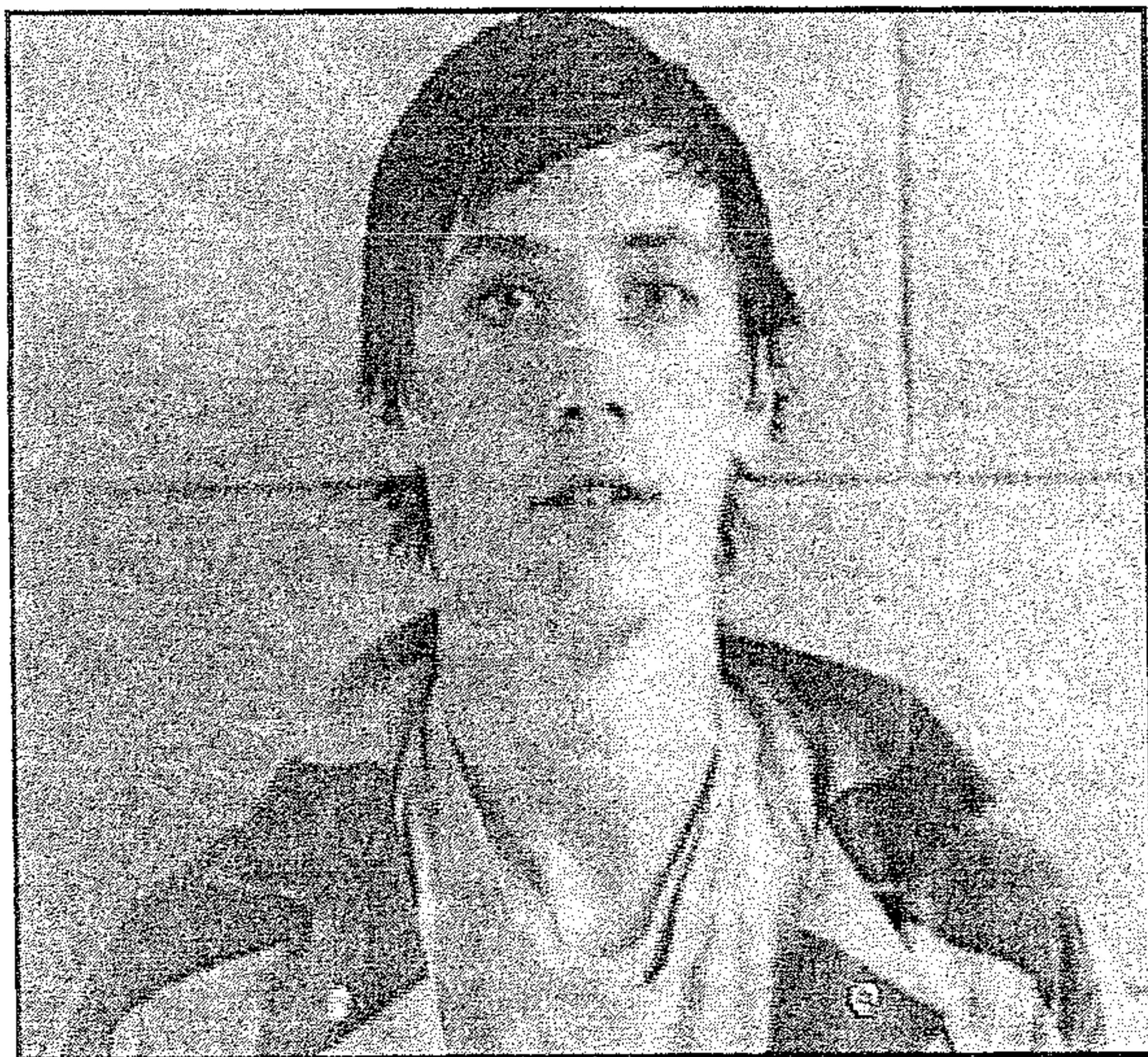

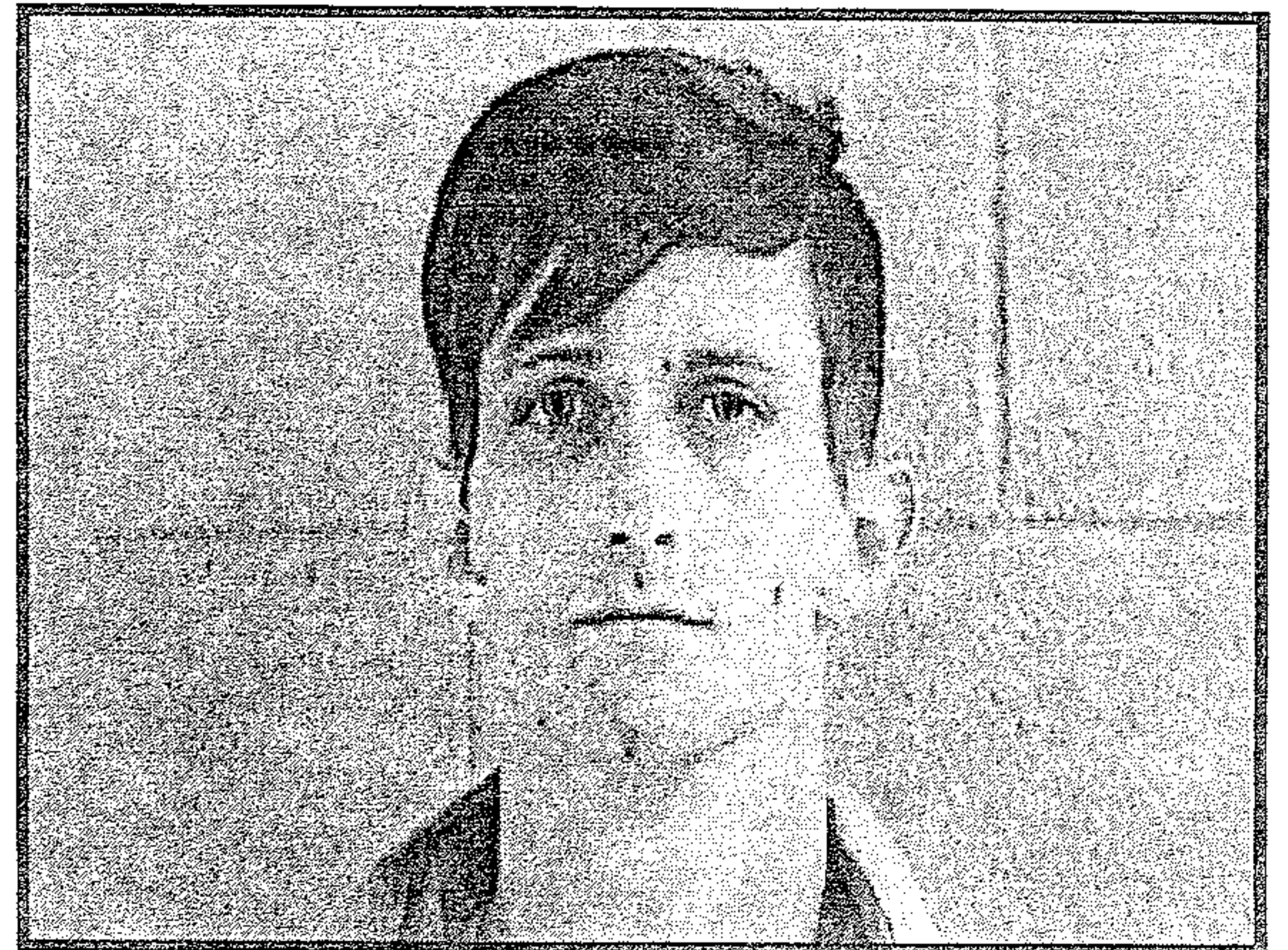

Parents Steal From Lafollette Elementary School PTO

The Tennessee Comptroller's Office has released an investigation which has resulted in the indictment of Matthew and Heather Brooks. Investigators determined the couple misappropriated at least \$8,286 from the Lafollette Elementary School Parent Teacher Organization.

The Comptroller's

Office began the investigation after Campbell County Schools reported questionable transactions in the PTO bank records.

Investigators determined that Matthew Brooks, the former PTO events coordinator, and his wife Heather Brooks, the former PTO president, used the PTO's debit card to withdraw cash and

