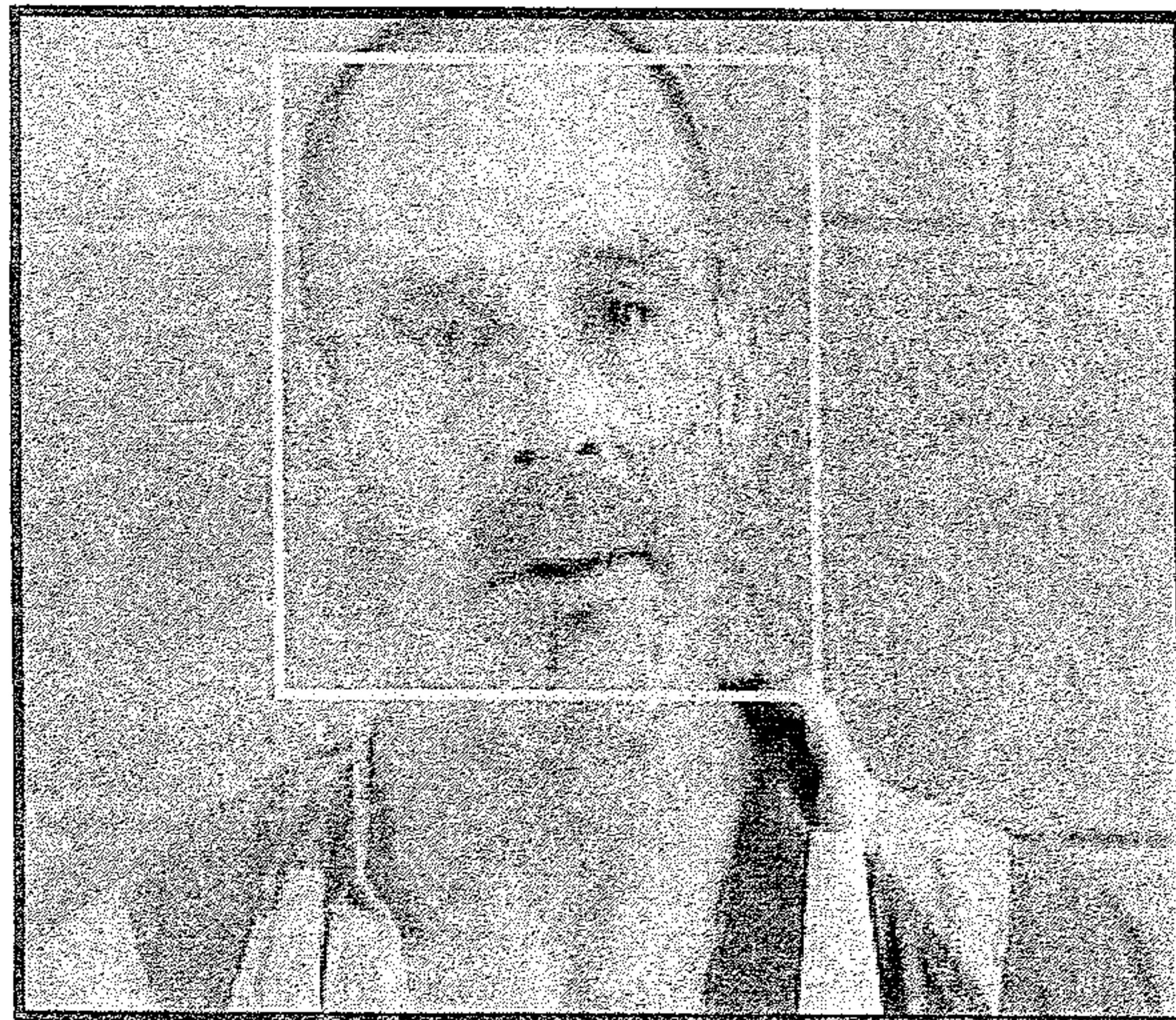

Richard McCullum, 39, Summer Street Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault Felony, and Resisting Arrest.

