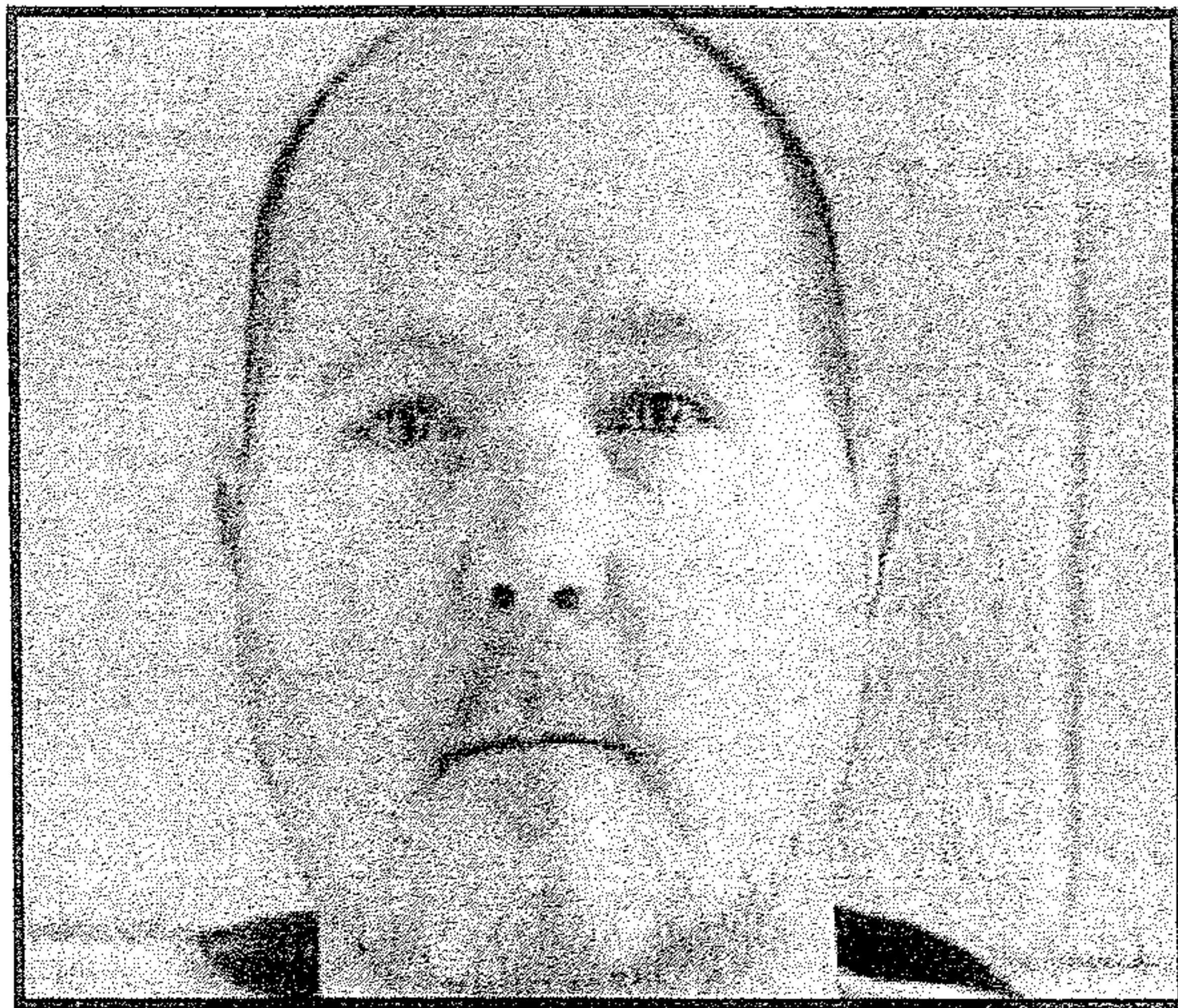
High speed pursuit ends with driver charged

tivation came from his understanding of the call that Christ gives us.

In the reading from 1 Corinthians today, Paul also articulates his motivation for

the way he lives. It is very important for him to keep the message simple. Rather than using "lofty words or wisdom" he focuses on the crucified Christ and the power of the living

God. While Paul often seems to lose his audience in rambling sentences and concepts, the focus here is on what God does in Christ ... period. What has God done for you?

Do people around you know? If not, maybe they should.

Prayer: God of majesty and might, you alone are our completion. Fill us with your love and compassion and embolden us to share what you have done for us every day. Give us words to speak and ears to hear your message and your hope. Amen.

