

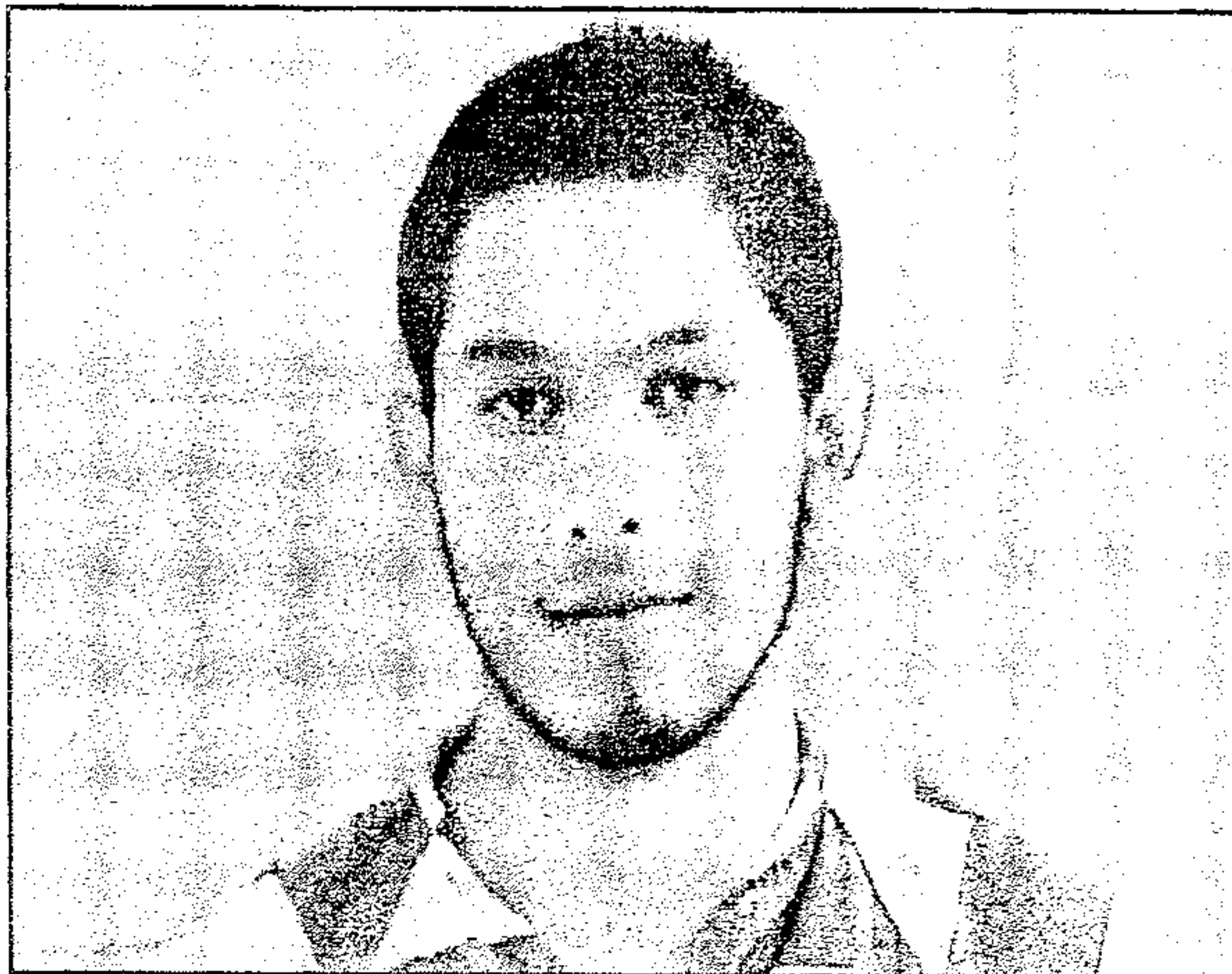

Former Cumberland County EMS Supervisor Stole Drugs

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller, in conjunction with the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, has found that Randy Davidson, former Cumberland County Emergency Medical Services supervisor, stole at least 79 single dose vials of controlled substances for his own use.

took the vials of the opioid pain relievers fentanyl and morphine from January 2015 through August 2016.

