our last installment, we looked at the history of Loudon County, and explored its earliest city, Morganton. As the railroad came through what is now Loudon County, the river city Morganton faced economic decline and eventually died out. Greenback, on the other hand, was born and began to flourish. Originally, the site of Greenback was a field owned by Robert Thompson and J.B. Hall. The residents wanted to name their new community Alleghany Station or Thompson Station. However, the Post Office Department refused their requests because of other post offices with the same name.

The name selection process was then moved to the Senate, and the name Greenback was chosen. The railroad was completed in 1889, and the first passenger train service was established in 1890. A second railroad depot, the L&N Depot, was completed in 1914 (this building is now a warehouse, though it is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. These two railroad lines brought economical growth to the small community of Greenback and helped to firmly es-
