
Help Us Catch the East Area Rapist

Although four decades have passed since a prolific serial rapist and murderer terrorized California communities from Sacramento to Orange County, the FBI and local law enforcement announced a national publicity campaign today and a significant reward—in the hopes of locating the suspect and finally bringing him to justice.

One of his few regrets about retirement, Biondi said recently, "was leaving the cases I didn't solve." What strikes him about the Maggiore murders and the East Area Rapist is how the subject has managed to elude capture. "It is mindboggling that he committed so many crimes without a slip up," the areas, the 911 emer- and his wife, Katie, 17 years as a homicide veteran detective said. And yet, one of Biondi's first homicide cases decades ago was recently solved through DNA evidence. So it is entirely possible, he said, that the East Area Rapist can be brought to justice. "That would elate me."

> After his crimes in the Sacramento area, the subject continued primarily in the East Bay Area of Northern California, where his activity escalated into rapes and homicides along the California coast. He would attack couples, tie up both victims, rape the temale, and then murder them. After July 1981, no associated incidents are known until 1986, when an 18-year-old woman was raped and murdered in Irvine, California—the last known crime associated with the subject.

Knutson, too, believes that capturing the East Area Rapist is still possible. "Sometimes it's just one call that makes a difference," he said. "If we get that one call and