Davidson falsified more than 50 controlled substance administration documents to make it appear the drugs had been used legitimately by other paramedics. Davidson acknowledged to in-

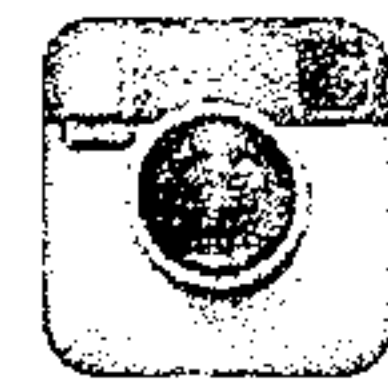
Kingsport resident sentenced to 78 months for the manufacture and detonation of a pipe bomb in Johnson City

Christopher Wayne Alexander, 55, of Kingsport, Tenn., was sentenced by the Honorable J. Ronnie Greer, U.S. District Court Judge, to serve 78 months in federal prison for maliciously damaging the office and contents of Victory Orthotics, Inc.,

(Victory Orthotics) in Johnson City, Tenn., by means of a pipe bomb in July 2015. The court also ordered him to pay at least \$300,000, and up to \$330,000, in restitution for the damage to Victory Orthotics.

Alexander previously pleaded guilty to

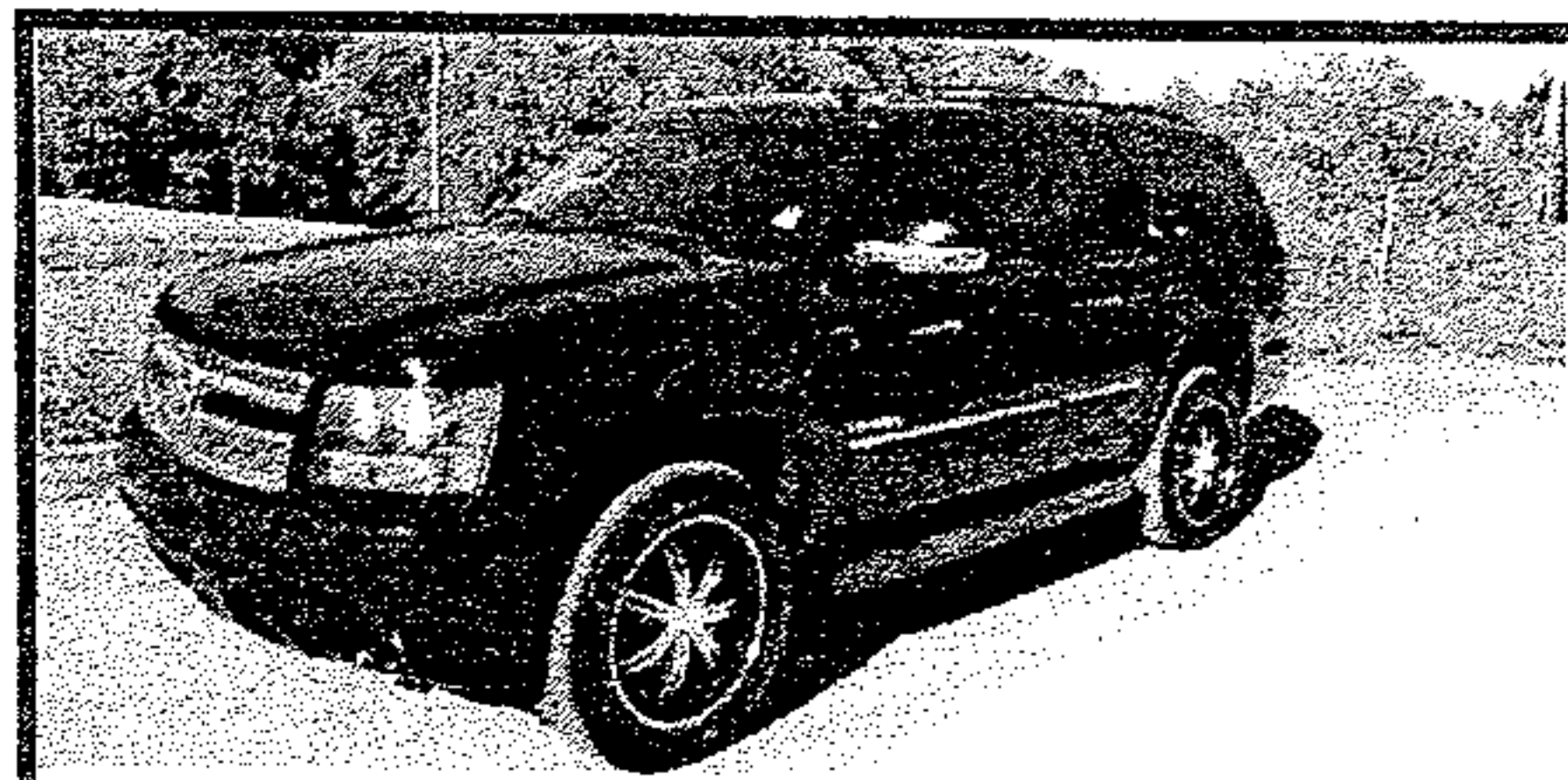

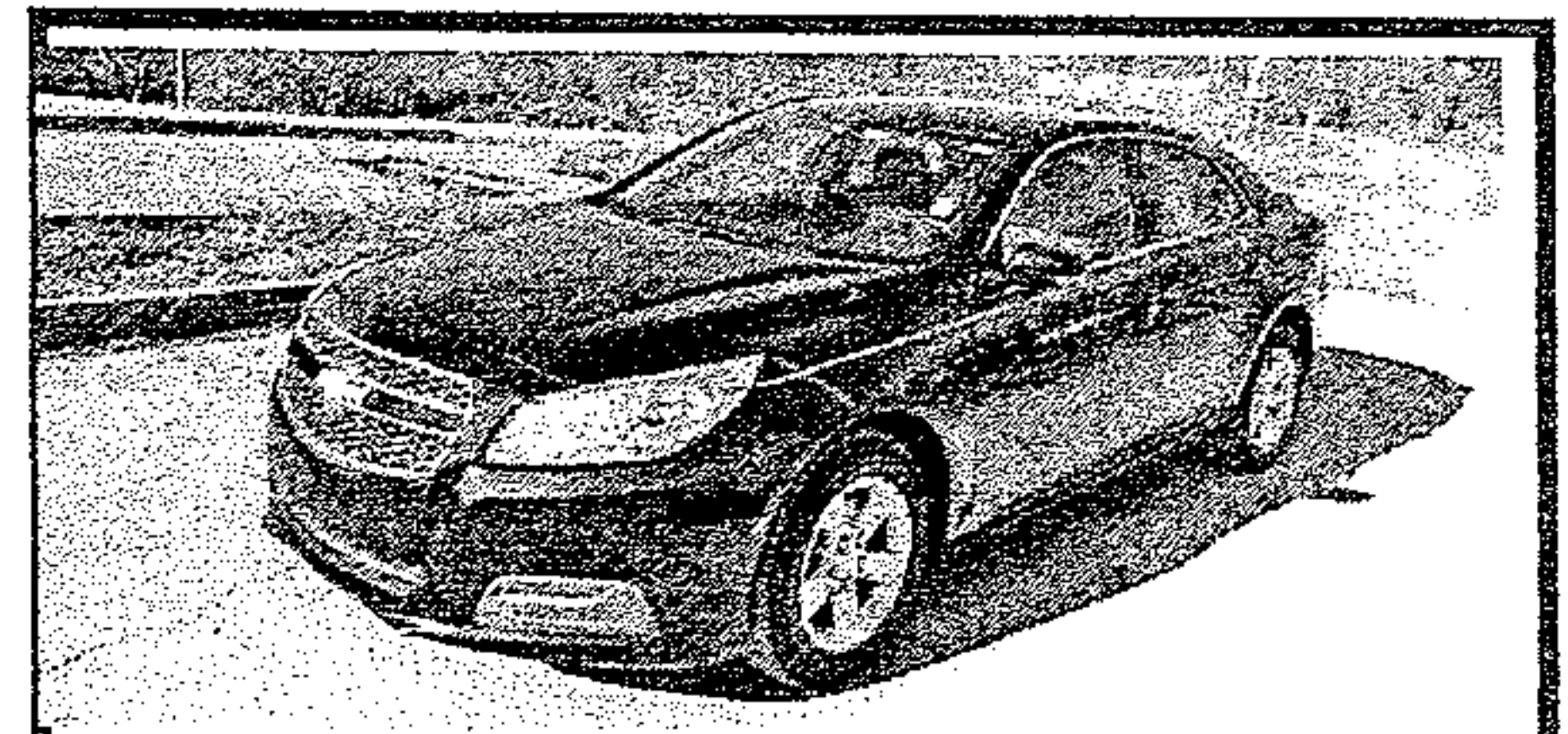

investigators that he had taken the controlled substances for his own use.

Randy Davidson resigned from Cumberland County EMS on August 15, 2016. In February 2017, Davidson was indicted by the Cumberland County Grand Jury on two counts of theft under \$1,000, one count of official misconduct, and one count of forgery.


"Although this scheme was first identified by Cumberland County EMS, it went undetected for at least 20 months," said Comptroller

Justin P. Wilson. "I'm pleased to see that EMS officials are taking steps to review the forms that are used when controlled substances are administered. The signatures of the paramedic, supervisor and a witness should always be included."

