Reckless

Walter Stachowicz, 35, Grandview Drive Loudon, was charged with Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, Poss. of Drug Para., and Simple Possession x2.

Deputy Kenneth Palmer LCSO, was dispatched to a reckless driver on Interstate 75 North. Dispatch advised it was a copper color Pontiac car. The tag came back on a 1999 Plymouth Breeze. Dispatch advised the vehicle was trying to get the complainant to hit him and serving in front of his tractor trailer. Deputy observed the vehicle matching that description with the same tag exit 75 North at the 81 exit. Deputy stopped the vehi-

cle at Highway 321. While exiting his vehicle Deputy observed the driver Mr. Walter Lawrence Stachowicz started digging in his pockets trying to get something out. Deputy approached the vehicle and observed the Mr. Stachowicz was digging in his right pocket. Deputy asked the Mr. Stachowicz what he was reaching for at which time he stated nothing. Deputy told the Mr. Stachowicz to exit the vehicle. The Mr. Stachowicz exited the vehicle at which time he asked him for his drivers license. Mr. Stachowicz stated he did not have a license they were suspended. Deputy asked Mr. Stachowicz if there was anything illegal inside the vehicle at which time he stated no.

Deputy asked Mr. Stachowicz if we could search the vehicle at which time he stated yes. While searching the vehicle Deputy did locate a small baggy with a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana, a small oval white and blue pill with imprint K 25. Deputy also located a syringe, 3 cut straws with a powder residue, and a part of what appeared to be some type of pill. The part of the pill was unidentifiable at the time of the stop. Deputy ran Mr. Stachowicz though dispatch at which time they advised his license were suspended for failure to pay fines. Mr. Stachowicz was placed under arrest and charged with driving on suspended, simple possession of Sch 6, simple possession of Sch 4, and posses-

seat Mr. Thomas Bowers had blood running down the side of his head. Deputy observed Mr. Bowers had a big cut above his left eye and a huge knot. Deputy was speaking with the other occupants of the vehicle at which time he observed Mr. Bowers try to hid something. Deputy asked Mr. Bowers what he was doing at which time he stated nothing. Deputy then had Mr. Bowers exit the vehicle to look at his injury and find out what was going on. Mr. Bowers stated that nothing had happened that he hit his head. While speaking with the other subjects of the vehicle Deputy walked passed the passenger side of the vehicle. Deputy observed a clear plastic baggy with


what appeared to be a clear crystal substance believed to be methamphetamine and two green pills. Cpl. Branam 922 then got the baggy from the vehicle. Deputy observed the pills were green with the imprint N 15 identified as Morphine Sulfate Extended Release 15mg. Deputy asked the owner of the vehicle if I could search the vehicle at which time he stated yes. In the vehicle Cpl. Branam located a backpack that Mr. Bowers stated belonged to him. Inside the backpack was a sunglass case with 5 syringes, two spoons with a unknown substance, a cut straw, and other items used to shoot drugs. Mr. Bowers was placed under arrest for Mfg, sell, del, poss of Sch 2, simple possession of Sch 2, and possession of drug paraphernalia and transported to the Loudon County Jail.
