a 2009 conviction for distribution of cocaine committed the instant offense shortly after being released from prison on his conviction for distribution of cocaine. His federal sentence reflected his prior state convictions and the risk of harm his conduct posed to society. Judge Collier also recommended that Fielding participate in a drug treatment program while he is in prison.

The indictment and subsequent conviction of Fielding was the result of an investigation conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Manchester Police Department, Coffee County Sheriff's Office, Winchester Police Department, and Tennessee Highway Patrol. Assistant U.S. Attorney Michael D. Porter represented the United States.
