

Healthcare solutions company to invest \$6.7 million, create approximately 250 new jobs



US Settles false claims act allegations against TVA Contractor Bartlett Holdings, Inc.

The United States, on behalf of the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA), reached a settlement on April 22, 2016, with TVA contractor Bartlett Holdings, Inc. (Bartlett), d.b.a. BHI Energy/Sun Technical Services. Bartlett was alleged to have violated the False Claims Act by knowingly con-

On May 6, 2016, Corey Bruce Patrick, 35, of Camden, Tenn., was sentenced by the Honorable Thomas A. Varlan, Chief U.S. District Judge, to serve 15 years in federal prison for second degree murder for a car wreck that resulted in the death of Heather Nicole Hendrix.

Upon his release from prison, Patrick will be supervised by the U.S. Probation Office for five years. He was also ordered to pay restitution to the victim's family in the amount of \$15,989.77 for funeral and burial related expenses and the value of Hendrix's car.
