Highway in Lenoir City, TN. The homeowner, Ashley Dawn Morris, was detained inside the residence. 32 3/4 2mg Alprazolam pills were found subsequent to a search of Morris' person. During the search of the residence

and out buildings, the following items were found: four 8mg Buprenorphine pills, four baggies containing forty eight 500/5mg Hydrocodone pills, one baggie containing ten 325/10mg Hydrocodone pills, a pill bottle with no label containing forty seven additional 2mg Alprazolam pills, one baggie with ap-

proximately 0.8 grams of a substance which field tested positive as heroin, 4 baggies with approximately 3.2 grams of brown crystalline substance which field tested positive as meth, four baggies with 5.8 grams of a

white crystalline substance which field tested positive as meth, a small glass vial with approximately 0.5 grams of a white powder substance which field tested positive for cocaine, three baggies of

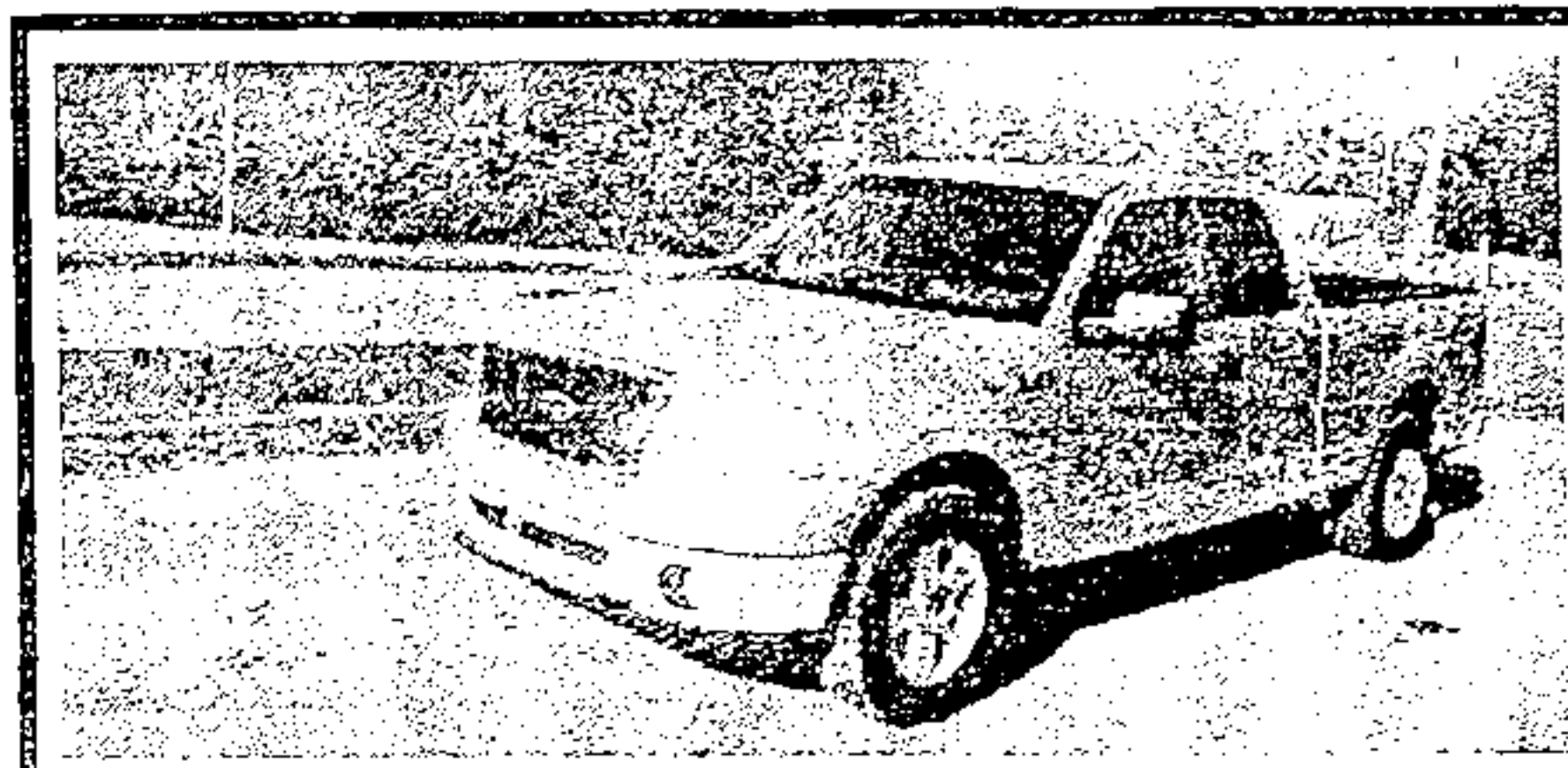

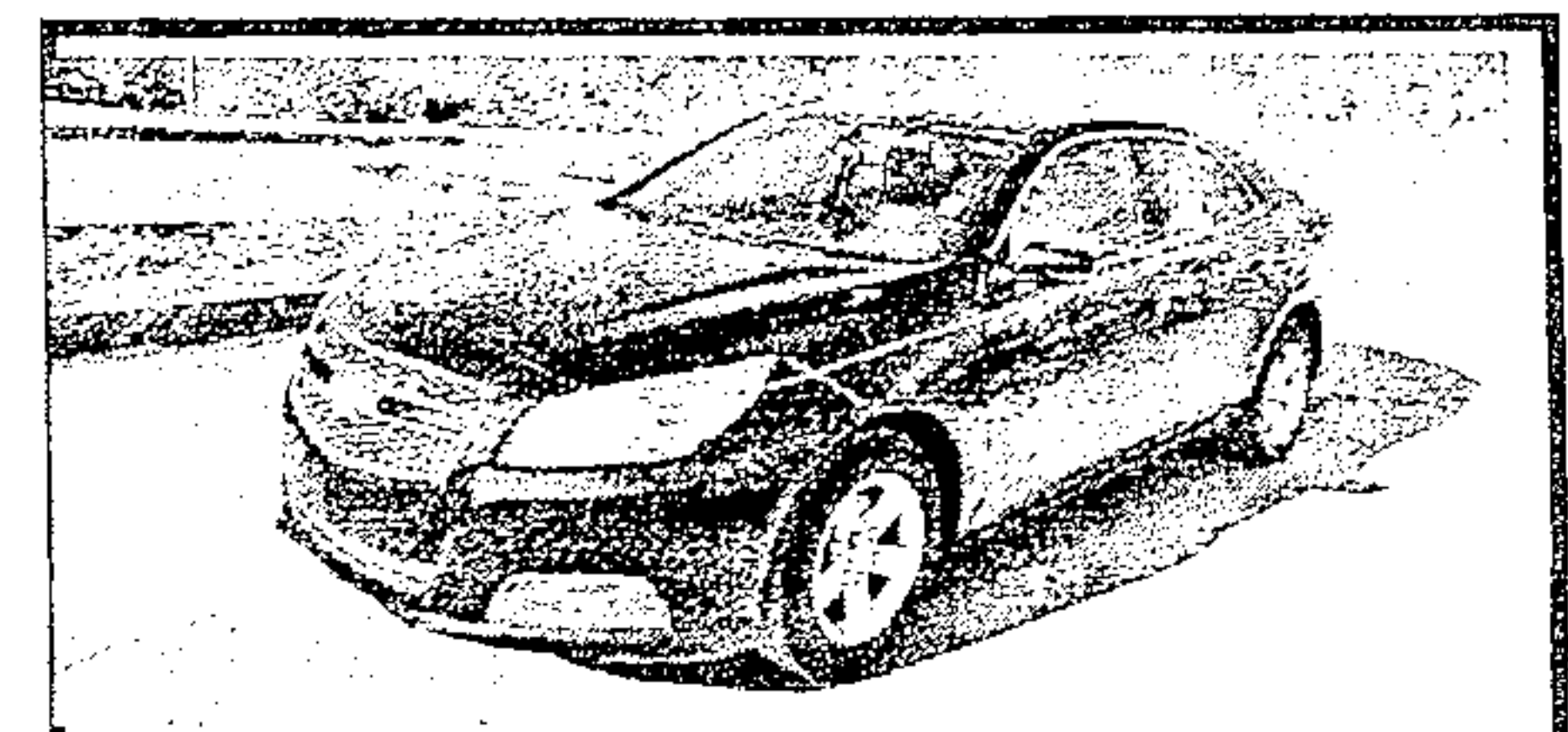