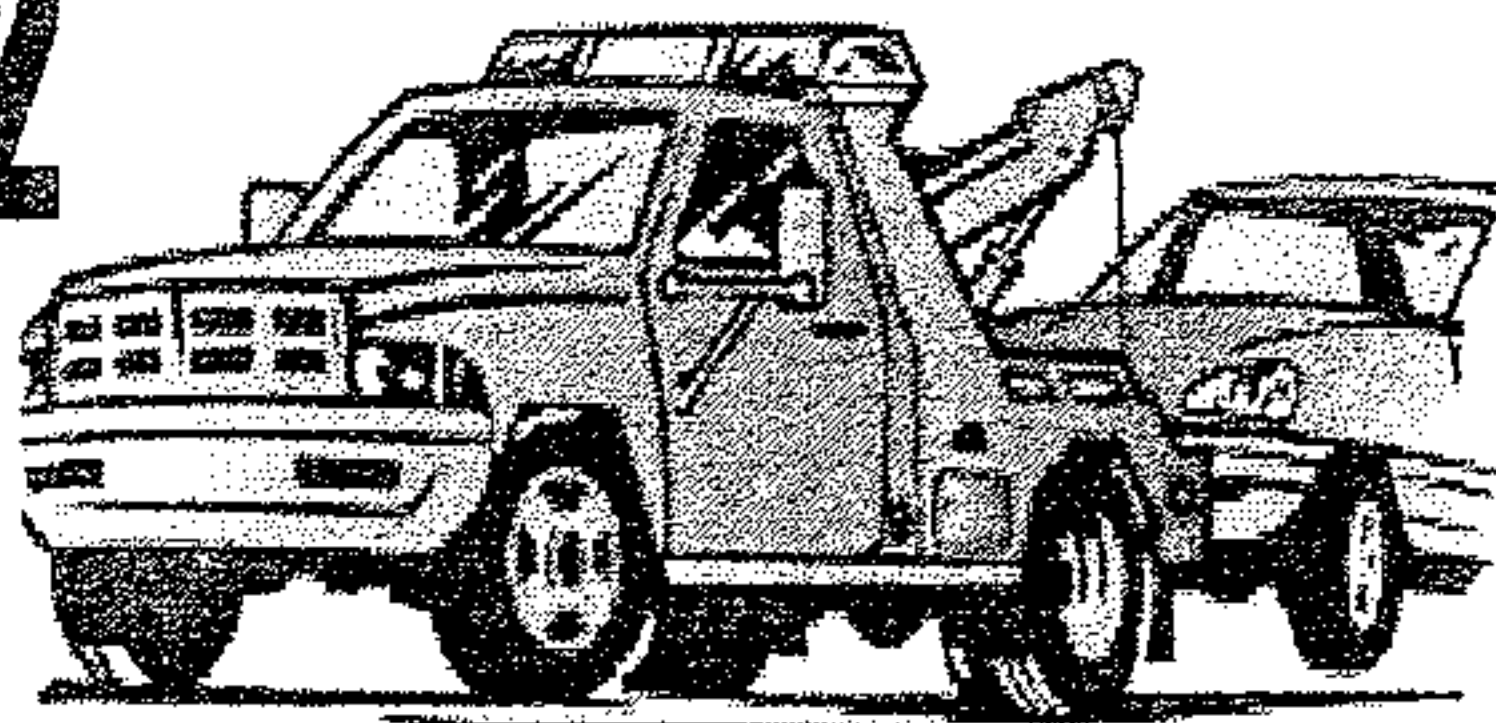

pills that she stated was Xanax. Ms. Ward stated she did not have a prescription for the Xanax. Deputy asked Ms. Ward to exit the vehicle at which time she was very unsteady on her feet. Deputy asked Ms. Ward to perform SFST and she did comply. Ms. Ward had constricted pupils lack of smooth pursuit, distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation and onset nystagmus at about 40 degree in both eyes. Ms. Ward had vertical nystagmus and lack of convergence. During walk and turn she could not keep balance during instruction phase. Ms. Ward stopped while walking, missed heel-to-toe several times, improper turn by just jumping around, and took improper number of steps. She took 29 steps down and 9 back. During one leg stand she was swaying, used arms for balance and put foot down several times. During Modified Romberg Ms. Ward had eye tremors and her estimation of 30 sec was at 47 sec's. Deputy placed Ms. ward under arrest for DUI. Ms. Ward's license came back suspended for failure to pay. Ms. Ward agreed to give blood sample and was transported

to Fort Loudon ER for BAC. This did happen in Loudon County TN.

"This book is an important read that offers insight into colliding worlds—poverty and race versus Ivy League privilege—and asks 'Is our society really set-up to help people transform their lives and transcend the circumstances into which they are born?'" Harris said. "I hope that this powerful story inspires some thought-provoking dialogue and hard self-examinations on the road to equality and social justice."

Author Jeff Hobbs tells the story of his Yale University roommate Robert Peace. Robert's life was rough from the beginning in the crime-ridden streets of Newark in the 1980s, with his father in jail and his mother earning less than \$15,000 a year. But Robert was brilliant and such a successful student that an alumnus from his high school volunteered to fund his expenses to any college, and Robert chose Yale. He studied molecular biochemistry and biophysics and continued to excel. Life was supposed to get easier, but Robert carried with him the difficult dual nature of his existence, trying to fit in at Yale, at home on breaks and at home after graduation.
