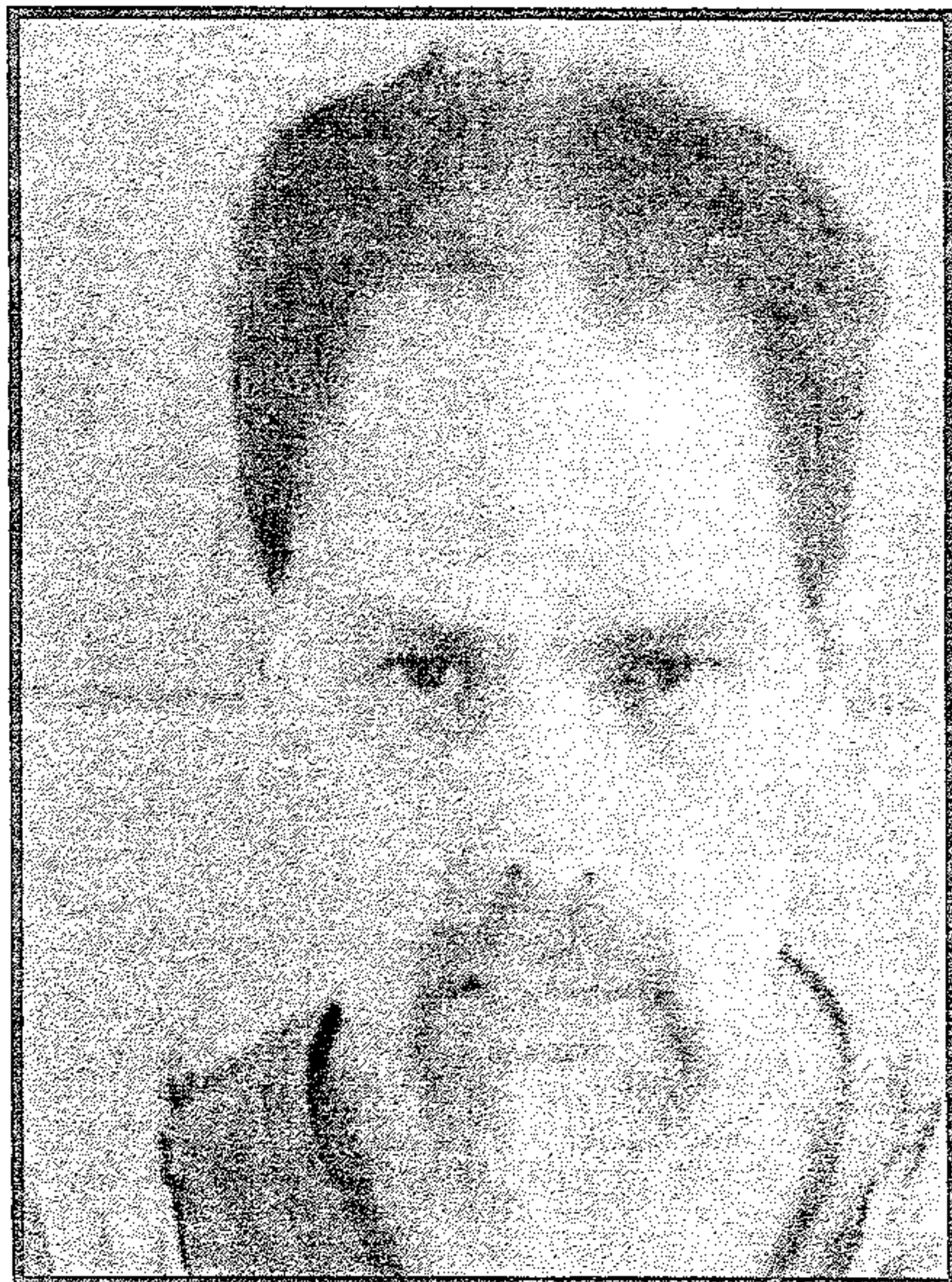





Christopher Lane, 29, Hwy 70 West Lenoir City, was charged with Driving on Revoked License, Poss. of Drug Para., Simple Possession Sch. III & VI. Officer Bruce Padgett LCPD, observed a white vehicle with a drive-out tag cross the center line on Town Creek Pkwy & Old Hwy 95 several times. Officer traffic stopped the vehicle in front of Anchor Drive, upon making contact with the driver Christopher Lane, who stated he did not have a valid driver license. Officer noticed Christopher putting drug

Each recipient received the Director's Community Leadership Award, presented every year since 1990 by FBI field offices around the country to publicly honor those who have gone above and beyond the call to service by tirelessly working to make their own cities and towns a better and safer place for their fellow residents.

The 2015 award recipients come from all backgrounds, all professions, and all parts of the country, and the issues they focus on vary greatly. But according to Comey, "They are united by a single thing—an effort to do good."

Comey explained

why the FBI publicly recognizes community leaders in this annual ceremony. "First," he said, "we want to thank them, because they're doing the same things we're doing, which is trying to make life better for the American people."

"And secondly," added Comey, "we want to show the world what America looks like... and that this is what we do in communities all over the country." He also hopes that the honorees inspire others, especially young people, to follow in their footsteps.

Among the individuals and organizations recognized during 2015 by FBI field offices were:

Anchorage: Samuel Johns, for helping homeless Alaskan native reconnect with their families, friends, and culture through Forget Me Not, the non-profit organization he founded.

Baltimore: Operation Pulse (People United to Live in a Safe Environment), for its work to reduce violent crime in

and around East Baltimore through a variety of crime prevention programs for churches, senior groups, churches, and businesses.

