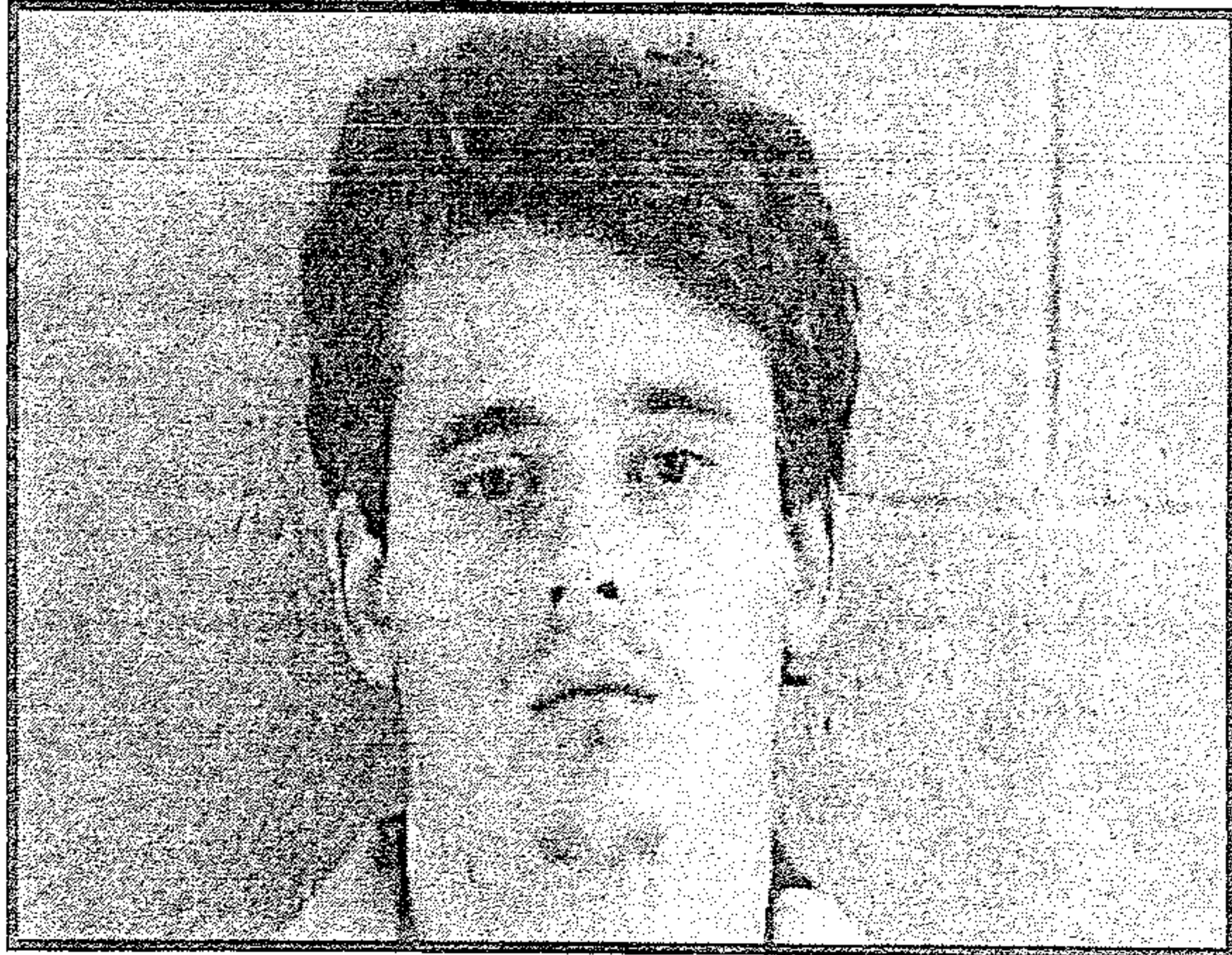


Victim left with multiple injuries after felony assault

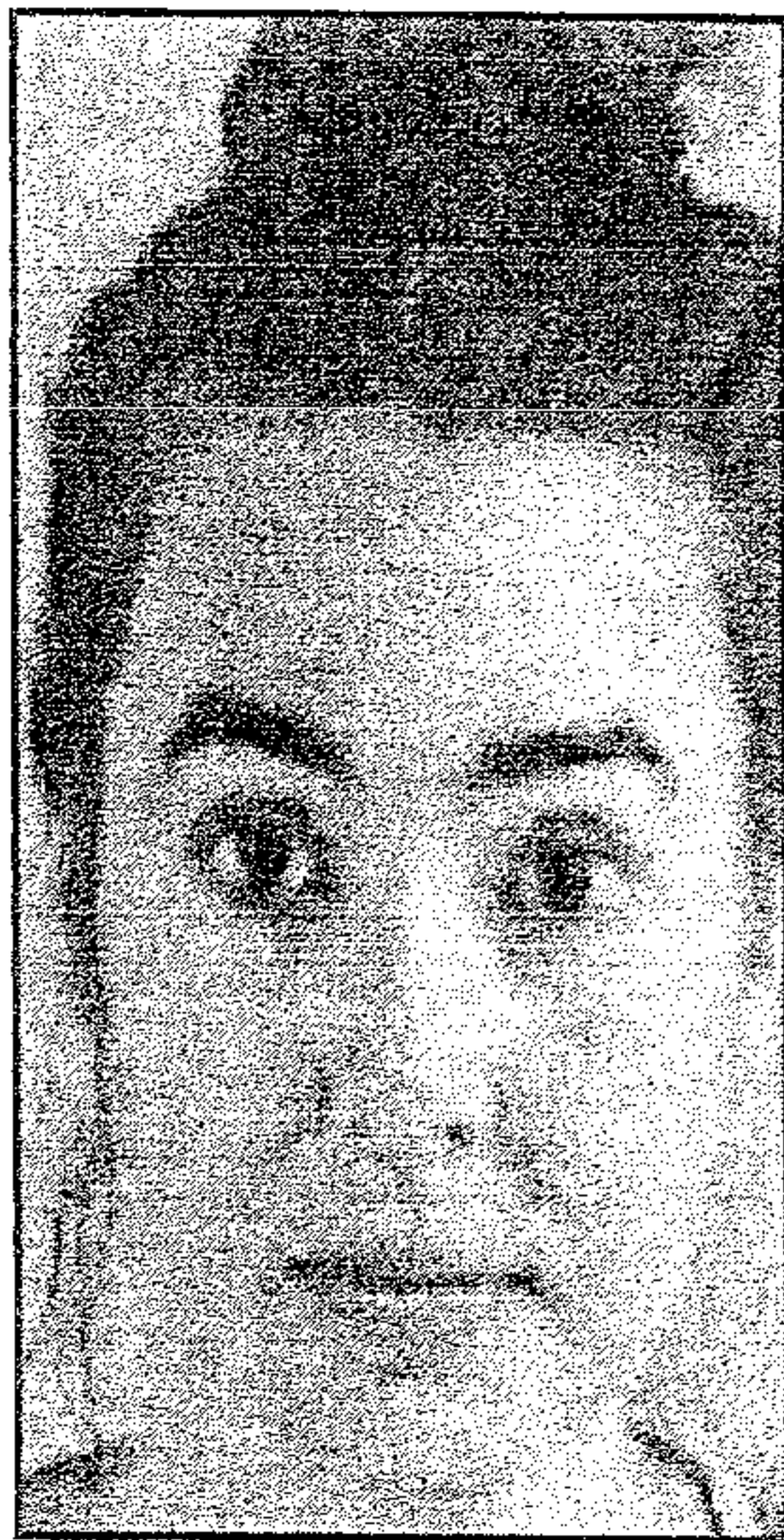

Crimes Against Children

Help Us Identify a Child Predator

The FBI is seeking the public's help to stop a child predator.

The unidentified woman being sought—known only as Jane Doe 39—can be seen in a video with a child who is being sexually exploited.

The video was obtained during an FBI investigation and forwarded to the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC), an organization that works closely with the Bureau to stop child predators. Further

investigation revealed that the images have surfaced elsewhere online, said Special Agent Susan Romash, who investigates child exploitation cases as part of the FBI's Violent Crimes Against Children program. "We know the video has been traded on the Internet," Romash said, "and we know this child is a victim who needs our help."

In the video, an adult woman is heard speaking Vietnamese, and at one point her face is shown.

“Our hope,” Romash said, “is that someone will recognize this individual’s face—or her voice—and come forward with information.”

The publicity efforts to identify and apprehend Jane Doe 39 are part of the FBI’s Operation Rescue Me and Endangered Child Alert Program (ECAP) initiatives.

Operation Rescue Me identifies child victims of sexual exploitation by using sophisticated image analysis to obtain evidence. ECAP seeks public and media assistance to help identify the John and Jane Does who display their faces—and other distinguishing characteristics such as tattoos—in pornographic images and videos of children.

The FBI has a long-standing partnership with NCMEC, which maintains a database of pornographic images traded online to help law enforcement coordinate and solve investigations. Working closely with NCMEC, FBI investigators look for metadata embedded within images that might contain GPS or other details that can reveal critical information.

