
Under Tennessee's sentencing laws, Dawson faces a sentence range of three to fifteen years. ADA Smith stated that she will seek to establish, based on Dawson's previous criminal history, that Dawson is 'career offender' which would mean whatever sentence he receives would require incarceration in prison for at least 60% of the sentence before he is even eligible for the possibility of parole. "I think it is indicative of how the jury felt about Mr. Dawson's crime that it only took the jury fifteen minutes to make a unanimous determination that he was indeed guilty," Smith said. "The victim in this case is a hard working, honest man who took the stand and told the plain truth to the jury about Timothy Dawson. Along with the


