Haslam Announces Drive to 55 Capacity Fund Grants

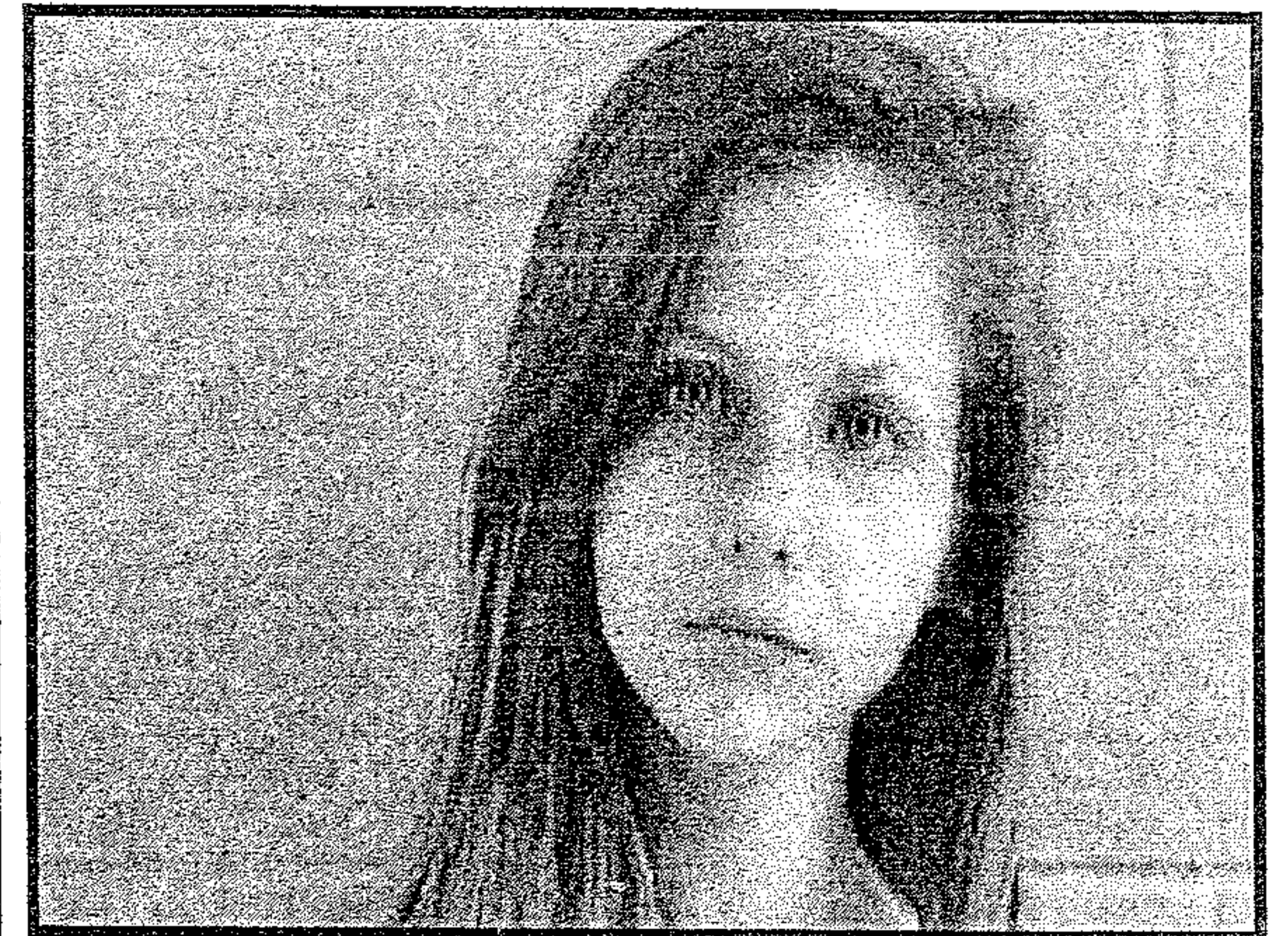
Funds Will Help Provide Opportunity and Growth to College Students across Tennessee

