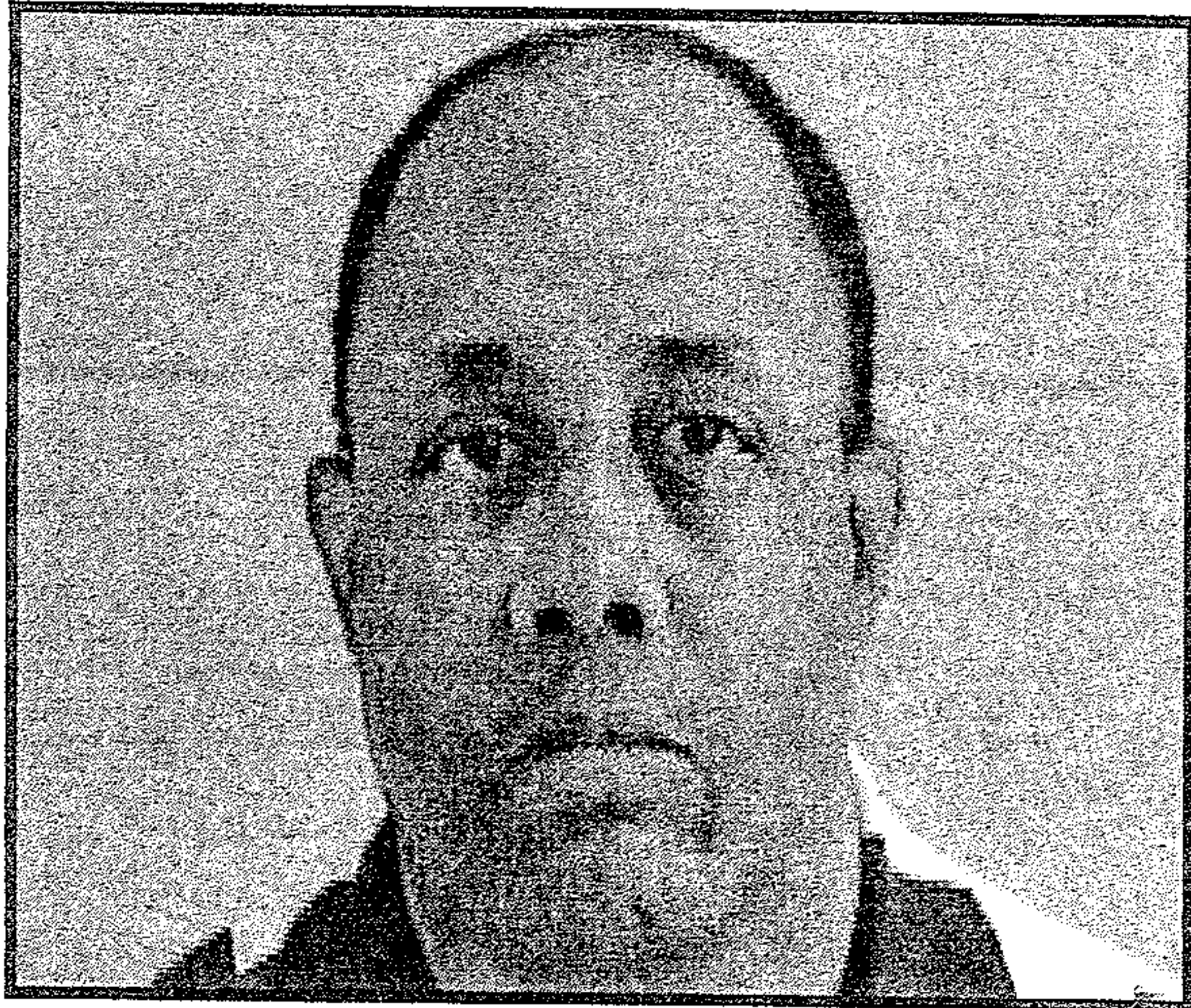

William Goley, 43, Shaw Ferry Road Lenoir City, was charged with Violation of Order Protection, and Vandalism.

