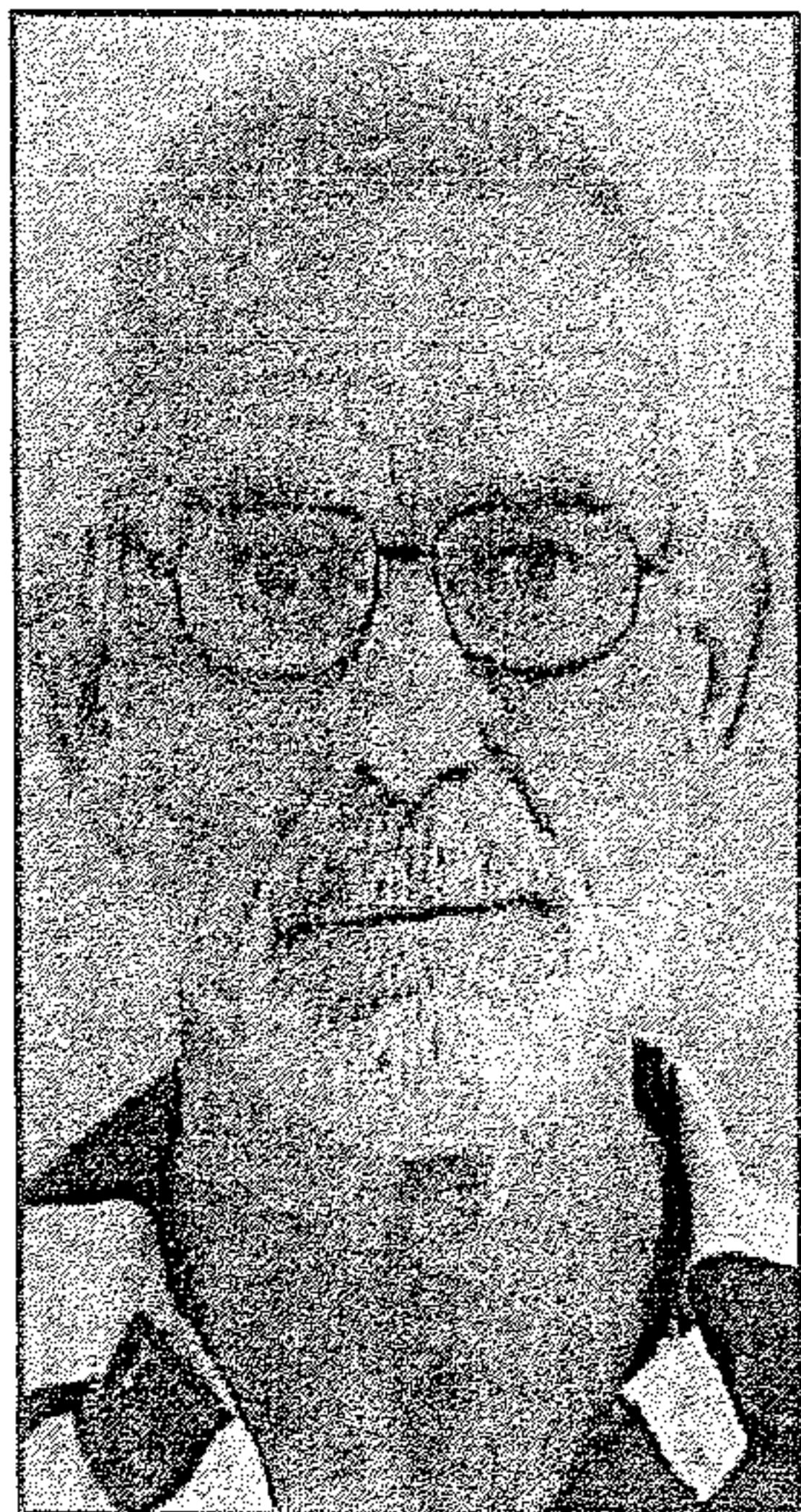

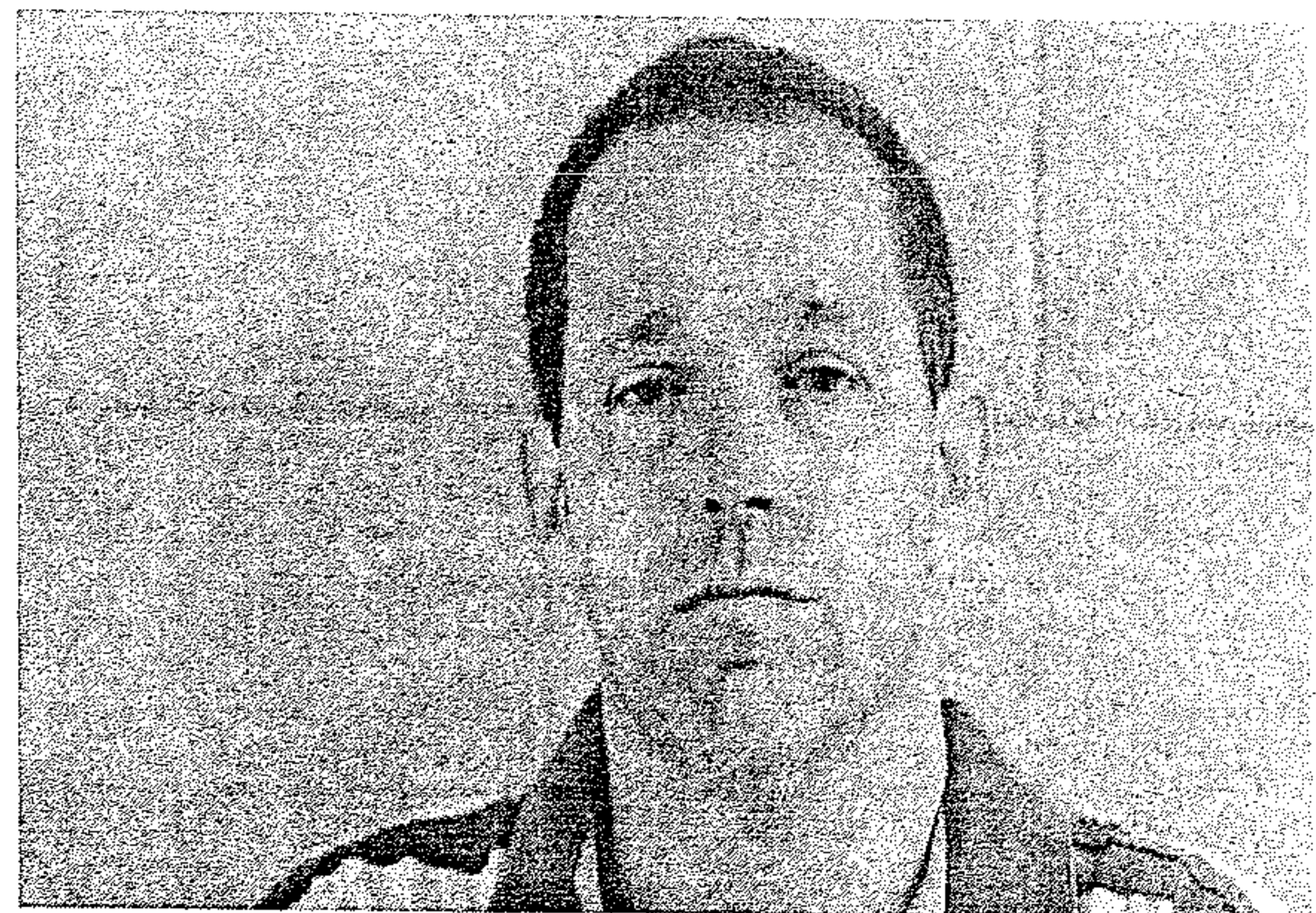

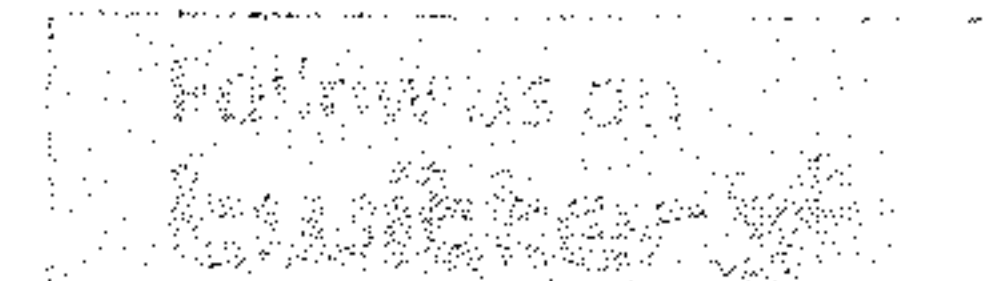

ately 4:03 pm. Mr. Cannon stated he had shot his sister and fiance and it was unknown if they were breathing or not.

This incident occurred at White Wing Road in Lenoir City. Deputy Chad Estes arrived on scene and detained Mr. Cannon. He discovered two females lying in the driveway with what appeared to be gunshot wounds. Three children were inside of the residence. Victim 1 was pronounced deceased at the

scene and victim 2 was transported by ambulance to UT Medical Center where she passed away at approximately 7:00 pm. Mr. Cannon was transported to the Loudon County Justice Center. Mr. Cannon stated he had been in an argument with his fiance, on today's date while returning from Maryville. He stated that victim 1 got out of their vehicle at highway 321 and 11. Mr. Cannon then drove to the residence with the three children. Mr. Cannon states he made attempts to call victim 1. Victim 1 arrived at the

residence with his sister victim 2. According to Mr. Cannon both victims came in the residence and an argument occurred.

Mr. Cannon stated both victims left the residence and he followed them outside. A

confrontation occurred between all 3 and he produced his weapon. The weapon was described as a 9 mm Smith and Wesson. Mr. Cannon fired several rounds striking both victims resulting in their deaths.