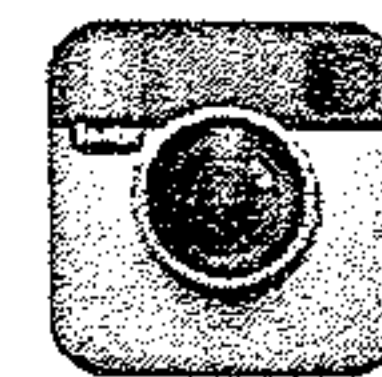

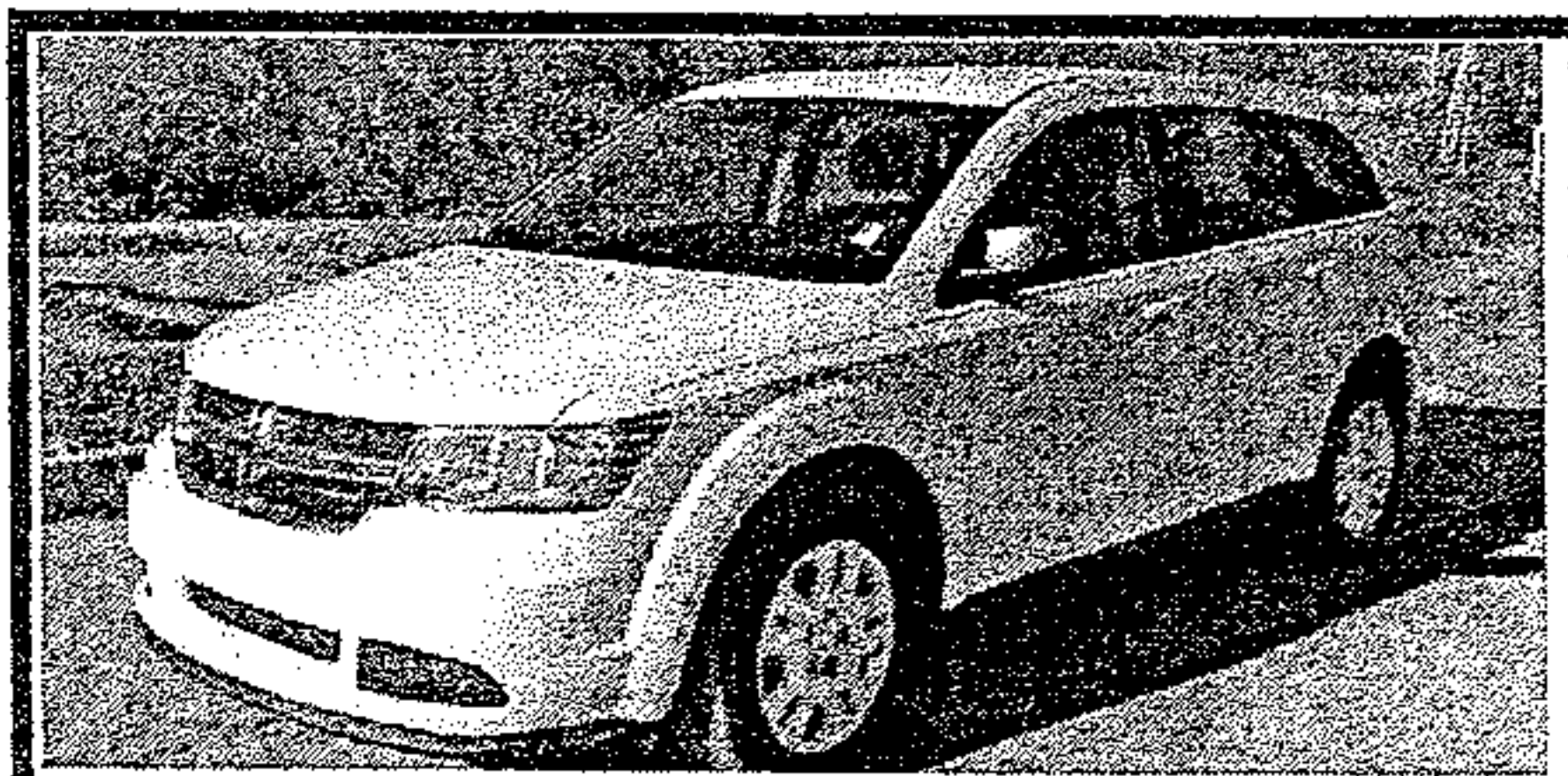

yellow pill container that contained one orange pill later identified as Oxymorphone Hydrochloride ER 40mg and three white pills later identified as Xanax 2mg. Officer then asked Mr. White if he would be willing to do Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) at which time he agreed to and performed poorly on. Mr. White was then placed under arrest for Driving Under the Influence. Officer then read Mr. White the Tennessee Implied Consent Law at which time he refused. Ms. Gamble was also arrested for simple possession of schedule

2 and schedule 4. Mr. White and Ms. Gamble were both transported to the Loudon County Jail. Upon an inventory of Ms. Gamble's purse a blue cut straw with a white residue was located and charged with possession of drug paraphernalia. This did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, TN.

