Chanse Davis, 22, Half Moon Road Oliver Springs, was charged with DUI, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Deputy Kenneth Palmer LCSO, was dispatched to a physical domestic at Highway 321 at Melton Hill Campground. When Deputy arrived on scene while trying to find the subjects involved he observed a silver Nissan Altima pull up to the scene. One of the witnesses stated that was one of the vehicles involved.

While walking up to the vehicle the driver rolled down the window and started yelling wanting to know who was in the roadway.

Deputy walked up to the vehicle at which time he could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the vehicle. Deputy asked the subject what was going on at which time he stated he didn't know he was just trying to leave.

Deputy observed the driver had blood shot eyes and appeared to be intoxicated.

Deputy asked the subject to exit the vehicle while he tried to figure out what was going on. After further investigation we determined the subjects involved in the domestic had left. Deputy then asked the driver of the vehicle Mr. Chanse Reed Lively Davis how much he had to drink. Mr. Davis stated two shots and a couple beers about four hours prior.

Deputy asked Mr. Davis if he would be willing to do some field sobriety task to determine if he was able to operate a motor vehicle safely at which time he agreed. Mr. Davis did perform poorly on all field sobriety task. Mr. Davis was placed under arrest for driving under the influence. Mr. Davis was read the Tennessee Implied Consent Form at which time he agreed to give blood. Mr. Davis was transported to the Fort

Loudoun Emergency Room for the blood draw.

While at the Fort Loudon Emergency Room Mr. Davis became uncooperative and would not sign the Emergency Room paper's Mr. Davis then stated he did not want to give blood. Mr. Davis was then transported to the Loudon County Jail.

The vehicle was towed from the scene by Malones Wrecker Service. This did occur in Loudon County TN. **From David H. Lillard Jr., Tennessee State Treasurer.**

I want to reassure the residents of Loudon County about a matter concerning an account of the Loudon County 911 Board.

In response to an article appearing in the July 20 edition of the News-Herald, the Tennessee Treasury Department, has researched the matter of the \$50,527.04 recently turned over to the Unclaimed Property Division by BB&T.

My department has determined the money in question did not constitute unclaimed property, and should not have been turned over during the bank's recent reporting. Branch Banking & Trust Company has reinstated this account in the full amount with all required interest. All of the money belonging to the Loudon County 911 Board has been returned to the bank, with no loss.

I want to stress that this money was never "missing." The account in question was always in the name of the Loudon County 911 Board regardless of whether it was in the bank or with the state. The 911 Board, BB&T and the Treasury Department were able to work together to resolve this matter quickly.

I would also like to take a moment to make sure the residents of Loudon County know more about the Unclaimed Property program, which is a consumer protection service that Treasury provides to Tennesseans.

Unclaimed property is money that has been turned over to the state by businesses and organizations who cannot locate the rightful owners. Every year, millions of dollars are turned over, and the Treasury Department's Division of Unclaimed Property works to get that money back to the rightful owners. Currently, there is more than \$700 million in unclaimed property waiting to be claimed.

The types of unclaimed funds that may be held include stocks, bonds, gift certificates, checks, unclaimed wages, refunds from utility or other companies, life insurance annuities that could not reach the beneficiary and more.

There is no time limit in Tennessee to claim unclaimed property. It is held for the rightful owner or their legal beneficia-

Daniel Bryant, 28, Turman Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Promotion of Methamphetamine Manufacture.

Deputy Jeremy Garland LCSO, was patrolling the neighborhood of Turman Dr. Deputy saw a male in the driveway of Turman Dr. When he saw Deputy, he took off

running into a wooded area behind the residence. Deputy then pulled in the driveway and came in contact with witness, who was sitting on the front porch. Deputy asked him who the man was that ran and he stated it was Daniel Bryant. Deputy could hear someone in the wooded area, so Deputy yelled for Daniel to come to

him. At that time, Mr. Bryant came out of the woods and approached him. Deputy asked why he ran when he saw me, and he stated because he didn't want him to stop him. Upon further investigation, Deputy asked witness for consent to search the area Mr. Bryant had ran, in which he agreed. In the path where Mr. Bryant had ran, Deputy located a red bag containing

cleartubing, blacktape, two Rexall cold packs, and a hair dryer. Approximately 15ft away in a chair, Deputy located an opened Rexall cold pack, an opened bottle of Drano, and an opened canister of Zippo lighter fluid. Mr. Bryant did state that he knew the components were consistent with those used to manufacture Methamphet-

amine. While speaking with witness, he stated that Mr. Bryant asked him for the red bag earlier in the day, but knew nothing of the items in the bag or the objects behind his house. Daniel Bryant was taken into custody due to being in the immediate area of components and ingredients known to be used in the manufacture of Methamphetamine. He was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. All the above did occur in Loudon County, TN.