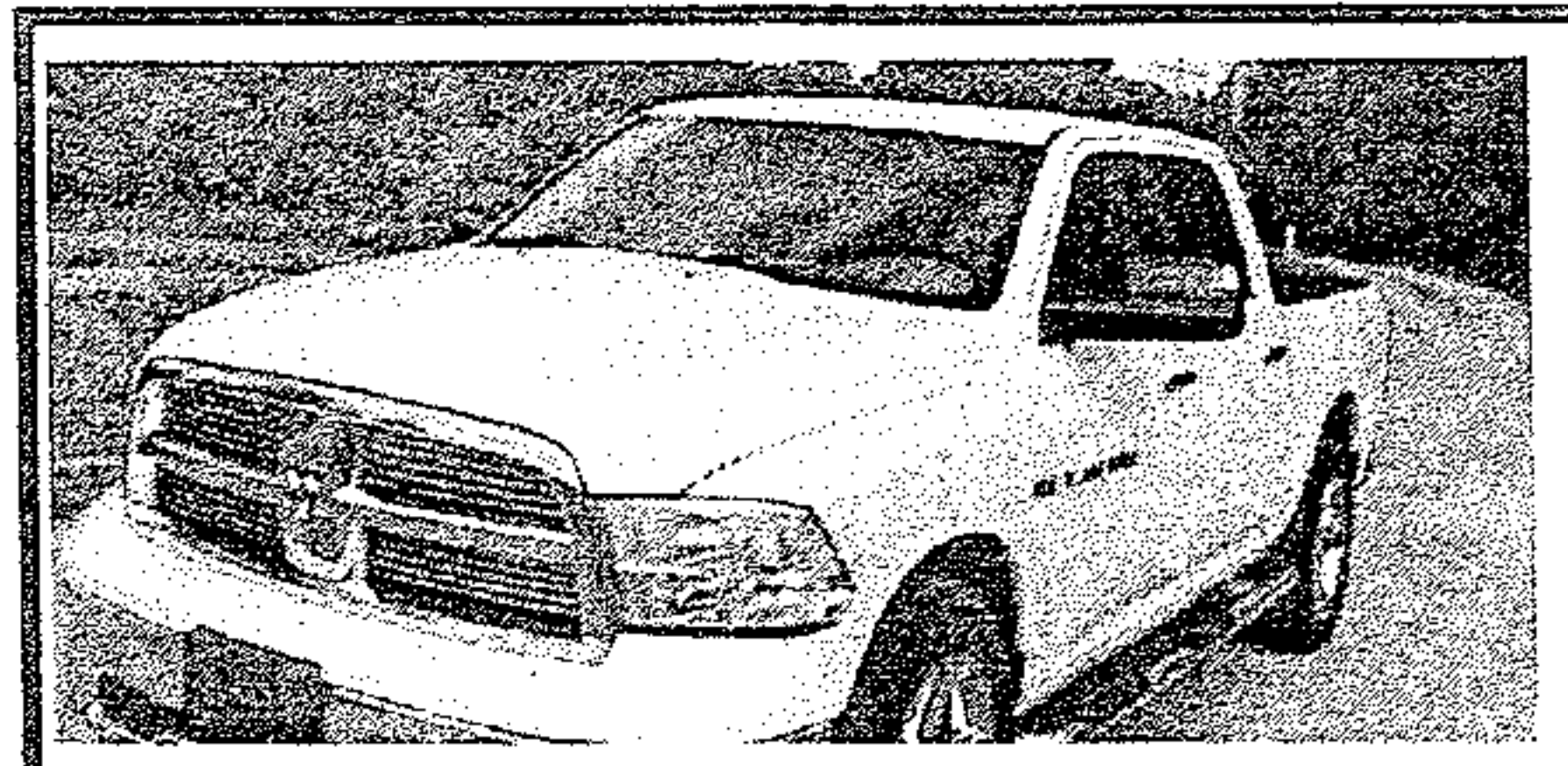

Assault

Cody Stovall, 23, Crock Rock Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault, and Domestic Assault Felony. Deputy Billy Lewis LCSO, responded to Donaldson Road for a domestic. Upon arrival Deputy made contact with Cody Stovall, who stated that the victim

had been using a cell phone that he purchased for victim. Stovall stated as victim was leaving he brought up the money for the cell phone. Stovall stated that he took the phone from the victim, at which time she tried to get it back. Stovall stated victim got him in a headlock and bit his arm. Deputy did notice a

small red mark on Stovall. Deputy traveled to Circle Drive to meet with victim. Upon speaking with victim she stated that she confronted Stovall about his drug use and he became angry and started arguing about the cell phone he bought her. Victim stated Stovall refused to let victim leave without paying him for the phone. Stovall grabbed victim's keys and phone and started walking away. Upon victim attempt to get her belongings, Stovall grabbed victim by the arms picks victim up and throw her against the couch. Stovall then grabs victim around the neck choking her to the point it started to hurt. Victim stated she was scared for her life. Victim

stated that a witness came out and got Stovall off victim at which time victim attempts to run to her truck. Stovall beat victim to the truck, and fights to keep victim from opening the door. Deputy did observe red marks around victim neck along with bruising on the underside of her left arm in the shape of a finger prints and a raised section on right biceps. It was learned from a witness he observed Stovall had followed victim down the road and was hitting her vehicle with his. Stovall was placed under arrest.

