Fake 911

Jarius Miller, 24, Petersburg Road, Knoxville, was charged with Misuse of 911 Emergency System.

Officer Green LCPD, responded to 9th Ave. W. in reference to possible underage alcohol consumption. Upon my arrival Officer assessed the situation and began verifying the age of all occupants at the residence. While conducting his investigation, Dispatch notified LCPD of a possible shots fired call that occurred at Walmart in which the caller refused to leave a name. Dispatch then notified LCPD a second call was made from Home Depot of a similar situation. Upon further investigation Dispatch notified that the 911 calls

were plotted at the residence Officer was currently investigating for underage consumption. Dispatch notified Officer this subject called in from the cell phone number which belonged to Jarius Miller. Officer gathered the occupants of the residence in the living room to determine who the caller was. Dispatch then sent Officer the audio recording of the 911 call that took place. Comparing the voice on the recording to the occupants of the residence, Officer concluded Mr. Jarius Miller had made both phone calls using different cell phones. Mr. Miller claimed responsibility several times throughout investigation. Mr. Miller stated he made these calls in an attempt to

remove all officers from the residence to continue the party. Officer took Mr. Miller into custody and charged him with Misuse of 911 TCA 7-86-316. Officer then transported him to Loudon County Jail without incident.

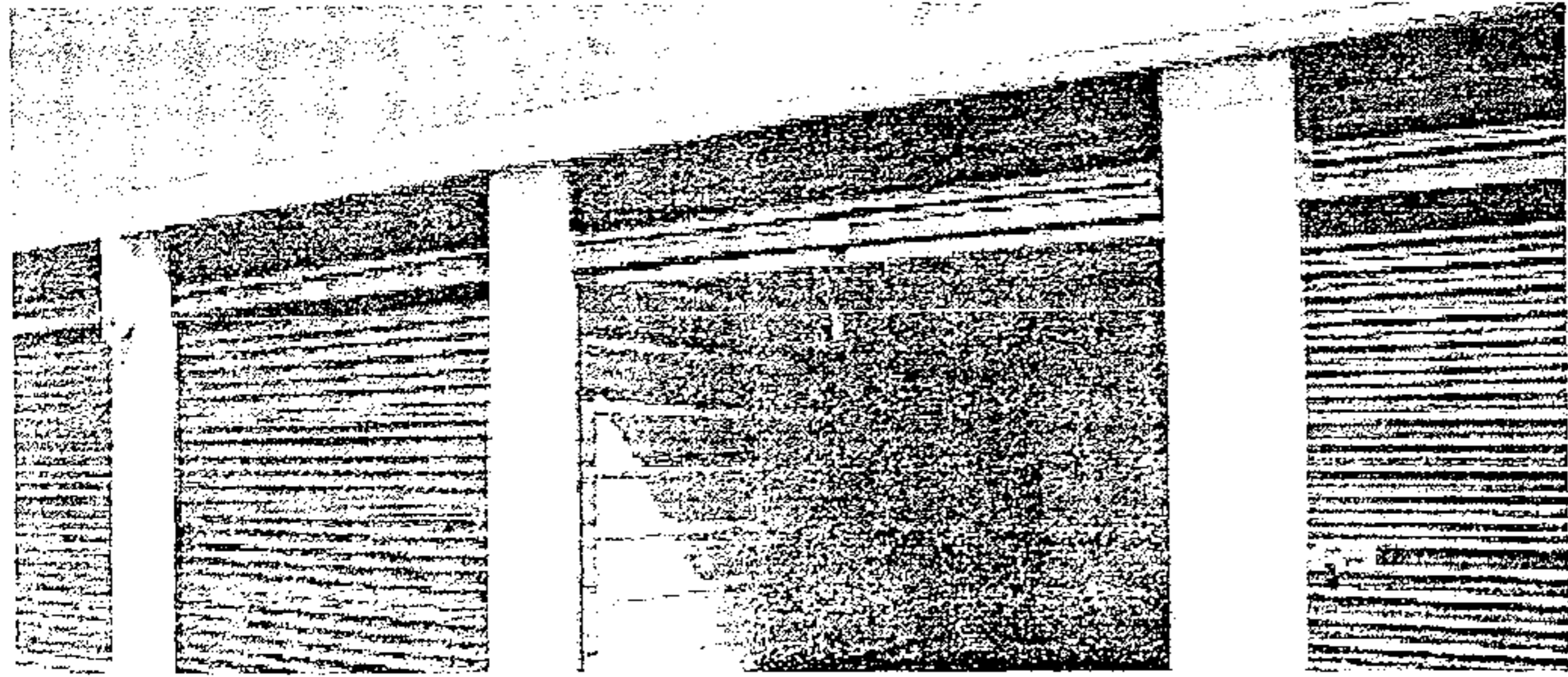
Possession

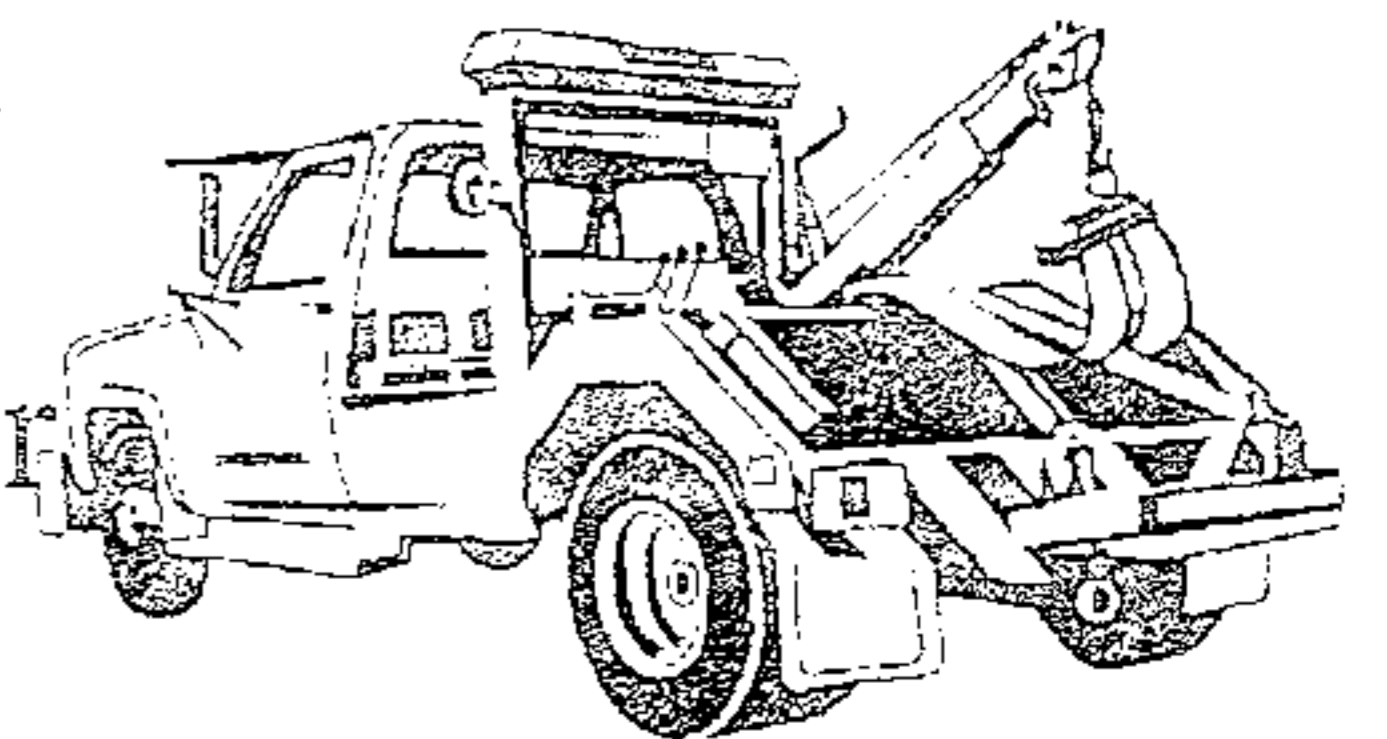

Hugh Clemmer, 47, Vann Street Tellico Plains, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale II x2.