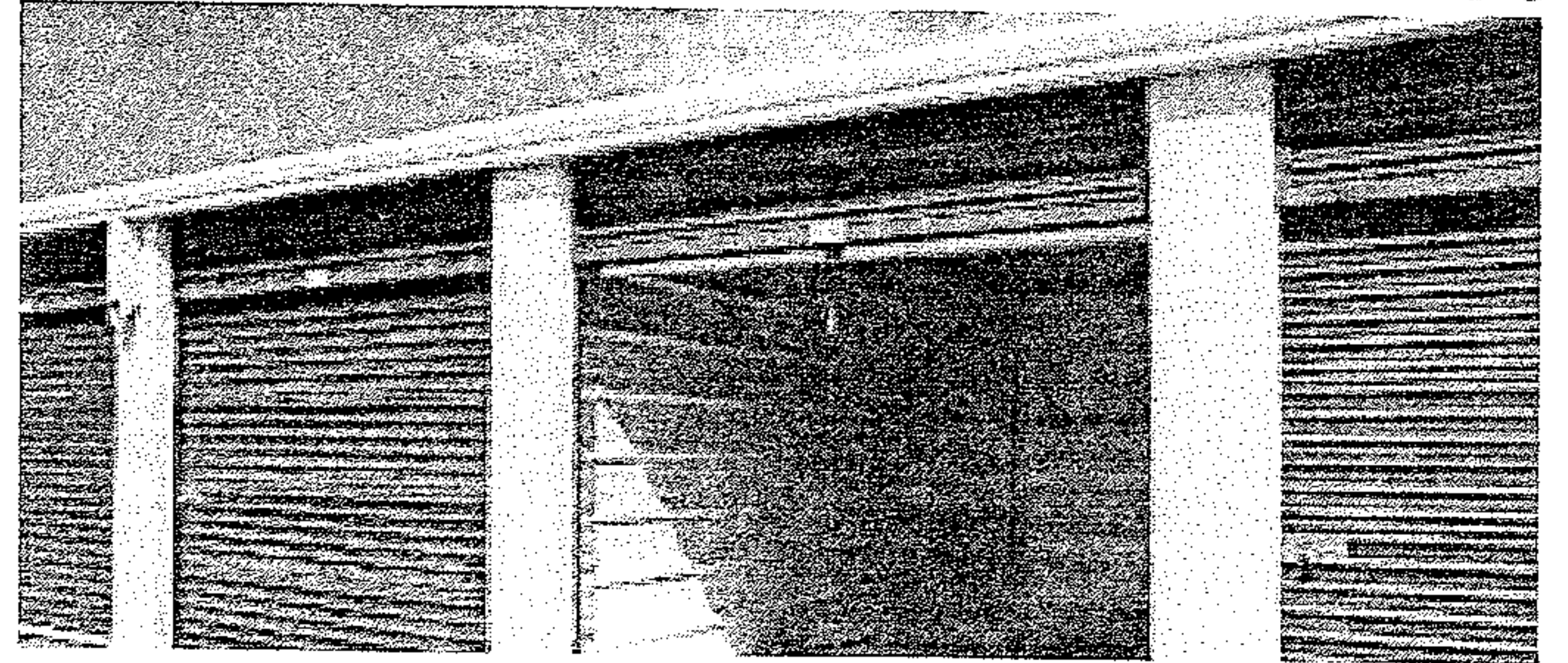

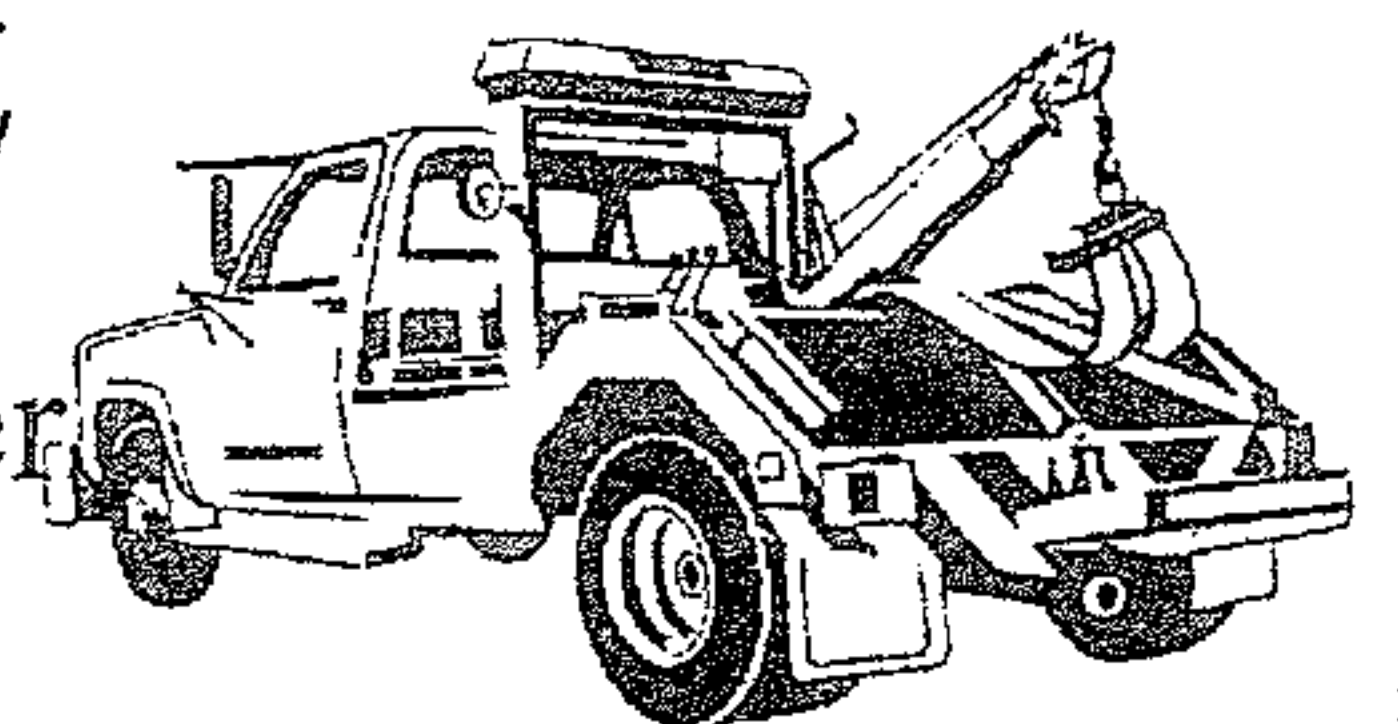

one count of damaging a building and property used in interstate commerce by means of fire and explosives (a pipe bomb) and three counts of possessing firearms (pipe bombs) not registered to him in the National Firearms Registration and Transfer Record. According to his plea agreement on file with U.S. District Court, Johnson City Police stopped Alexander's vehicle a short time after the explosion for having a license plate obscured by tape, making it unreadable. An ensuing search of

the vehicle revealed an assembled pipe bomb and components to manufacture additional pipe bombs. The pipe bomb in his vehicle was consistent with recovered remnants of the one detonated

at the Victory Orthotics building. Officers also found a number of tools in the vehicle and/or on Alexander's person, including a glass-breaking tool, a pry bar, pruning shears and knives. Testimony

at the sentencing hearing indicated that he cut/disabled the security alarm before breaking in and planting the pipe bomb.

A search warrant executed at Alexander's Kingsport residence the next day produced another assembled pipe bomb, along with fuses, remote firing devices, powders and ignition sources in a walk-in safe. Extensive literature regarding the manufacture of improvised explosive devices was found in the safe, including manuals titled "Home-built Flamethrowers," "How to Make Disposable Silencers-A Complete Guide," and "The Advanced Anar-

chist Arsenal Recipes for Improvised Incendiaries and Explosives." A large number of firearms and ammunition were also located throughout the home.

Testimony from the sentencing hearing indicated that approximately one week after the explosion, residents and individuals maintaining properties near Victory Orthotics found two addi-