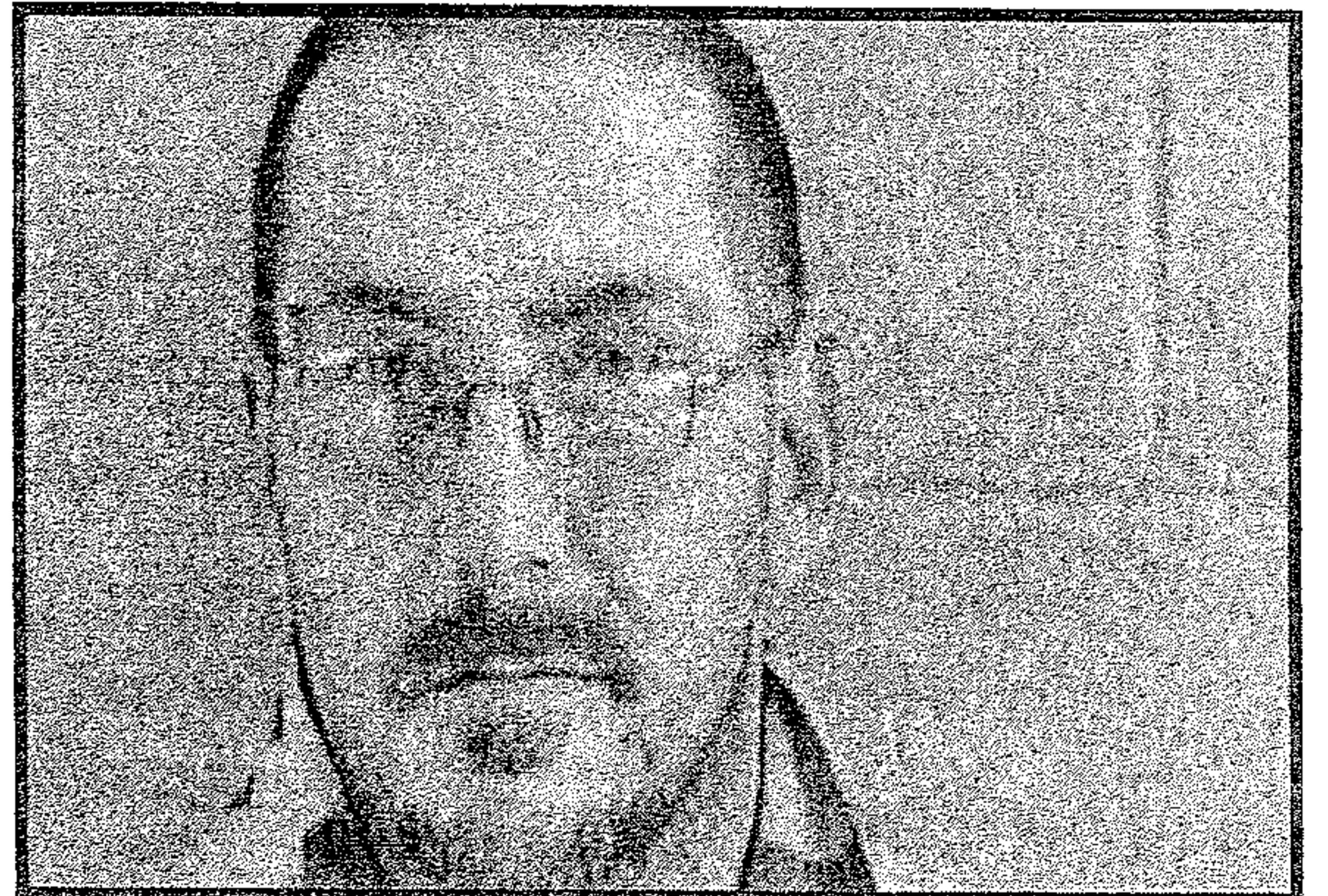
Loudon police Department was dispatched to Summer street, upon arrival Officer Kent Russell could hear a loud argument with the couple inside the trailer.

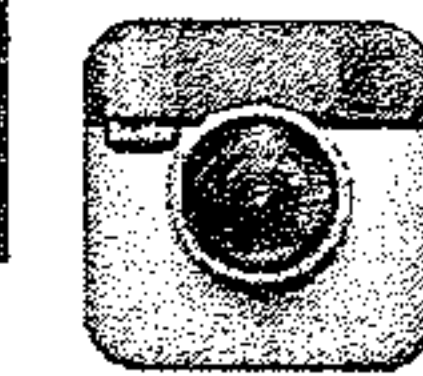

Office of Open Records Counsels Creates Model Public Records Policy

For the first time in state history, Tennessee government entities now have a model policy to help define how public records requests are handled.