Lisa Roberts, 42, Vann Road Madisonville, was charged with Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, Legend Drugs, and Criminal Impersonation.

Deputy Cody Fritts LCSO, observed a Green Saturn car traveling on Spring street. The vehicle was traveling in the center of the roadway on several occasions and the front seat passenger was not wearing a seat belt.

Upon stopping the ve-

hicle the driver gave the information of Kimberly Sue and date of birth 08/21. Her real identity was later found to be Lisa Roberts. The rear passenger was identified as Hugh Clemmer and front seat passenger was identified.

Upon speaking with the driver Ms. Roberts Deputy noticed signs of intravenous drug use on her hands and arms. Ms. Roberts hands were also shaky and she appeared nervous. Deputy asked the owner of the vehicle for consent to search his vehicle and he agreed. Found in the back seat between the seats in a plas-

tic bag were 33 pills. 18 white pills with imprint M365 (Hydrocodone 5mg) and 15 peach pills with imprint V3605 (Hydrocodone 7.5).

Mr. Clemmer stated the pills belonged to him. Upon searching Ms. Roberts purse her real identification was found. Also found in Ms. Roberts purse was baggy with 7 yellow pills imprint UL15 (Meloxicam) and 4 Blue and Red Capsules with imprint GW3171 (Clindamycin). Upon running Ms. Roberts through dispatch she was found to be driving on a Revoked Driver License. Lisa Roberts and Hugh Clemmer were taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail. This did happen in Loudon County.

