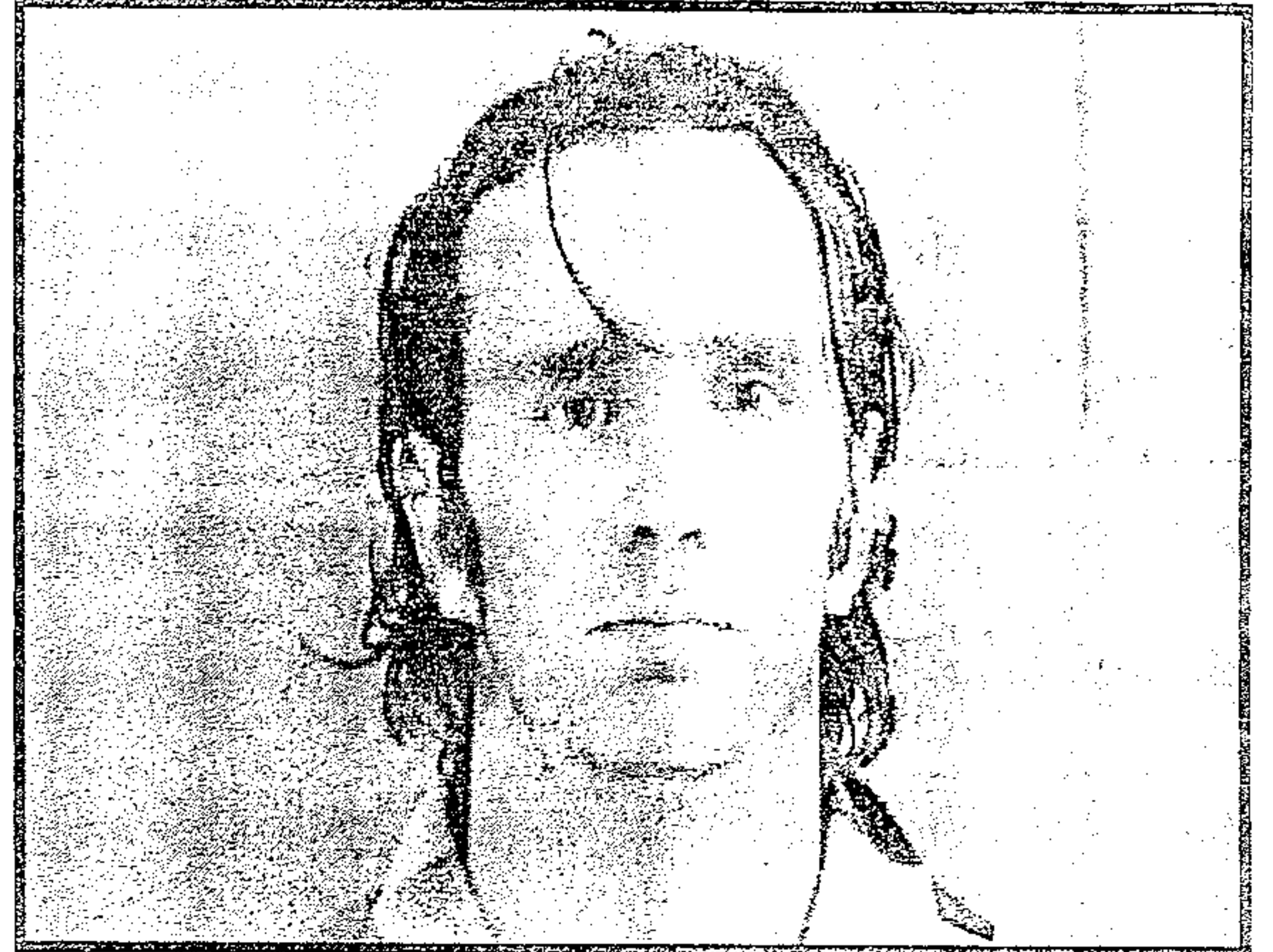

Comptroller's Office Releases Report Examining Higher Education Funding Formula

The Comptroller's Office of Research and Education Accountability (OREA) has released a new report and supplemental documents explaining the formula used to fund Tennessee's public colleges and universities.

