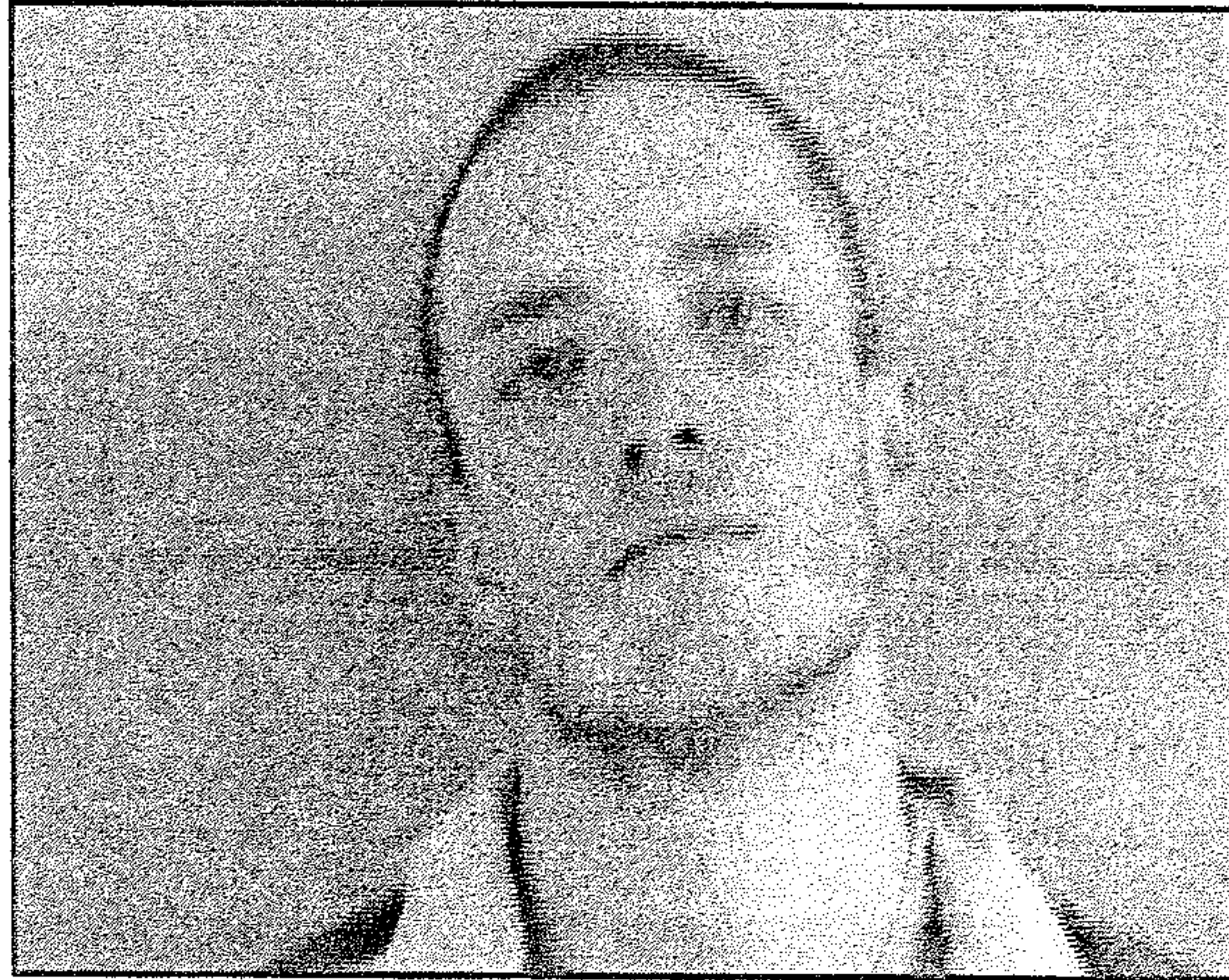

had a loaded syringe in his left pocket. Wilkerson stated he used the syringe for consuming illegal drug not medical purposes. Inside the gold container was 7 blue baggies with a crystal substance that field tested for Methamphetamine totaling 2.5 grams, and also located was 2 1/2 white pills believed to be Burprenophine hydrochloride. Wilkerson did not have a prescription for the medication. Wilkerson was placed under arrest, the driver was given a warning for speeding.
