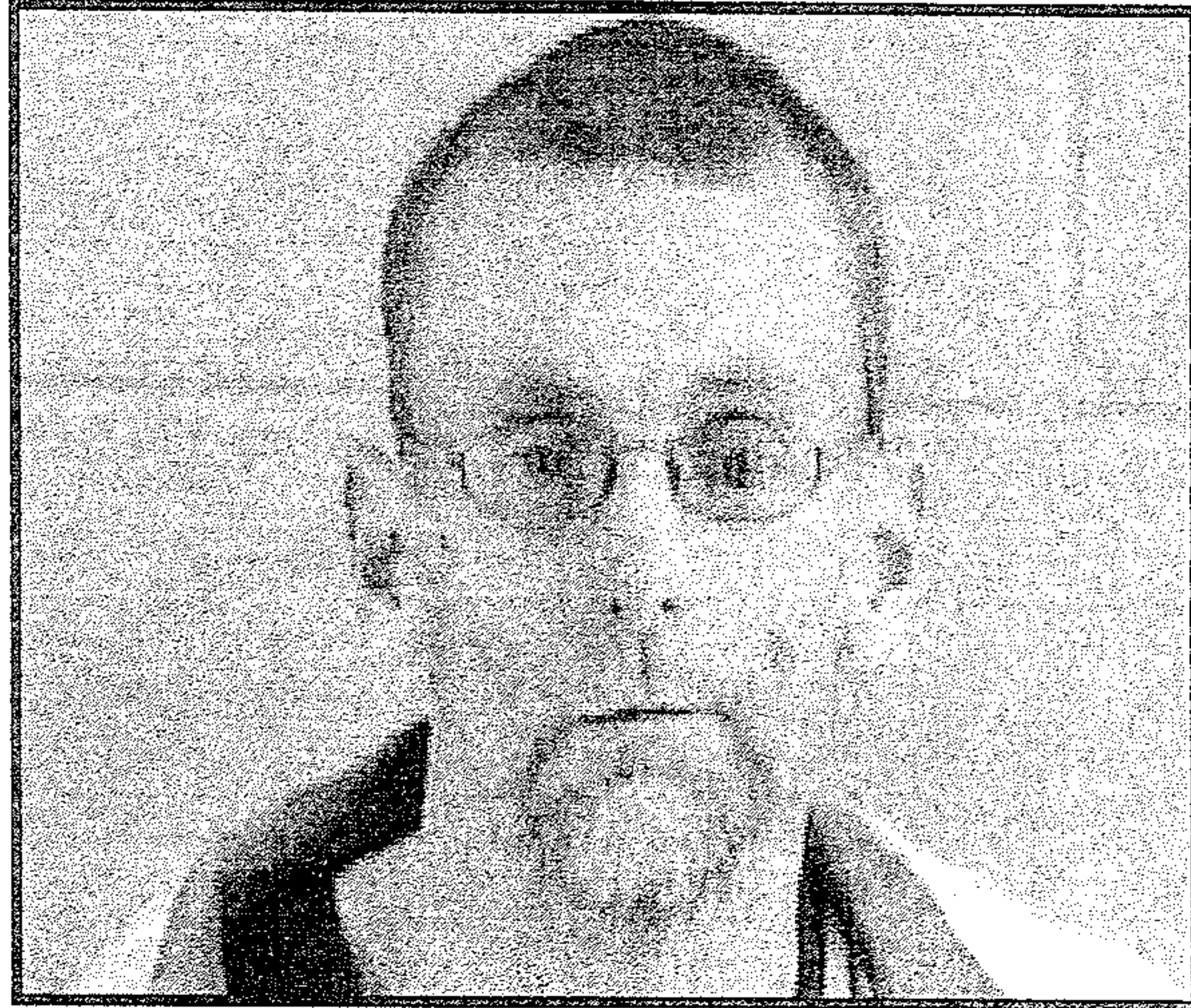

Nearly hitting oncoming vehicle leads to DUI for impaired driver