pending License Officer with LPD, witnessed a gray BMW disobey a traffic control device at the intersection of Rose Dale Avenue and Ward Street. Officer was able to catch up to this ve-

hicle and traffic stop it at the intersection of Cedar Street and Grove Street. Officer approached the vehicle and identified the driver as Mr. Timothy Jones. While Officer was speaking with Mr. Jones he requested his driver's license. At this time Mr. Jones handed Officer an identification only card. Officer asked Mr. Jones if he was suspended or revoked, he stated suspended. 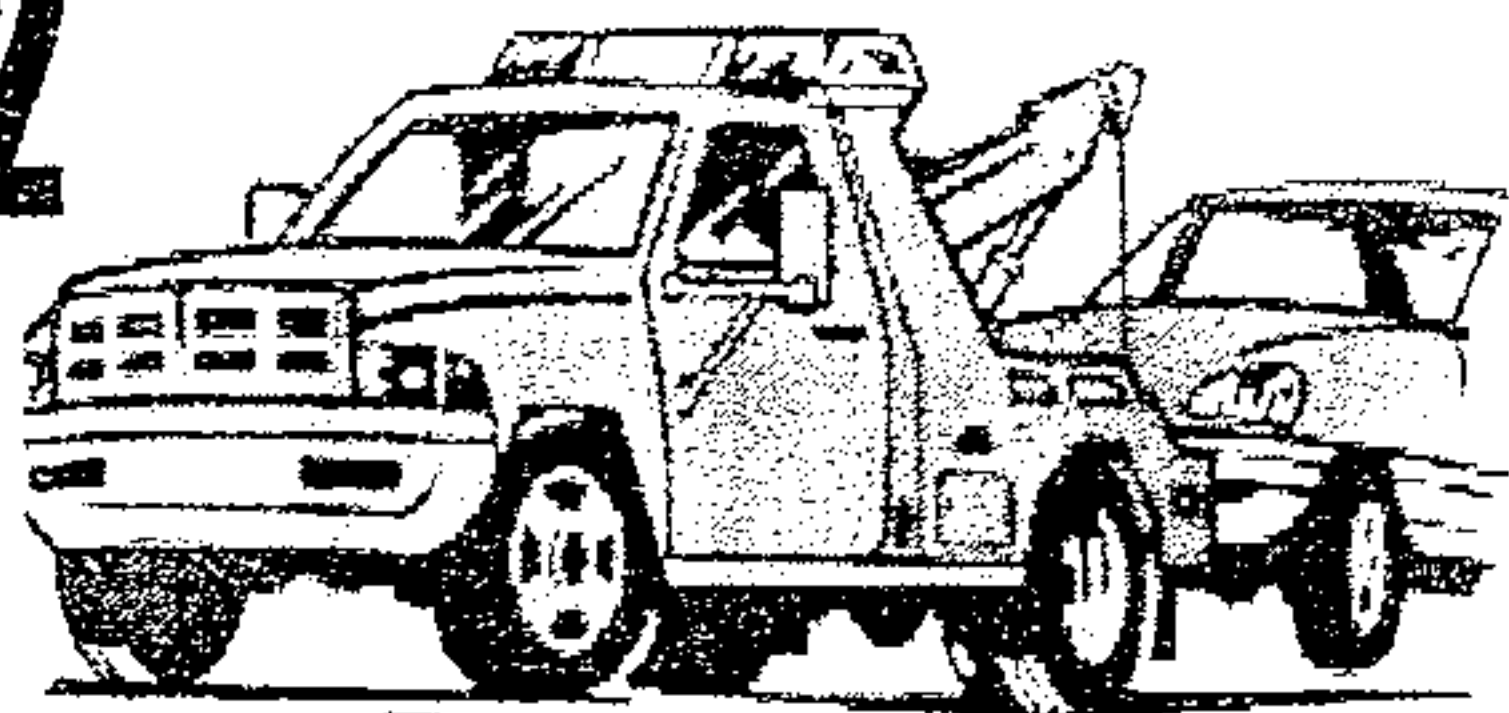

