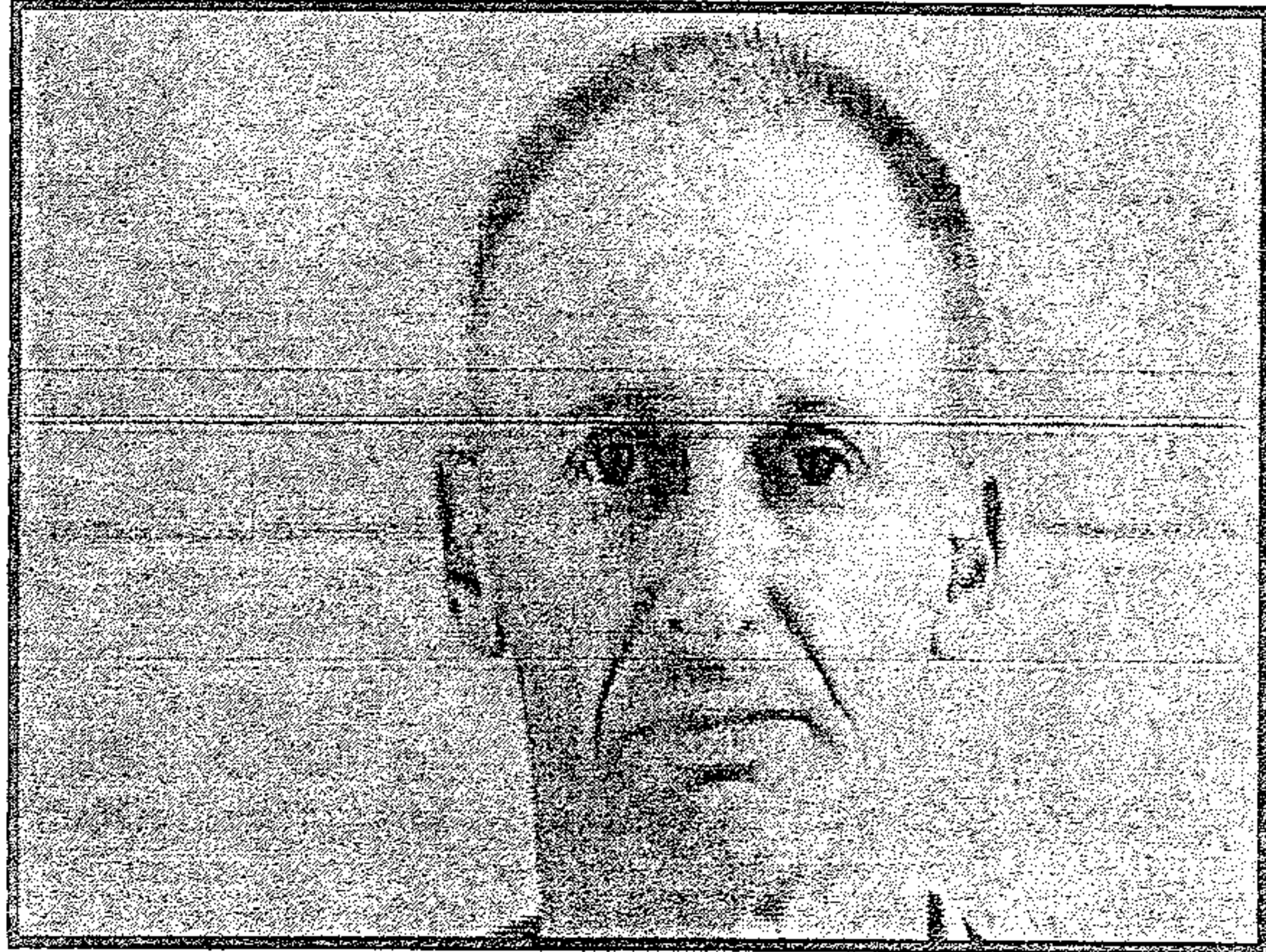

"Cyber risks can seem overwhelming in today's hyper-connected world, but there are steps you can take to protect yourself and reduce your risk," said Assistant Direc-