“We also search for clues within the images,” Romash said. “Those clues often help us determine where the image was produced or who created it. If those approaches don’t work,” she explained, “but there is an adult in the image whose face is shown, we publicize it through ECAP and ask for the public’s help.”

The video depicting Jane Doe 39 and a child

victim was first noted by NCMEC in April 2016. The woman is described as an Asian female, likely between the ages of 25 and 35, with long black hair. She is wearing a white, yellow, blue, and red floral dress. In addition, she could be heard speaking Vietnamese.

The FBI is seeking the public’s assistance in identifying Jane Doe 39, a woman who can be heard speaking Vietnamese in this clip taken from a video in which a child is being sexually exploited.

Anyone with information can submit a tip online or call the FBI’s toll-free tip line at 1-800-CALL-FBI (1-800-225-5324).

Since its inception in 2004, ECAP has resulted in the identification of 26 of the 39 John/Jane Does, and in the recovery of more than 40 child victims. Operation Rescue Me, established in 2008, has resulted in the recovery of more than 200 child victims. “These programs work,” Romash said, “and we are again asking for the public’s help to save an innocent child from being victimized.”

Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted

66 Officers Feloniously Killed in 2016

A total of 118 law enforcement officers were killed in the line of duty in 2016, according to the FBI’s annual Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted (LEOKA) report released today. Of those deaths, 52 were accidental and 66 were felonious.

Additionally, 57,180 officers were assaulted in the line of duty, with nearly 30 percent of those officers being injured in the incidents.

All of these numbers increased from figures reported in 2015, when 45 officers died accidentally and 41 were feloniously killed in the line of duty. There were 50,212 assaults against law enforcement listed in the 2015 LEOKA report.

Through its Uniform Crime Reporting Program, the FBI collects data about the circumstances surrounding assaults against law enforcement and officer deaths. The data is collected from campus, local, state, tribal, and federal law enforcement agencies, as well as FBI field offices and non-profit organizations that track line-of-duty deaths. The LEOKA Program uses the data it collects to provide data-driven officer safety training to law enforcement officers around the country.

Of the 66 officers who were killed in criminal incidents:

The average age was 40 years old, with an average of 13 years of law enforcement experience.

Sixty-four of the officers feloniously killed were men, and two were women.

Nearly all of the officers were killed by firearms—62 out of 66. Of

the 62 officers killed by firearms, 51 were wearing body armor at the time they were killed.

Four officers were killed intentionally with vehicles.

The most common categories of circumstance surrounding officers’ line-of-duty deaths were ambushes (17), followed by answering disturbance

calls (13), and investigating suspicious people or circumstances (nine). (For more information on these incidents, see the summaries section of the report.)

Of the 52 officers who were killed in accidents:

The average age was 38 years old, with an average of 11 years of law enforcement experience.

Fifty of the officers accidentally killed were men, and two were women.

Half of the law enforcement officers killed accidentally in 2016 were killed in auto accidents—26 of the 52. Additionally, 12 were struck by vehicles, and seven were killed in motorcycle accidents.

The annual LEOKA re-

port also contains a separate section on federal law enforcement officers who were killed or assaulted in the line of duty last year. According to the 2016 federal data, one federal law enforcement officer was killed and 324 were injured.

Martha Morgan, 33, Mulberry Street Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Officers from the Loudon Police Department were dispatched to a hysterical female in the roadway in the area of Mulberry Street. Officers arrived and made contact with Martha Morgan at Mulberry

Street. Ms. Morgan explained to officers that she was involved in an argument with her boyfriend victim at the residence where they both reside. Ms. Morgan stated victim was physical with her and pushed her. Officers also made contact with victim whom told officers a similar story regarding an argument with his girlfriend Martha Morgan.

Victim was detailed in the events that unfolded. Victim stated that his girlfriend Martha Morgan came home from work and was "drunk" she began verbally arguing with victim and told him to leave. He went outside and was working in the garage when another roommate, came to him and said that Martha wanted to see him. Roommate left the scene and victim went back inside to talk with Ms. Morgan and an argument again ensued. During this argument victim began to leave with his belongings and went to retrieve a necklace. Victim

stated that Ms. Morgan then grabbed him by the neck. Visible, new scratches, were visible and bleeding at the time of this interview. Victim stated that he "slapped her hand away" and left the residence. After speaking with victim your Affiant spoke with Ms. Morgan and she corroborated the fact that the scratch marks on victim's neck were in fact from her. She had no visible marks or injuries. Ms. Morgan was found to be the primary aggressor and arrested for Domestic Violence Assault. This incident occurred in the City of Loudon.
