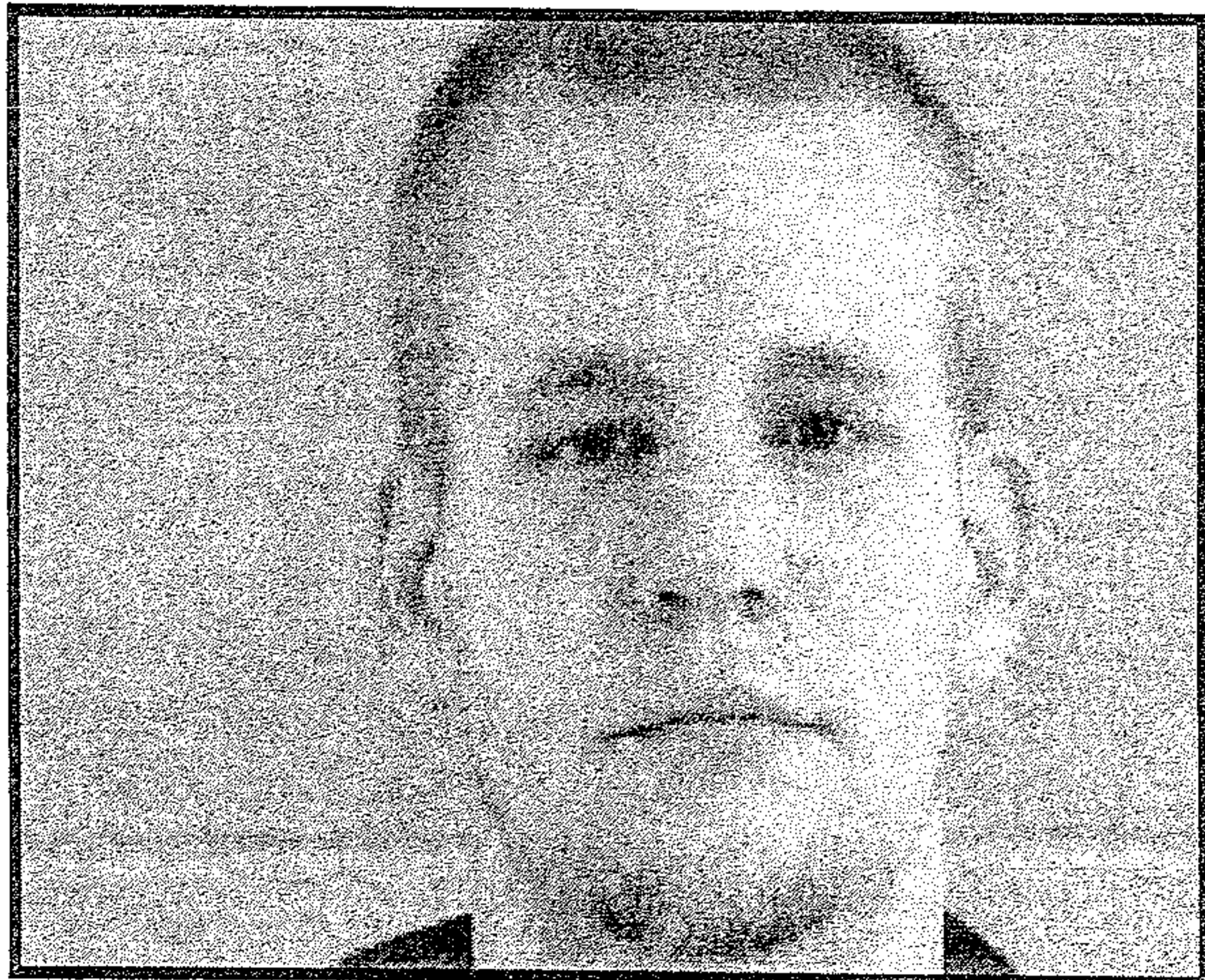

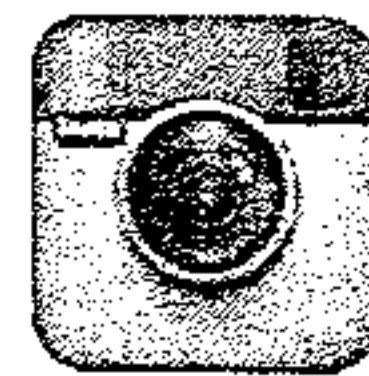

 fied her self as Kristi behind the drivers seat, and another white female identified as Ms. Kimberly Ann Wilkerson putting gas inside the vehicle. The two females were arguing and appeared to be intoxicated on narcotics. Ms. Wilkerson was arrested for a failure to appear out

