Haslam Takes Action on Remaining Bills Passed by 109th General Assembly

Tennessee Gov. Bill Haslam today took action on all remaining bills passed by the 109th General Assembly. He returned SJR 467 without his signature and allowed HB 2248 to become law without his signature. The governor issued the statements below on both bills.