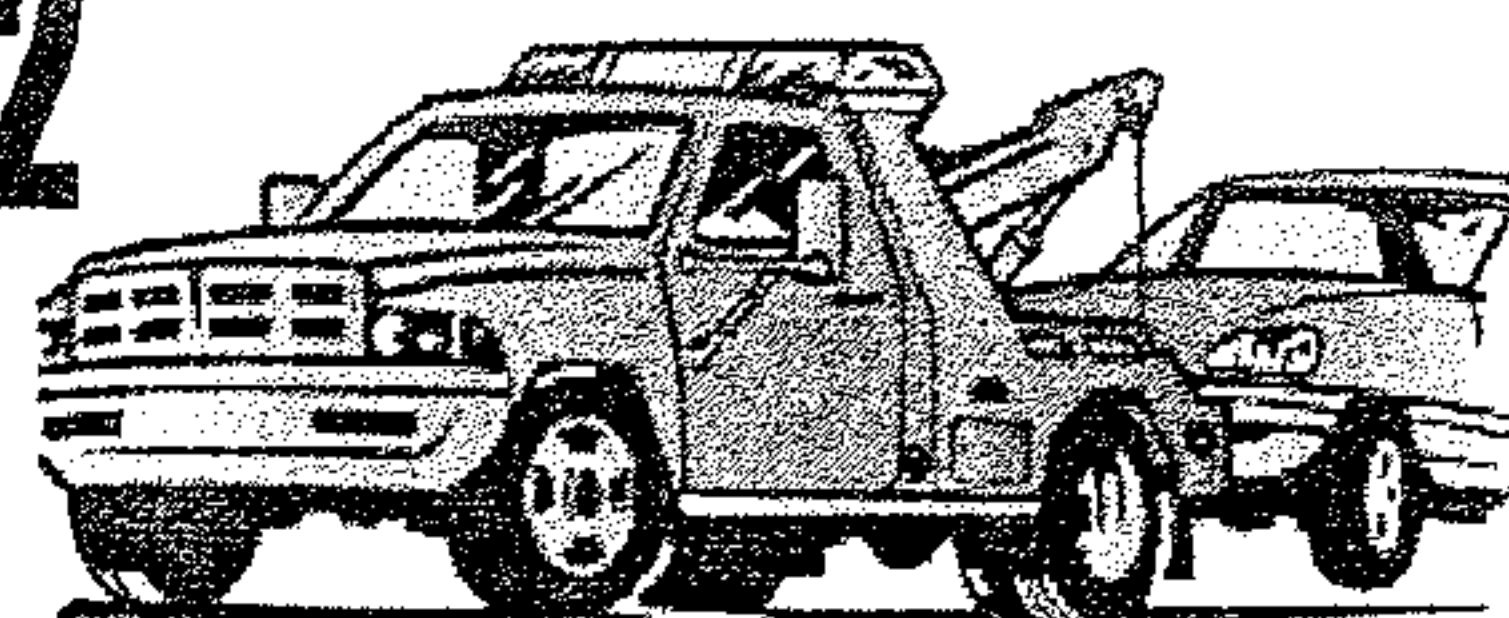

the car. While talking with these individuals he observed a CD case with a pile of a crystal like substance on it in the back floorboard at the feet of where Derick Manning is sitting. Agent asked Mr Manning what the substance was and he advised me that it was methamphetamine. Agent asked Mr. Manning to exit the car and he was detained. The owner of the vehicle gave verbal consent to a search of the vehicle. The female, Ashley Plemmons, stated that she had paraphernalia in her purse and con-

sented to the search of it. Inside the purse, Agent located numerous hypodermic needles, a glass pipe (with burnt marijuana residue), 2 pill bottles with multiple small marijuana cigarettes, two blue pills that are believed to be Xanax of two different milligrams. Ms. Plemmons was charged with Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Simple Possession of Schedule IV and Simple Possession of Schedule VI. Mr. Manning was charged with Simple Possession of Schedule II Methamphetamine. The third occupant

was not charged in this incident. This incident occurred in Loudon County.