of Loudon County Sessions Court (53gs-2016-cr-598). The female that identified her self as Ms. Kristi was identified as Ms. Christina Deanne Cook. 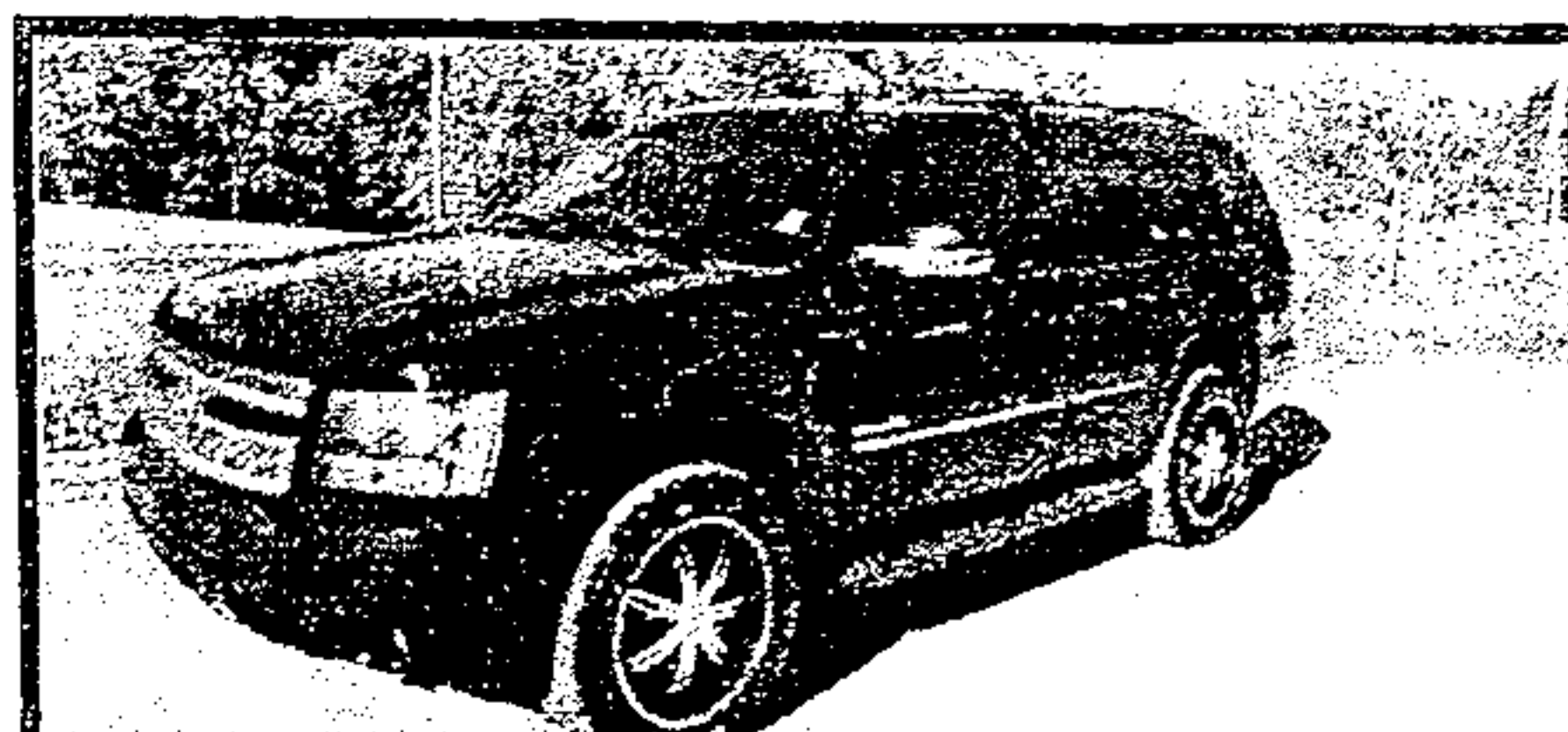