 tional pipe bombs and brought them to the attention of law enforcement. These pipe bombs were virtually identical to the others recovered by law enforcement.

Law enforcement agencies participating in the investigation included the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, State of Tennessee Bomb and Arson Section, Johnson City Police Department,

Johnson City Fire Department and Federal Bureau of Investigation Evidence Response Team. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Nicholas Regalia and Wayne Taylor represented the United

States.

Warren Sanders is a Legionnaire of Post 256 and is the founder and co-chairman of TAP, Technology Ac-

cess Program which is part of the TVCUC, Tellico Village Computer Users Club. Warren explained to his fellow Legion members exactly how TAP was formed and where it is today. Mr. Sanders stated, "Volunteers from the Users Club would 'clean' computers donated for the two Village-wide garage sales held each year. I became the leader of that effort. In the Spring of 2007, myself and another volunteer were going to take about 3 van-loads of extra computer equipment to a commercial business when we thought to ourselves, these extras could possibly help some of the poorer families in the area that probably could not afford to purchase a computer. With the blessing of four organizations and the kindness of the Community Church, TAP got started. On June 2, 2007, working from a building the Church provided we were able to give away 12 computer systems. Now, almost 10 years later, we have given away over 4,700 computer systems and impacted over 7,500 children by providing them with in-home access to computer technology." TVCUC is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization.

