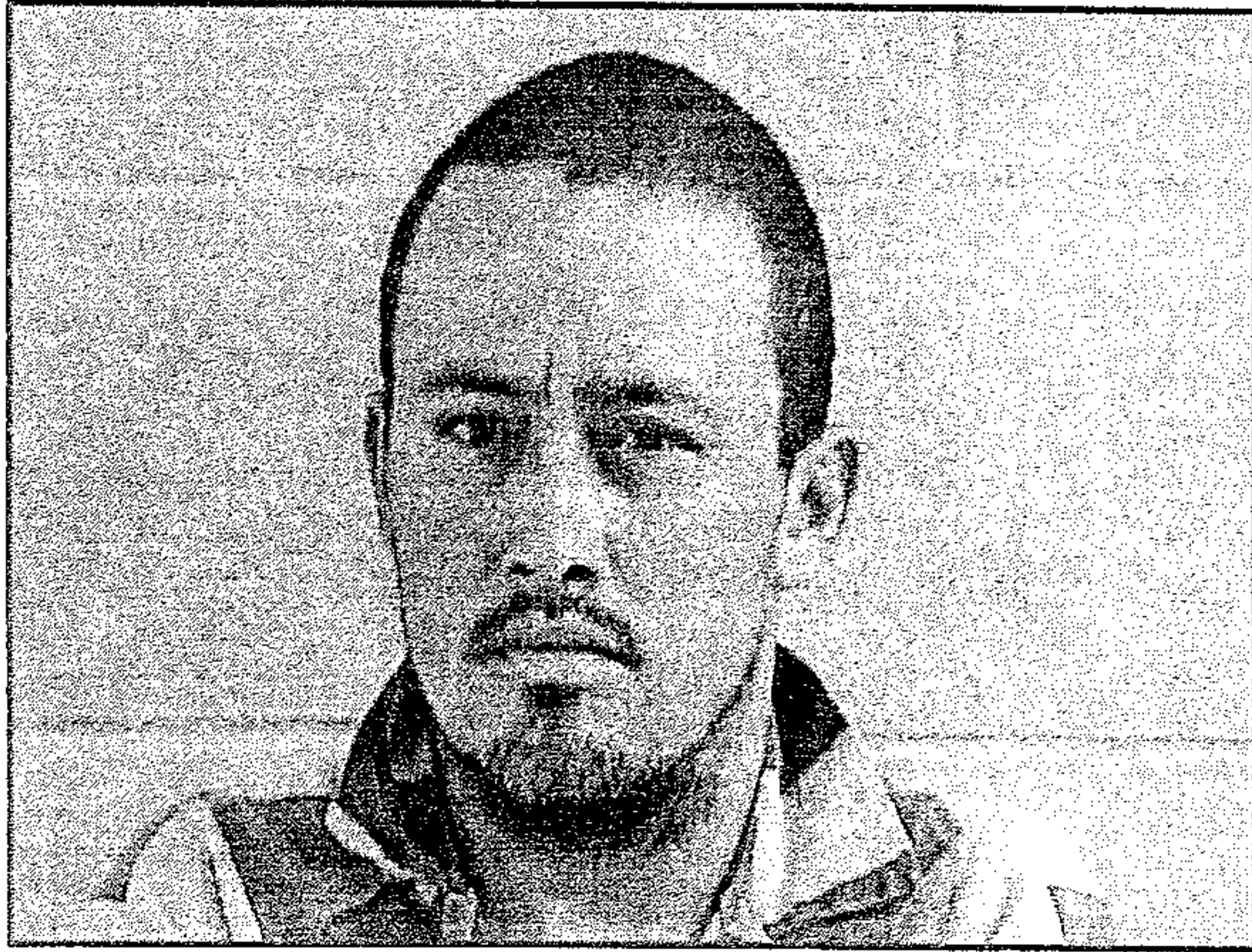


## Hispanic man charged with aggravated assault x3 after shooting in Lenoir City

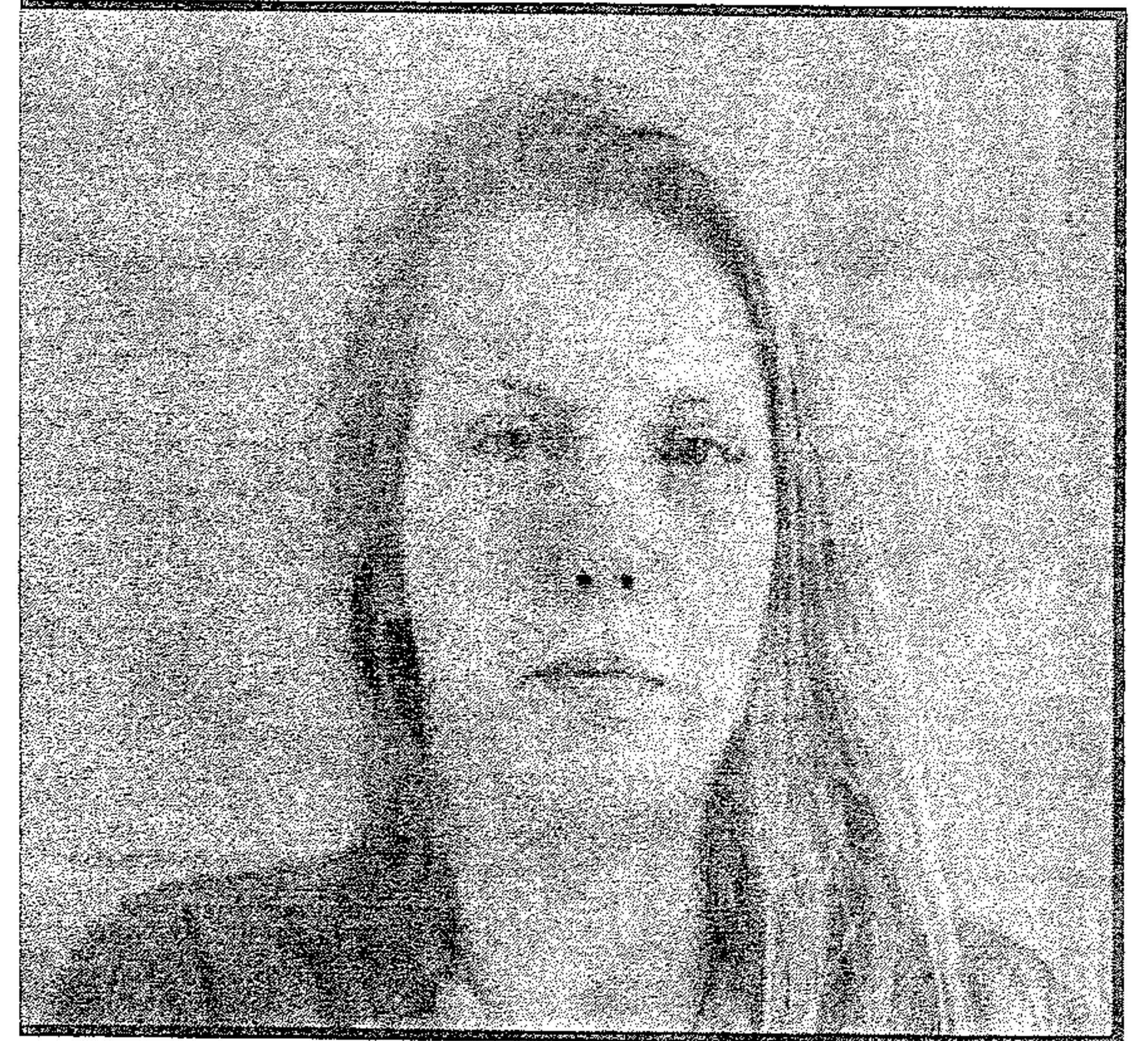

**Reckless**

Richard English, 56, Veterans Memorial Drive Tellico Plains, was charged with DUI.

According to the report, Deputy Lance Anderson LCSO, responded to exit 76 @ Sugarlimb in reference to a reckless driver. The complaint stated a red vehicle with temp tags was bright lighting and tailgating him.