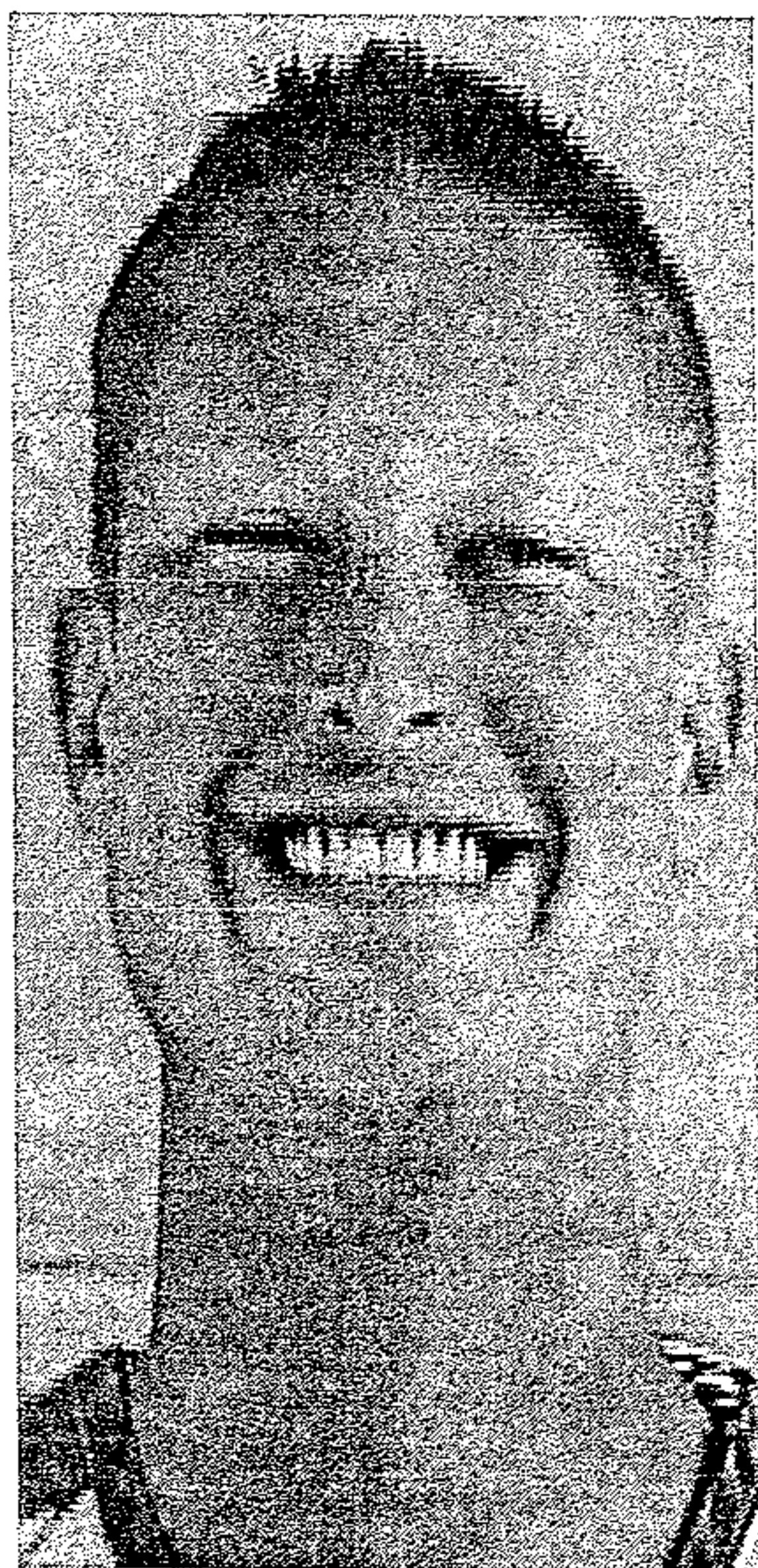
DUI

Perry Brummitt, 45, White Wing Road Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Officer Keith Sennett LCPD, was dispatched on a reckless driver. Officer located the vehicle in question at Arby's. Officer observed the Driver identified as Perry Brummitt, walking away from the vehicle. Officer made contact with Brummitt inside Arby's and noticed he had slurred speech, very unsteady on his feet, and had an odor of an alcoholic beverage about his person. While walking back to Brummitt's vehicle Officer had to grab him to keep him from falling. Brummitt stated he hit the median exiting the interstate and caused his flat tire, which he drove on to Arby's. Officer located a half drunk Bud Light on the floor board and a Yeti cup with beer in it. Brummitt refused sobriety test and was placed under arrest.

Police beat
Dawn Powell, 39, Jackson Bend Road Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault, and Resisting Arrest. Deputy JC Schultz LCSO, answered a physical domestic at Jackson Bend Road. Deputy and Sgt. Watkins had just cleared this location 5 minutes earlier, because of a verbal domestic. Upon arrival Dawn Powell was being actively aggressive towards victim placing her in fear of being injured. Deputies attempted to place Powell under arrest, however she began fighting Deputies. Sgt. Watkins deployed his taser and dry stun in an attempt to minimize injury to Powell. Once handcuffed and placed in the vehicle Powell started kicking the window and door of the cruiser, and banging her head until arrival at the jail. Once at the jail Powell was placed in the restraint chair, where she continued to scream.

