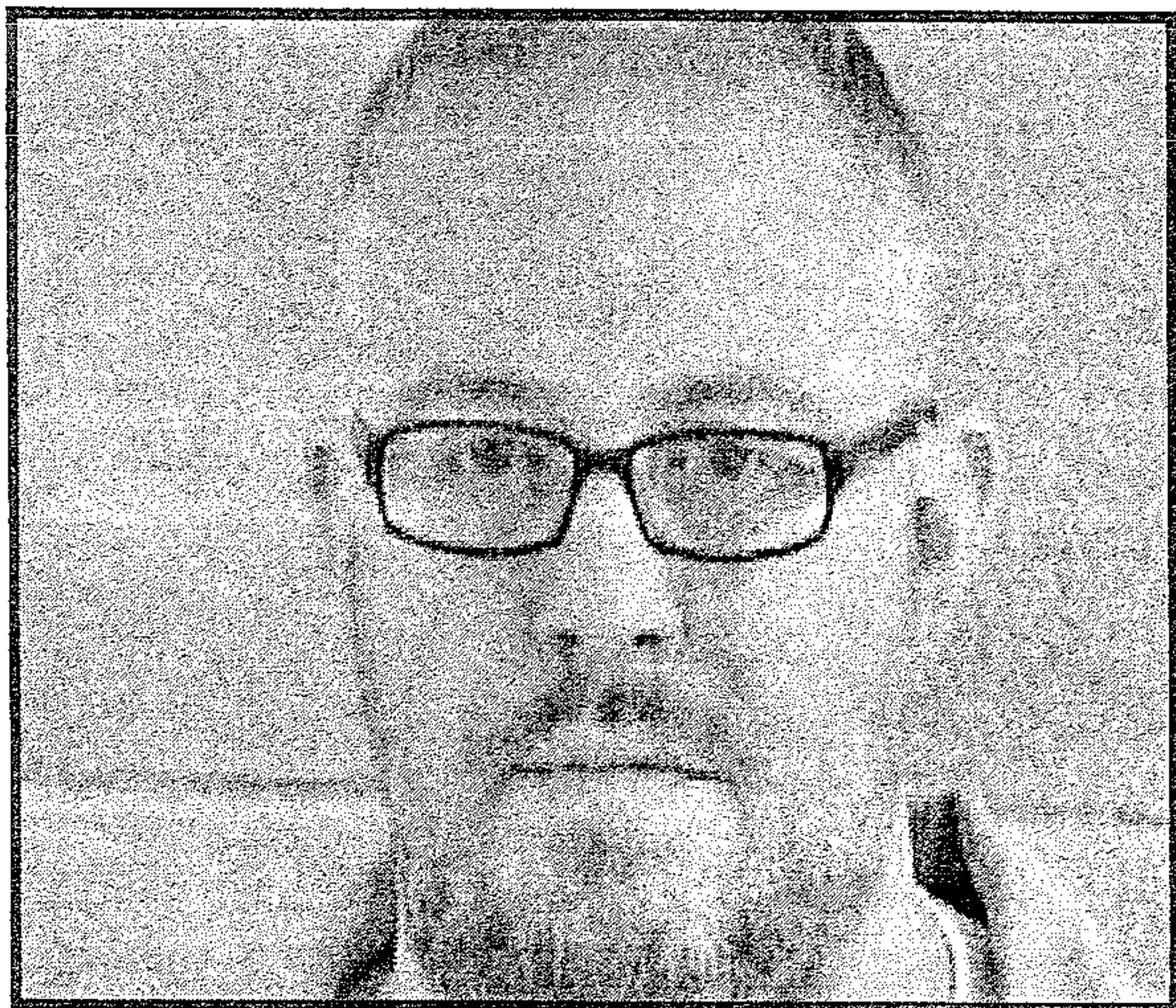

Scripture: Matthew 5:21-37

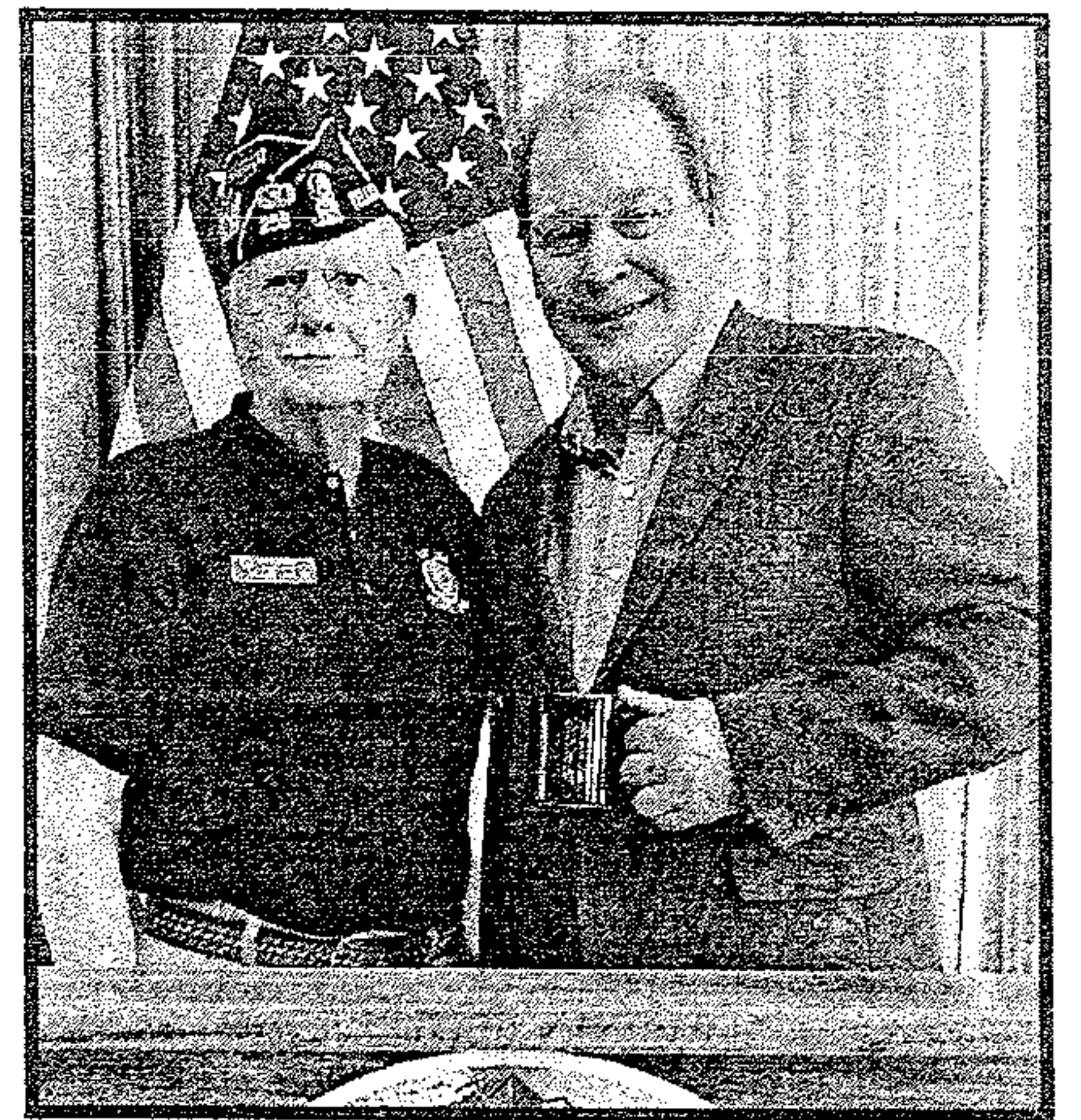

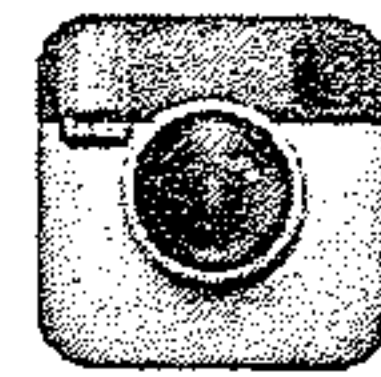

Scott Barker, Editorial Page Editor at the Knoxville News Sentinel visited the members of American Legion Post 256 to provide them with some insight on the popular new term, "fake news". In his

