## Federal Funding Received for Future Tennessee State Veterans Cemetery at Parkers Crossroads

Tennessee Gov. Bill Haslam and Department of Veterans Services Commissioner Many-Bears Grindler today announced the state received nearly \$6 million dollars in federal funding from the National Cemetery Administration (NCA) for the construction of the future Tennessee State Veterans Cemetery at Parkers Crossroads.

The 132-acre cemetery will be located at 693 Wildersville Road and will serve more than 45,000 veterans and their families within 17 counties in west Tennessee.

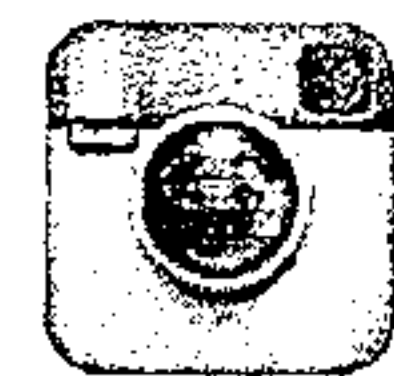

The Tennessee counties within a 75 mile radius of the proposed cemetery include Benton, Carroll, Chester, Crockett, Decatur, Gibson, Hardeman, Hardin, Haywood, Henderson, Henry, Lewis, McNairy, Madison, Perry, Wayne, and Weakley counties.

"It is important that veterans who live in rural Tennessee have convenient access to a pristine final resting place," Haslam said. "Our state veterans cemeteries are not only symbols of our gratitude, they are valuable resources that serve our veterans and their families at times of tragedy and loss."

"We could not ask for better partners in state and local support to help pave the way for this future state resource," Grinder said. "We are excited to move this project forward to a groundbreaking celebration with intentions of opening this cemetery

in 2017."

"We owe a great deal of gratitude and respect to the men and women who served our country in uniform," said U.S. Sen. Bob Corker. "The Tennessee State Veterans Cemetery at Parkers Crossroads will serve more than 45,000 veterans and their families, and I am pleased this project will now move forward."

"I was honored to support funding for the Tennessee State Veterans Cemetery at Parkers Crossroads, which will ensure that more than 40,000 veterans and their families receive the honor and respect they deserve for their service and sacrifice," U.S. Sen. Lamar Alexander said.

"It is fitting to pay tribute to our veterans of today and tomorrow with a future project in the midst of a valuable piece of Tennessee's Civil War history," Rep. Steve McDaniel said. "This field of honor will serve as a reverent reminder of the service and sacri-

ifice of our brave men and women."

There are currently two state veterans cemeteries in Knoxville, one in Nashville and one in Memphis. Veterans and eligible dependents can pre-register for burial by visiting the State Veterans Cemetery page <http://tn.gov/veteran/article/state-veterans-cemeteries>. Pre-registrations will open for

the Tennessee State Veterans Cemetery at Parkers Crossroads 90 days before construction is completed.

The Department of Veterans Services will host a groundbreaking ceremony at a later date. Construction is expected to be completed in the winter of 2017.

Cpl Chris Hutchens LCSO, did observe a red Chrysler sedan traveling on Hwy 11 towards Lenoir City at the junction. The vehicle took Hwy 70 E, and while merging Deputy did observe the vehicle swerve into the

dividing lane markers for the intersection. Deputy pulled out and began following the vehicle on Hwy 70 E. The vehicle crossed the center line on numerous occasions. Deputy initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle in front of MoneyMaker's, and the vehicle traveled further and came to a stop onto Thorton Dr. Deputy approached

the vehicle and identified the driver as Mr. Shane Butler. Butler had a hard time finding his wallet, which was in the floor board and could not remember the other documents Deputy asked for, and continually provided the wrong registration form. Butler had a strong odor of alcoholic beverage emitting from his per-

son, and stated he had come from a bar where he had been drinking. He stated he believed it was 12:30am, when in fact it was around 2:30am. Butler was asked to perform standardized field sobriety and he did perform poorly. Butler was placed under arrest, and read the Tennessee Implied Consent law in which he did

agree to provide a breath sample. Butler was then transported to the Loudon County Jail, where he provide the breath sample. The Sample resulted in a 0.170% BAC on the first sample and 0.173% BAC on the second. This did occur in Loudon County.