Honolulu: Roy Sakuma, who for the past 50 years has taught, mentored, inspired, and brought hope to thousands of people in Hawaii and even Japan, and who has spent countless hours speaking to school children, candidly sharing his experiences regarding bullying, suicide, and insecurity.

Houston: The Houston-based non-profit K9s4COPS organization, for providing K-9s to help police find explosives, drugs, and weapons in some of our nation's most at-risk communities and for assisting in the apprehension of more than 400 violent fleeing suspects.

Los Angeles: Omar Siddiqui, for bringing Muslim community leaders to the table to meet with Los Angeles FBI representatives and for encouraging young Muslim adults

Wesley Waller, 35, Hines Valley Road Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Child Abuse and Neglect, Man/Sell/Del/Resale SCH.II, and Sexual Battery.

Sgt. Detective Jason Smith LCSO, was notified a Department of Children Services referral had been made in reference to a sex-

ual battery. The victim was identified and she was being interviewed at the Child Advocacy Center. Victim splits time between her mothers residence and her fathers residence. During the interview victim disclosed that Wesley Waller had touched her on her buttocks after watching her undress. Victim stated that he asked her to try on a pair in un-

derwear which she had not been allowed to wear previously. She stated that while in her bedroom she was changing and that she realized Wesley was watching her.

She states that he then touched her on her hip and buttocks. Victim also stated he told her that he was going to shower and masturbate. Victim stated she could hear him making

noises while showering. She also disclosed while she was taking a shower on or about March 23rd, 2016 Wesley came into the bathroom. Victim stated that the shower curtain is plastic and has blue squares and clear square which can be seen through. Victim states that she had locked the door but it opens anyway. Victim also disclosed that

Wesley had appeared naked on occasion in front of her. On April 4th, 2016 Deputy had a search warrant written for the address where these incidents were to have occurred. The address was Hines Valley Road Lot in Lenoir City.

During the search warrant, the shower curtain was photographed and five pairs of underwear, including the one described by victim were located in Mr. Waller's bedroom. The bathroom door was also discovered to not latch properly allowing access even when locked. During the search for the underwear, items used for making methamphetamine were discovered in plain view as well as in drawers and cabinets. Coffee filters, muriatic acid, light bulbs fashioned to smoke methamphetamine, foil, plastic bottles with residue in them were located in the bedroom and bathroom of Mr. Waller. Mr. Waller's girlfriend, arrived at the scene with her daughter and Mr. Waller's . Girlfriend stated that she stayed at the residence. She stated that the last time she knew Mr. Waller had manufactured the methamphetamine

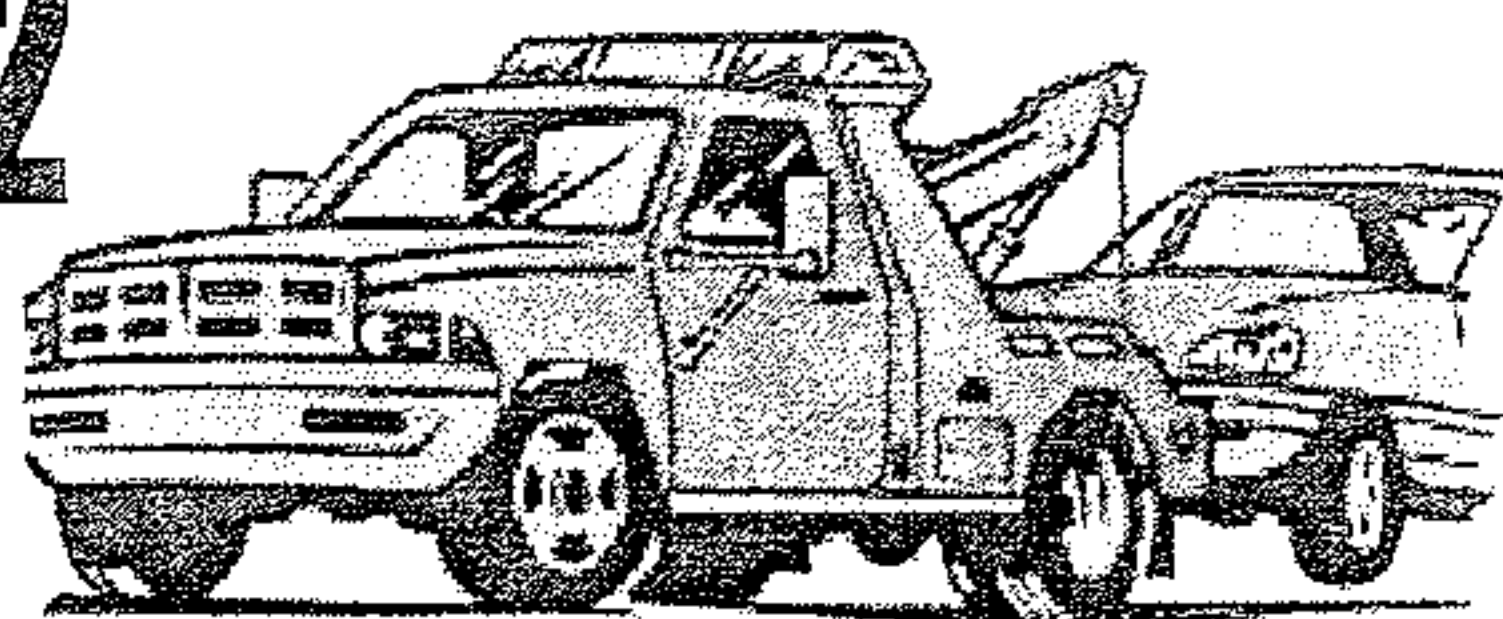