briefing, Mr. Barker made reference to how this term rose to prominence during the 2016 election in reference to everything from Hillary Clinton's health to the notorious Pizagate conspiracy theory. He stated, for the most part fake news is sensational false news-like stories cre-

ated purely to attract readers to web sites or tabloids for the purpose of attracting viewers to ads, consequently making large sums of money for those sites and papers that produced the questionable news story.

If you read a questionable article from a site that you are not sure is legitimate, look for these red flags. The domain name may end in ".com.co", and site most likely will not have a "About Us" section. Also note, fake news will not have sources of any quotes or figures. And, if it's real news, rest assured, mainstream media will cover it.

After the briefing there was a question and answer session. Legionnaires concerned with the news reporting within today's political climate led to some very spirited conversations. Mr. Barker noted, fake news in our politics has created this dividing line in the culture that's not healthy for the democracy. He then ended his remarks stating, just like Vet-

erans the professional media share in the love of our country, and we all must work to make it better. For additional information about

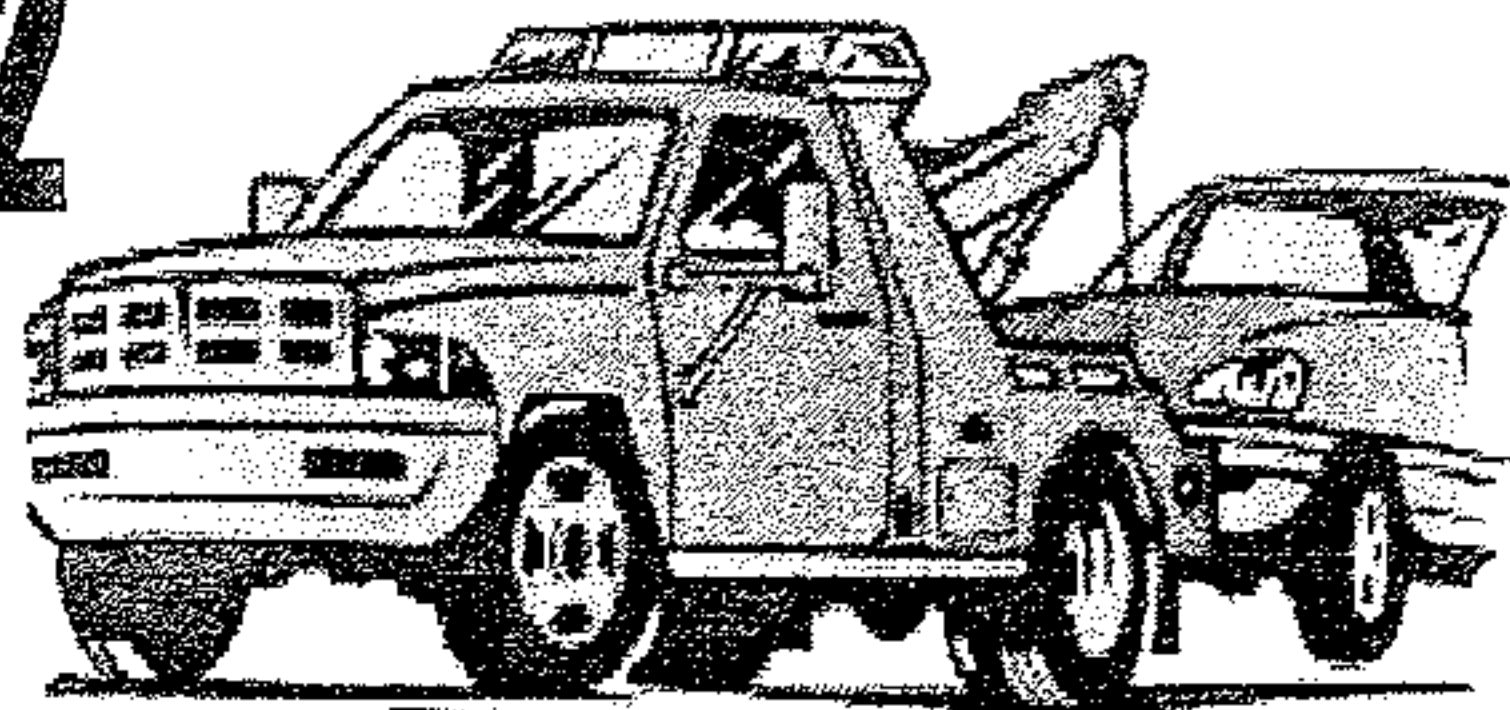

Kidnapping

Pedro Cifuentes, 19, Pine Ridge Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Sexual Battery, Kidnapping, Assault, Aggravated Burglary, and Underage Consumption.

Pedro Abel Cifuentes, a 19 year old hispanic male, was speaking to victim, while she was smoking cigarettes outside their apartments. Cifuentes was heavily intoxicated at the time and during the course of their conversation he asked victim if she would have sex with him but she said no and that she had a boyfriend. Subsequently, victim stated that she was tired and going to bed as it was approximately 3:00 - 3:20AM. The defendant initially tried block her from going into her apartment, when she finally got inside he forced his way in while she was telling him to stop and leave. Once inside he grabbed her from behind and pushed her to the couch in the living room. The defendant held her down on her front against the couch while he grabbed her breasts under her clothing. He pulled her pants partially down exposing her buttocks and began licking her lower back and buttocks. He also was trying to get his hand down the front of her pants. Eventually the defendant pulled his pants down exposing his penis and put her hand against it in an attempt to make her grab him. During this whole incident he was telling her to let him