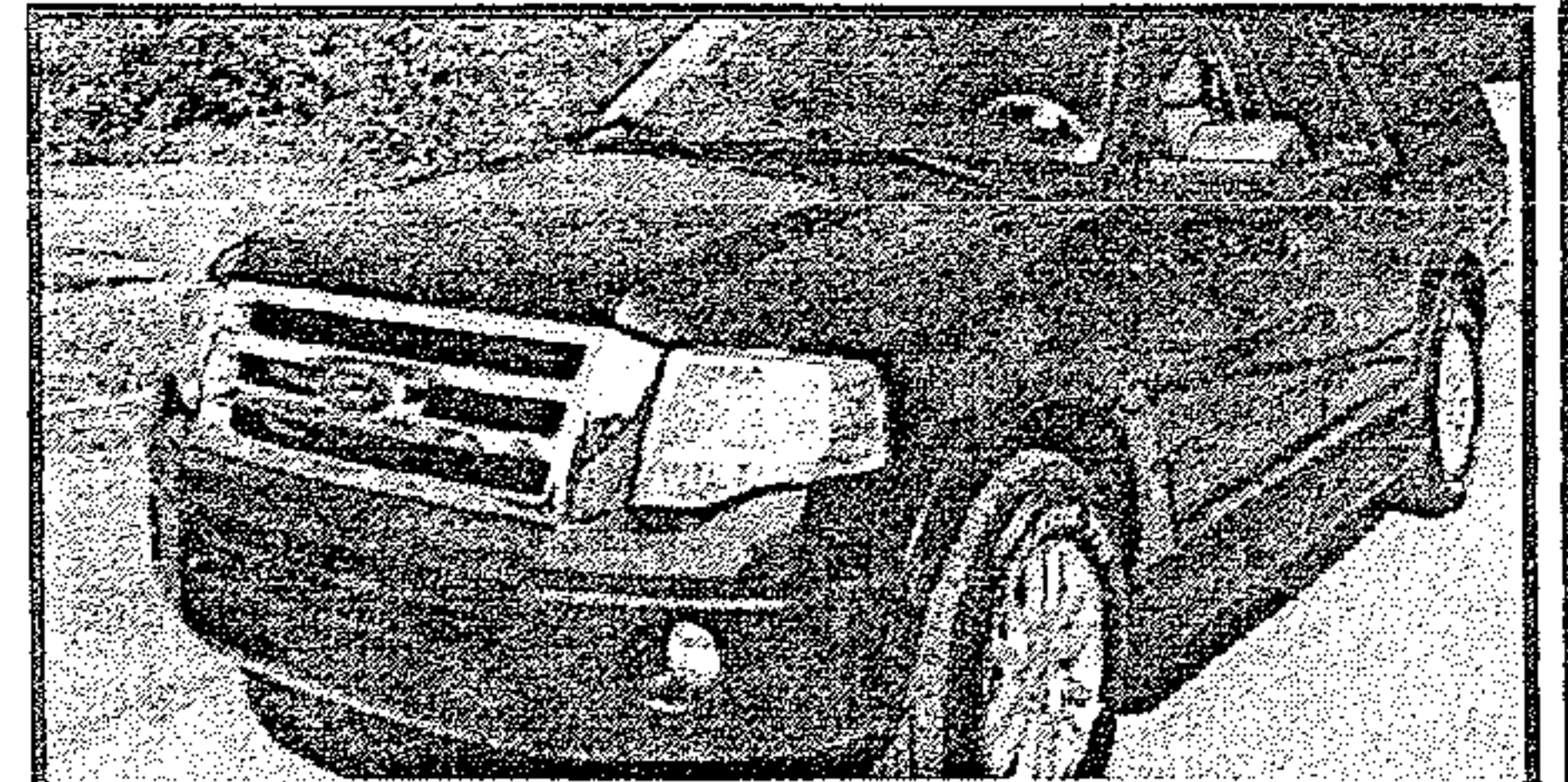

Terry King, 29, Loudon Ridge Road Loudon, was charged with Simple Possession, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Agents with the 9th DTF and Officers with LCSO were notified of an individual by the name Terry Dustin King at Loudon Ridge Road that was possibly in possession of drug paraphernalia and also prescription narcotics. Officer arrived on scene and made contact with King. After stating to King why we were there he was asked if there were any of the above mentioned items inside the residence. Mr King states he recently returned from a trip to Florida where he came into possession of several pills that were given to him by someone he had just met.

Mr. King states that he gave those pills to his mother, who he lives with at the residence, to put up for him. Mr King also turned over to Officers a set of digital scales that were located in his backpack. Mr. Kings mother stated that Mr King was with them on a family trip in Florida a week ago and had taken off with any unknown individual and just recently returned back home.

Kings mother states earlier on this date Dustin was in the bathroom for about an hour and when she went into the restroom after him she located a spoon with an unknown residue and a piece of cotton laying on the sink. The pills that were given to King mother by Dustin were

81 one mg Lorazepam, a Sch IV narcotic and 4 Flexeril, a prescription narcotic, that were in a bottle with someone's else name on them. These actions happened in Loudon County, TN.



