Kit Mitchell, 44, Cherokee Circle Madisonville, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II., Simple Possession, and Poss. of Drug Para. Officer John Ailor LCPD, was contacted by Monroe County Deputy Danny Graham, in reference to a consensual search of a room at the Econolodge in Lenoir City that Kit Mitchell had booked in his name. Upon search approx. 26.4 grams of a clear crystal substance, believed to be methamphetamine, was located in a container, approx. 1.8 grams of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana, several plastic baggies used to repackage and resale meth, glass pipe and a digitz electronic scale.

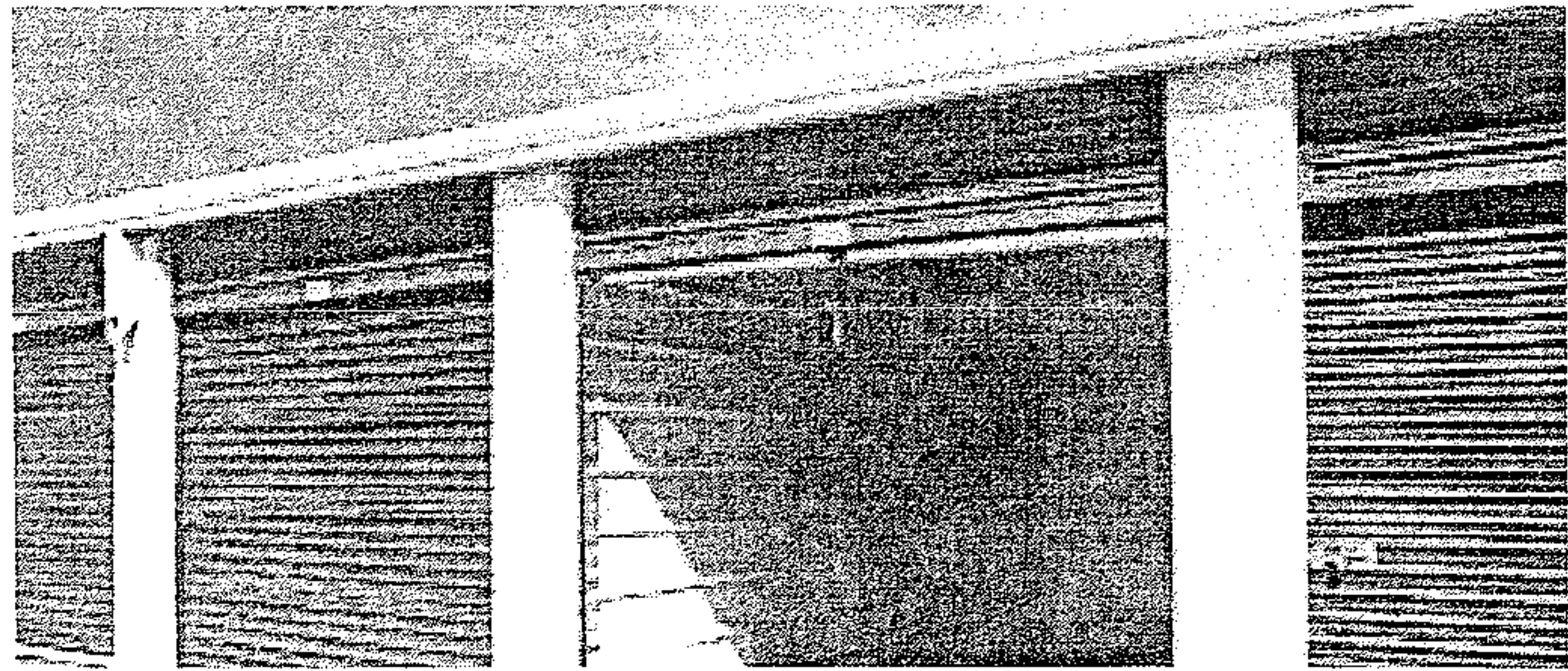

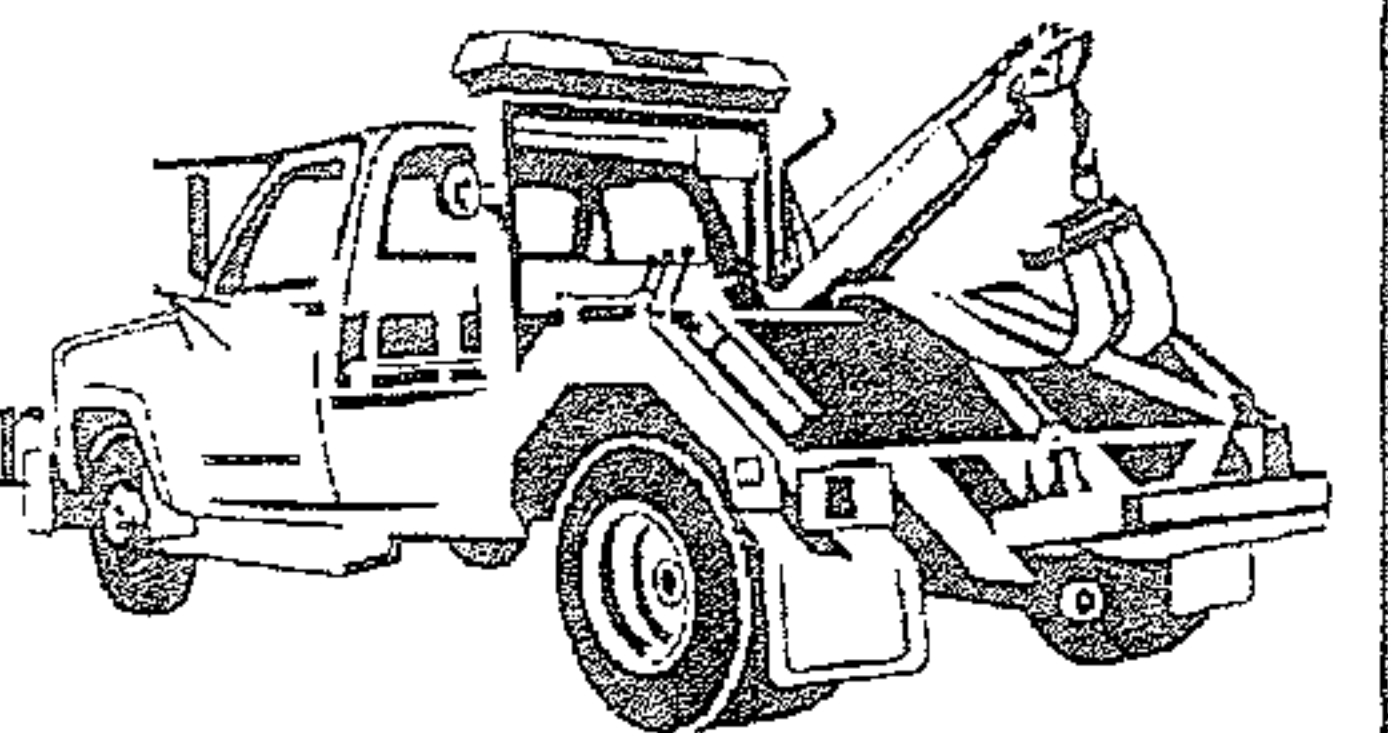

Officer B. Johnson LCPD, was dispatched to Kelly Lane in regards to a past Assault. Upon arrival officer made contact with complainant and victim. Complainant stated that her son Jimmie Lynn Arden 3rd was over at her residence for dinner and to see his children. Jimmie sat down in the living room and stated he was going

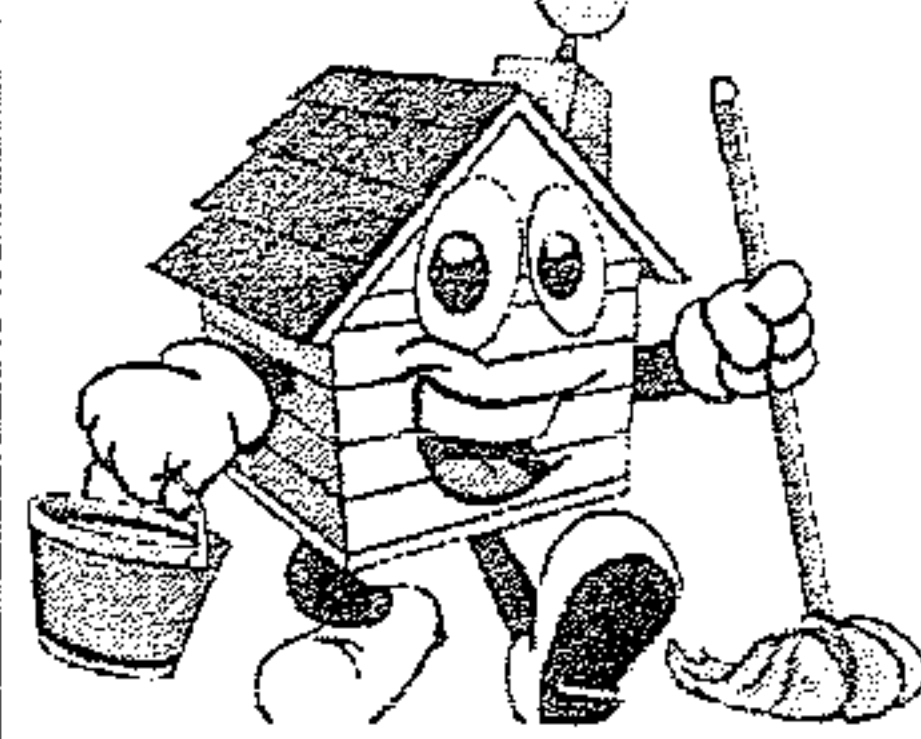
