Melinda Connatster, 49, Disco Loop Road Friendsville, was charged with DUI, and Violation of implied Consent.

Officer Jordan Samuels LCPD, was dispatched to a reckless driver call on Highway 321 crossing the Dam. While approaching the Dam in order to make contact with reckless driver dispatched advised the vehicle was turning its headlights on and

off, traveling approximately 10 mph, and went up on the curb and almost struck the railing. Officer observed the vehicle in question cross over the fog line and almost ran off the road.

Officer then activated his emergency equipment in order to catch up with vehicle. Officer stopped the vehicle on Highway 321 at St. Thomas Way. Upon approaching the vehicle the driver, Ms. Melinda Connats-

er, stated that she could not get out of the vehicle even though the door was unlocked. Ms. Connatser climbed across the passenger seat and exited the vehicle. Once out of the vehicle Officer, instructed Ms. Connatser to step towards his vehicle in order to obtain general information. While speaking with Ms. Connatser, she appeared to be under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs at which time Officer asked if he could do Standarized Field Sobriety Tests on her in order to make sure that

she was ok to operate the vehicle at the time of stop. Ms. Connatser gave consent at which time she did poorly on Standarized Field Sobriety Tests.

Ms. Connatser was placed under arrest for Driving Under the Influence and was then read the Tennessee Implied Consent Law at which time she refused to give a non mandatory blood draw sample. Ms. Connatser was transported from the scene to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. This did occur in Lenoir City







PUBLIC NOTICE

WATER SYSTEM FLUSHING PROGRAM

The Lenoir City Utilities Board (LCUB) and Lenoir City Fire Department will be conducting lour semi-annual water distribution system widel lflushing program per Tennessee Department off Environment & Conservation Water Quality Control Requirements. The Flushing Program will occur for LCUB customers on Monday, May 22, 2017, from 6:00 p.m. until 2:00 a.m. Ithru Thursday, May 25, 2017, until 3:00 pm. The program goals are to identify problems in the water system and ultimately have them cor-Irected. When fire hydrants are flowed, iron deposits in the water lines become agitated. This lmay cause a brown discoloration to the water lin the area which is being flushed. This condition is only temporary and will normally correct litself in a number of hours. During this period of flushing, LCUB recommends that you flow your cold water prior to use to determine if there lis any discoloration. While the water is still safe for consumption, we recommend not laundering white clothes without first testing the water for discoloration. If your water is discolored, it will clear up on its own under normal usage over la period of time. It is also best to limit the usel of your hot water until the water flows clear as this will keep the iron deposits from going into lyour water heater. You may also notice a drop in water pressure during these times; however, the water pressure should return to normal within a short period of time. If you continue to experilence difficulty with your water pressure or con-Itinue to have discoloration of water on Monday. May 29, 2017, please contact LCUB at (865) 1988-0700 to report the problem.
