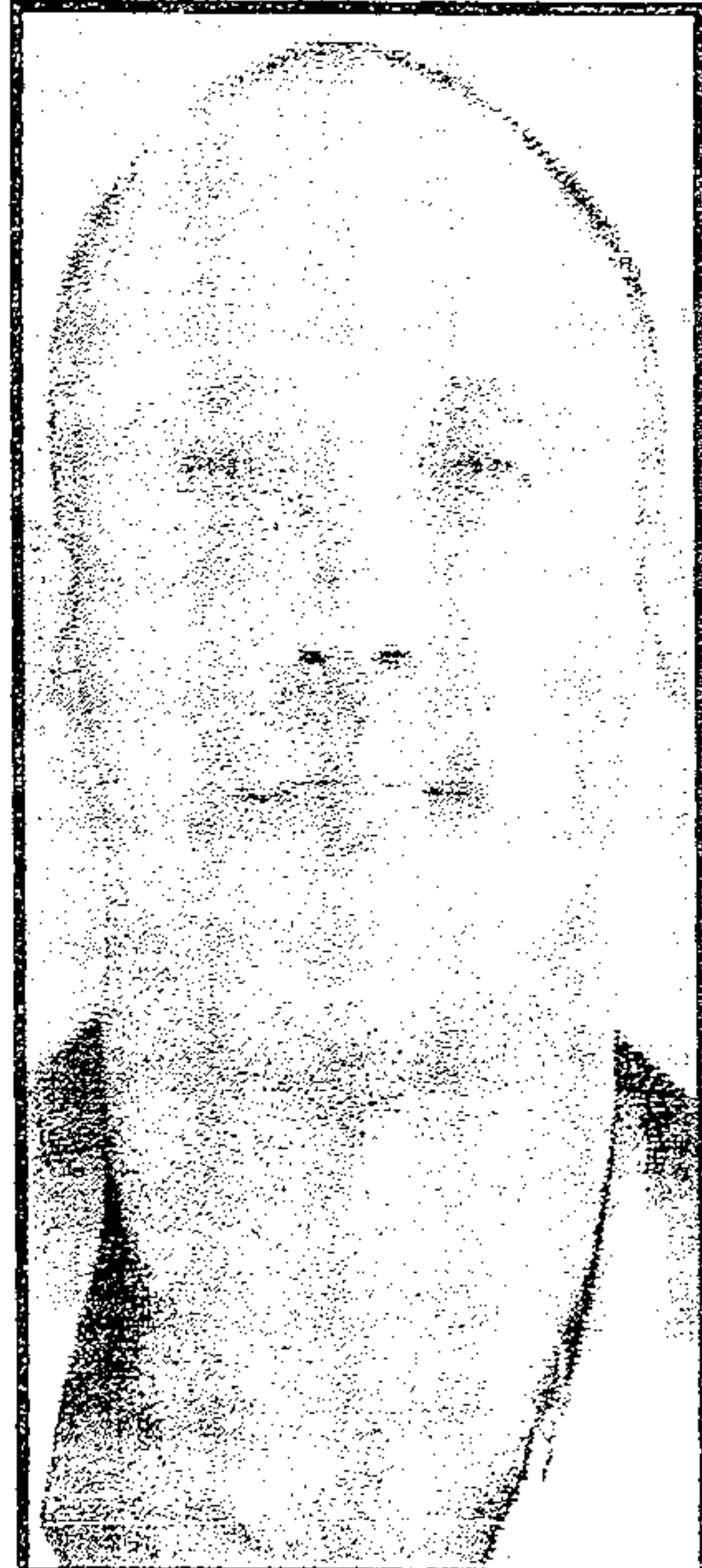

Caryville resident sentenced to serve 160 months in prison for child pornography offenses

On June 15, 2016, Robert Breon Evans, 60, of Caryville, Tenn., was sentenced by the Honorable Thomas A. Varlan, Chief U.S. District Judge, to serve 160 months in federal prison as a result of his conviction for distribution and possession of child pornography. Following his release from prison, Evans will be supervised by the U.S.

Deputy Jeremy Garland LCSO, was dispatched to a 911 hang up with a possible domestic at West In. Upon arrival, Deputy could see the above said defendant (Dylan Graves) smoking a pipe in his living room as approached a window.

As Deputy knocked on the door, the above said defendant quickly went into a bedroom. After several minutes of attempting to make contact, a female came to the door asking why we were there and stating she had been in the shower and was the only one home. Deputy Garland and Deputy Reagan made entry into the residence. After several verbal commands, the above said

defendant crawled out of closet in the back bedroom. Deputy asked the defendant for his name and date of birth. He replied his name was "Justin" and his date of birth was "08/86". Deputy then asked how old he was and he stated he was 22. After several attempts, Mr Graves did give his real identity. Probation Office for 15 years and required to register with the sex offender registry in any state in which he resides, works, or attends school.

Evans pleaded guilty on Feb. 10, 2015 to federal charges stemming from an undercover investigation into distribution of child pornography via

peer-to-peer file sharing software on the Internet. After undercover investigators downloaded child pornography from Evans's computer, a federal search warrant was executed at his residence. A forensic examination of his computer revealed that he had collected thousands of images and videos of child pornography.

A large assortment of the depictions of child abuse collected by Evans was available for download by others from his computer through the use of peer-to-peer software.

Nancy Stallard Harr, Acting U.S. Attorney, emphasized the importance of pursuing child pornography offenders. "The United States Attorney's of-

office will continue to aggressively prosecute individuals who victimize children, who are some of the most vulnerable members of our society, by sharing child pornography on the Internet."

This investigation was conducted locally by Knoxville Police Department's Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force. As-

sistant U.S. Attorney Matthew Morris represented the United States.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by U.S. Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims. Former Employee Stole Thousands from Clarksville Gas and Water

A special investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office, in conjunction with the Clarksville Police Department, has found that former materials management technician Tony Hams stole at least \$47,518 from Clarksville Gas and Water.

Mr. Hams stole the money over a five-year period by making online personal purchases using a gas and water department purchasing card (P-card). Mr. Hams bought chil-

dren's clothing, Oakley sunglasses, health and beauty products, a bow and arrow kit, and many other items for his personal benefit.

Mr. Hams concealed his theft by fabricating invoices and requisition forms. He also logged fictitious items into the gas and water department's inventory records. All of the personal charges on the P-card were paid with gas and water department funds.

Tony Hams was terminated from Clarksville Gas and Water on January 26, 2016. On June 6, 2016, the Montgomery County Grand Jury indicted him on three counts of theft over \$10,000, one count of official

misconduct, and ten counts of forgery.

"This theft was allowed to continue for several years because Mr. Hams was responsible for both ordering and receiving inventory items," said Comptroller Justin P. Wilson. "It is important that supervisors carefully scrutinize invoices and verify that all items that are ordered and received are for legitimate business purposes."

Clarksville Gas and Water Department officials have indicated they have corrected the deficiencies in the department's financial processes.
