Investigation Reveals Misappropriation of \$120,506

A special investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has found that former Luttrell city recorder Rebecca Ailor misappropriated at least \$120,506 in city money. Ms. Ailor issued more than 140 checks to herself or a family member from September 11, 2012, until February 22, 2016.

FBI Returns 1875 Correspondence to Smithsonian Archives

A handwritten letter by Charles Darwin that was stolen from the Smithsonian Institution Archives more than three decades ago was recovered by FBI special agents and returned last week to the care of the Smithsonian.

Smithsonian conservators worked closely with FBI art crime experts to authenticate the Darwin letter, which went missing before it was cataloged Smithsonian Archives. Smithsonian experts were able to compare the letter to another one in their collection that Darwin wrote to Hayden.

"This is an impor-