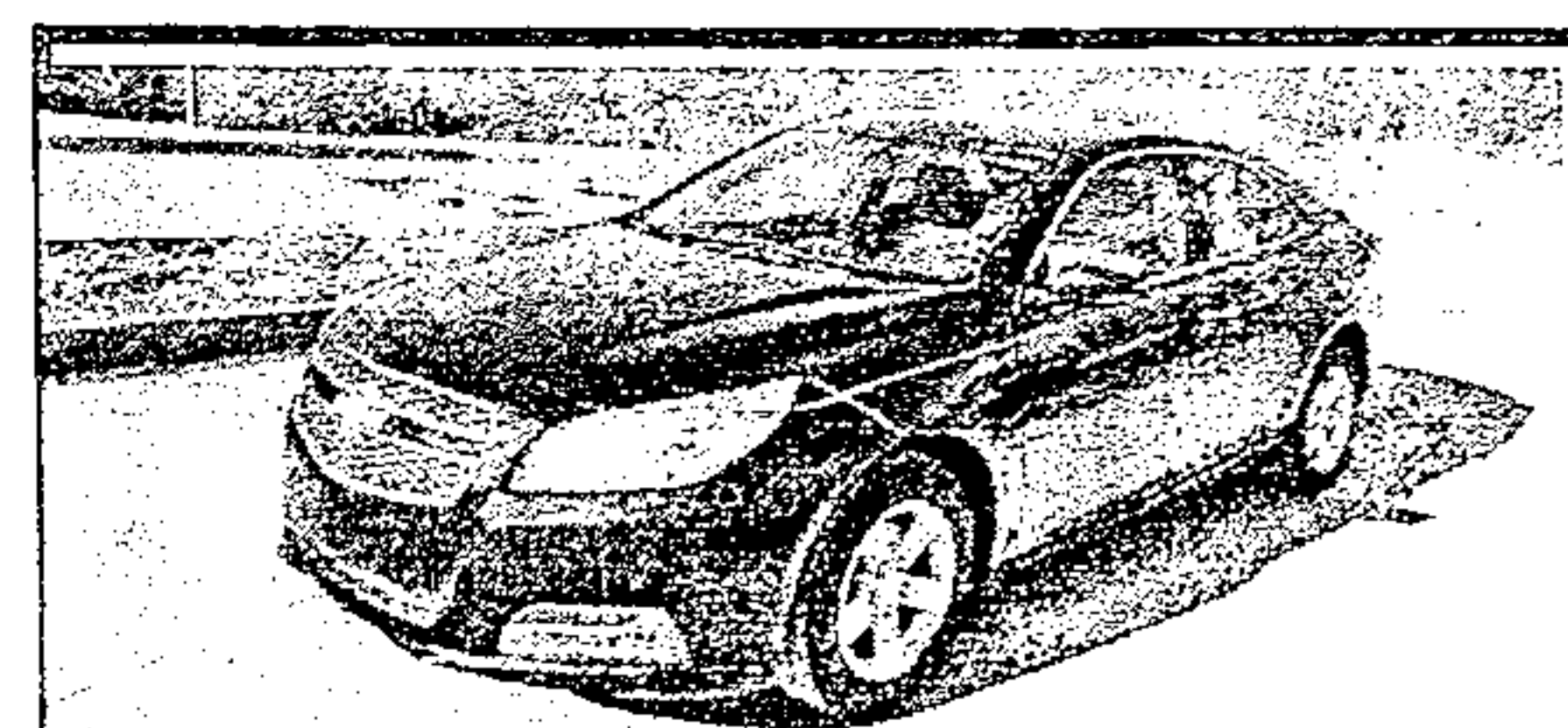

methods citizens have created to support foster parents and the children they serve, from a church that has built a safe room to a non-profit organization that helps celebrate foster children's birthdays.

"Every child has the right to a loving family," Gov. Haslam said. "Tennessee currently has well over 6,000 children in foster care, through no fault of their own. More than 4,000 incredible foster parents have stepped

up to provide a safe and supportive environment to these children. At the same time, we are always looking for more foster families to help us get these children safe, healthy and back on track." Not everyone can

become a foster parent, but there are a variety of proven opportunities to help. The goal of TNFosters is to encourage the faith-based community, creative leaders, non-profits and the private sector to find even

more ways to advocate for children in the state foster care system.