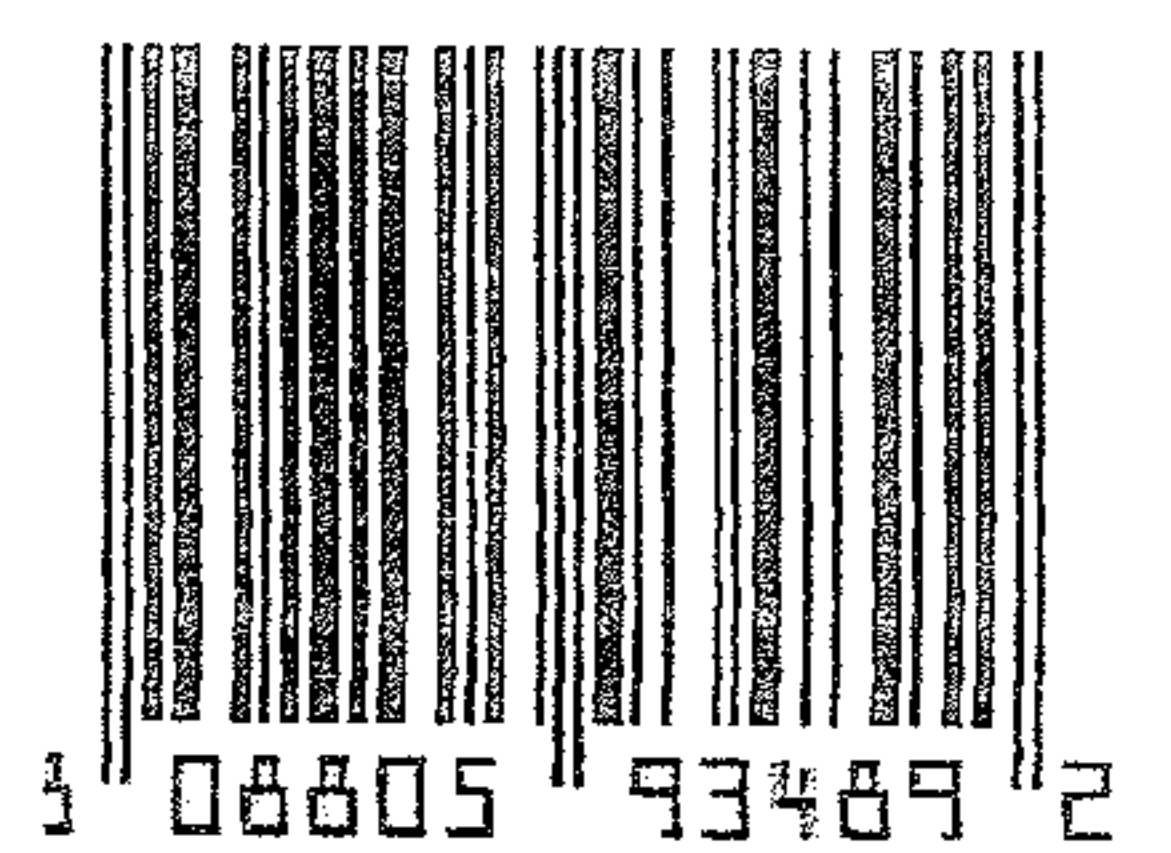

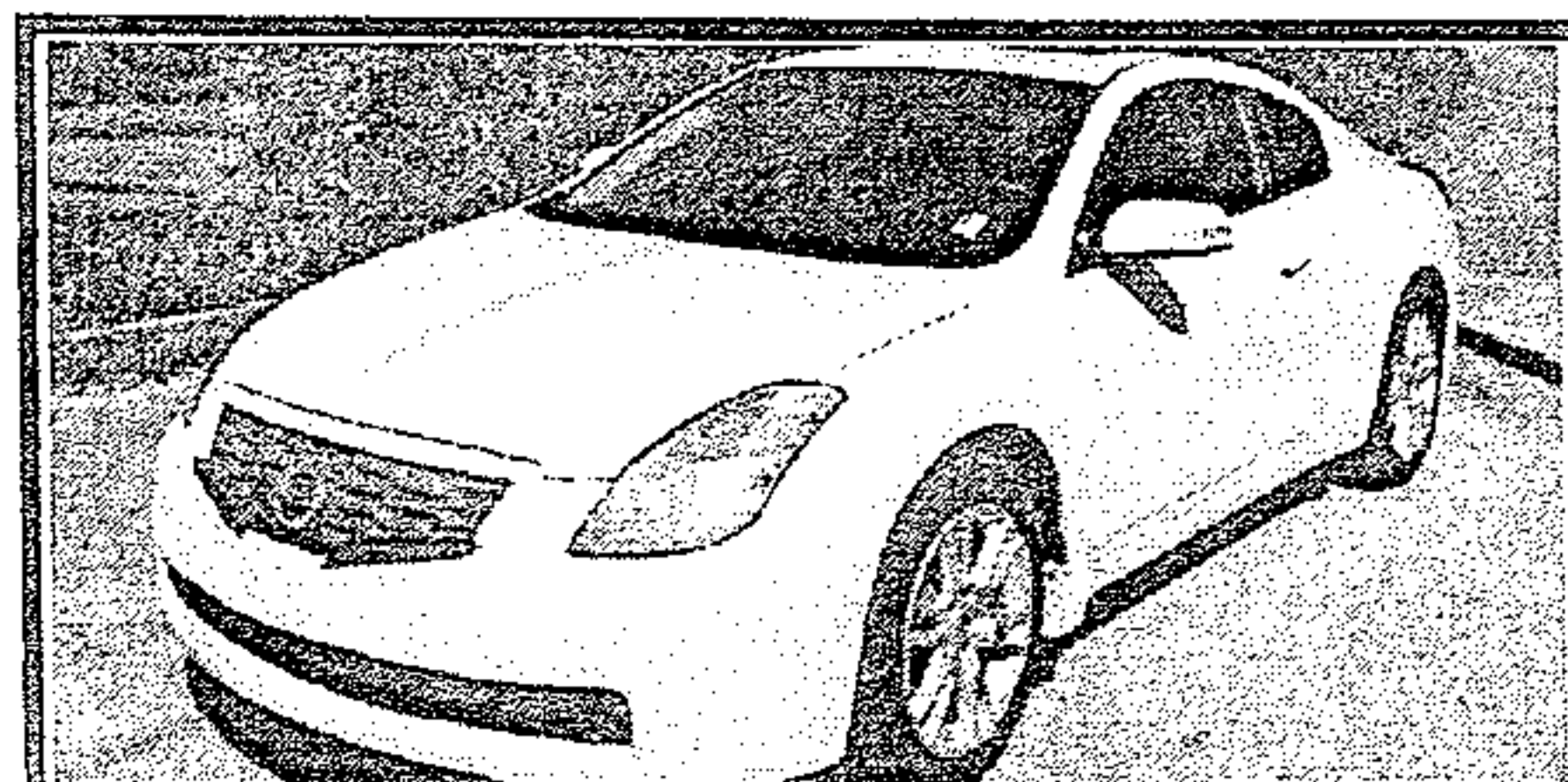

Officer Green, responded to Browder Hollow Rd. in reference to a physical domestic. Upon arrival Officer observed the complainant, Christie Cox, which had scratches on her knees, red marks on both sides of her face, and a dirty, stretched out shirt. The victim stated her and her boyfriend, Charles Edwards, had been consuming alcoholic beverages and began verbally

arguing due to her belief that Charles had been having sexual relations with an ex-girlfriend of his. She stated the argument became intense as she continued with the allegations. She stated Charles punched her in the face and shoved her off the porch causing the scratches on her knees and locked her out of the house. After being locked out she requested an Officer. After speaking with Mrs. Cox Officer spoke with Mr. Fields which stated they had both consumed too much alcohol causing the argument to get intense. He stated she continuously accused him of having sexual relations with an ex-girlfriend. After con-

tinuously refusing the allegations, Mrs. Cox became irate, slapping Mr. Charles in the face and ripping his shirt off of him. Officer observed Mr. Charles had a long red mark along his cheek and his shirt was stretched. Due to the fact Officer could not articulate the primary aggressor, Officer took both subjects into custody and they were transported to Loudon County Jail without incident.