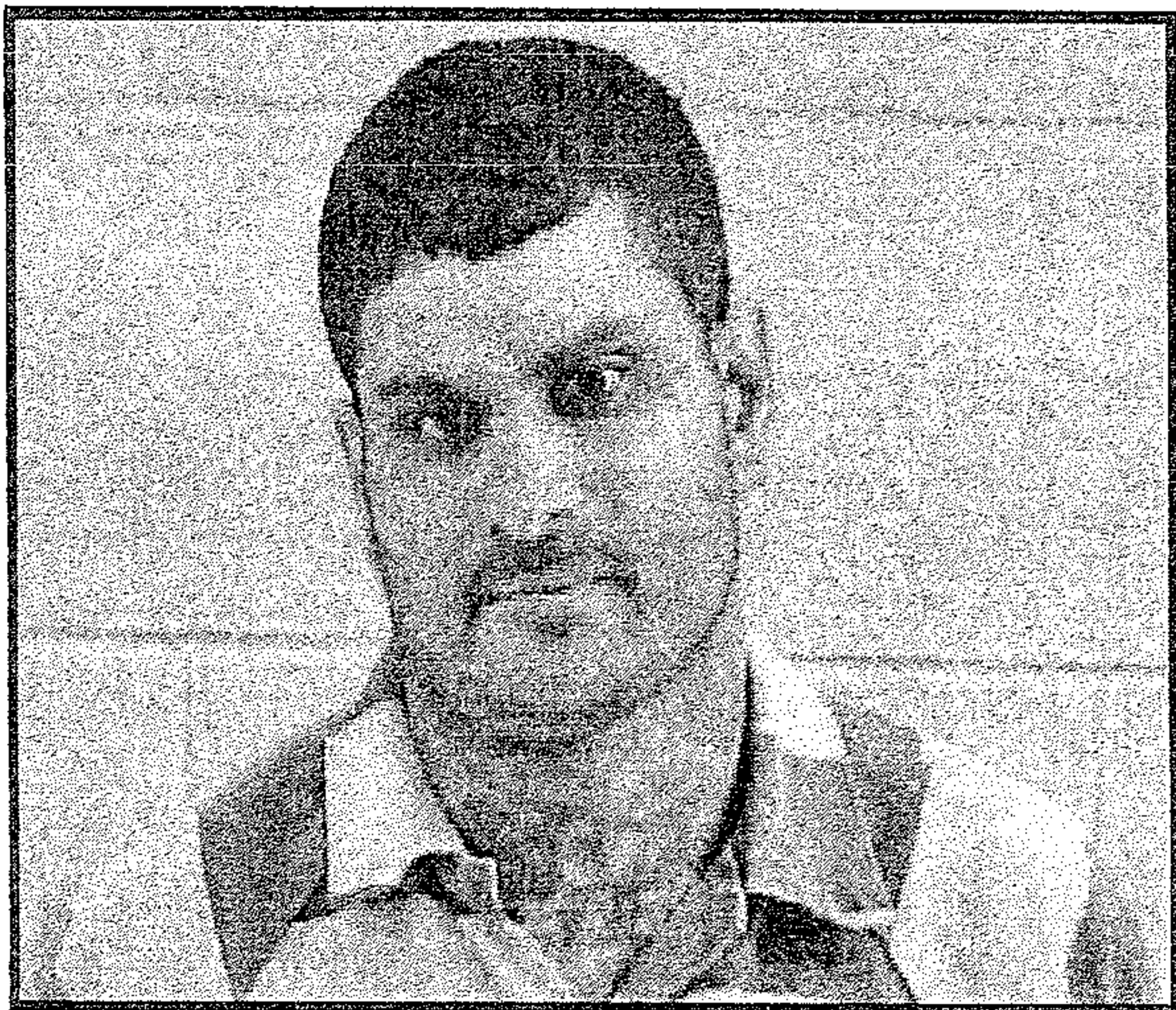
Alfred Brogdon, 43, Short Bark Road Madisonville, was charged with DUI, , and Violation of Implied Consent.