Drive unprecedented numbers of students enrolling in college for the first time. As Tennessee Promise has made college a reality for so many of our students, we are committed to providing our institu-

tions with the resources to support them," Haslam said. "The Drive to 55 Capacity Fund assists our campuses in getting these students to and through college so we can continue to close the skills gap in Tennessee's

workforce." The fund awarded a total of \$24.3 million to ten colleges and universities. The projects funded include a new TCAT training facility in Anderson County through the Tennessee College of Applied

Technology (TCAT) Knoxville, an advanced robotics training facility for Motlow State Community College, and an expansion of the nursing program at Dyersburg State Community College. First-time fresh-

man enrollment at Tennessee's colleges and universities grew by 10 percent in 2015, including a 25 percent increase at community colleges and a 20 percent increase at TCATs. Tennessee also saw a historic year-over-year growth in the state's college-going rate in 2015, increasing 4.6 percentage points in just one year.

"As we have expanded access to higher education through the Drive to 55, it is crucial that we ensure colleges and universities have the resources to prepare students for the workforce," Mike Krause, executive director of the Tennessee Higher Education Commission, said. "The process of awarding these funds was very competitive and each funded program will provide opportunity and growth to students across our state."

A total of 44 proposals were submitted, requesting a combined \$120.9 million for construction or renovation or for program expansion. All projects seeking funding were required to demonstrate need for building capacity to respond to student enrollment and statewide workforce demands.

Proposals were reviewed by a team of readers from across state government, including the Department of Economic and Community Development, the Department of Labor and Workforce Development, the Tennessee Board of Regents, and the University of Tennessee system. Based on reader scores and final approval from the Tennessee Higher Edu-