The Comptroller's Office of Open Records Counsel (OORC) established a model public records policy to assist all Tennessee

government entities. The model policy was created after Representative Bill Dunn and Senator Richard Briggs led the passage of Public Chapter 722 during the 109th Tennessee General Assembly.

Public Chapter 722 requires every governmental entity subject to the Tennessee Public Records Act to establish a written public records policy by July 1, 2017. The policy must be adopted by the appropriate governing authority, and the OORC model policy will serve as a helpful resource.

A public records policy must cover the process for making and responding to public records requests, redaction of records, and how fees, if any, are charged for copies. Additionally, the policy must identify who has been designated the Public Records Request Coordinator for the entity.

"This model policy will be an excellent resource for the hun-

dreds of government entities across Tennessee," said Comptroller Justin P. Wilson. "The Comptroller's Office of Open Records

Counsel stands ready to assist government employees in preparing their entities' policies."

Will McInturff, 20, Gudger Road Maryville, was charged with DUI.

Deputy Lance Anderson LCSO, observed a white Toyota Camry leave the right

lane of travel and cross the double yellow center line into the opposite lane of travel on Steekee Rd. The vehicle was negotiating a curve and the vehicle was completely in the

opposite lane.

Upon traffic stop Deputy identified the driver as Will McInturff, the offender. While speaking with the offender Deputy observed a strong odor

of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. The offender stated he does smoke marijuana but stated the last time he did was on 01/16/17. Deputy asked if the offender would per-

form SFST and he agreed. The offender performed poorly on SFST. Based on the totality of circumstances, Deputy determined the offender was impaired to the point that he could not safely operate a motor vehicle on the public roadway. Cpl. Branam 922 did perform ARIDE on the offender after Deputy made his decision. The offender was taken into custody, read implied consent (consented), and transported to Ft. Loudon ER for blood withdrawal. The offender was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. All occurred in Loudon County, TN. Citation # 01655 was issued. A check of the offender's driving history reveal one prior driving while impaired on 04/05/15 from McMinn County, TN.

