls most heavily on the bodies of black women and men—bodies exploited through slavery and

segregation, and, today, threatened, locked up, and murdered out of all proportion.

Coates shares with his son—and readers—the story of his awakening to the truth about his place in the world through a series of revelatory experiences, from Howard University to Civil War battlefields, from the South Side of Chicago to Paris, from his childhood home to the living rooms of mothers whose children's lives were taken as American plunder.

In addition to his pastoral work, Pastor Battle has served as Director of Minority Resources at the Cincinnati Bible College and Seminary; as a Visiting Professor at the International Christian College of Manila; and as Adjunct Professor at several colleges, including his current position at the Knoxville International Bible Institute and Covington Theological Seminary. He earned a Master of Divinity Degree at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, a Master of Arts Degree from Cin-

cinnati Bible College and Seminary, and is presently a Doctor of Ministry Candidate at Liberty University in Lynchburg, Virginia. He currently serves as the Moderator of the Knoxville Baptist District Association and as Vice President of the Knoxville Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance. He is married to the former Julia Tomma Buckner and they have fifteen children.

Chris Woodhull has over 20 years of inner-city experience and was the founder of TRIBE ONE, an at-risk urban youth ministry in Knoxville, Tenn. He also served on the Knoxville City Council for eight years while leading five different public processes, one of which resulted in an Innovation in Government Award from the city. He is currently the director of creative development for the

SoulCare Project in Chattanooga. He graduated from the University of North Carolina at Asheville, and has studied negotiation at Harvard Law School.

The series will continue on May 18 when the Honorable Pamela Reeves, United States District Court, will discuss Sisters in Law: How Sandra Day O'Connor and Ruth Bader Ginsberg went to the Supreme Court and Changed the World by Linda Hirshman. On June 22, Dr. Annette Mendola, UT Department of Philosophy, will discuss Being Mortal: Medicine and What Matters in the End by Atul Gawande. On July 27, Dr. Margaret Lazarus Dean, UT Department of English, will discuss her own book Leaving Orbit: Notes from the Last Days of American Spaceflight.

Evading

Emacia Blair, 23, County Road Niota, was charged with DUI, Driving on Suspended License, Evading Arrest, Aggravated Assault, Driving on Roadway laned for traffic, Due Care, Financial Responsibility, speeding, Seatbelt, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Deputy Lance Anderson LCSO, was refueling his patrol vehicle at the Exxon on 1111 Hwy. 321 North. Deputy was advised by a motorist of a possible intoxicated person pumping gas. Deputy made contact with a black male, later identified as Emacia Blair, sitting in the driver's seat of a silver Dodge

Ram, not wearing the vehicle's seatbelt. As Deputy was speaking with the driver he observed a strong order of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the vehicle. The driver had watery bloodshot eyes and slurred speech.

The driver kept trying to roll the window up on Deputy hand and started backing

the vehicle up. Deputy opened the driver's door and asked the driver to exit. The driver heavily accelerated while Deputy still had a hold of the driver's door. Deputy was able to let go of the door but did sustain minor injuries to the top of my right hand and thumb. The vehicle then drove over a curb, through

bushes, and turned right on Hwy. 321 N. The vehicle turned left on I 75 S. forcing a vehicle off the roadway at the ramp entrance. Deputy activated vehicle's emergency equipment, included blue light and siren. The vehicle accelerated up to approximately 100 mph. Deputy constantly paced the vehicle for approximately six miles at 90 mph. During this time the vehicle passed a semi truck on the shoulder.

At approximately the 73 mm the vehicle started throwing sparks and heavy smoke from the undercarriage. The vehicle came to a stop on the 72 exit ramp. The driver got out of the vehicle and was taken into custody. Dispatch advised Mr. Blair's TN driver license was suspended. Deputy was unable to perform field sobriety due to the circumstances at the scene. The driver was transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

The driver was read implied consent and agree to use the Intoximeter. However the machine was not working and the driver refused a blood withdrawal. The driver also stated he did not have valid auto insurance. Deputy Lance Anderson LCSO, made the arrest.