Assault on City
Park Drive
Frank Johnson, 35, Branch Hill Lane Knoxville, was charged with Assault. Frank Johnson did intentionally and knowingly assault victim at City Park Drive, causing bodily injury to victim, by striking him in the face causing him to fall to the ground where Johnson continued striking victim. Johnson then approached victim and held out his hand as if he wanted to shake victim hand, then Johnson struck victim again. Victim suffered abrasions about his body, significant bruising to his side and rib cage area, and laceration to his lip. Victim glasses were broken. Victim sought medical attention because he suspected possible fractured ribs. Sgt. Lynette Ladd LCPD, issued a warrant. Deputy Cameron Myers served Johnson with assault warrant.

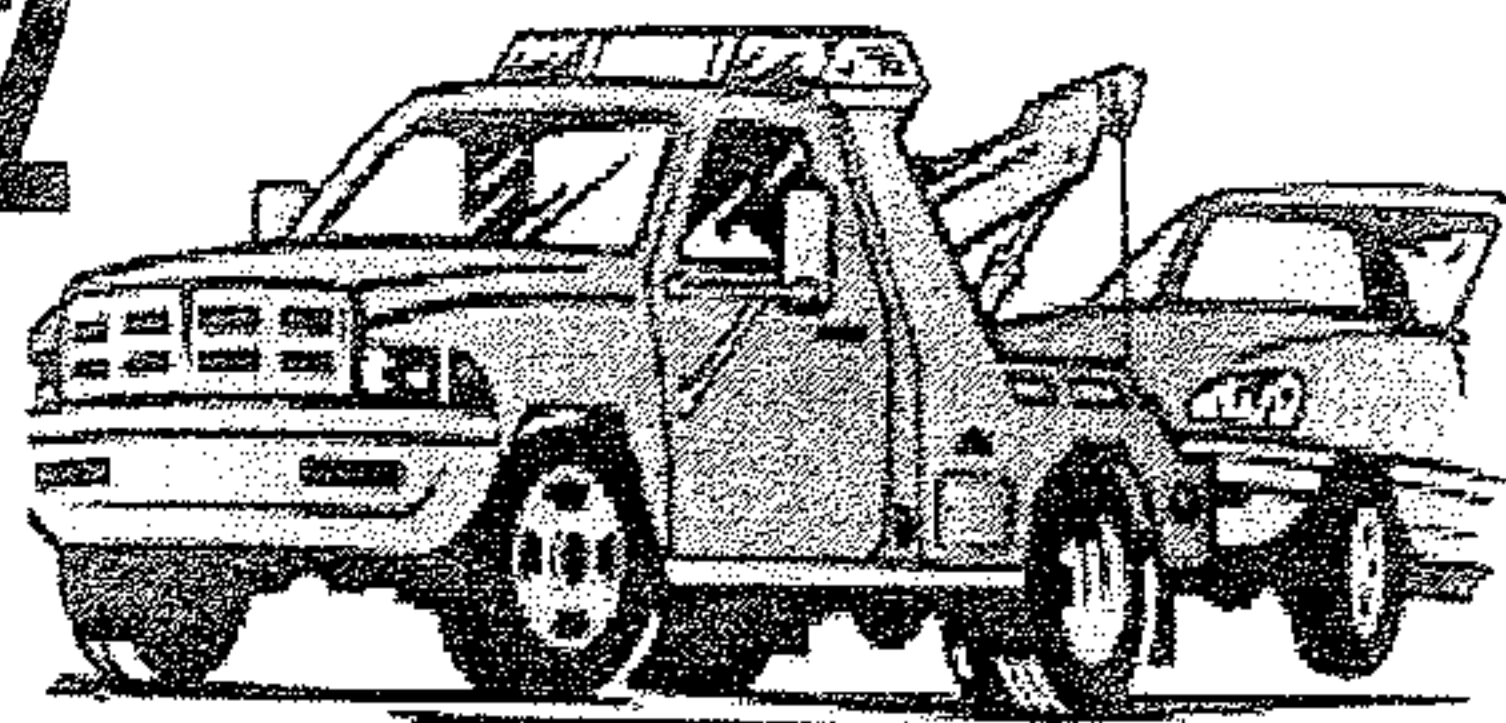

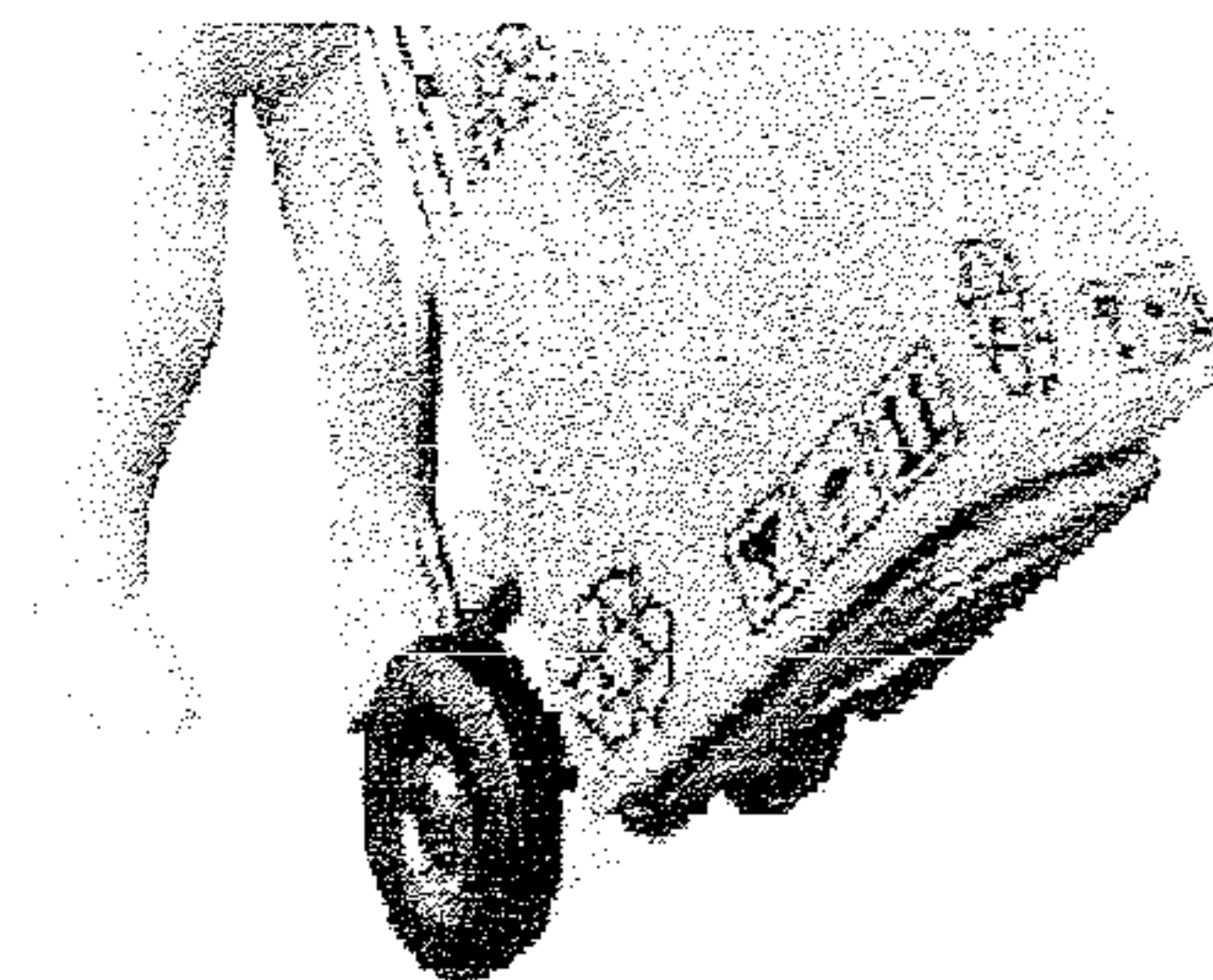