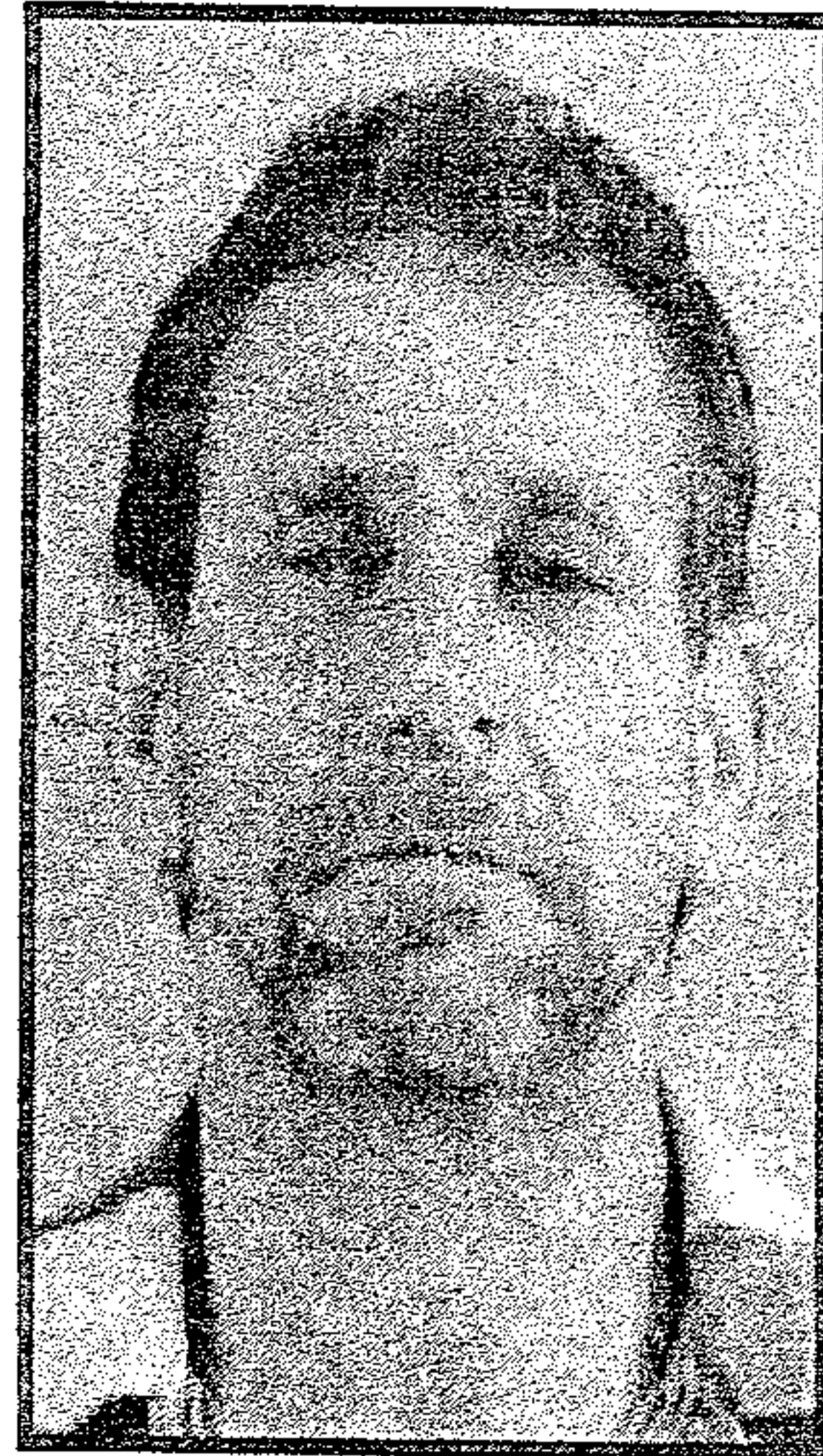

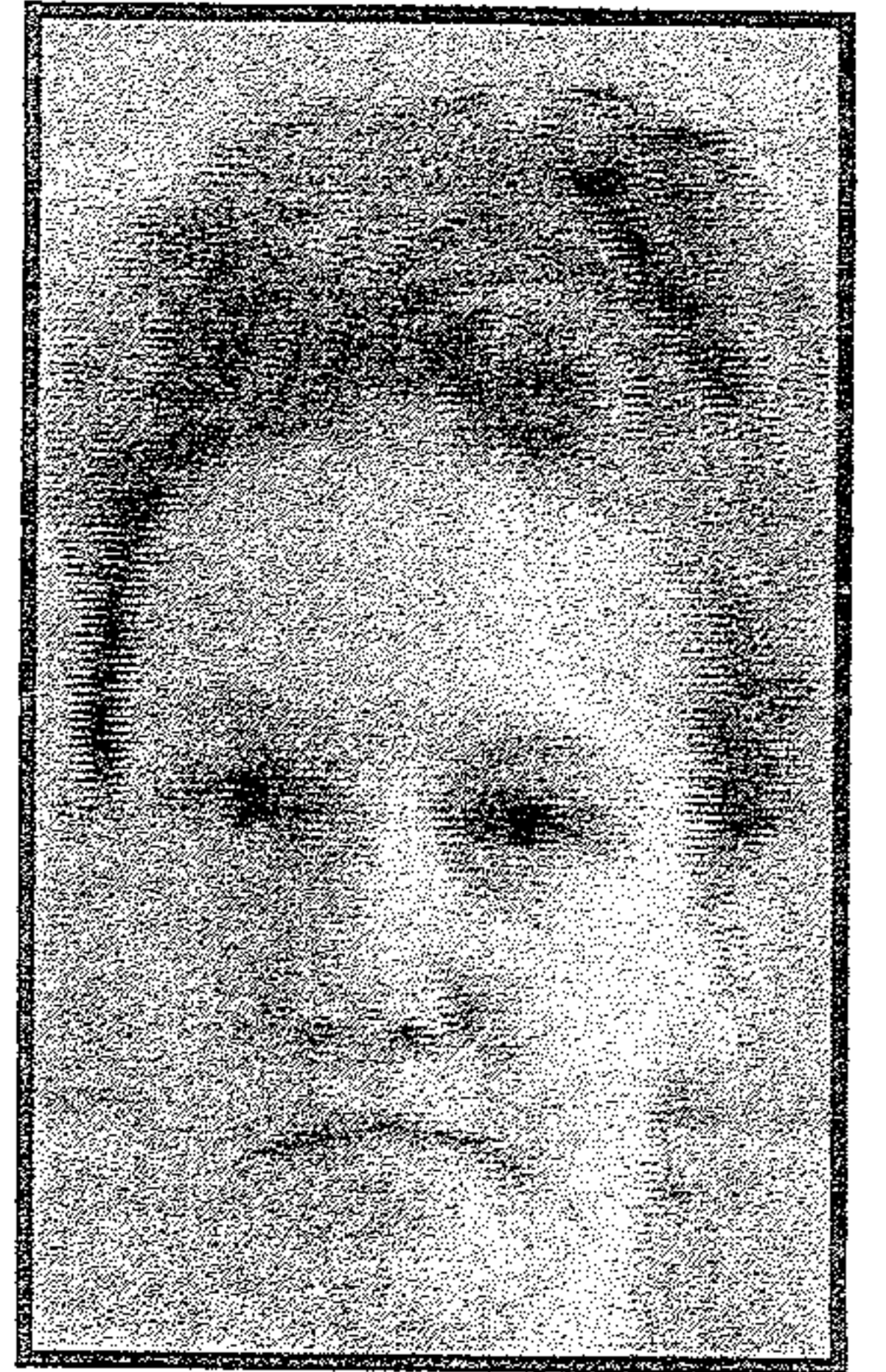

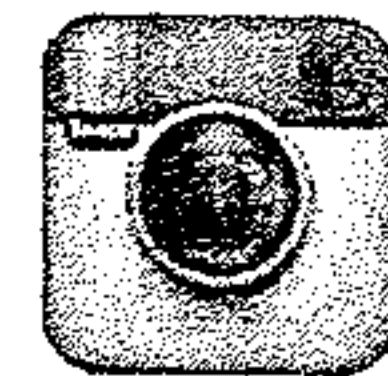
Haslam Announces Randy Boyd To Return to Private Sector

advise she was asleep and awoke to a window, in the living room, that had been broken out with a large rock. As Officer Arden spoke with the victim, Officer Myers and J. Dishner checked the area. Officer had prior knowledge that victim had an Order for Protection against the defendant, William N. Goley, and he was a possible suspect. Officer asked Officer Myers to check the railroad tracks directly behind the apartment complex. Officer Myers located the defendant approximately 100 yards east of the victims residence. Officer Arden and Dishner responded to the scene to make contact with Mr. Goley. Upon initial contact with Mr. Goley, no officer mentioned the crime that had been committed at the victim's residence.

After reading Mr. Goley his Miranda Rights, he advised that he did not want to answer any questions regarding the incident.