"We are launching the TNFosters campaign not only to find more amazing foster parents but to recruit additional support into the system," Mrs. Haslam said. "There are countless ways to help these foster parents and children, and we intend to match those needs with caring Tennesseans who want to help."

The Haslams were joined for the campaign's launch on Monday at Cross Point Church in downtown Nashville by state legislators, judges, local officials, non-profit and business leaders. The effort is spearheaded in large part by America's Kids Belong, a national organization that has launched similar efforts in five other states.

"The America's Kids Belong team believes that every child in foster care is unique and carries with them their own story, but they also have a few things in common: resilience, big dreams and even greater potential," AKB President Brian Mavis said. "They just need a loving, patient and supportive family to help them thrive. Our team is honored and excited to be a part of this movement that will build on the recent child welfare successes in Tennessee. Together we can change the story for children in foster care."

Tennessee is poised to emerge from a 16-year-old federal consent decree that has contributed to strengthening its public-child welfare practice. A large part of those successes include a more

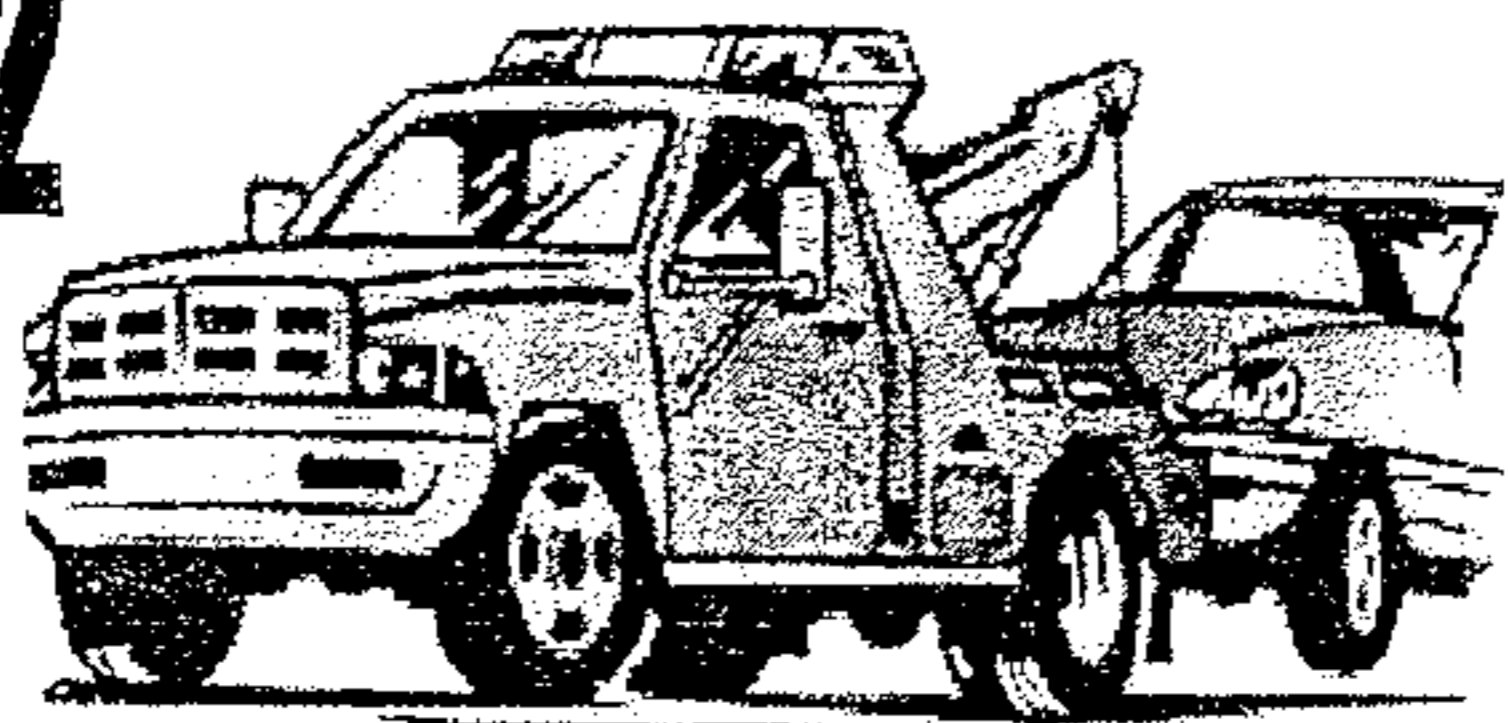

Kavonte Carson, 22, Russellwood Drive Rockford, was charged with Evading Arrest, and Man/Sell/Del/Re-sale Sch. VI.

