New Online Map Brings Transparency to Public Utility and Transportation Assessments

The Tennessee Comptroller's Office of State Assessed Properties (OSAP) has launched a new tool that brings greater transparency to public utility and transportation properties that are annually appraised and assessed by the Comptroller's Office.

A new interactive map has been added to the Comptroller's website. This online resource will be

helpful to Tennessee property assessors, trustees, city collecting officials, and other Tennessee citizens who are interested in the assessment of property.

Visitors to the website are now able to view the names of companies, their assessments, GIS parcel mapping, aerial images, and other information.

OSAP, which is often known as Tennessee's 96th Assessor,