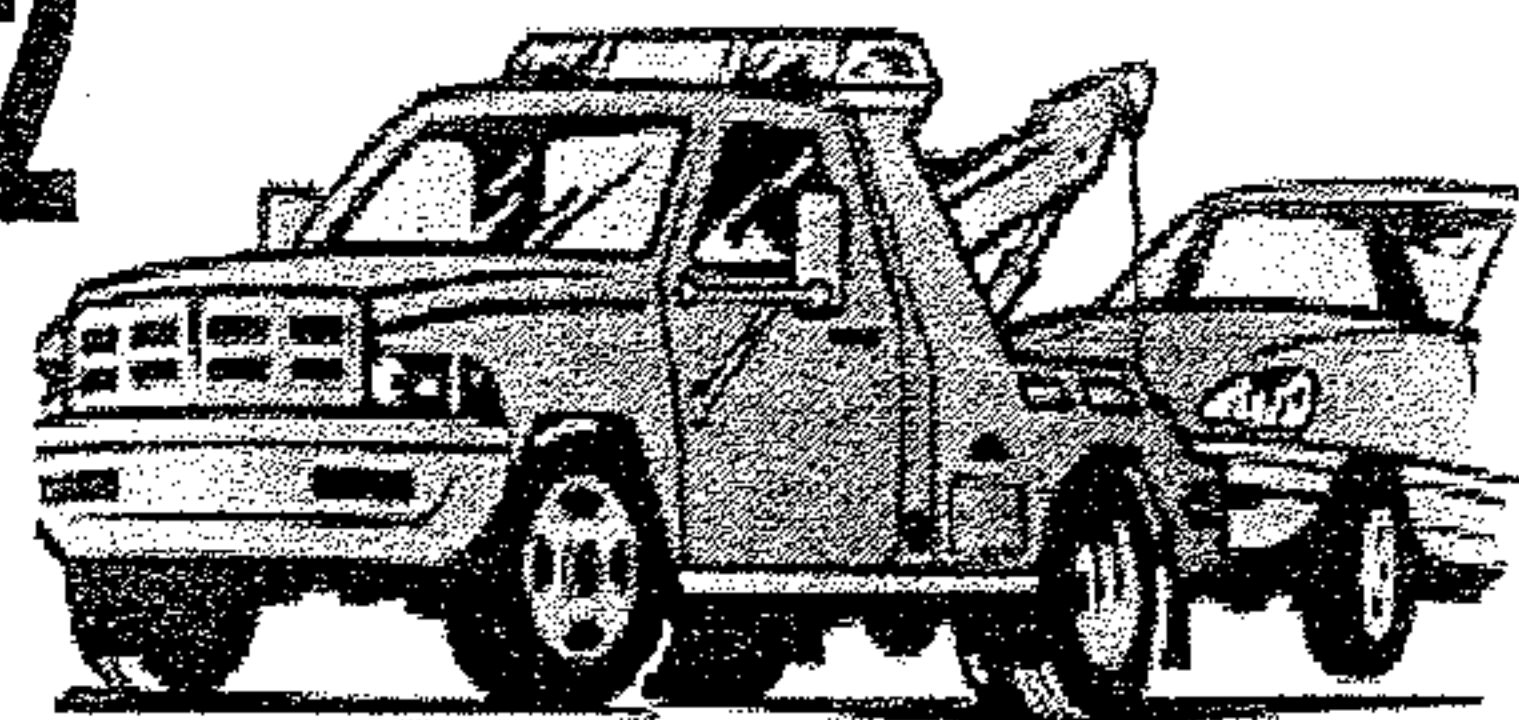

Arrest

Dallas Householder, 24, of Yacht Haven Lane, Knoxville, was charged with possession of drug paraphernalia.

Deputy K. Palmer LCSO, was dispatched to Hirst Circle for a suspicious vehicle. Deputy was advised by dispatch that the vehicle was a red Dodge pickup. When Deputy was turning onto Hirst Circle he observed the vehicle in question turning onto Old Midway Road. Deputy turned around on the vehicle at which time he caught up to the vehicle on Highway 11. Deputy attempted traffic stop on Highway 11. The vehicle pulled onto Garnet Hill Drive just off Highway 11. When the vehicle stopped the passenger in the vehicle opened the door and took off running. Deputy then made contact with the driver Mr. Dallas Blake Householder. While up at the vehicle with Mr. Householder Deputy could smell a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle and at that time he was detained and placed in the back

of the patrol vehicle. While searching the vehicle Deputy located a blue meth pipe in the ash tray of the vehicle. Deputy also located a blue marijuana grinder under the driver side seat of the vehicle. Mr. Householder stated that the marijuana grinder was his but the meth pipe was not. Mr. Householder was placed under arrest for possession of drug paraphernalia and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

The vehicle was towed from the scene by Malones Wrecker Service. This did occur in Loudon County TN.

Violence

Traci Campbell, 39, Murray Chapel Road Sweetwater, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Deputy Lance Anderson LCSO, along with Deputy Frye 916, responded to Murray Chapel Rd in reference to a disturbance. Upon arrival Deputy made contact with the victim. The victim stated he had been in an argument with his girlfriend and a physical altercation occurred. The victim stated his girlfriend left prior to our arrival. Deputy observed the victim's lower lip to be bloody and slightly swollen. Deputy also observed several scratches and red marks on the victim's left side neck. The victim stated his girlfriend also bit him several times on the

arm and torso area, however he refused to show me the bit marks. The victim identified his girlfriend as Traci Campbell. The victim did not want to pursue charges. However based upon the victim's injuries and the totality of circumstances, Traci Campbell was determined to be the primary aggressor. Options were explained, all occurred in Loudon County, TN.

At approximately 23:19 Monroe County Dispatch advised they had made contact with the offender in Sweetwater, TN. The offender was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County line where Deputy took the offender into custody and transported her to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

About the Drive to 55

In 2013, Governor Haslam launched the Drive to 55 to increase the number of Tennesseans with a postsecondary degree or certificate to 55 percent by 2025. As a result, the Drive to 55 has established the Tennessee Promise program, the nation's first scholarship and mentorship program that provides high school graduates last-dollar scholarships to attend two years of community or technical college free of tuition and fees; reduced the number of college freshmen requiring remediation through the SAILS (Seamless Alignment and Integrated Learning Support) program; provided free technical college for adults through TCAT Reconnect Grants; created Tennessee Reconnect + Complete to help more adults return to college to complete unfinished degrees; developed a more comprehensive state approach to serving student veterans; and leveraged technology to enhance classroom instruction and college advising.