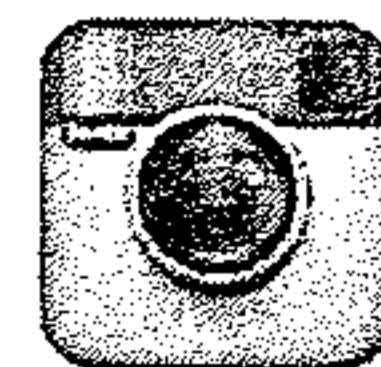

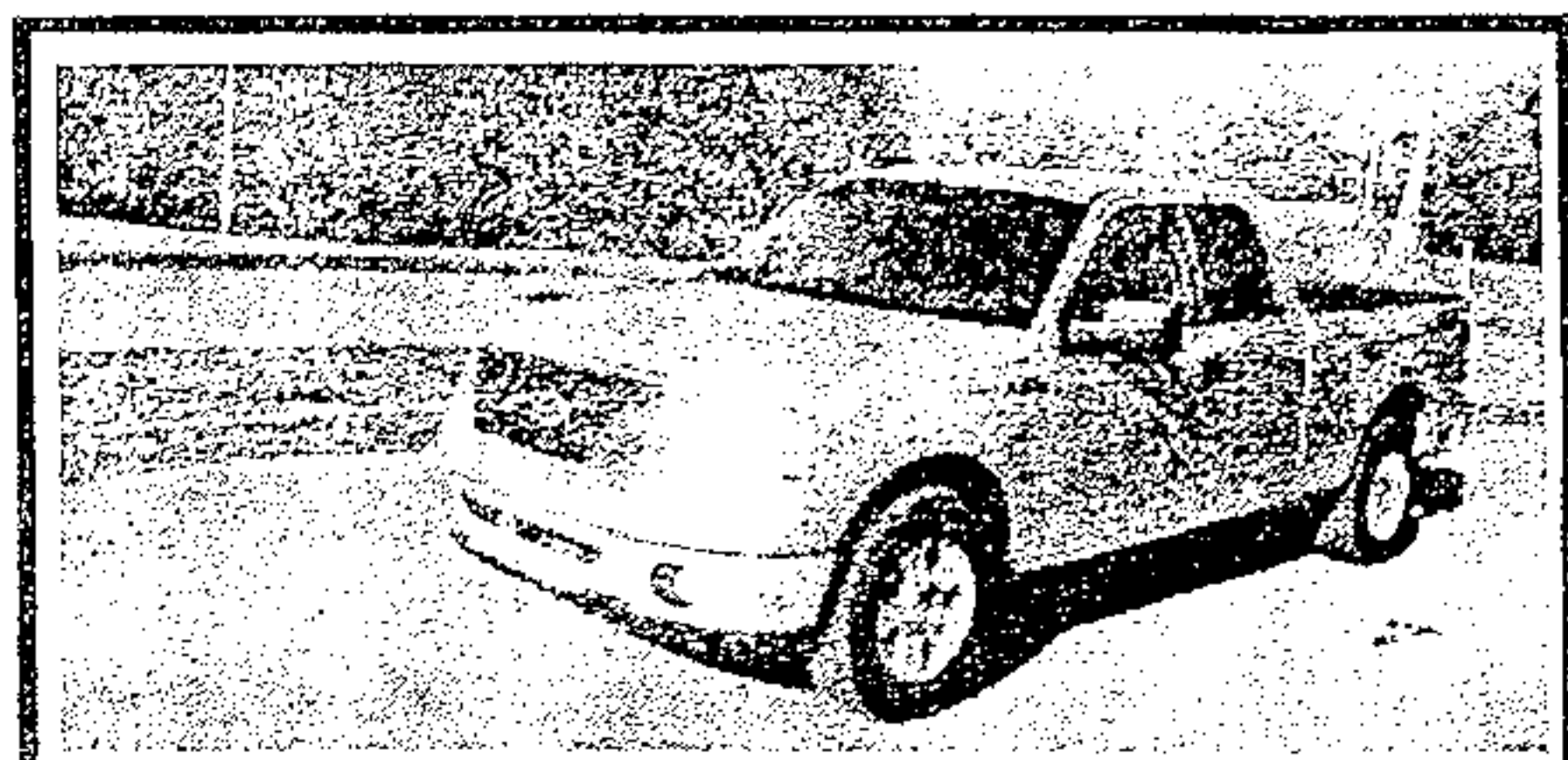

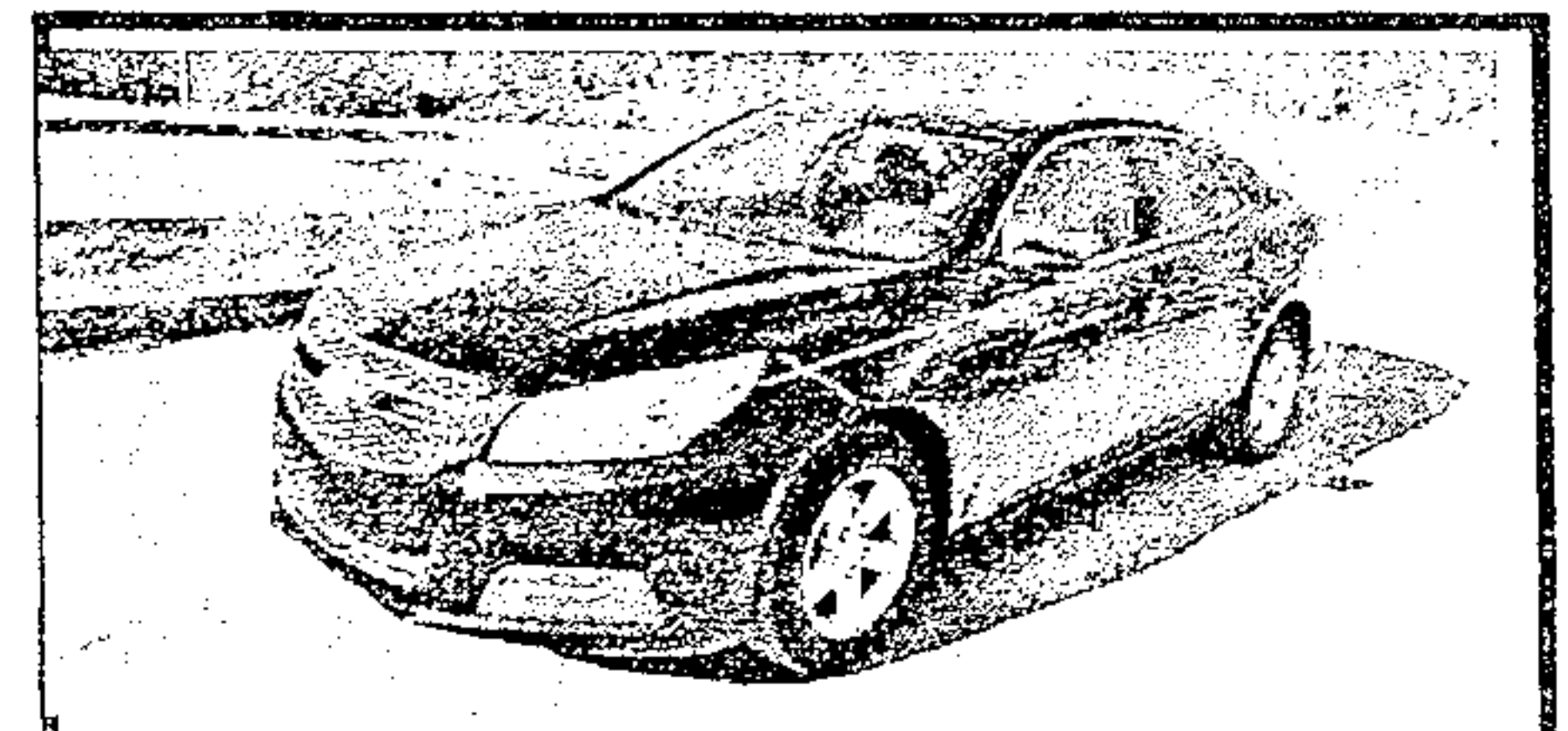