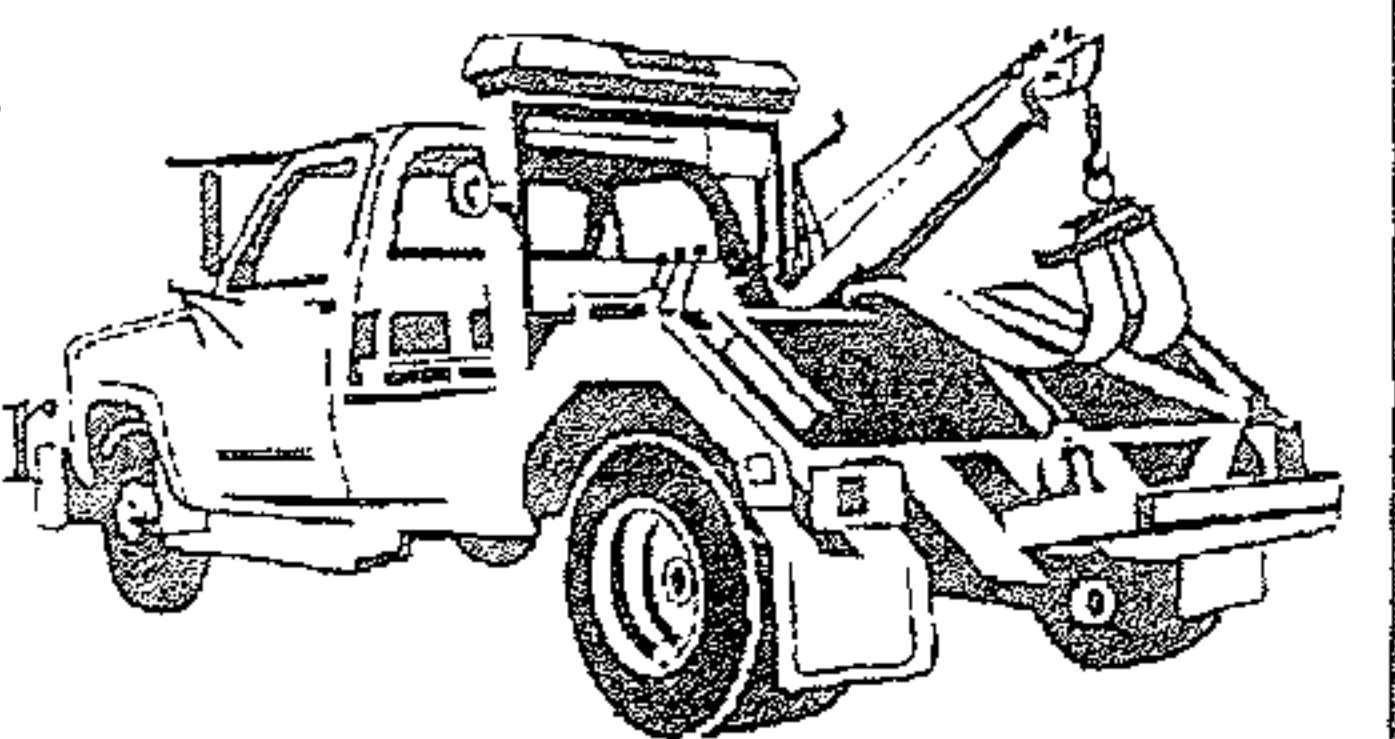

Use common sense; for example, don't click on a link from an unsolicited e-mail, and remember that if an online deal seems too good to be true, it probably is. And overall, remain vigilant to keep yourself and your family safe in the online world, just as you do in the physical world."

How can you protect yourself?

Learn about the IC3—and use it if you're ever a victim. The Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) is a reliable and convenient reporting mechanism for the public to submit complaints about Internet crime and scams to the FBI. The IC3 uses the information from public complaints to refer cases to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and identify trends. The IC3 has received nearly 4 million complaints since it was created in 2000. Anyone who is a victim of an Internet enabled crime, such as an online scam, should file a complaint with IC3 to help the FBI stop hackers and other cyber criminals. Learn more about the lifecycle of a complaint submitted to the IC3.

Practice good cyber hygiene at work. When you're at work, you're a target. From personal data to financial information to company secrets, company networks are a gold mine for hackers and fraudsters. One common scam that victimizes compa-

nies is Business e-mail compromise, in which a hacker will gain access to a company official's e-mail to defraud the company or access employees' private information. Additionally, ransomware, in which hackers will place malware in digital files that demands ransom, is a serious threat to companies and other large organizations. Know the risks of the Internet of Things (IOT). Cyber security goes beyond your computer and phone. Many homes are now filled with Internet-connected devices, such as home security systems, connected baby monitors, smart appliances, and Internet-connected medical devices. Using strong passwords and purchasing IOT devices from companies with a good security track record are just a few of the things you can do to protect your family and home.