While Officer was speaking with a detective via phone, Mr. Goley made an excited utterance statement, I didn't do anything, I didn't break her window, Mr. Goley also stated that he saw a Mexican break the window and he was chasing him down the railroad tracks. Mr. Goley is required to stay away from the

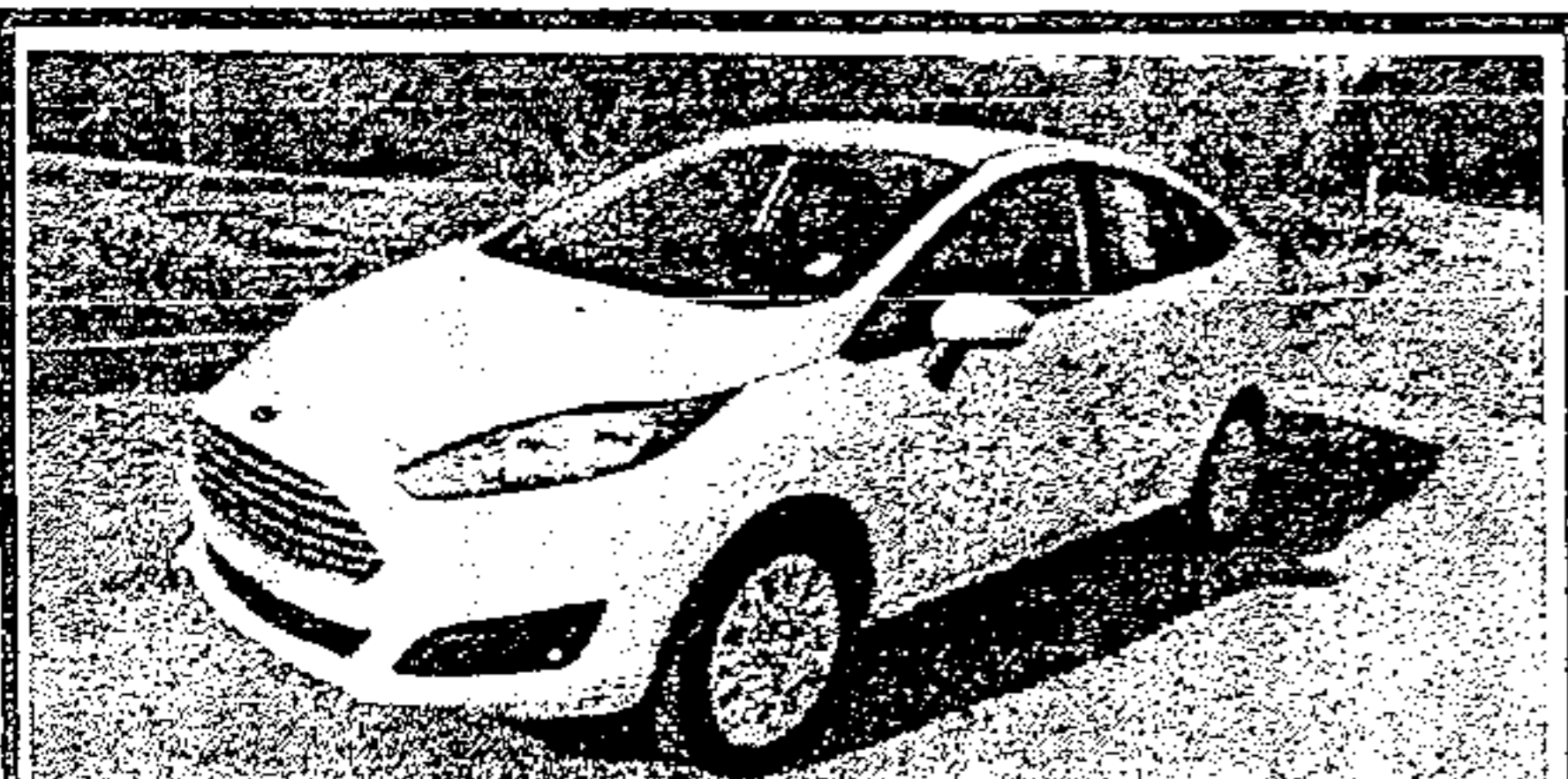

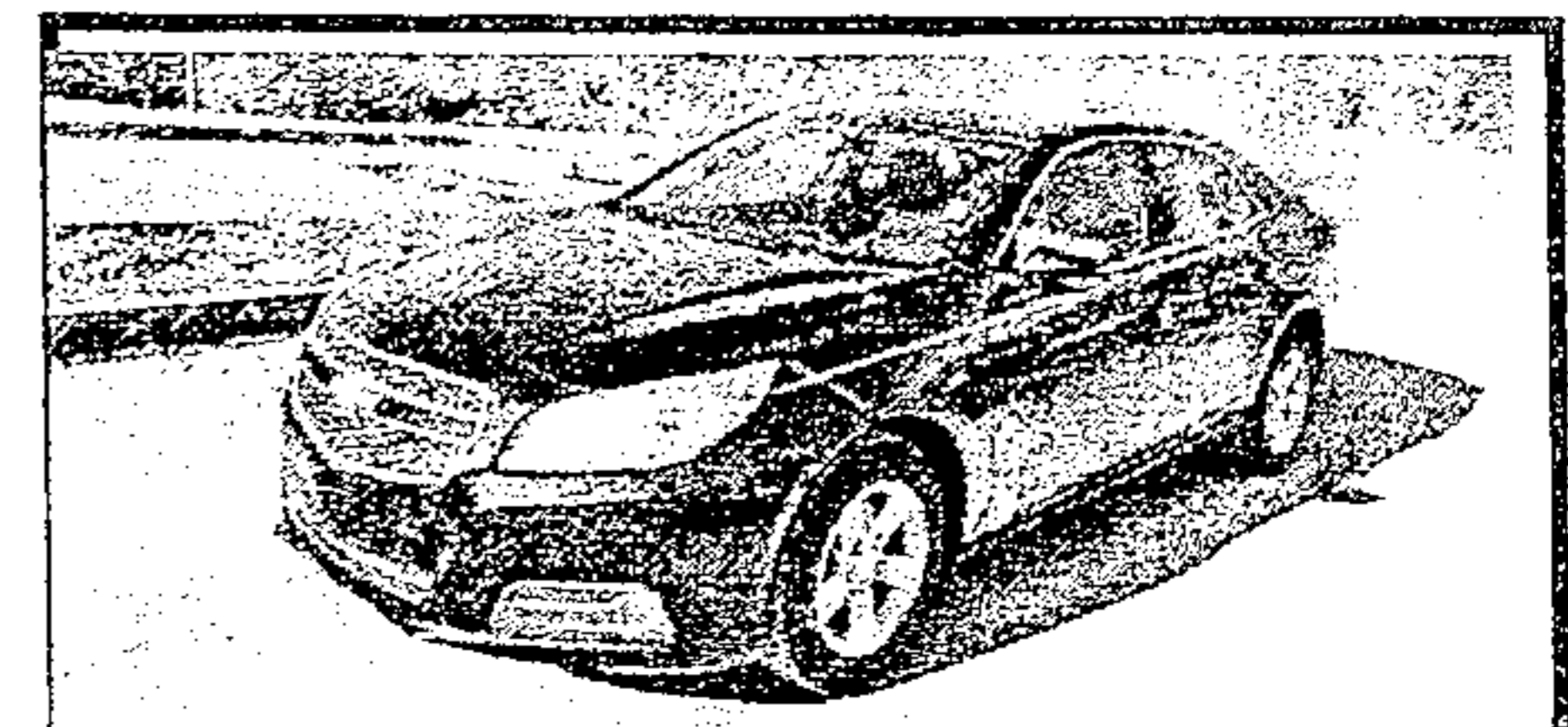

direct investment, and second in the growth of household median incomes. ECD has also set several records and generated nearly 50,000 new job commitments and nearly \$11 billion in capital investment in the state.

Boyd joined the administration in 2013 as a special advisor to the governor for higher education, helping create the state's Drive to 55 initiative, the Tennessee Promise and Reconnect programs and other initiatives to increase the number of Tennesseans with a postsecondary degree or certificate to 55 percent by 2025.

"The State of Tennessee has gained so much from Randy's service. To put it sim-

ply: without Randy, there is no Tennessee Promise or Drive to 55 or a comprehensive approach to job growth via workforce development," Haslam said. "I will miss his energy, passion and deep commitment to bringing economic growth and success to every corner of the state, and I am grateful for everything he has done for Tennessee."

As commissioner, Boyd established ECD's first Division of Rural Development and co-chaired the Governor's Rural Task Force to accelerate rural development and job creation in all counties of the state. public-private partnership to support Tennessee entrepreneurs and small businesses grow the jobs of the future.

to distribute 50 grams or more of methamphetamine (actual) in the Eastern District of Tennessee.

The life sentence given to Hedelsky was based on his prior

criminal history which, according to information on file with the U.S. District Court, included several felony drug convictions, as well as manslaughter, assault, and possession

of a firearm during the commission of a crime. The sentence also included an enhancement for possessing a firearm during relevant conduct related to the methamphetamine dis-

tribution offenses.

The indictment and subsequent conviction of Hedelsky were the results of an investigation conducted by the 17th Judicial Drug Task Force and Drug

Enforcement Administration. Assistant U.S. Attorney Michael D. Porter represented the United States.

Mr. Goley also had motive and opportunity to knowingly cause damage(\$150.00) to the personal property of victim with her consent based upon the statements he made on scene. This did occur in Lenoir City, Tn.