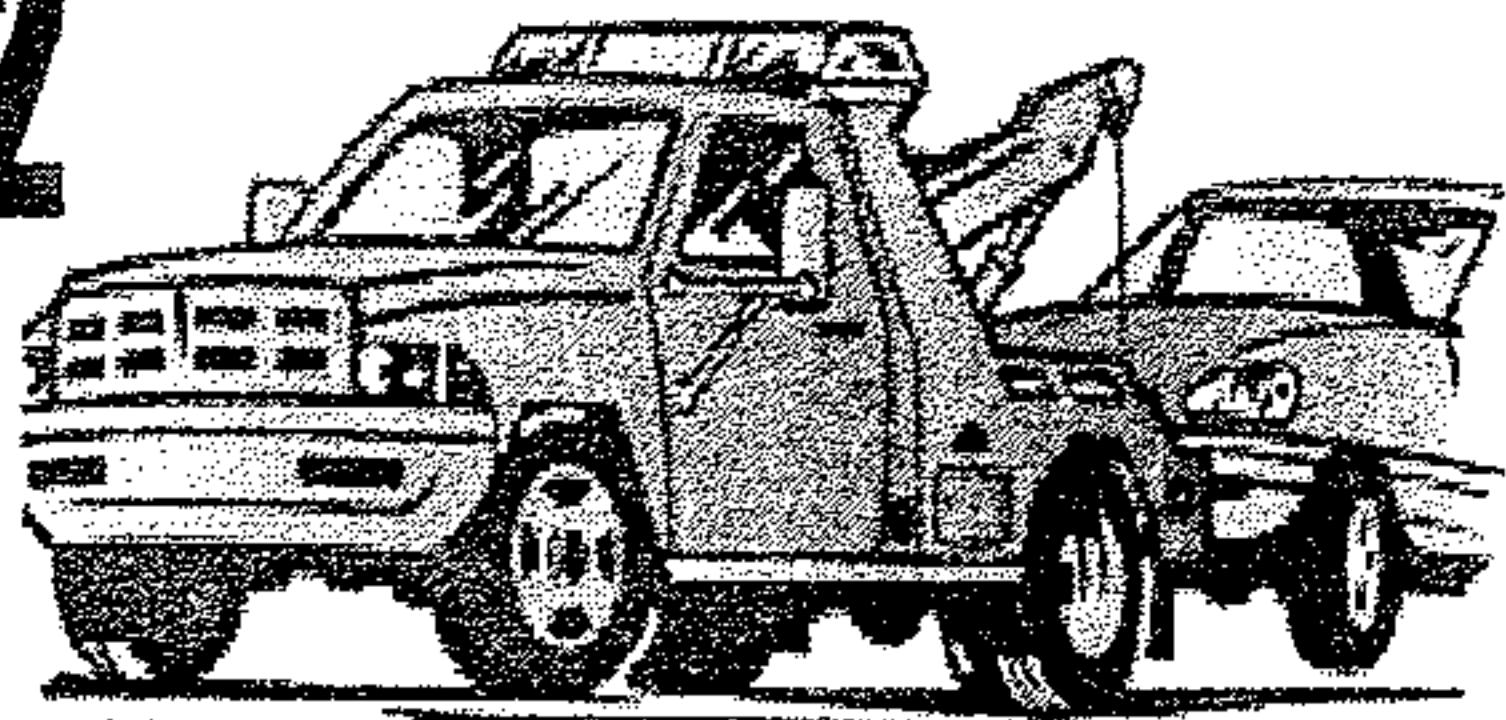

Craig Smallwood, 41, San Isidro Drive Sweetwater, was charged with Violation of Order Protection.

Officers was dispatched to W Lee Hwy. for a disturbance. Upon arrival Officer spoke to Mr. Craig Smallwood who stated his 15 year old daughter was inside this residence with a 27 year male Officer Bobby Lankford did locate the juvenile female inside the residence. Officer ran Mr. Smallwood's drivers license and NCIC showed he was the respondent of an order of protection from Monroe County with the petitioner being who was sitting in the vehicle with him. Dispatch advised the order of protection stated the two to have no social contact. Dispatch did call Monroe County dispatch and did confirm they had on file the order of protection. Due to this Officer did place Mr. Smallwood in custody for violation of an order of protection. Mr. Smallwood was transported to the Loudon County Jail. Dustin Merrill, 24, Calderwood Hwy Maryville, was charged with Poss. of Drug Para., and Assisting other Agency.

Deputy Kevin Dailey LCSO, observed a red Mazda pickup

going 44 mph in a 35 mph at Morganton Rd and Meadow Rd West through pacing the vehicle. Traffic stop was initiated at Morganton Rd and Blount County line where Deputy came in contact with the driver and passenger Dustin Merrill, after speaking to the driver dispatch advised that Mr. Merrill had warrants out of Blount County and Monroe County. As Deputy was speaking to Mr. Merrill he noticed he was profusely sweating from his face, and was nervous in his actions by moving around for no reason. He was taken into custody when the warrants were confirmed where he had 2 warrants from Blount and 2 from Monroe, inside his right cargo pocket was a spoon and needle cap where he stated he did not have anything else in the vehicle. While looking from the door Deputy observed a aluminum foil wrapper in the passenger seat that was under Mr. Merrill as well as seeing a needle which turned out to be 6 needles in the top of a camouflage bag. Inside the aluminum foil was a white powder which Mr. Merrill indicated was Cocaine in which he had just bought. He was taken into custody and driver was given a verbal warning for speeding where she was released. This all did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

Scripture: Matthew 4:12-23

"Repent for the kingdom of God is near." It is easy to interpret these words as harsh and unforgiving. And yet for Jesus they are an invitation to live into the promise of God's compassionate justice. The phrasing could just as easily read this way: "Good news! The kingdom of God is near! Oh, and by the way, the power of this news can only lead to repentance." That is to say, it's nearly impossible to dwell in darkness when you are standing in the presence of a great light. It is awfully hard to believe lies when the truth is walking with you. Or as Martin Luther King, Jr. put it: "A lie cannot live."