Deputy K. Palmer LCSO, was dispatched to Hirst Circle for a suspicious vehicle. Deputy was advised by dispatch that it was a red Dodge pickup. When Deputy turned onto Hirst Circle he observed the vehicle in question turning onto Old Midway Road from Hirst Circle. Deputy turned around on the vehicle at which time he caught up to it on Highway 11. Deputy stopped the vehicle on Garnet Hill Drive just off Highway 11. When the vehicle stopped on Garnet Hill Drive the passenger door opened and the passenger took off running. Deputy made contact with the driver at which time he was detained. Deputy asked the driver who the subject was that took off running. The driver stated it was Kavonte Carson. Deputy ran that name though dispatch at which time the suspect had warrants out of Blount

Count and Anderson County. Deputy located a blue container which had three baggy's of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana right outside the door where the suspect took off running. It was approximately 28 grams of green leafy substance all together. We did attempt to locate the suspect after he ran but was unable to locate him at the time.

Dispatch did receive a call from a residence on the back side of where the suspect took off running about a black male that knocked on the door. The subject at the residence stated the male said his name was Kavonte Carson and he was wanting to use the phone. The subject at the residence stated he would not let him use the phone so he took off running again. We were still unable to locate the suspect at that residence. Deputy did write warrants on Mr. Carson for evading arrest and manufacture, sell, delivery, possession of Sch 6. This did occur in Loudon County TN. Christopher Crandall, 24, Northshore Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault Felony.

Deputy Jamie Ketner LCSO, was dispatched to Northshore Dr. on a physical domestic.

Dispatched advised Deputy that Christopher Crandall had choked victim and had left the scene in a white pickup truck. Dispatched then advised that Mr.Crandall had went back to the house. Cpl.Hutchens was first to arrive on scene and had detained Mr. Crandall Mr.Crandall stated that he had two "tall boys" he also had a cut straw in his pocket used to snort narcotics. Mr.Crandall stated that someone was watching him and that the mafia was going to kill him. Deputy spoke with victim and she was on the phone and her son was in the floor on the computer and he started to cuss and get upset. Victim then stated Mr.Crandell pushed her on the bed, straddled her and choked her unconscious.

Victim stated that while he was choking her Mr.Crandell said "Are you ready to meet your maker?" victim did urinate on herself because she passed out. Victim did have red marks on her neck

consistent with being choked and the bed was wet where she urinated on herself. Deputy arrested Mr. Crandall and transported him to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

robust foster parent recruitment and retention program, and the TN-Fosters campaign will build on those ongoing successes at DCS.

"We are always seeking to expand the pool of homes," DCS Commissioner Bonnie Hommrich said. "We are also looking for foster parents who are willing to accept a wider range of children into their homes – not just small children, but sibling groups and teenagers too."

Commissioner Hommrich also outlined a set of expectations:

Over the next nine months, recruit a minimum of 100 forever homes for the population of children free for adoption who don't have a family identified.

In 2017, recruit and license 10 percent more foster homes than

the number voluntarily closed in calendar year 2016.

In 2017, begin recruitment initiatives that result in no less than 5 percent of the churches in a county committing to be a part of this faith-based initiative.

Also joining the Governor and the First Lady Monday were other advocates for foster children, including the Tennessee Alliance for Children and Families, an organization composed of the state private-provider network, which offer specialized foster care to the state's children. Also in the forefront was the Tennessee Alliance for Kids, a new group which will be building a network to connect the needs of children and families to churches and organizations that want to help.

The Department of Children's Services is Tennessee's public child welfare agency. It includes child protective services, foster care, adoption, independent living programs and juvenile justice. In total, approximately 7,900 children are currently in its care.