A substantial amount of public funding is allocated

based on the recommendation created by this complex formula. In 2017-18, approximately \$913 million appropriated for higher education was allocated to colleges and universities according to the formula, which is designed to fund higher education based on outcomes and per-

Alexander Baity, 29, Long Street Place Knoxville, was charged with Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, Evading Arrest, Resisting Arrest, Reckless Endangerment, and Speeding 21 MPH Over Limit.

Deputy Billy Lewis LCSO, observed a White Male jump into a blacked out Silver Infiniti G35 at Stockton Valley Church and leave at a high rate of speed. Upon catching up to the vehicle it was traveling 60 MPH to 80 MPH in a 50 MPH and 45 MPH zone on Highway 72 towards Loudon City. Upon attempting traffic stop with emergency equipment on Highway 72 at Interstate 75, the vehicle continued towards Hwy 11 at 80 mph. Upon turning onto Hwy

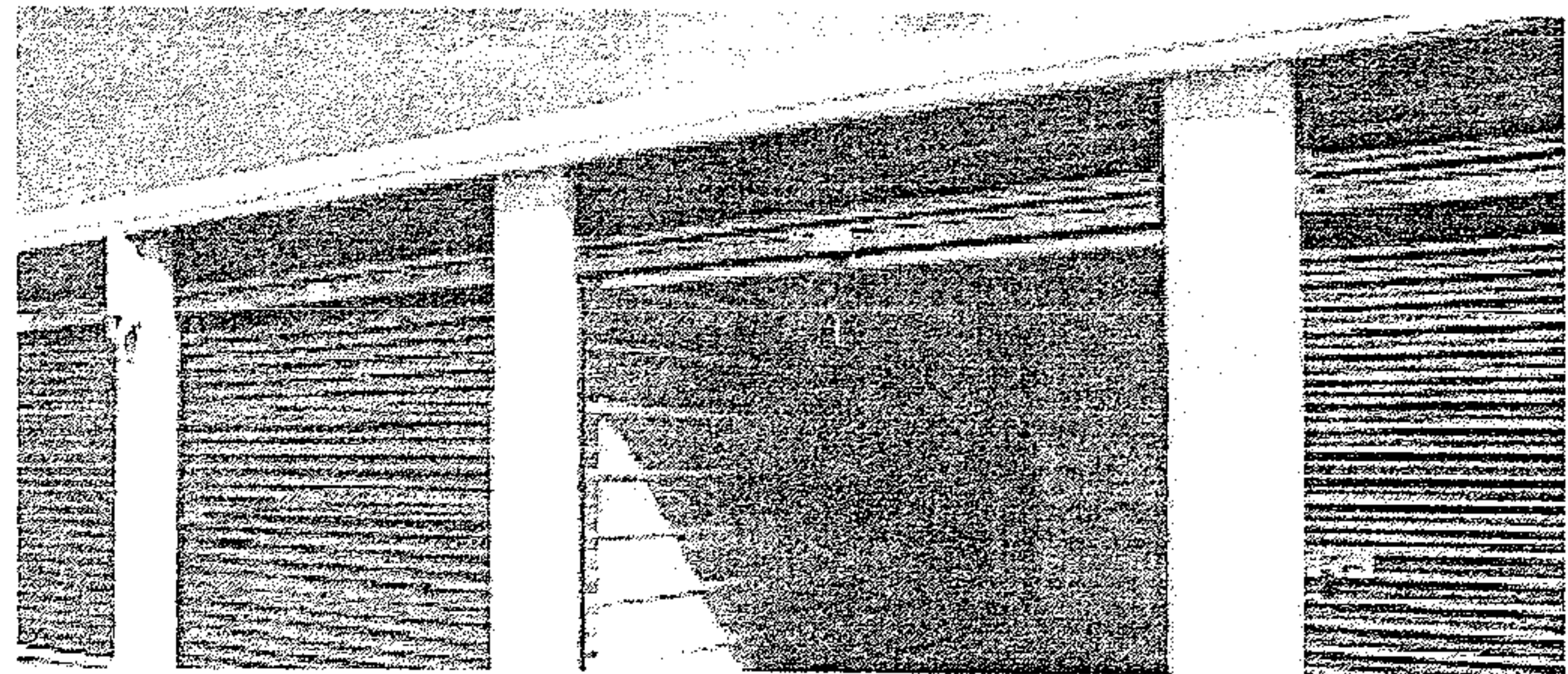

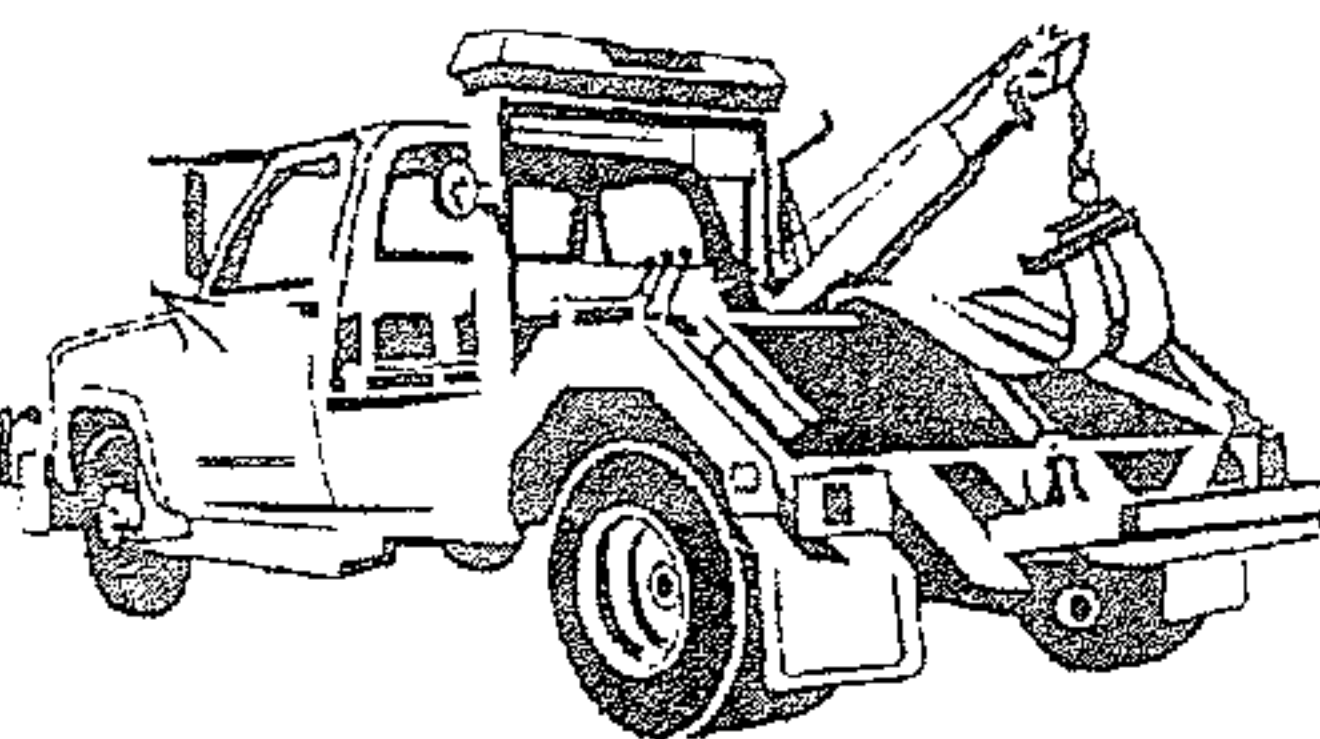

The report provides an examination of the rise of outcomes-based funding in Tennessee and a detailed look at how the formula creates funding recommendations for each college and university. Throughout the report, the major components that drive the funding recommendations are explained and accompanied with examples of their impacts on colleges and universities. The report concludes with exhibits showing how changes occur to the funding recommendations for each community college and public university in the state.