make love to her and she kept yelling for him to stop. Also at some point victim was able to dial 911 on her phone but dropped it leaving the line open. It was when LCPD officers responded that the defendant finally got off of victim allowing her to break free from his grasp. Detective Brad Brown LCPD, interviewed the defendant at the Loudon County Jail with the translation assistance of LCPD Officer Christian Dragon, wherein he admitted to the above series of events. This did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

Haslam Files Next-Tennessee Legislative Agenda

Legislation focuses on education, community development, and economic growth

Tennessee Gov. Bill Haslam today filed his NextTennessee legislative agenda for the 2017 session of the 110th General Assembly.

"With the NextTennessee agenda, we're focused on policy proposals to build and sustain economic growth and the state's competitiveness for the next generation of Tennesseans," Haslam said. "Because of the fiscal responsibility we have shown, the Tennessee we can be is a state with a safe and reliable transportation network that supports long-term growth, one of the best K-12 systems in the country and free access to a post-secondary degree or certificate for all Tennesseans. And we can still be the state with the lowest taxes and the lowest debt."

The Tennessee Reconnect Act is Haslam's proposal to make Tennessee the first state in the na-

tion to offer all Tennessee adults without a degree access to community college tuition-free – and at no cost to taxpayers. Tennessee would become the first state in the nation to offer all citizens – both high school students and adults – the chance to earn a post-secondary degree or certificate free of tuition and fees.

The Tennessee STRONG Act, "Support, Training and Renewing Opportunity for National Guardsmen," establishes a four-year pilot program for eligible members of the Tennessee National Guard to receive a last-dollar tuition reimbursement toward a first-time bachelor's degree.

The IMPROVE Act, "Improving Manufacturing, Public Roads and Opportunities for a Vibrant Economy," cuts \$270 million in taxes, including the sales tax on groceries, while proposing a comprehensive and balanced transportation plan that keeps Tennessee a pay-as-you-go state and its roads debt free.

The Tennessee Broadband Accessibility Act allows Tennessee's private, nonprofit electric cooperatives to provide retail broadband service, makes grant funding available to the state's local libraries to help residents improve their digital literacy skills and provides \$45 mil-

lion over three years in grants and tax credits for service providers to help make broadband more available to Tennessee's rural, unserved homes and businesses.