These purchases included buying service for personal cell phones, games for Google Play, personal meals at local restaurants, and entertainment in Gatlinburg and Pigeon Forge.

Heather Brooks also manipulated or withheld the PTO's financial reports to conceal this activity from the board.

The Brooks' admitted to investigators that they misused PTO funds and assisted Comptroller investigators with identifying their personal transactions. After the discovery of these discrepancies, PTO operations were suspended. The organization was administratively dissolved in March 2017.

In October 2017, Matthew and Heather Brooks were each indicted by the Campbell County Grand Jury on one count of theft over \$2,500.

"It's important that PTO organizations follow state law requiring funds to be safeguarded," said Comptroller Justin P. Wilson. "PTO's should take precautions such as requiring more than one signature on checks, maintaining documentation for all purchases, and having multiple people review bank statements."

Karen Rezek, 47, Pine Lane Greenback, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Deputy A. Parton LCSO, responded to Pine Ln, in reference to a domestic. Upon arrival Deputy spoke to Karen Rezek who stated that she was involved in a verbal argument with her boyfriend. Deputy asked her if there was any physical altercations between them during the day and she stated no.

While speaking with Ms. Rezek Deputy could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from her and she was very hesitant to answer his questions. Deputy then went inside to speak with victim. He stated that Ms. Rezek started drinking around 3:00pm on Sunday and continued drinking throughout the day and passed out. She woke up around 11:00 PM around the time victim went to bed. Ms. Rezek then came into the bedroom looking for her phone and couldn't find it. She then asked victim for his phone and after he refused to give it to her she jumped on top of him and started kicking him in the head. He then called for her son to come into the room to get Ms. Rezek off of him. After son came into the room Ms. Rezek then went down stairs and passed out in the bathroom. When she woke up around 5:00am she asked victim where her phone was again and he stated that he

didn't know. She then hit him in the face and called the police from victims work phone.

Victim showed a picture of the right side of his face that had marks consistent with getting hit. Deputy then asked him and Ms. Rezek's sons if they would fill out a statement and they stated that they would. Deputy then went and spoke with Ms. Rezek and asked her if there was anything else that happened. She stated that victim hit her but would not go into details about the incident. Deputy then asked her if she would provide a written statement and she stated that she would not.

Bradley Williams, 25, Lake Forest Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession, Poss. of Drug Para., Violation of Probation x2, and Contraband in a Penal Institution.

Deputy Cody Fritts LCSO, observed a White Jeep Cherokee at the red light of Highway 321 and Highway 11. Deputy observed the driver throw plastic from his vehicle out the driver window. The driver also was not wearing a seat belt. Upon running the registration on the vehicle through dispatch it returned to Bradley Williams. Deputy had prior knowledge that Bradley Williams had a Warrant out of Loudon County for violation of probation. Upon stopping the vehicle the driver was identified as Bradley Williams. When Deputy asked Mr. Williams about the item he threw from the vehicle he stated he threw part of a ketchup pack out the window. Mr. Williams was found to have two warrants out of Loudon County and taken into custody. Upon searching Mr. Williams, found in the right pocket of his jeans was (4) syringes and a baggy. Deputy asked Mr. Williams if he could search his vehicle and he agreed. Found in the passenger seat floor board was a burnt spoon. Mr.

Williams was transported to the Loudon County jail. Upon arriving at the jail while Deputy Purdy was searching Mr. Williams, plastic cellophane with an orange pill was recovered from his anal cavity. Mr. Williams stated the pill was Opana (Oxymorphone). This did happen in Loudon County, Tn.

Kristopher Pierce, 23, Steekee Road Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Deputy Z. Frye LCSO, responded to call of a physical domestic at Steekee Road, Loudon. Once on scene Deputy made contact with the complainant. The complainant stated that her son and his wife had been verbally arguing and then it began to get physical before she was able to separate both parties. Once inside the residence Deputy spoke with the victim. The victim stated that her and her husband, Kristopher Pierce, the offender, had been in an argument because he was upset that she would not have sexual intercourse with him. The offender got mad and head-butted the victim in the forehead. She then stated that she pushed him off of her before separating until Deputy arrived. Deputy did observe redness and

swelling on the victims forehead, along with a knot approximately two inches in diameter. She also had a small scratch above her left eye. Deputy then spoke with the offender and he stated that they were arguing about intercourse and he got mad at her and head-butted her in

the forehead. He then stated that she pushed him off of her and then they separated. Deputy did not observe any physical marks on the offenders body. Mr. Pierce was arrested for domestic assault and transported to the Loudon County Jail. The victim refused