Identity

Kyle Wyatt, 36, State Street North Carolina, was charged with Identity Theft and Theft of Property x2.

On or about March 1, 2016, Kyle Wyatt did commit the offense of Identity Theft Trafficking. Wyatt did simultaneously possess the personal identifying information of five (5) different individuals. Wyatt possessed the personal identifying information with the intent to commit an unlawful act including, but not limited to; obtaining or attempting to obtain credit, goods, services or medical information in the name of the other person.

Wyatt did not have the consent of any of the five individuals to use their personal in-

formation in any way. Wyatt was using other people's identifications to obtain cellular phone contracts and cellular phones. A search incident to arrest resulted in Lenoir City Police locating several driver's licenses with Wyatt's photograph and other peoples information, along with Transunion customer support reports containing other people's names, social security numbers, addresses, and dates of birth

Business E-Mail Compromise

Cyber-Enabled Financial Fraud on the Rise Globally

The Art of Deception

The organized criminal groups that engage in business e-mail compromise scams

are extremely sophisticated. Here are some of the online tools they use to target and exploit their victims:

Spooing e-mail accounts and web-sites: Slight variations on legitimate addresses (john.kelly@abccompany.com vs. john.kelley@abccompany.com) fool victims into thinking fake accounts are authentic. The criminals then use a spoofing tool to direct e-mail responses to a different account that they control. The victim thinks he is corresponding with his CEO, but that is not the case.

Spear-phishing: Bogus e-mails believed to be from a trusted sender prompt victims to reveal confidential information to the BEC perpetrators.

Malware: Used to infiltrate company networks and gain access to legitimate e-mail threads about billing and invoices. That information is used to make sure the suspicions of an accountant or financial officer aren't raised when a fraudulent wire transfer is requested. Malware also allows criminals undetected access to a victim's data, including passwords and financial account information.

If you or your company have been victimized by a BEC scam, it's important to act quickly. Contact your financial institution immediately and request that they contact the financial institution where the fraudulent transfer was sent.

Next, call the FBI, and also file a complaint—regardless of dollar loss—with the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3).

Don't be a Victim

The business e-mail compromise scam has resulted in companies and organizations losing billions of dollars. But as sophisticated as the fraud is, there is an easy solution to thwart it: face-to-face or voice-to-voice communications.

"The best way to avoid being exploited is to verify the authenticity of requests to send money by walking into the CEO's office or speaking to him or her directly on the phone," said Special Agent Martin Licciardo. "Don't rely on e-mail alone."

Here are other methods businesses have employed to safeguard against BEC:

Create intrusion detection system rules that flag e-mails with extensions that are similar to company e-mail. For example, legitimate e-mail of abc_company.com would flag fraudulent e-mail of abc-company.com.

Create an e-mail rule to flag e-mail communications where the "reply" e-mail address is different from the "from" e-mail address shown.

Color code virtual correspondence so e-mails from employee/internal accounts are one color and e-mails from non-employee/external accounts are another.

Verify changes in vendor payment lo-

cation by adding additional two-factor authentication such as having secondary sign-off by company personnel.

Confirm requests for transfers of funds by using phone verification as part of a two-factor authentication; use previously known numbers, not the numbers provided in the e-mail request.

Carefully scrutinize all e-mail requests for transfer of funds to determine if the requests are out of the ordinary.