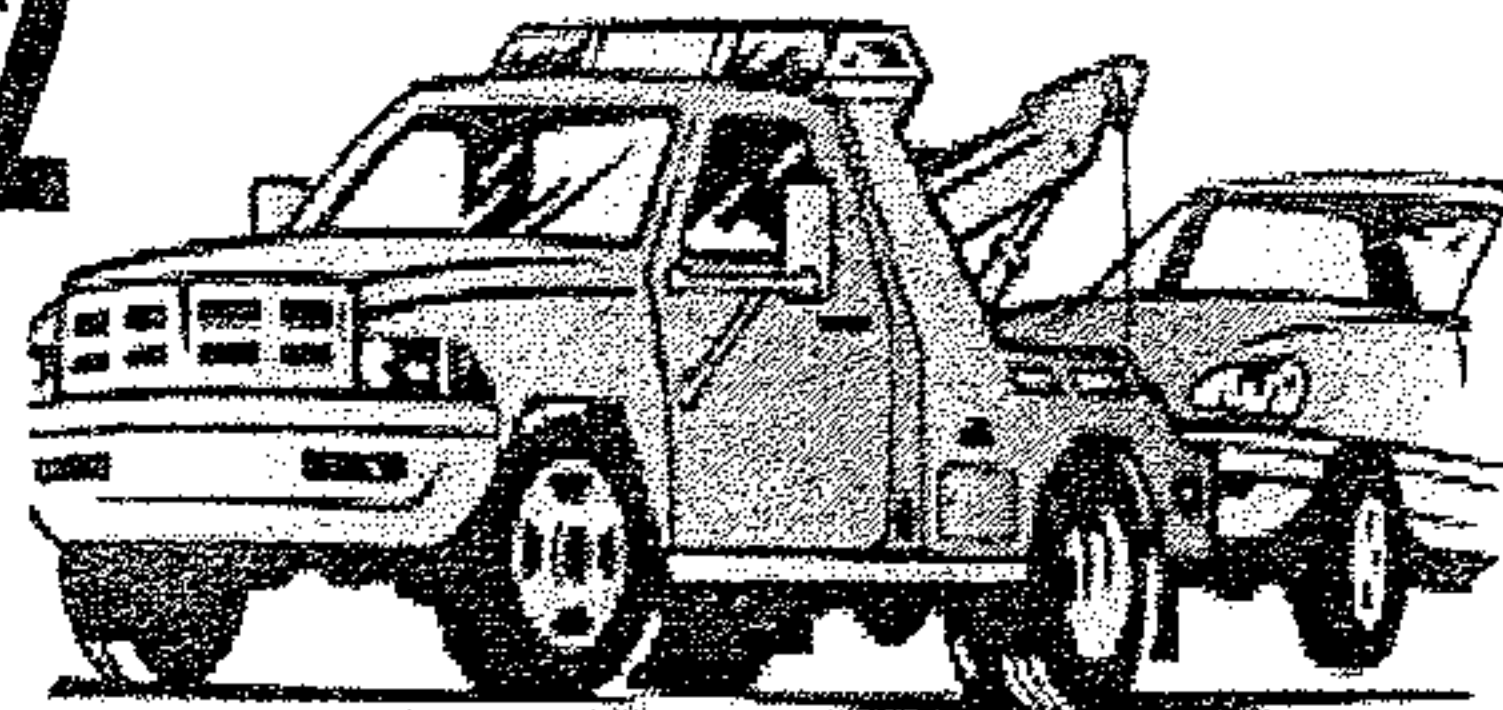

Tennessee Associate Professor of English and Africana Studies, will be joined in the discussion by a panel including Tatia Harris, Andrew Swafford, and Renee Kesler. The event is free. Pizza from the Tomato Head will be available.

In Kindred, a contemporary African-American woman from the 1970s is forced

back to 19th century plantation slavery where she meets her ancestors and faces the hardships, violence and shocking cultural differences. Published in 1979, Kindred persists as a profoundly relevant story, taught in high school and college classes, and regularly the title for community book programs.

"What sets this novel apart from other neo-

slave narratives is that Dana interacts with her ancestors and experiences the everyday life of slavery directly (including the community building, violence, and loss)," Commander said.

In addition to this evening event, Books Sandwiched In will keep the focus on diversity at its usual lunchtime event when Dr. Rebecca Klenk leads a discussion of Bad Feminist: Essays by Roxane Gay, Wednesday, March 29, noon to 1:00, in the East Tennessee History Center auditorium. Commander received her Ph.D. in American Studies and Ethnicity from the University of Southern California. She spent the 2012-2013 school year in Accra, Ghana, as a Fulbright Lecturer/Researcher,

where she taught at the University of Ghana and completed research. Harris is TCCRP Grant Manager/Title VI Coordinator, City of Knoxville. Swafford is an English teacher at Fulton High School. Kesler is director of Beck Cultural Exchange Center.