Deputy observed the complaint and a red vehicle at the exit ramp.

Deputy initiated a traffic stop and identified the driver as Richard English. English had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage about his person.

Deputy observed a large open bottle of Bacardi Tequila behind the driver seat, two cold un open cans of Coors, and one empty Michelob in the passenger floorboard. A mix drink was sitting in the middle console. English did poorly on sobriety test, and was placed under arrest.

**Former Clinical Pharmacy Manager sentenced to serve 16 months for \$4.4 million in TennCare Fraud Scheme**

On June 26, 2017, Amber Reilly, 33, of Jonesborough, Tennessee, was sentenced by the Honorable J. Ronnie Greer, U.S. District Judge, to serve 16 months in federal prison for healthcare fraud, which resulted in at least a \$4.4 million loss to TennCare. Upon her release from prison, she will be supervised by U.S. Probation for three years.

Reilly, a former clinical pharmacy manager, pleaded guilty in October 2016 to one count of healthcare fraud. In her plea agreement, she admitted that between October 2014 and April 2016 she falsified prior authorizations, medical lab reports, and drug test results for at least 51 Hepatitis C patients

who had prescriptions for expensive drugs used to treat Hepatitis C. These patients had health insurance through TennCare, which does not pay for Hepatitis C prescriptions for patients who abuse illicit substances or who have limited or no scarring of the liver. The patients' authentic medical lab reports and drug tests showed that they failed to meet TennCare eligibility requirements. However, Reilly replaced disqualifying information regarding levels of liver scarring and illicit substance abuse on the authentic records with qualifying information, and then submitted the altered records to TennCare. She also fabricated allergies on the prior authorization forms of some of these patients so they could receive the most expensive Hepatitis C drug, Harvoni®.

As a result of Reilly's conduct, at least \$4.4 million was paid by TennCare to purchase prescriptions for these 51 patients, which would not have

been paid if true and accurate prior authorizations, drug test results, and medical lab reports pertaining to these patients had been submitted.

This investigation was conducted by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation and Department of Health and Human Services - Of-

fice of the Inspector General. Assistant U.S. Attorney T.J. Harker represented the United States.

Lincoln Sanders, 25, Homeless, was charged with Burglary to a Motor Vehicle, and Theft of Property.

Shawnda Stuart, 28, Hwy 321 Lenoir City,

was charged with Burglary to a Motor Vehicle, and Theft of Property.

Victim reported that someone entered his vehicle and took items (I-pad) without his consent. The com-

pany of the item was contacted and traced back to an address on Browder Hollow Road.

Deputy made contact with a male and female identified as Lincoln Sanders and Shawnda Stewart. Sanders ad-

mitted having the item and had purchased it from another person. Both were taken and interviewed, and admitted to taking the item. Investigator Charlie Cosner LCSO, charged both parties.

**Former Lauderdale County School Employees Indicted for Theft**

A special report from the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has found that two former employees of the Lauderdale County Department of Education continued to receive compensation after their employment with the school system had ended.

Educational assistant Devlyn Green terminated her employment with Lauderdale County in May 2014; however, auditors determined she continued to receive direct deposits to her personal bank account until December 19, 2016. This resulted in Green receiving salary overpayments of \$33,510.95.

The School Department also paid the employer portion of Green's Social Security and Medicare totaling \$2,563.59 and contributed \$1,769.78 to the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System on Green's behalf.

Bus Driver Milton Waller terminated his employment with Lauderdale County in October 2016; however, he continued to receive direct deposits totaling \$4,459.18 through February 16, 2017. The School Department also paid the employer portion of Waller's Social Security and Medicare totaling \$341.14.

The director of schools first disclosed this activity to the Comptroller's Office in February 2017 and has stated his intention to

In June 2017, Devlyn Green was indicted by the Lauderdale County Grand Jury on one count of theft over \$10,000. Milton Waller was indicted for one count of theft over \$2,500.