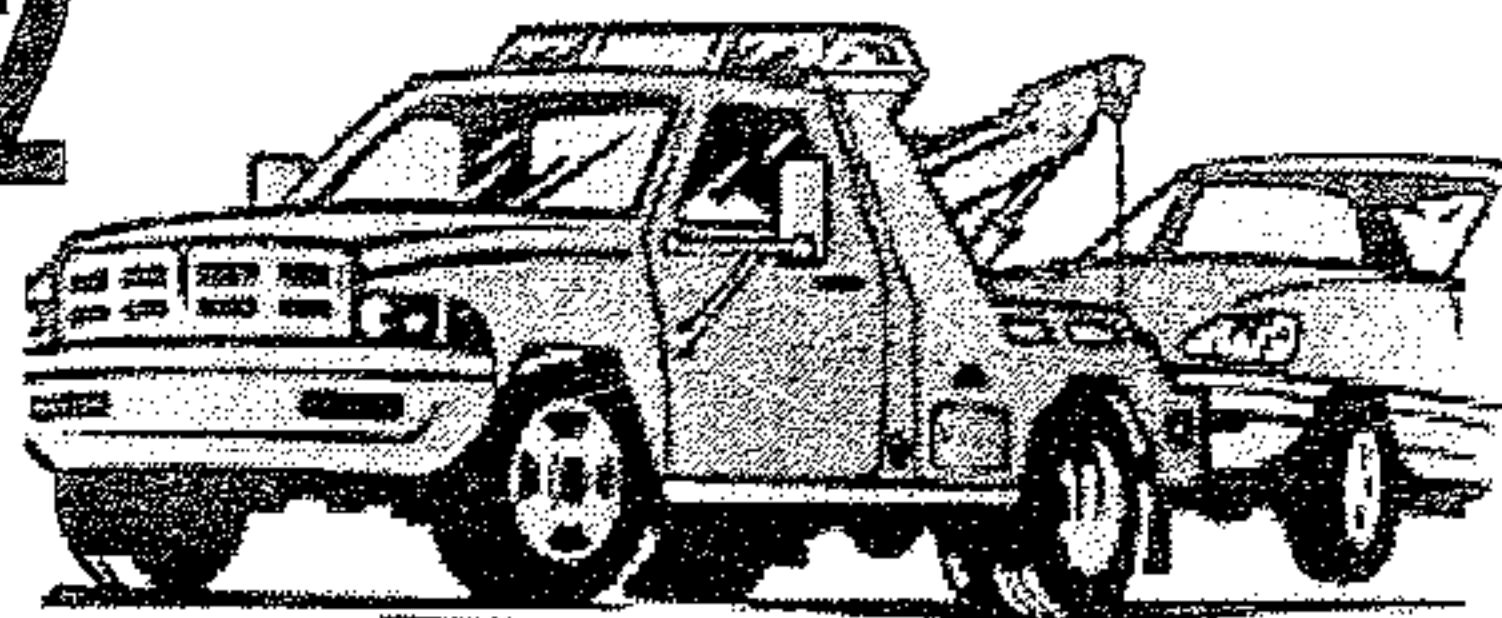

the vehicle the backup officer located a cigarette pack in the possession of Aguilera. This pack was found to contain a small blue plastic baggy with a crystalline substance that tested positive for the presence of methamphetamine. During investigation Aguilera was sitting on a retaining wall next to where the vehicle was parked. When Aguilera was taken from that location to the patrol car. A backup officer found 2 baggies, consistent with the first baggy found right next to where Aguilera was sitting. These baggies also contained a crystalline substance consistent with Metham-

phetamine. Due to the packaging and numerous plastic baggies of Meth Mr. Aguilera was charged with Possession with intent to sell, Aguilera possessed this firearm during the course of a dangerous felony. Aguilera attempted to discard the additional baggies of methamphetamine during investigation and was charged with Tampering with Evidence. Officer Andrew Pierson LPD, made the arrest.

Helton

Probation Office for 10 years and will be required to register with the sex offender registry in any state in which he resides, works, or attends school.

Helton pleaded guilty in October 2015 to federal charges stemming from an undercover investigation into distribution of child pornography via peer-to-peer file sharing software on the Internet. After undercover investigators downloaded child pornography from Helton's computer, a federal search warrant was executed at his residence and a forensic examination of his computer revealed that he had collected thousands of images and videos of child pornography. A large assortment of the depictions of child abuse collected by the defendant was available for download by others from Helton's computer through the use of peer-

to-peer software.

Nancy Stallard Harr, Acting U.S. Attorney, emphasized the importance of pursuing child pornography offenders stating, "This sentence should send a message that the United States will aggressively investigate and prosecute those who choose to participate in the continued victimization of children, some of our most vulnerable members of society, through the circulation of child pornography on the Internet."

This investigation was conducted locally by Knoxville Police Department's Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force. Assistant U.S. Attorney Matthew Morris represented

the United States.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by U.S. Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims.
