enue, Lenoir City, was charged with possession of schedule II for resale, possession of drug paraphernalia and possession of schedule II roxicodone.

According to the reports, on Wednesday, September 9th, 2009, the Loudon County Sheriff's Office Narcotics Unit served a search warrant at the residence of William and Gloria Young on West 3rd Avenue. While

searching the location, approximately 14 grams of cocaine base (a schedule II drug) was found and approximately 1 ounce of powder cocaine (a schedule II drug) was found. The cocaine and cocaine base were discovered in the living room area of the house. 3 small round pills identified as roxicodone (a schedule II drug) were discovered in the kitchen, on a shelf above the stove, along with digital scales, razor blades and other items used to convert cocaine powder into a base form. Discovered in the living room, was a 9mm pistol with a full magazine. A check of the pistol showed it to be stolen out of Knox County. While interviewing William and Gloria Young they both reportedly admitted to selling cocaine base and converting cocaine powder into cocaine

base. During the interview with Mrs. Young, she reportedly stated, William Young possessed the 9mm handgun for protection, due to the circumstances. Present during the search warrant was Gloria Young and her 5 children, ranging in ages between 1 and 10 years old. William Young was arrested at the EZ Stop on West Broadway.

Sgt. Billy Hall, Deputy Shane Ezell and Deputy Marty Stanley, Loudon County Sheriff's Officers - Narcotics Unit made the arrests.

Robert Jerome Stevenson, 44, East Myrtle Street, Johnson City, was charged with DUI, driving on revoked license 9th offense and violation of implied consent.

According to the report, Friday, at about 10:13pm, Sgt. Jimmey J. Wiggins, LCSO, observed a black Honda Civic stop in the right hand lane of traffic on Highway 321 near Highland Park Drive. The vehicle also had a tail light that was not working. The officer stopped the Honda and identified the driver as Robert J. Stevenson. Mr. Stevenson reportedly had slow and slurred speech and glassy

reportedly found a white plastic pipe with powder residue on it, believed to be used for illegal drug use.