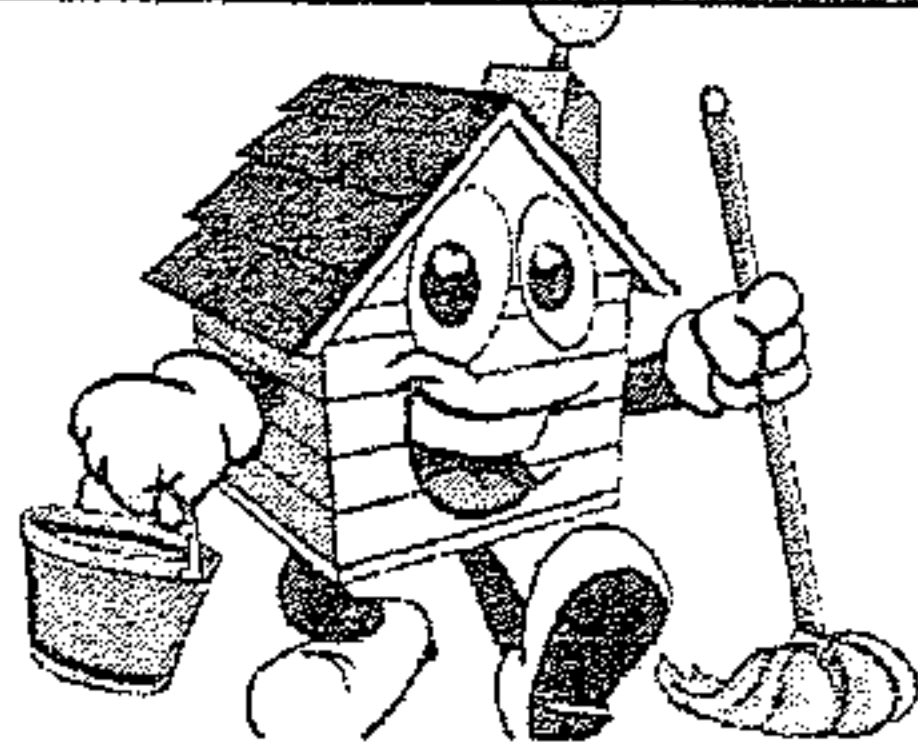

Emily Orr, 21, Rose Street Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Deputy J.C. Schultz LCSO, responded to a suspicious vehicle call at Hickory Creek Rd. Upon arrival Deputy contacted a blue Toyota Corolla sedan. Deputy approached the vehicle which was running and in gear and attempted to wake up the offender who was later identified as Ms. Emily Orr. The female was confused, had bloodshot eyes, and was slurring her speech. After asking the offender to exit the vehicle Deputy asked her what she was doing in this drive way, she responded with she was waiting on a female to come and pick her up. Deputy asked the offender if he could perform field sobriety on her and she agreed.

She was unsteady on her feet, had trouble concentrating, and was unable to complete any part of field sobriety. What tasks she did perform, she performed poorly. The offender was taken into custody. She was explained implied consent and she agreed to give a sample of blood for testing. She was asked if there were any drugs or syringes on her and she stated no.

Dispatch advised Ms. Orr had a revoked license for failure to satisfy a criminal offense, and that she

had a warrant out of Knox County for aggravated assault (NIC-W542157339). A hold was placed with Knox County.

Upon inventory of the vehicle prior to towing, Deputy found 10 syringes, a spoon with a filter and a substance in it, pills, a grill lighter, and water.

The syringes were also inside Ms. Orr's purse with the spoon. There a gorilla mask, and a knife in the passenger floorboard. The vehicle was towed and stored at Malone's wrecker service. Ms. Orr was transported Fort Loudon Emergency where blood was drawn. She was then transported to Loudon County Jail. This did occur in Loudon County, TN.

the bridge heading towards Maryville. Officer activated his siren and vehicle continued for approximately one mile before coming to a stop. Driver of the Vehicle was identified as Daniel V. Tindell of Clinton, Tn. License showed to be suspended for failure to pay child support. Officer did smell an odor commonly associated with marijuana coming from inside the car and during removal of driver and passenger Matthew O. Tindell a Handgun was seen in the passenger floor board and for officer safety both males were placed into cuffs. Search of the vehicle during DUI investigation rendered approx-

imately 3.8 grams of a green leaf substance and THC WAX, a set of digital scales, plastic baggies, several glass pipes used to smoke marijuana, a Taurus 38 handgun, and 4 long guns/rifles/shotguns, one of which came back stolen out of the state of Georgia (20gauge shotgun).

All property was inventoried and removed from scene until investigation is completed. For safety Officer at this time took driver to a safe location and did conduct Field Sobriety Task in which subject performed poorly on. Tennessee Implied

Consent form was read and signed and a successful blood draw was conducted at Fort Loudon Medical Center. Daniel Tindell and Matthew Tindel were both transported to the Loudon County Jail and booked on several charges.

 arrived in the parking area he observed a white Dodge Durango leaving the parking area driven by an older male (Ronnie Mcmillan) and also occupied by a younger female.

Your Affiant was familiar with both. Your Affiant observed that no brake lights

were visible from the back of the vehicle due to the height of the trailer and non working lights on the trailer. Also no registration was visible. Prior to the stop bot myself and Sgt. Scott Newman observed furtive movements by both the driver and the passenger into the center console area of the vehicle.

Affiant conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle and spoke with the occupants. They both claimed that no physical confrontation took place at Food City.

Ronnie Mcmillan, the owner of the vehicle, whom Officer know to be on State Probation for drug charges related to prescription pills, gave your Affiant consent to search the vehicle.

This search resulted in locating 10 oblong pills identified as Oxycodone in a plastic vial between the drivers seat and the center console.

McMillan was mirandized by your Affiant and stated that he received the pills from an unnamed individual earlier this morning to replace pills that McMillan had given to this unnamed individual earlier in the month. McMillan has a prescription for oxycodone but not that specific type and received those pills outside the purview of his doctors prescription. Mcmillan was charged with simple possession of Schedule II pills. This happened in the City of Loudon.
