Sales Tax Holiday



Lenoir City originated from lands owned by General William Lenoir. General Lenoir was born in Brunswick County, Virginia, on May 8, 1751, and moved to North Carolina in 1759. During the Revolutionary War, he served as captain under Colonel Cleveland in the Battle of

King's Mountain. As a reward for his services during the war, the state of North Carolina awarded him 5000 acres located along the northern bank of the Tennessee River. This tract of land, known as the Lenoir tract, stretched a distance of two miles.