The report is intended to provide legislators, higher education administrators and stakeholders, and the public with a better understanding of the outcomes-based funding formula.

To supplement the report, OREA has also produced several other documents that help explain the formula and how it produces funding recommendations. Each document adopts a different format for explaining the formula, and provides the reader different methods for understanding how the formula works. These include a four-page brief, an infographic detailing the funding recommendation process created by the formula, and a one-page

executive summary.

The Comptroller's report and supplemental documents aim to make the state's funding formula for higher education more understandable and transparent.

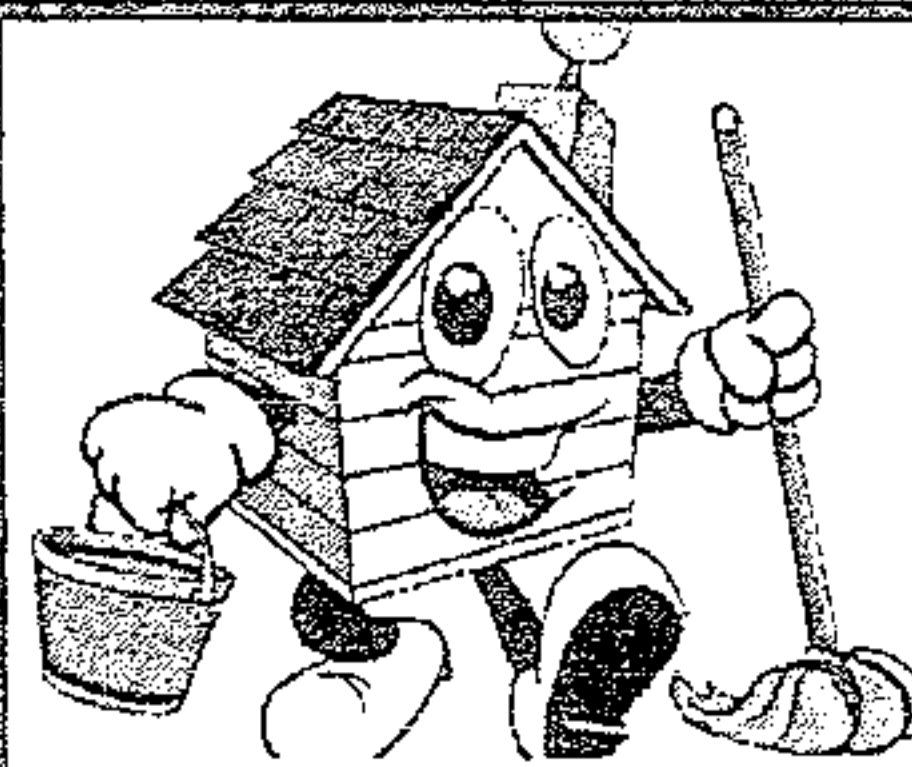

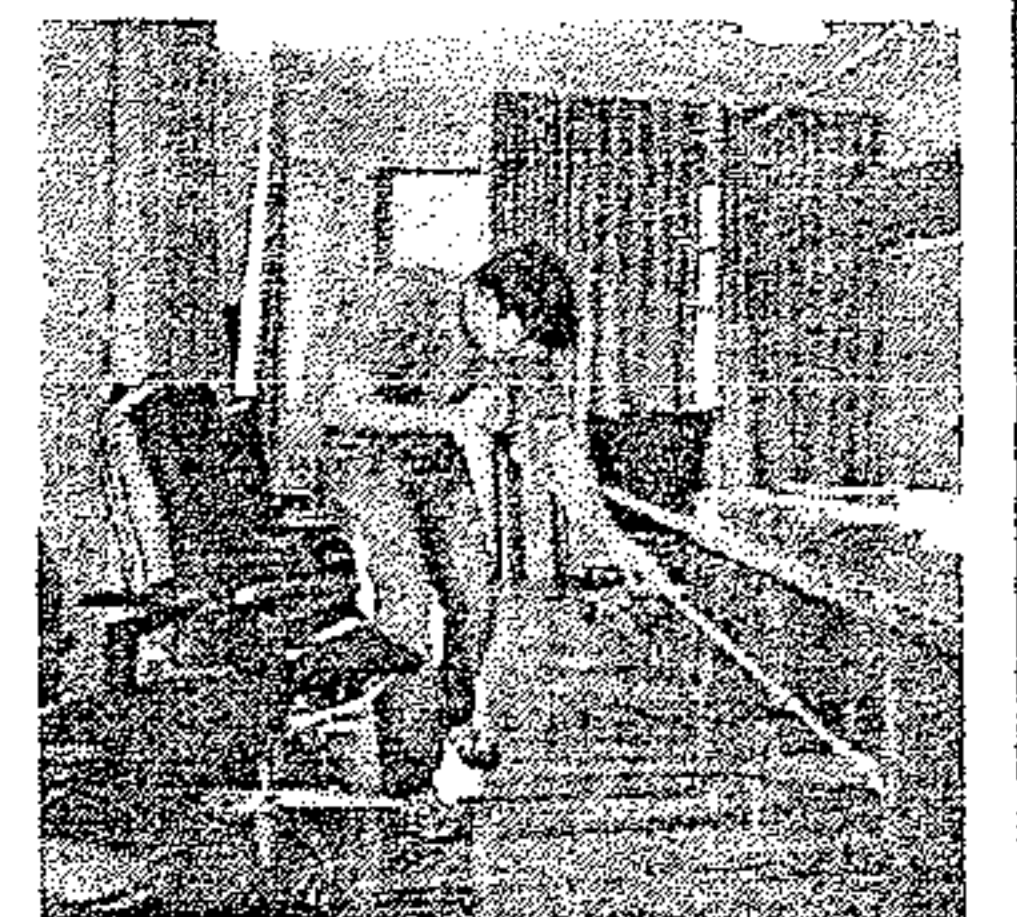

Denieka Skeens, 27, Poplar Street Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault Felony.

Officer Morgan LCPD, responded to physical domestic assault at Poplar St, Lenoir City, TN 37771 between a male and female. Upon arrival Officer met a Denieka Skeens who stated she had been assaulted by her brother. Upon further investigation and statements from 2 witnesses at the scene it was made known that the brother had marks on his neck from being grabbed. Denieka has a history of domestic assaults in the past. Victim 1 brother of Denieka stated he came home and Denieka was screaming and furious about something in which he did not know. As him and his mother victim 2 walked into the living room Denieka came down the stairs with a shelf and started swinging it at him. He stated he took the shelf from her, as he did this she grabbed him by the throat. After he got her off of him he went outside to get away from his sister. Victim 2 stated that Denieka came down the stairs with a shelf and was trying to hit her son. Then picked up a hammer like she was going to hit her in an attempt to cause harm serious bodily harm or death. Victim 2 got the hammer away from Denieka. Victim 2 also stated she was in fear that Denieka was going to hurt her because she

had hit her many times in the past. Denieka had wrote a statement but ripped it up stated she did not want to press charges she just wanted to leave. Denieka was identified as the primary aggressor and was taken into custody for Aggravated Domestic Assault and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

Deputy Kevin Kirkland LCSO, did observe a red SUV driving on Pond creek with his high beams on. Deputy turned around on the vehicle and he turned into a driveway.