“It’s important that government entities follow a clear process whenever there is a separation of employment,” said Comptroller Justin P. Wilson. “All timesheets should also be reviewed to ensure they support payroll.”

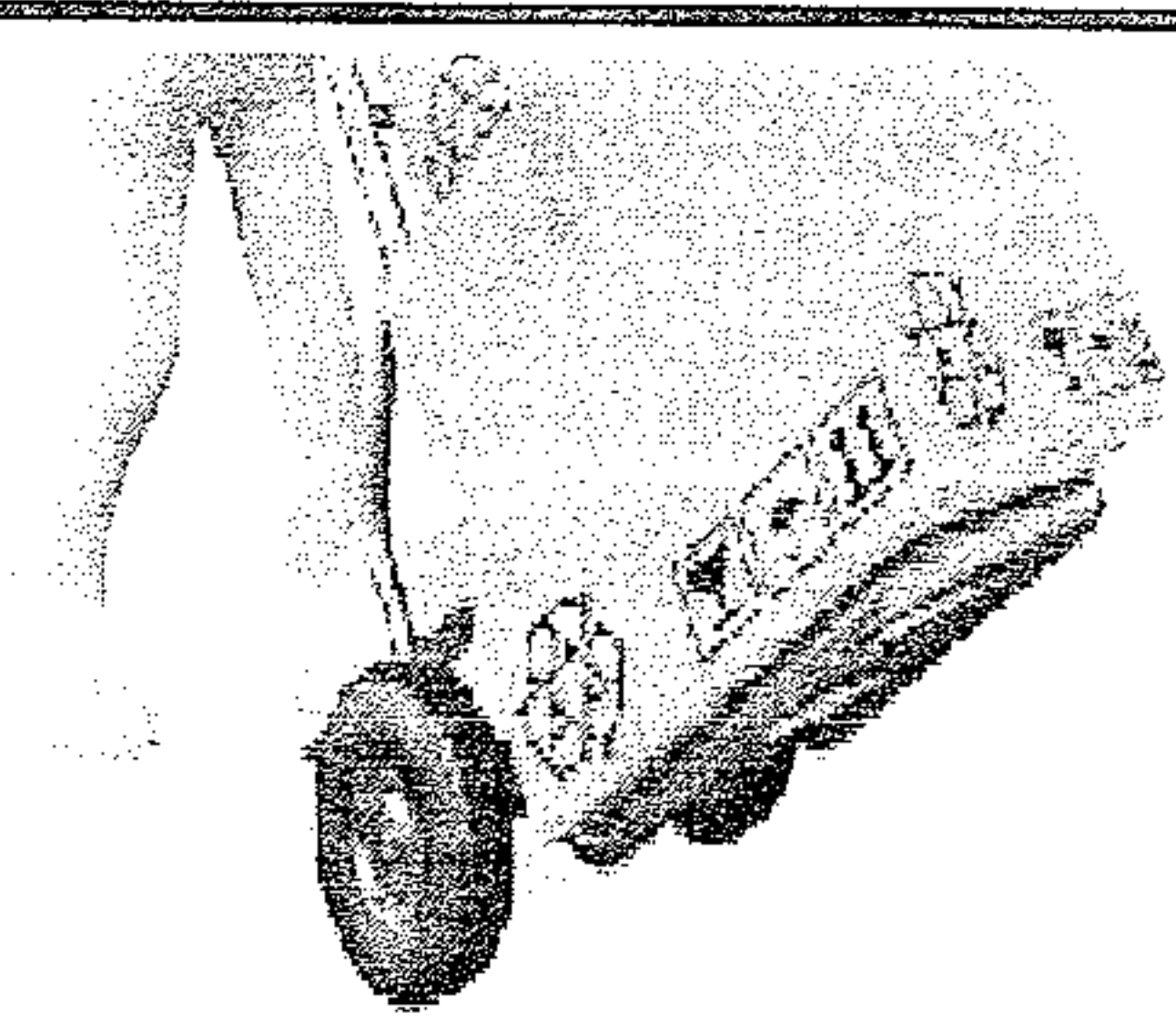
